The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

According to Marjorie Smeltzer-Stevenot, John Pulisfelt was one of the earliest settlers in Bergen County. He was of German origin, from Darmstadt.

The Pulis family should not be confused with Powles, a Dutch family name.

The Pulis ancestors may have come from Bielefeld, in Germany.

BELLIS.--William Bellesfelt came from Neuwied, Germany, prior to 1730, when he was naturalized in New Jersey. Sons were Adam, Johann William, Peter and Johannes. The Bellis families descend from them. --- *Somerset County Historical Quarterly*, Vol. V, p. 121

On 7 April 1804 (recorded 12 June 1804, Bergen Co S:334) James Pulisfelt and Lath, his wife, and Cornelius Pulisfelt and Jane, his wife, of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to Abraham Pulisfelt of same place, for \$500, 67-30/100 acres more or less, in Franklin Township, part of Lot No. 63 in Ramapough patten. Signed by James H. Pulis, Lath Pulis (her mark), Cornelius Pulis, Jane Pulis (her mark). Witnessed by Abraham Hopper.¹

On 7 April 1804 (recorded 12 June 1804, Bergen Co. S:336) Cornelius Pulisfelt and Jane, his wife, and Abraham Pulisfelt and Helena, his wife, conveyed to James Pulisfelt, all of the Township of Franklin, for \$500, 67-30/100 acres more or less, in the Township of Franklin, being part of Lot No. 62 in the Ramapough patten. Mentioned land released to Abraham Pulisfelt. Signed by Cornelius Pulis (his mark), Abraham Pulis, Helena Pulis (her mark). Witnessed by Abraham Hopper.¹

On 12 December 1812 (recorded 7 January 1813, Bergen Co. H2:230) Jacob Winter of the Township of Franklin, and Antye, his wife, conveyed to Abraham Ackerson of the same place, for \$687.50, two lots in the Township of Franklin, part of lot no. 129 in Ramapough tract: (1) 10 acres more or less. (2) 10 acres, 2 rods, 17 perches; land of late Peter Hammon, deceased; Garret Hopper; John Eckhart; Cornelius Pulisfelt. Signed by Jacob Winter (his mark), Antye Winter (her mark). Witnessed by Jacob Young, Abraham H. Pulis.¹

At the time of their marriage, they were both living at Masonicus. (Ackerman/Goff Zion Luth records say both of Saddle River.)

Abraham Pulis, 34, farmer, and Margaret Pulis, 30, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with them were: David H., 8; Mary J., 6; and John, 3.

Abm. Pulis, 45, farmer, and Margaret, 40, his wife, were listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township, Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with them were: David, 19, farmer; Mary J., 17; John J., 14; and Margt. A., 9.

The house of A.D. Pulis is shown on the 1861 Hopkins-Corey Map (where it appears to be located in the area of the west side of East Crescent Avenue in the Ramsey-Allendale vicinity). According to Kay Paulsen, They lived in a house just north of 209 E. Crescent Avenue. The house was shown, labelled "Pulis" on the 1876 Walker's Atlas of Bergen County. All that remained of the house in 1992 was a laid-up stone well close to Crescent Avenue.

She was listed in the 1870 Federal Census, living with her daughter, New Jersey, Bergen Co., Hohokus Township, Ramseys P.O., p. 18, enumerated 16 June 1870, Dwelling 123, Family 134 -- Pulis, Margaret, 50, Keeping House, value real estate \$1400, value personal estate \$150. b. NJ; Gamble, Jas., 21, Farm Laborer, value real estate \$2000, b. NY; [Gamble], Margaret, 19, b. NJ.

Margaret Pulis, 83, was listed in the 1900 Federal Census, living with her daughter & son-in-Law James & Margaret Gamble) in Allendale, Bergen Co., NJ.

Adam Bellesfelt was naturalized in New Jersey by act dated 8 Dec 1744. He was an early member of the 1st Presbyterian Church of Amwell, NJ.

This will of Adam Belliss Sr. of Amwell Twp, was dated 7 March 1761, probated 6 April 1761 (Hunterdon Cp. Will #517J). The old Family Bible of Johann Adam Böllesfeldt has survived to shed more detail on his branch of the family.

There was a deed dated 17 January 1817 where Albert and two of his brothers, and their wives, deeded property to a John Quackenbush. It was common practice to list wives to the first parties in these documents, but none was listed for Albert.¹

Albert Pulis joined the Wyckoff Ref Ch 12 May 1821, and his wife, Margaret Winter, joined the same church 21 Nov 1825.

In Bergen County Deeds, Book C3, page 442, there is an indenture dated 12 April 1823, where William H. Pulis deeded over 40 acres for \$5.00 to Albert W. Pulis. The description is summarized as beginning in the northwest corner of the lot... The boundaries were given as bounded on the: north by William W. Pulis; on the east by Henry Winter; on the south by Conrad Sturr, and on the west by William H. Pulis. This amounted to 44.23 acres, per map dated 12 March 1823. The deed was recorded 10 February 1830.¹

In another indenture dated 18 June 1824, recorded 10 Feb 1830 (Book C3, page 443), Jacob Pulis, and his wife Mary; William Pulis, and his wife Catherine; Henry W. Pulis, and his wife Margaret; all of Franklin, deeded a parcel to Albert Pulis for \$5.00. The parcel amounted to 49.63 acres and was described as part of Lot 51. The property was described as beginning in the southeast corner of the lot in line with Conraet Stur. This survey was also based on the 12 March 1823 map. The property also included a small wood lot beginning in the southeast corner of William W. Pulis and abutted the land of Henry H. Pulis.¹

Albert resided on the west side of present day Pulis Avenue in Franklin Lakes borough, Bergen Co., NJ. This was a short distance north of the Campgaw depot on the Susquehanna Railroad at 322 Pulis Avenue and is listed in the National Register of Historic Places, #83001544, 9 January 1983.¹

The 1876 Bergen Atlas (Franklin Township) shows Albert as Alb Pulis with the property of J.W. Pulis on his north. There were other Pulis members in the area and the map shows a Samuel Pulis at the northwest corner of the crossing of the New Jersey Midland Railway (now the NYS&W). Therefore, when the railroad was put through the right-of-way included land owned by the Pulis families.¹

Albert joined the Wyckoff Reformed Church on 12 May 1821, with his wife joining 21 November 1825. Most likely his children were baptized at this church.¹

Living with Albert, 57, and Margaret, 52, at the time of the 1850 census, was Albert Blauvelt, 13.

Albert Pulis and wife, Margaret Winter, were members of the Wyckoff Ref Ch on 1 April 1865, when a membership list for the church was made.

Albert was a retired farmer in the 1870 census, at which time he and Margaret were living with James H. Blauvelt and Rachel Lake and their family.

The will of Albert Pulis was dated 28 Mar 1849 and probated 13 Oct 1873. It was witnessed by James W. Pulis, Jacob W. Pulis, and William W. Pulis. In it he mentioned wife Margaret, and four daughters, Catherine, Elizabeth, Mary Ann, and Margaret.

Two sons named Andreas Böllesfeldt were born to Wynandt Böllesfeldt; both lived to adulthood. This naming custom was not unusual for the time and place.

Christian Pulis, prob. son of Johannes Pulis, was a Tory; his 100-acre property, inherited from his father, Johannes, was confiscated in 1779 and sold in 1784 to Peter Ward, Sr.

Christian Pulis, along with Henry Ridner and Peter Redner, were members of the 4th Battalion of New Jersey Loyalists. On 26 January 1779 an inquisition in the Bergen County Court of Common Pleas Christian Pulissalt, living in Franklin Twp., was accused and found guilty of treasonable practices. His 100 acres, including his home at what is now 175 Pulis Avenue, was confiscated.⁴

On 2 July 1784, Cornelius Haring, commissioner, of Bergen Co., conveyed to Peter Ward of Saddle River Precinct, for £800, 100 acres; mentioned corner to Jacobus Bogart and Jacobus Pulisfelt; seized from Christian Pulisfelt, late of Franklin Township, for joining the army of the King. Signed by Cornelius Haring. Witnessed by John Neafie, Petrus Haring.³

In February 1798, Coenraad Pulis (ancestor of the Pulis family in Wayne Co., PA) moved from NJ, along with Richard Nelson (Elizabeth's brother?), and purchased land in the Dyberry Creek area before it became a Township (1805). Coenraad and Richard Nelson had adjacent farms. Coenraad's farm was below the Day's Bridge on the Dyberry Creek ("Big Eddy"); much later was a sand and gravel pit.¹

He was a member of the Baptist Ch, Bethany, PA when it first organized in 1817.¹

Coenraad Pulis left a will (Wayne Co. Wills Book 1, File 394, p. 409) naming his two brothers [sons?] Ephraim and Aaron executors of his estate. In his will, he listed a claim against his son-in-law Calvin Niles and a judgment for the amount of \$334.07 as unpaid and due his estate. Also two notes due from Aaron Pulis in the amount of \$145.34, along with two other notes due: one from Thomas Spangenberg and another on Jonathan D. Simpson.¹

In an indenture dated 18 June 1824, recorded 10 Feb 1830 (C3:443) Jacob Pulis, and his wife Mary; William Pulis. and his wife Catherine; Henry W. Upon her death to be divided among her children, share and share alike. Grandchildren are mentioned.²

He was probably the Peter P. Pulis, farmer, who signed in August 1894, the petition calling for a special election to create the Borough of Montvale.
