The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Hugh Raynor was an early settler of Tanners Neck, Westhampton; he owned property west of Beaverdam River. Sarah was bur. in the plot of her son-in-law, Henry Jessup of Quogue.

His father, Jonathan, by his will, gave to Hugh and his male heirs a lot in Little "Onuck", and his home lot and buildings in Southampton.

Hugh was listed in the 1776 Census as Head of a Family in Southampton Town, with three males and five females. Hugh Raynor was listed in the 1800 U.S. Census for Southampton Town.

In his will, dated 12 Mar 1799 and proved 22Dec 1802, Hugh Raynor names wife, Sarah, sons, Stephen and Henry, the latter to have lands and a mill at Setuck River, daughters, Jane Jessup, Phoebe Foster and Abigail Tuthill, children of daughter, Prudence Pierson, and son, James, who is to have the residue of the estate. James sold his grandfather's homestead in Southampton to Elie Pelletreau in 1812 (Lib. B, 218, Suffolk County Wills, N.Y. Hist. Soc. Coll., 1894, p. 325).

In his will, he wrote: ...I, John Rayner, of Hempstead, considering the uncertainty of life. I leave to my wife Elizabeth 2 cows and a feather bed and furniture. To my daughter Levinah, wife of Samuel Smith, 1 cow. My executors are to sell as many cattle as may be necessary to pay debts, "and £20 over," which my executors are to put at interest for my grandson, John Charlock, "to pay for his schooling," and the principal to be paid him when 21. I leave to my wife the use of 1/2 my lands during widowhood and no longer. After her death or marriage my executors are to sell out lands to the value of £30, which I give to my son Daniel. All the rest of my lands and rights of land I leave to my sons, John, William, Willett, and Daniel. And they shall allow to my grandson, John Charlock, sufficient meat, drink, lodging, and apparell until he is 16, and then put him to a good trade. I leave to my wife the use of all movables during widowhood and then to my daughters Levinah, wife of Samuel Smith; Hannah, wife of Carman Rushmore; Rachel, wife of Dr. Charles Peters, and to my grandson, John Charlock. I make my son John and my friend, Timothy Clowes, executors. Dated June 8, 1763. Witnesses, Josiah Smith, Joseph Rayner, S. Clowes. Proved, December 12, 1763.

Records of the Town of Southampton, Vol. III, p. 545: "John Raynor sells to his brother, Josiah Raynor, of ye town of Line, County of New London, Conn., all my rights to any land in Southampton which I formerly bought of said Josiah Raynor, except the meadow which I sold to Joseph Taylor, lying in Shinnecock Litle Neck, price ten pounds, Sept. 1, 1717. Josiah then left Lyme and returned to Long Island."

Nathan Raynor resided in Westhampton. Jerusha was living at Westhampton, according to the 1790 Census. By his father's will, Nathan was to inherit "all his lands and meadows in Apocock Neck, one right of commonage in the West Purchase, from Apocock Neck West and half a lot in Cedar Swamp, Riverhead".

Nathan apparently left no will, but the testament of his widow, Jerusha, May 24 1801, proved August 26, 1809, names her daughters, Phoebe, Mehetable, Martha and her heirs (Lib. C, Suffolk County Wills).
