The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

At age nine Quidor moved with his family to New York City. He began his career as a painter of tavern signs, parade pen-nants, and fire engines. Such activities seem to have occupied him throughout his life, for his easel production was small and intermittent. In addition to Irving's works, Quidor used themes from the Bible, Miguel de Cervantes's Don Quixote, and James Fenimore Cooper's Leatherstocking Tales. His literary paintings were not illustrative; he took fanciful literature as a starting point for an intensely personal interpretation of subject and mood that frequently satirized the social customs and prejudices of his age. He also painted occasional landscapes of the Hudson River valley. Quidor achieved humour and power through dramatic gesture and exaggerated expression, so much so that it has been suggested that he painted from theatrical productions. He used colour and shadow to convey an often-foreboding sense of atmosphere. Although he received appreciative reviews from contemporary critics, his extraordinary and unrealistic style had little impact on his colleagues, and his work was coolly received at exhibitions. Twentieth-century art historians, however, have reclaimed him as one of the more intriguing and personal American artists of the 19th century.<sup>1</sup>

The literary genre painter John Quidor was an enigmatic figure whose career is extremely difficult to trace. Born in 1801 in Tappan, New Jersey, he moved to New York City in 1811. He was apprenticed to the portraitist John Wesley Jarvis from 1818 until 1822, when he successfully sued his teacher for not complying with the terms of his contract. Henry Inman was one of his fellow pupils. In 1823 Quidor began to speculate in Illinois real estate, and he lived there sporadically throughout his life.<sup>2</sup>

His name first appeared in the New York City Directory in 1827, where he was listed as a portrait painter. Probably unable to compete with Jarvis, Inman, and Morse in that field, Quidor specialized in genre scenes derived from the novels of James Fenimore Cooper and Washington Irving. He began to exhibit at the National Academy of Design in 1828, and he exhibited a painting at the Boston Athenaeum in 1833. Charles Loring Elliott and Thomas Bangs Thorpe became his pupils around 1830; the latter wrote the only contemporary description of Quidor's studio. In 1834 Dunlap mentioned that Quidor "had painted several fancy subjects with cleverness...His principal employment in New York, has been painting devices for fire engines, and works of that description." Between approximately 1843 and 1849 he is known to have painted a series of seven large Biblical scenes for a Methodist minister, now lost, in exchange for a farm in Adams County, Illinois, that he never obtained. He was not listed in the New York Directory between 1837 and 1850, and appears to have lived in the West during the late 1840s. Quidor returned to New York in 1851 and resumed painting. In 1868 he retired to his eldest daughter's home in Jersey City Heights, New Jersey, where he died in 1881.<sup>2</sup>

Although Quidor failed to achieve professional success during his lifetime, after John I. H. Baur's 1942 retrospective exhibition of his work at the Brooklyn Museum he came to be regarded as one of America's foremost literary painters. Because of his vivid, imaginative, and idiosyncratic interpretations, most historians regard Quidor as a "visionary eccentric" who was the direct precursor of Ryder and Blakelock. Quidor represented his literary subjects with great fidelity to their original texts. His work bears a strong similarity to seventeenth century Dutch or Flemish genre prints, and the British caricature tradition of Hogarth, Gillray, Cruikshank, and Rowlandson. Previously thought to have been a uniquely independent and innovative

painter, it is now known that Quidor drew heavily on engraved sources for the compositions of his early paintings, and that these influences were thoroughly assimilated into his later work. His mature style is characterized by its warm tonality, exuberant composition, and exaggerated linearism. During the middle 1850s his technique began to change, culminating in the thinly painted indistinct forms, restricted colors, and calligraphic brushwork typical of his late work. Peter Quidor lived at Hanover Square, New York City at the outbreak of the Revolutionary War. Upon learning that the British were in possession of New York City, he moved his family and his most prized possessions to Rockland (what is today Palisades, NY). It is said he left his dinner cooking over the fire. He never returned to claim his property.

Peter Quidor ("of Rockland, N.Y.") on 26 Jan 1799, NYC, was granted letters of administration on the estate of his brother: "George Quidor, cabinetmaker" who died intestate.

On 29 Sep 1801 (recorded 30 January 1807, Bergen Co. Z:183) Peter Quidore of Harington, conveyed to John Parsel of the same place, for \$1, two parcels: (1) at a place called Van Houten's Point; Wilhelmus Ferdon; edge of steep rocks; John Sneading's land, bounded N by John Sneding; S by Wilhelmus Ferdon; W by Peter Quidore; E by steep rocks and partly by Peter Quidore. (2) 10 acres beginning land of David Anderson; Johannes Ferdon; John Parsel. Signed by Peter Quidor. Witnessed by Ann Haring; John Davd. Haring.<sup>1</sup>

On 5 January 1804 (recorded 28 March 1804, Bergen Co. S:28) Walter J. Persil, yeoman, of Harington, and Annettye, his wife, conveyed to Peter Quidor Sr. of Rockland County, a parcel of 5 acres, 30 polls or perches, part of the Estate of Henry Ludlow of the State of New York, Gentleman, lately conveyed by his heirs to Thomas Ludlow, in New Jersey, shown in a map made 9 January 1802 by John D. Haring, being half of the Lot No. 18. Bounded N by Lot No. 17; E by Peter Quidor's land; S by Peter Quidor Jr.'s land; W by Lot No. 13. Signed by Walter Percil (his mark), Annettye Percil (her mark). Witnessed by Jacob Banta, Martin Higgins (his mark).<sup>1</sup>

On 13 April 1806 (recorded 4 June 1806, Bergen Co. Y:53) John J. Iserman and Catherine, his wife, Cornelius Eacker and Leah, his wife, Peter Mabye, and Abraham Mabye of the State of New York, conveyed to George Hagens, for \$150., 9-3/4 acres in Bergen County, lot no. 19 on map made by John D. Haring. Bounded N by lot no. 18; E by Peter Quidore; S by lot no. 20; W by lot no. 12. Signed by Peter C. Mabye; Abraham C. Mabye; Cornelius Ackerson; Leah Ackerson (her mark), John Iserman, Catherine Iserman. Witnessed by Benjamin Blacklidge, Abraham Cole (his mark).<sup>1</sup>
