The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Lodewyck Corneliszen came from Amsterdam, Holland, not later than 1650. The earliest references to him are under dates of January 1, and April 2, 1651, when his name appears as witness to baptisms in New Amsterdam.²

Cornelis Melyn was preparing to return to New Netherland and on 18 May 1650 bought the ship New Netherlands Fortune, (Nieu Nederlants Fortuyn) which he equipped under the leadership of Captain Post. The ship sailed on 30 Jun 1650. Both Adriaen And Lodewyck Post were on this ship. No relationship has been proven, Adriaen from The Hague, Lodewyck from Amsterdam.⁴

Lodewyck Pos(t) was the progenitor of the Post Families of Raritan. He remained in Manhattan Island when Adrian went to Staten Island.⁴

Lodewyck Post was a very well known citizen of New Amsterdam, his name often appearing on the public records. His name first appears in public records Sept. 1, 1653. On Feb 7, 1656, as a tavern-keeper, he requests permission "to sell wine and beer by the small measure." On April 30, 1672 he is mentioned as Provoost Marshall of the City.

The early residence of Lodewyck Post is described as being where what would now be the north side of Pearl Street, between Old Slip and Broad Street, then called the "Water Side."¹

Lodewyck Corneliszen and Agnietje Bonens witnessed the baptism 17 July 1661 NYC Ref Ch, of Niesje, dau. of Corn. Hendrickszen & Styntie Harmens.

Agnietje Boons, was, along with Hendrick Obee, a witness to the baptism 1 Feb 1664 NYC Ref Ch, of Jeuriaen, son of Arent Juriaenszen & Belitie Lodowycks.

Agniet Lodovÿcksz, along with Steven Courtszen, witnessed the baptism 14 Jan 1665 NYC Ref Ch, of Maria, dau. of Jan Adamszen & Geertie Dircks

Decision: Petitioner's request is granted. July 4, 1665.--Lodowyck Pos vs. Arent Lautsman. Pltf. complaining as father of Beletje Lodowyck, maketh known the unchristian and insufferable treatment and behaviour of deft, towards said Beletje, deft's lawful wife, exhibiting divers attestations, etc., and demanding that deft, shall be condemned in such penalty as the Magistrates may deem proper, and further that his said daughter Beletje Jacobsen be not constrained to return again to her husband against her will. Deft. answering denies, that he has improperly treated his wife, but says, they had some differences, whereof said Lodowek Pos and his wife were the principal causes, exhibiting a declaration to that effect, requesting that his wife be obliged again to return to him and he promising to live henceforth with her as man and wife ought to do. Pltf. replying says, that he has now been three times before the Court concerning improper treatment of his daughter by the deft., who each time promised amendment, but never kept his promise; therefore he persists in his suit. The Deputy Mayor and Aldermen having heard the debates of parties on both sides--postpone the decision of the Court to next Court day and meanwhile their Worships shall authorize some honorable and fitting person to reconcile, if possible, the parties to love and friendship--if not, to report. July 11, 1665--Arent Lautsman communicates by petition in substance, that he and his wife were, pursuant to order of

July 4, with Rev. Ministers De Johannes Megapolensis and De Samuel Driesius, but that his wife's parents would not come to any agreement nor listen or submit to the advice of the Ministers. He requests therefore, that the Court would please to order his wife to return to him, as he no longer could live without a wife, again promising to live with her as an honest man ought to do. Whereupon Arent's wife appearing, assisted by her father, and the request having been read to her, she was asked, if for this time she would not go with her husband on the promise of amendment given by him; she answers: No. as he had already repeatedly promised the same, but never kept it. The Mayor and Aldermen, -- --, declare, they had contributed all in their power, as well through the clergymen as otherwise, to reconcile the parties in love and friendship, but all in vain, and whereas by divers declarations it is sufficiently apparent, that the parents, Lodowyck Pos and his wife, are the chief and principal cause of the trouble, which has arisen between the parties, they therefore order the said Lodowyck Pos not to detain the above named Beletje, wife of Arent Lautsman, in his house beyond 14 days, within which time parties shall have to be reconciled to each other or in default thereof they must again make joint application to the Court; and further said Arent Lautsman is hereby notified, that if again any complaints should be made of his improper behaviour, then he shall be delivered over to the Governor General for punishment, whether by separation from bed and board, imprisonment or otherwise, as his Honour shall deem proper as an example to other evil householders.

July 25, 1665.--The petition of Arent Lautsman was read and considered, making complaint, that his wife still evinces her unwillingness, contrary to the last judgment of the 11th inst., to come home to him; also that his father-in-law, Lod. Pos, is entertaining her contrary to said judgment, and requesting the Court to order and constrain the said Pos not to entertain his wife any longer and order her to return home to the petitioner; the Mayor and Aldermen direct, that the matter be placed in the hands of the jury. The aforesaid judgment of the 11th together with the other papers having been considered by the jury, they decide that Beletje Lodowycks, wife of said Lautsman, shall return to her husband and that Lodowyck Pos shall no longer harbour her without the consent of her husband, or allow others to harbour her, and he is to pay costs in this case. The Court approves the jury's verdict.

At the time of the (2) m., he was a widower, living Acquackanonk; she a widow, living at Hackensack.

A son of Pieter Post by his wife Catryntje, was buried 3 Nov 1731 from Bergen Ref Ch.²

It may be this Peter Post who was one of the executors named in the will of John Hibon of New York, carpenter, dated 5 Oct 1727, probated 25 Nov 1727. The executors named were friends Peter Post, of Hoboken, New Jersey; and Johannes Hyer, of New York, cooper.¹

It was probably this Peter Post who bought by deeds of lease and release, on 3-4 May 1736 from Richard Ashfield of New York, a tract of 428 acres “at Wanuch [Wanaque] adjoining Cornelius and Jacobus Blinkerhoff on the Paquannack, Pomtan and Packhack rivers.” He established a grist and saw mill soon after his settlement, which was carried on by his son Peter Post. Nelson called him the progenitor of the Pompton and West Milford Posts.

Pieter Post, Annaatje Post [Pieter’s second wife?] witnessed the baptism 1738 Pompton Plains Ref Ch of Catharine, dau. of Hendrick V. der Coek & Catharina Post. Pieter Post, Annaatje Post, witnessed the baptism 15 Dec 1745 Pompton Plains Ref Ch, of Johannes, son of Hendrick Van der Koeck & Catharina Post.

By his will, dated 3 December 1757, proved 25 April 1783, it appears Peter had married a second time. His will is quoted in full in Nelson’s *The History of the City of Paterson...*, p. 137. In it he mentions wife, Johana; three children: eldest son Aderyaen Post, son Peter Post; son Garret Post; and (grandchildren?): Aderyain Post, Peter Post, Catrina Cool and grandchild Catrina Post. He also mentions his two daughters and grandchild: Catrina Cool, Mary Mead and Catrina Post (child of deceased daughter Johana). He names sons Aderyaen Post, Peter Post, and Gerret Post executors. Witnessed by Jacobus Barguo, George Ruyerse, Pyeter Berry.

He was probably the Peter Post who was a Major in the Revolution.

In the marriage record they are "Peter Post, y.m., born at Hoboken, living at Pomtan, and Elizabeth Van Voorheese, y.d., born at Wyckoff, living at same place."

Peter succeeded his father in carrying on the grist and saw mills at Pompton.

Peter's lengthy will was dated 6 Feb 1776, probated 29 March 1781. It is quoted in full in Nelson, *The History of the City of Paterson...*, p. 140. In his will, Peter Post, Senr. of Pompton, he mentions his wife Elizabeth, all his estate real and personal while she remains his widow; his sons Peter and Adrian, to share land bequested by father; son Henry to have three acres of land out of son Adrian's part, and Peter and Adrian (both have wives, per will) are to build a good stone house with one comfortable room and a cellar under same for their brother Henry with his help; son John to have Large Dutch Bible; to six daughters, Catherine Post, Abigail Post, Elizabeth Post, Anatie Post, Mary Post, and Margaret Post, £75 each to be paid out of an estate made to his wife by his father-in-law's last will & testament, lying and being at Wyckoff, and if it does not cover that amount the remainder to be paid from a note due from Gelyn Doremus. He also mentions his brother Garrit.

They were possibly the "Pitter Poss and elizabeth" who wit. bp. 14 April 1772 Ramapo Lutheran Church, of Pitter Redner, son of Johannes Redner and Nancy.¹

Peter Post was listed in the 1850 Federal Census, of Passaic County (p. 269). The 1861 Hopkins Corey Map shows a building belonging to Peter Post, south of the Cannon Ball Trail above present-day (manmade) Lake Vreeland. The 1876 Walker's Atlas (p. 116) shows the same location of the building. In both maps, the Post building is the westernmost of the sites identified along Midvale Mountain Road. The 1870 Federal Census (Bergen County) lists Peter H. Post, age 35, farm laborer, with his wife Mary, age 25, and a one-year-old son Isaac.

In the marriage record, they were: Willem Post, young man from N. York, with Aaltje Teunis Couvert, young lady, both residing in N. York, from which place they brought with them a certificate to the effect that their marriage proposal took place without objection. In the NYC Ref Ch record of their banns and marriage they were: Willem Pos, j.m. Van N. Yorke, en Aeltje Theunis Van Couverden, j.d. Van N. Breuckelen, beyde woonende tot N. Yorke.

They lived at Mashpate Kills (Maspat Kills), Newtown, Long Island, NY. He took the oath of allegiance at Brooklyn as a native on 26 Sep 1687. He also is recorded as a member of the New York Dutch Church 29 Aug 1678 (his wife recorded on 4 Dec 1679). He removed to Bedford (Brooklyn) on 2 March 1687.¹

The family of William Post appears in the census of Hempstead, L.I. in 1698. Listed with him are two Christian names illegible, but doubtless intended for the wife Aeltje and eldest son William, plus Ananet, Barbary, Asher, Bereche and Elizabeth.

On 26 April 1697, William Post and wife Altie of Madnan's Neck deeded Hendrick Rycker land in Bedford in Brooklyn bounded by that of Thomas Lambertse, widow Jorisse and Jacobus Vandewater; also house and lot, etc. "now in possession of Benjamin Vandewater." Both signed, she by mark.²

His will was dated 31 Oct 1702, probated 21 May 1703 at Jamaica, L.I. (Liber A, p. 161). In it he names his wife "Allche," two sons and six daughters by name (omitting Agnietje).¹

Wilhelmus Post was the ancestor of the Hunterdon and Somerset County, NJ Posts, various of his children moving to "the Raritans" soon after his death.¹
