The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Isaac Post is thought to be the brother of Frederick Post. He left his home and took refuge in the British lines on 26 March 1781. He then emigrated to Shelbourne County, Nova Scotia and was granted 200 acres in Port Roseway River West in 1786. On the 14th of March 1786 Isaac Post made a Claim for Lost Property while living in Orange County, New York to the value of 493 pounds New York currency. It is not known if Isaac Post received any compensation for his losses.

After Isaac's death, Brechje DeClark returned to New Jersey and m. (2) 27 Jan 1806 Tappan Ref Ch, **Hendrick Oblenis** (widower of (1) Antje Lydecker and (2) Catrina Blauvelt), son of Peter Oblenis & Sarah Nagel.

They lived on the Manor of Phillipsburgh at what is now Yonkers, NY.

In order for Jacob to have had children of marriageable age in 1748 and 1750, he would have had to have been born by about 1705.

In 1765 Jacob Post bought a 90-acre farm in what is now Palisades, Rockland County, NY from James Lawrence. This was later devised to son Abraham and Abraham's descendants still lived on the land as later as 1968.

In his will dated 2 April 1771, probated 23 May 1771 (Liber 27:599 New York), "Jacob Post, Sr., of the Yonkers, Westchester County" mentioned son Jacob; son Abraham (a small tract of land lying in Rockland, in the County of Orange, which land he now lives on); sons Isaac and Peter; daughters Joanna and Margaret; son Anthony; son Martin; grandson Martin Cargeer; granddaughter Ann Cargeer (goods that belonged to her mother), Makes sons Isaac and Anthony executors. Witnesses were John Warner, James Mahony, Colin McCarthy.

Leslie Post wrote, in Sep 2004, "My theory as to why John Van Orden and family is living there is that my great-grandfather, (Jacob's brother) next door, was enlarging his house at that time and John Van Orden, a mason, was doing the stone foundation work -- the Van Orden family were neighbors and friends of the Posts -- a Van Orden having witnessed my ggrandfather's will in the 1830s -- I know the house was enlarged before 1864, because my grandfather (born in 1864) did not know anything about it --- it was only in the early 1950s, when the house was remodeled that old clap boards on an inside wall, gave us the clue that the house had been added to at one time ---this also explained what happened to a small house that was on an adjacent property that my ggrandfather purchased in 1859 --- simply moved to enlarge the family home for the growing family --- Just a theory, but it fits the facts that I know."¹

Jan Janszen [Post] was a native of Harlingen, Holland.¹ (Vriesland)

He is said by family legend to have gotten his surname, Postmael, from being employed as a mail carrier.

"The city counsel of Harlingen gave a job as postman to a Jan Janssen in 1610. At that time it was unusual to have a surname as you probably know. An alias was common. So Jan Janssen postma could well have been his name. Perhaps his children took that surname/alias. This Jan Janssen had to take care for the post delivery to Groningen and Embden. Some other people with the name of Jan Janssen are also in my archive (of Harlingen), all first part of the seventh [17th?] century. One of them was a kaag (type of ship) shipper, and another(?) one was participating in the compagnie (organisation of merchants) that send ships to Groenland to fish on whales."³

He leased a farm in Harlem from Laurens Jansen on 23 April 1679. This lease was cancelled the following July 3rd, "under a new agreement, but Janszen alias Postmael remained in Harlem until 1683 or 1684. At that time he removed to Kingston, NY, where his wife's family lived (where his name is found "Postma" on the records). He died at Kingston a few years later.¹

John Post was named as overseer to executor (wife Hannah) of the will of Thomas Stephens of Southampton, Suffolk Co., NY, dated 11 March 1711, probated 27 Sep 1711.¹

In his will dated 25 Feb 1741, probated 7 April 1741, he wrote: ...I, John Post, of Southampton, in Suffolk County, Gentleman, being very weak in body. I leave to my son, John Post, my now dwelling house, barn and home lot, adjoining, as far as the Great ditch northward from said house. I leave to my son, Joseph Post, my new house and home lot of land adjoining on the west side of the road of the Town street, and also that piece of land that was uncle Joseph Post's against Patrick Cains; Also 1/3 of my Wood close, and one piece of land in the Plains on the west side of the lane by John Howell's land that he had of James Cooper, deceased; Also 1/2 of my meadow at Accobog, and 1/2 my meadow on the Beach and Island, and my meadow at Shinecock; Also that piece of land lying at Noyack joining to the land of George Harris, and 1/2 of my lot in Pine neck, and 1/3 of my Commonage east of Canoe Place, both in the late Divisions and undivided. I leave to my son, Isaac Post, one piece of land lying on the north side of my home lot beyond the Great ditch, to the lane called Goodale's lane; Also the close I bought of Joseph Clarke, and 1/3 of my Wood close; and one close in the Plains, called the 10 acre Close; and 1/2 my meadow at Accabog; and 1/2 my meadow on the Beach and Island, and 1/2 my lot in Pine neck, and my meadow at North Sea, and 1/3 of my Commonage east of Canoe Place. My son Isaac is to live in one end of my house with my son Joseph, till he can build a new house. I leave to my wife Mary æ50, and to my son Isaac two cows; the rest of my movables to my three sons, John, Joseph, and Isaac, and I make them executors. Witnesses, Ichabod Sayre, Joseph Jagger, Abraham Cooper. Proved, April 7, 1741.²

[NOTE.--Captain John Post died March 3, 1741, in the 68th year of his age. His homestead was on the east side of Main street, Southampton, and now owned by John F. Fournier and James Bishop. The railroad crosses it. The lot left to his son Isaac is now the homestead of the late William Jagger. This was originally owned by Thomas Sayre, the first settler, who left it to his son Job, who also left it to his son Job. The "Wood Close" is probably the farm at the north end of Mam street, lately owned by Uriah Lane, and the land on the west. The lot "against Patrick Cains" is probably the lot where the Water works now are in Southampton. The "Close bought of Joseph Clarke" is east of this. The house and lot left to son Joseph is the homestead lot of Mrs. Albert Reeves, and now owned by Mrs. Harriet Rogers.--W. S. P.]²

Mentions conveyance from Isaac Van Ryper to said John El. Vreeland 30 August 1805. Bounded E by Peter Terhune; S by Jacob Hopper; W by Aurie Banta; N by said Jacob Hopper. Signed by John El. Vreeland, Jane Vreeland. Witnessed by Lewis Thibou, Abrm. Willis.²

At the time Washington marched through Acquackanonk, he ordered the bridge destroyed to delay the British and John H. Post was deputized as one of the party to destroy it. John H. Post was at the Battle of Monmouth.

They lived in the Ponds area; then to Saddle River; then to Essex Co. (now Passaic Co.), where they lived at Acquackanonk or Passaic.

In John H. Post's Rev War Pension (No. W866) application declaration 1 Oct. 1832 Bergen County Court of Common Pleas, he told of his military service as a Private and Corporal in the NJ Militia under Lts. Cornelius Stagg, Ryer Ryerson and Demarest; and Ensign James Bogert. He stated that he was age 72 and was a resident of Acquackanonk, Essex Co., NJ. He testified that he was born in that part of Saddle River now called the Township of Franklin in County of Bergen on 10 April 1760. He claims that his age is "in the book of Aquackonk in the county of Essex," that he resided in the county of Bergen until 1802 and then in County of Essex until the present. He stated that Abraham Van Houten was taken prisoner and later became the Capt. of their company. He volunteered for service with Abraham Van Houten, Paul Van Houten and Daniel Smith. He was in the service with his brother-in-law John Ackerman. He saw James Kent, the husband of Catherine Kent, in the service. In another declaration made when he was 84, he admits to his mind not being totally clear and [not] able to recall everything, he mentions that when he served under Capt. Willis, a Ryer Ryerson was a lieutenant.²

Elizabeth made her (Rev. War Pension) declaration 14 Aug 1848, when she was 89 years old, widow of John H. Post, and a resident of Acquackanonk, Essex Co., NJ and was not able to be in the court because of "her age and bodily infirmity." She stated that John H. Post d. 7 March 1847 and that she was married June 1780 by Rev. Benjamin Vanderlinda at the home of her late brother-in-law Jacob Van Houten, near the Ponds Church, Franklin Twp., Bergen Co., NJ. Children of John H. Post and Elizabeth Ackerman who testified: Syntie, b. 26 March 1780, [testified] as Syntie Fleming, age 71, on 31 March 1851; Catriena, b. 26 Jan 1782, [testified] as Catriena Lydecker, age 69, on 1 April 1851; Tryntie?²

However, attached to this declaration are statements and one of them reads "Minister of Ponds Church states that in church records are: Syntie, daughter of Johannis Post and Elizabeth Post was gedoopt Mert 26 1780 and another daughter Catriena godoopt Janewarit 1782 on 26th day of month" The records say that she has no family record and that she has been unable to procure a copy of the Church record of said marriage on account of the loss or destruction of the marriage records of the Rev. Benjamin Vandelinden long deceased, but that annexed is the affidavit of Cornelius H. Post the brother of her late husband, who is the only person now living who was present at their Marriage and the certificate of the Rev. Wilhelmus Elting of the Dutch Reformed Church at Paramus, Bergen County and State aforesaid, as to the loss of the said Marriage records.³

Wilhelmus Eltinge, of Saddle River, John Post, of Essex Co., NJ, Andrew Parsons of Essex Co., NJ, Albert G. Lydecker, age 63, of Franklin Township, Bergen Co., NJ as of 1 April 1851; Ralph B. Romaine, age 79, as of 1 April 1851, Rev. Barnabas Collins, pastor of the Ponds Ref Dutch Church, Rev. John H. Duryea, pastor of the 2nd Dutch Church at Manchester, Passaic Co., NJ, Ebenezer Wiggins, pastor of the 1st Dutch Church at Paterson, Passaic Co., NJ; Judge Thomas Gould. All testifying as fellow soldiers in the Revolution, Ralph/Rulef Van Houten, age 81, Thomas Hammons, age 82, both of Bergen County, NJ on 31 Oct 1832; Abraham Garrison, age 71, of Bergen Co., NJ on 20 July 1833.²

Cornelius H. Post says that some time during the Revolution his brother married Elizabeth Ackerman in a private dwelling at a place called the Ponds. Cornelius Post was then 19-20 years old. Cornelius H. Post made this statement in Michigan, Wayne County.¹

John C. Post served as a Private in the NJ Militia in the Revolutionary War. He testified that he entered the service in Apr 1776, served under Lt. Caterlin and Ensign Samuel Van Bricke. He also testified: "I shot the British Light-horseman who shot our sentry, piloted Gen.Wayne to what was called the Negro Fort, near Bulls Ferry. The Refugees and Tories had possession of Fort Lee and the Negroes of the Block House,The British had possession of the lower part of Bergen Co., NJ"¹

On 28 May 1789 (recorded 14 December 1805, Bergen Co. W:343) Andries Cadmus, Cornelius Cadmus, Peter Garrison, husband of the late Prescilla, his wife, dau. of John Cadmus, deceased; Gertje Cadmus, Cornelia Post (wife of John Post), all heirs of the late John Cadmus of Saddle River Township, who died intestate, with the consent of their mother, Fytje Cadmus, widow of later John Cadmus, deceased, conveyed to Jacob Ackerman and Aegje, his wife, daughter of the aforesaid John Cadmus, for 5 shillings, 39-2/4 acres and 26 poles, in the Patten of Slatterdam in the Township of Saddle River, being part of one of the small Lots of the Patten aforesaid otherwise called Jaqueses Patent of which John Cadmus aforesaid in his lifetime was possessed, being lot no. 2, beginning at land of Dirk Vreeland at corner of Peter Garrison; mentioned line of Abraham Cadmus. Signed by Andrew Cadmus, Cornelius Cadmus (his mark), Peter Gerretse, Geertye Cadmus (her mark), Fytje Cadmus (her mark), Cornelis Post, John C. Post, Prinha Cadmus, Jannetye Cadmus (her mark). Witnessed by Cornelius T. Van Houten, David Marinus.⁴

John C. Post of the Township of Saddle River, and Cornelia, his wife, and Jacob Ackerman of same place and Aeghea, his wife, on 1 January 1803 (Bergen County Deeds R:12) conveyed to Peter Hopper of the Township of Saddle River for \$3750 a parcel, tract or lot in Small Lots in the Patent of Slauterdam...being part of a lot of land which was lawfully seized and possessed by John Codmus in his lifetime. Beginning at a Road dividing the Small Lots and the big lots at the SW corner of land of Abraham Codmus thence running along line of said Codmus; lot of land sold by heirs of John Codmus to John Van Bussum; [land of] Dirck Vreeland. 119 acres more or less according to a survey made in 1789.⁴

He served as a Private in the New Jersey Militia in the Revolutionary War. He applied for a Revolutionary War Soldiers Pension 21 Oct 1832 Bergen County Court of Common Pleas (no. W121). He stated that he was aged 71, a resident of Franklin Twp., Bergen County, NJ and had been born 24 June 1761 in Saddle River Township, Bergen Co., NJ. He testified

that he guarded the prisoners Cole and Welcher/Wilshire just before they were executed. He served under Lt. Post. He was one of a party that took as prisoners, Jacob Smith and Peter Zabriskie, two Tories, for trading with the British. He knew the following men who could testify to his war service: Aaron Garrison, Thomas Hammond, and Samuel Romine.⁴

John P. Post, 79, military pensioner, was listed in the 1840 Federal Census, living with his son John J. Post and family, in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ. There was no female of his wife Catrintje's age listed living with the same family in 1840.

His widow (M. Catrena, dau. of Jacobus Koch) applied for a pension 27 May 1844 in New York City Marine Court testifying that she was 83, of New York City, widow of John P. Post who died 27 Oct 1843. She stated she was married 27 Feb 1782. Her children with John P. Post were: Wese?, b. 4 Dec 1783; John J., b. 31 Jan 1787 (of Bergen Co., NJ on 3 March 1845); Peter J., age 65? (of Passaic Co., NJ on 25 May 1844); Samuel, age 52 (of Passaic Co., NJ on 25 May 1844). In a hand written letter, in Dutch, is the following written by Jacobus Koch/Kogh, father of Catherine Koch/Kogh Post: "Feb 17, 1757, I Jacobus Koch, living at Slotterdam, married Maria Laerne [Laroe] born Remports [Ramapo]. I was born Nassouw, Delbroburgh, Stater of Haier. [children:] Casparus Koch, b. 25 June 1758; Catherine Koch, b. 15 May 1761, m. 27 Feb 1782 Johannes Post; Jacobus Koch, b. 16 April 1764." Others mentioned in the pension papers were: John Springsteen, ahe 69, of NYC on 27 May 1844; Rev. Zacariah H. Cooper, Samuel Romaine, both of Franklin Twp., Bergen Co., NJ; Thomas Hammond, Aaron Garrison. Testifying as fellow soldiers in the Revolution: John C. Post, 71, of New Barbadoes, Bergen Co., NJ, Abraham Garrison, age 70 ("guarded prisoners at the Ponds Church"), both as of 31 Oct 1832; Jacob Tuers/Turse, age 78, of Saddle River Twp., Bergen Co., NJ (on 21 Aug 1833). Also included in the pension file are the pension papers of John C. and Cornelia (Cadmus) Post.⁴

The following transactions may refer to this John P. Post: On 7 December 1796 (recorded 27 Feb 1805, Bergen Co. U:38) Jonas Halsted of the Township of Franklin, blacksmith, conveyed to Peter Lozier of the same place, for £400, 56 acres strict measure [surveyed 1768] in the Ramapough Tract, beginning SE corner Corines Bartolf. Mentioned land of John P. Post. Signed by Jonas Halstead. Witnessed by James Christie, Jonathan Traphagen.⁶

On 1 May 1807 (recorded 13 May 1807, Bergen Co. Z:394) Alexander James of the Township of New Barbadoes, conveyed to John P. Post of the Township of Franklin, for \$1,200., 15 acres more or less in the Township of Saddle River, being lot Alexander James purchased of Isaac Van Riper. Bounded W by land now or late of Christian A. Zabriskie and Passaic River; N by land now or late of Christian A. Zabriskie; E by said Christian A. Zabriskie and Aury Bush; S by Cornelius Post, Junr. Signed by Alexander James. Witnessed by Henry Van Dalsem, Garret C. Post.⁶

On 15 January 1810 (recorded 10 June 1813, Bergen Co. I2-70) John P. Post and Catherine, his wife, of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to Henry Van Houten of the Township of Saddle River, for \$650., 11 acres more or less in the Township of Saddle River. Signed by John P. Post, Catharine Post (her mark). Witnessed by Richard Outwater, Wm. Vn. Leusden, James J. Post.⁶

Catherine died 7 Sep 1844 while on a visit to her sons in NYC.

Three sons survived her; her son, John J. Post of Bergen County, NJ was administrator of the widow's estate. Other surviving sons were Peter J. Post, of NYC and aged 55 in 1844; and Samuel Post, of NYC and aged 52 in 1844.

John Post and his wife Annatje Post became members in full communion of the Reformed Dutch Church of Saddle River when the Congregation of Saddle River and Paramus was divided, July 1812.

It is believed that John Post came to Upper Canada with his father and mother about the year 1795. While their exact date of arrival is unknown, it is presumed they did not come with the original Loyalists on 6 June 1784 as they are not listed on the official Loyalist Settlers List. When the Post family came to Upper Canada, they settled in Fredericksburgh Township, Midland District, in what is now known as Lennox and Addington County, Ontario.

On 23 May 1797 in Fredericksburgh Township, John Post as "the son of Frederick Post, Late Private Soldier in Colonel Bayards Regiment of His Majesty's Forces in New York", petitioned for a grant of land of 200 acres. John Post states in his petition that he "has been resident in his Majesty's Dominions since the year 1779". It is impossible to know how to take this statement. John Post had a younger sister born in 1788 in Paramus, New Jersey, and the name of Frederick Post appears on Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ Tax Rateable lists from 1789-1794, so the family was probably still there. Was John in New York City, which was British held until about 1783?

On May 12, 1798, Eunice Alger Post also petitioned for land as the daughter of a United Empire Loyalist and was granted 200 acres in Alnwick Township, Northumberland County on 18 May 1807.

Several real estate transactions involving John Post, with land land bought and sold took place between 1797 and 1847. On 6 March 1850, Jacob Post sold a parcel of land to Henry Miller and moves to Huntingdon Township, Hastings County, Ontario.

In 1822, John Post, aged 51, served in the Prince Edward County Militia along with his two eldest sons, Frederick, aged 22 and William, aged 19.

The 1861 Census for Ameliasburgh Township, shows John Post, aged 90 years, born in the United States, of Baptist faith, Yeoman, married and living in a one and a half storey frame house. Also listed are his wife Eunice, aged 80, born in the United States, son Abraham, aged 36, Catherine his wife, aged 33, and children Nathan, aged 12, Walter, aged 10, Ann E., aged 7 and William L., aged 5. They are all born in Ontario and are of Wesleyan Methodist faith.

In his will, he , he leaves his property, being the West half of Lot #66, Concession I, Ameliasburgh Township, to his wife Eunice until her death and then to his youngest son Abraham. He stated that his "other sons have no right to expect any bequest or property from me because each of them received a Deed of a farm free and clear of all incumbrances". To his eldest daughter Mary Gerow he bequeths "the sum of twenty pounds payable in neat stock, household furniture, exclusive of thirty pounds she has had". To his second daughter Sarah Way, he bequeths "the sum of twenty-four pounds payable in neat stock household furniture exclusive of twenty-six pounds she has had". Appointed executors are wife Eunice Post, son Abraham Post and grandson Daniel F. Gerow. The Will was registered on 15 June 1863.

John J. Post, 40-50, was head of a household of 13, including [his father] Rev. War pensioner John P. Post, 79, in Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ in the 1840 Federal Census. Listed living in the household were one male 5-10, one male 10-15, 2 males 15-20, 2 males 20-30, one male 30-40, one male 40-50, one male 70-80, one female 5-10, one female 15-20, one female 40-50, and one black male 24-36.

John & Mary were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Franklin Township, with their children James, 28; Hester, 25; Zachariah, 23; and Catherine, 18. Living with them at the time of the 1850 census was John Bartrim, 47; Hagar Colfax, 9;

John J. Post's will was dated 30 Oct 1865, probated 11 June 1866, he being of Franklin Township, Bergen County, NJ. In it he mentions his wife Mary Post, and children Catharine, Hester, Zachariah, James, and John Jr. He also mentioned brother-in-law John Bartrim, living in his household. Executors were John Post Jr., James Post, and Zachariah K. Post. Witnesses were Peter J. Banta and Garret I. Demarest.

According to his will, his property included a mill. He mentioned: "To son James part of my farm where I now reside to middle of road leading from Ponds Church to Ramapo by lands of Peter S. Demarest. From thence running along his lands north of the fence which runs between burying ground and orchard, thence along fence westerly to end of said fence near the mill, thence northerly and parallel with road leading from Pompton to the fence at the dwelling house lately occupied by my son James." Sons John James and Zachariah to have privileges of barn. mill. He also mentioned wife Mary, and daughters Catherine and Hester. Son John was to receive lot and farm where he resides also lot of woodland formerly owned by Anthony Batrim, deceased, lying in Ponds woods adjoining the lands of Peter S. Demarest, Abraham Stevens, land formerly of Samuel Demarest, deceased; also house and lot of Anthony Bartrim, dec'd at the corner of the road leading from Pompton to Ramapo opposite Ponds Church. Also along lands of Aaron Doty. Lands purchased of Jacob Garrison, Jr., adjoining lands of Aaron Doty to Ramapo River, also lands bought of Corines Quackenbush, know as Corinus Lot, 30 acres. Mentions lands of Henry I. and John H. Speer.¹

An Inventory of Goods of John Post, dated 29 March 1866, and filed 5 April 1866, made by executors Jacob Post and Levi Hopper, with Peter H. He was a local Justice of the Peace (appointed 1813) in or near Upper Saddle River and was known locally as "Squire Post." He was also a Judge of Common Pleas for Bergen County. He owned a large farm on West Saddle River Road in Upper Saddle River which was part of the 330-acre tract conveyed from Isaias and Leah Valleau to Albert Terhune in 1746.

He owned a sawmill, a general store, an inn and a tavern on West Saddle River Road. He also operated a cider mill, tannery, grocery, distillery and chair turning mill.

Joseph Post, with his wife Adaline sold for \$2 on 30 May 1842, the land for the Saddle River Methodist Church (Little Zion).

He may be the same Joseph Post, Esq., who, according to Martha Ann Zabriskie's diary, married (perhaps for the second time) 27 Dec 1847. Perhaps this marriage was to Jane H.

His second wife may be the "Ally" who prob. d. about 7 May 1847, according to an entry in Martha Ann Zabriskie's Memorandum Book.

He and Jane H. are listed in the 1850 Federal Census, Hohokus Twp. Living with them are Isaac A. Shurte, 49; Hannah Shurte, 54; Catharine Shurte, 13; and Isaac Shurte, 19.
