The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: "...I, Jacobus Quick, of New York, cordwainer, being very weak of body, I leave to my eldest son Jacobus, 5 shillings; I leave to each of my children which I have by my former wife, Mary, each £10 when of age. I leave to my wife Hyltie the silver tankard which was formerly her father Cornelius Clopper's, deceased, and came to her as part of her portion; to her for life, and then to my two children by her. I also leave her a feather bed and a negro woman All the rest of my estate I leave to my wife Hyltie, and my children Jacobus, Abigail, Mary, Cornelius, Luke, and Effie, "and to such children as I may yet procreate." My wife is to have her portion according to a certain marriage contract, made March 22, 1736, which is to be a rule for my executors. I appoint my wife and my cousins, John Roosevelt, Cornelius Clopper, and my cousin John Stephens, executors. Dated January 15, 1740/1. Witnesses, Thomas Besly, Peter Vergereau, John Tole. Proved, December 1, 1741. [NOTE.--The house of Jacobus Quick was on the corner of Pearl street and Hanover square, where the "Grace Building" now stands.--W. S. P.]

Theunis Thomasz Metselaer was the immigrant ancestor of the Quick families of NJ and NY. He m. Belitie Jacobs. In the various records he is found using 4 different last names -- his patronymic: Thomasz [and variations]; his surname: Quick; his place of origin: van Naarden; his trade name: Metselaer which means "mason" in Dutch.

On Nov 14, 1616, at Naarden, the marriage took place of Willem Willems, jonges, i.e., bachelor, from Scotland with Geertgen Jacobus Vleckeesteyn, j.d. from Naarden. This bride was undoubtedly a sister of the wife of Teunis Thomaszen (Quick).¹

Theunis Quick's sister, Belitje, was the wife of Gerrit Cosyn, Vrutje's maternal uncle.

Theunis Quick was a prosperous New York baker at a time when bakers were numbered in the top rank of professions, and were entitled to call themselves "gentlemen." Theunis Quick ordered an unusually large two-handled silver bowl, bearing the initials of Tuenis and Vrutje, from American silversmith Cornelius Kierstede. This bowl is today in the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York. The will of Theunis Quick is NY Liber 15, p. 137-40, at Queens College, Historic Documents Collection.

I make my sons executors. Dated April 25, 1739. Witnesses, John Van Gelder, John Sayre, Simon Johnson. Proved, November 1, 1743.

Thomas and Grietje moved from Rochester Twp, Ulster Co, NY, to Metshippekong, now Montague, NJ. About 1734/35 they became some of the first settlers of Upper Smithfield, PA. As the area expanded and became a village, the name changed to Milford, taking its name from the mill and convenient fording place. Thomas joined Captain John Van Etten's First Company on 12 Jan 1756. His agreed enlistment term was one month. In February 1756, his name was crossed from the agreement, with the note "Killed by Indians in February 1756." According to many accounts, he was a good friend to the Delaware Indians, but was set upon, robbed and murdered by a band of them one evening. Two of his sons managed to escape with their lives, one of whom, Tom, devoted his life to avenging the murder.

His estate administrators were William Ennis, his son -in-law; Benj. Shoemaker and James Hyndshaw, appointed 9 March 1756. (Northampton Co. PA Wills, #86).
