The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: I, Auries Ramson, of Jamaica, yeoman. I leave to my dearly beloved wife the whole and sole use of all my estate, moveable or immoveable to be wholly and intirely at her own use so long as my widow, and if she should marry again then she shall quit all my estate except one bed and furniture, which I give her and likewise £50 of good money paid by my Executors out of my estate after my said wife's marriage or decease. To my two sons, Rem and Auries Remson, all my lands whether woodlands, cleared land, or meadow, with the houses, barns, orchards, gardens, stables, and whatsoever thereon, and wheresoever it may be; Also my right in town lands and Commonages, equally divided between them, their heirs or assigns forever; and if either son die without lawful issue then his share to go to the survivor; my said two sons to pay the following legacies out of my real estate. To my daughter Aulche, the now wife of Stoffil Stymess, the sum of £100 within one year after my wife's second marriage or decease. To my daughter Elisabeth, the now wife of Peter Noorstrout, £50 within two years after my wife's second marriage or decease. To my daughter Maria, the now wife of Samuel Simmons, £100 within three years after my wife's marriage or decease. To my daughter Aunte £100 she being now the wife of John Bennet, within four years after my wife's marriage or decease. To my granddaughter Milly, the daughter of Anthony Demott, £20 within five years after my wife's marriage or decease, if she die before that time the £20 to be divided between my daughters, Aulche, Elisabeth, Maria and Ontye. My Executors likewise to pay to the children of my son John, deceased, £100 equally divided. Also to my grandchildren, the children of John Snedeker, £50 equally divided between them. My indoor moveables to be divided amongst all my children then living equally reserving to my wife an equal part in case she should be married; my outdoor moveables to my two sons, Rem and Auries equally. I make my trusty and well beloved sons, Rem and Auries, Executors. ††††††††††(Signed)††††††††††ARES†REMSEN.†Dated August 14, 1778. Witnesses, Nathaniel Box (of Jamaica, schoolmaster), Isaac Amberman, Jr., John Amberman. Proved, Queens County, February 27, 1786.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Jacob Remsen, at present of the City and State of New York, merchant, being sick and unwell in body. I leave to my eldest son, Rem Remson, ten shillings in lieu of all pretences of heirship. To my wife Catharina, all my estate, real and personal, during her life provided she remains my widow, hereby giving her full power to take possession of my estate and to do with it as she shall think most proper for the use and maintenance of my children respectively within age; but if she remarry I direct that all estate, as well real as personal, be divided into four equal shares by my executors, and that my wife take unto herself one fourth part in full bar of dower, and that the remaining three fourths be divided among my nine children in manner following: First I order that my younger children be brought up out of my whole estate until they severally attain the age of twenty-one or marriage. When the youngest is twenty-one then my estate to be divided as follows, to wit: one ninth each to my children, to my son William, to my daughter Dorothy Remsen, to my son Jacob, to my daughter Mary Remsen, to my daughter, Catharina Remsen, to my son John, to my son Daniel, to my daughter, Antie Remsen, and to my daughter, Sarah Remsen. In case my wife should prove pregnant at my decease such child or children as may be born after my decease shall have an equal part with the rest of my children and be educated in like manner. In case my wife should die before the youngest child shall attain the age of twenty-one then my executors shall take possession of all my estate and place it to the best advantage until the aforesaid division take place. I authorize them to advance from the monies to any of my children marrying or going into any business so large a sum as they in their discretion may judge expedient, provided it does not exceed the share of such child. I appoint my wife Catharina and my sons, William and Jacob, and my son-in-law, John Remsen, executors. Dated April 8, 1784. Witnesses, Henry Remsen, Everardus Brouwer, Abraham Kip, of New York City, shopkeeper. Proved, August 12, 1784. Confirmed, New York, January 11, 1785.

I make my loving wife executrix, and my friends, Abram Remsen, Jeremias Remsen, and Martin Schenk, executors. Dated September 26, 1776. Witnesses, John Alstyne, of the City of New York, blacksmith, Martin Schenk, Kings County, yeoman, Nicholas Couwenhoven. Proved, May 14, 1782.

Joris Remsen acquired in 1728 a tract of land in the Pond (Quaspeck) Patent in Orange (now Rockland) County, NY, in the vicinity of Rockland Lake.

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. Know all men by these presents that I, George Remsen, of the Pond, in the Precinct of Haverstraw, being weak in body, this 26 of March, 1744. I leave to my eldest son, Rem Remsen, my large Bible for his birthright. I also leave to my son, Rem Remsen, 10 acres of land at the south end of my home lot joining to the land of Johannes Muts. I leave to my three daughters, Anne, Ariete, and Lambatie, a certain lot of land lying at the Pond, at a place called Pines Ridge, adjoining to Demarest Kill, on the east side thereof, and south to the land of Alexander Weaver, and east and north by land of John Polhemus, deceased; Also a lot at the Pond at a place called the English Ridge, "lying on the west side of the Kings road, adjoining a small brook, on the east side of the said land, and on the south to the Kill of the Beast, and north by Jacob Polhemus." I leave to my grand children George Polhemus and Lambatie Polhemus, a certain lot of land lying on the English Ridge, on the east side of the Kings road, bounded south by Jacob Polhemus, west by the Kill of the Beast, north by Jacob Polhemus, deceased, being 40 acres. My executors are to sell a lot of 100 acres, at the Pond, adjoining Demarest Kill, and on the south side of the Kill of the Beast. I leave to my son, Theodorus Remsen, after the death of my wife Sarah, all my home lot at the Pond, bounded north by the land of Theodorus Snedeker, east by Rem Remsen, south by Johannes Muts and William Felter, and west by the Kill of the Beast; Also a piece of meadow on the west side of the Kill of the Beast, belonging to the home lot. I leave all household goods, after the death of my wife, to my three daughters. My wife Sarah is to have all the use of 1/2 of the estate during her life. I make my wife and my son Theodorus, executors. "Subscribed at the Pond in the Precinct of Haverstraw." Witnesses, William Jones, Paulus Vandervoort, Johannes Cuiper. Proved, May 12, 1748. Theodorus Remsen was then dead.¹

The "Pond" above mentioned is now Rockland Lake in Rockland County. "Demarest Kill" is the upper part of Hackensack river. The "Kill of the Beast" is a brook flowing into Hackensack river. Congers station is on the farm which in ancient times belonged to Theodorus Snedeker.¹

In his will, he wrote: ...April 27, 1770. I, Peter Remsen, of New York, merchant, being weak in body. All debts are to be paid. I leave to my son Simeon £10, which is to be paid to him in six months with intent to bar him from all claim on my estate as heir at law. I leave to my wife Janettye the use of all my estate, real and personal, for her support and maintainance and to bring up and support such children as shall remain with her during the term of her natural life, if she so long remains my widow. If the interest is not sufficient, she may sell real estate, "so that she may have an honorable, comfortable, and decent living for herself and children." If she should marry, she is to have £800 as her Dower. When any of my children are married or come of age, my wife may give to them such an outset and sums of money "as may put them into a way of Business at her discretion." After her death I leave all to my children, Simeon, Dorothea, Rem, and Onganitche. "If any Disputes or Differences should arize between any of my children, concerning the Division of my estate, they shall not go to Law, one with another, but any dispute to be settled by indifferent men; and if any refuse to comply with this they shall be utterly excluded." Rem Jansen Vanderbeecke was the founder of the Remsen family in America. He was from Jeveren in Westphalia, or according to other sources, from Coevorden, in Overijssel. He was a smith. He lived first at Albany, then removed to the Walabout in Brooklyn.

Rem Vanderbeek was a blacksmith by trade, residing for some time at Albany where several of his children were born and where he was nominated for commissaris in 1655. He sold his house and lot in 1660. He purchased a plantation at the Walabout adjoining that of his father-in-law, Joris Jansen Rapalie, prior to 1643, on which he finally settled. Rem Jansen Vanderbeek died intestate. In 1683 his property was assessed to his widow.¹
