The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He was of Poundridge and Hawthorne, Westchester Co., NY.

Solomon Miller's will dated June 21, 1822, probated in 1827 at White Plains, mentions Enos and Mahala, showing that they were m. prior to 1822. Enos m. 2: Charlotte Vredenburg, in Sing Sing (now called Ossining by its embarrassed inhabitants). Charlotte was b. Feby. 23, 1797; d. Hawthorne, N. Y., April 5, 1871, aged 74-1-13. Eardeley incorrectly states that Mahala was dau. of Henry and Polly Miller.<sup>1</sup>

Enos Reynolds owned the Harvey Barrett farm near Poundridge, N. Y., across the street from Sarah Green's father's farm. Enos bought a farm in 1830 in Hawthorne then called Unionville and moved there. Enos and his family were Quakers; descendants Methodists.<sup>1</sup>

In the 1850 census, Bergen County, Franklin Township, dwelling 165, family 175 -- Peter M. Reynolds is listed as a manufacturer. Living with them was Mary Lee, 18, b. Ireland.

Reynolds, 50, Editor, value real estate \$5000, value personal estate \$1000, b. NY; Lucy M. [Reynolds], 46, b. NY; Peter M. [Reynolds], 18, Printer, b. NY; Lucy [Reynolds], 14, b. CT; Louisa [Reynolds], 12, b. NY; Philip [Reynolds], 8, b. NJ; Jessie [Reynolds], 6, b. NJ; Alexander [Reynolds], 3, b. NJ; Mary Caasey, 20, Servant, b. Ireland.

His will executed August 1, 1765, was probated at Stamford, Oct. 31, 1765, gives children in order below. He joined the Second (West) Congreg. Ch. Greenwich, Dec. 24, 1732.

Elizabeth's father, Elisha Mead, was son of Joseph<sup>2</sup> Mead who in 1665 was one of the original patentees of Greenwich; Jan. 10, 1664, Elisha received a deed from the estate of his father.

On Dec. 1, 1734, Reuben sold his interest in the estates of his deceased father Joseph and his deceased brother Benjamin to his brother Joseph, Jr. In 1754, Reuben was a grand jurymen of Greenwich. He died eleven years later. As he died in 1765, the Reubens, Sr. and Jr., in the 1790 Census at Chatham (Canaan Township) Columbia Co., N. Y., are probably his son and grandson. A third Reuben there in 1790 I cannot locate. Note how his sons were scattered at their respective deaths. In 1790 Joel seems to have been in Chatham, N. Y. with Reuben; Titus was in North Salem, Westchester Co., N. Y.; Moses was in Stephentown, Rensselaer Co.; Jonah was in Northcastle, Westchester Co.; David was probably in New Cornwall, Orange Co., N. Y., but there are too many Davids in that Census to be sure.

It is said that all six of Reuben's sons were in the Revolution, and the records published in the 1916 Reynolds Family Annual seem to bear this out. Reuben and Elizabeth had in Greenwich, Conn.

Titus Reynolds was reared in Greenwich; in 1756 and 1759 he was in the French & Indian War from Fairfield Co., Conn.; also an officer in the Revolutionary War, as follows: "Lieutenant commanding, Oct. 19, 1775, Capt. Nathaniel Delevan's Co., in Col. Van Cortland's Third Regiment, Manor of Cortland, N. Y. (Peekskill). Lieut., under Capt. Gideon Seely, appointed April 22, 1779, in Lieut. Col. Thaddeus Crane's Fourth Westchester Co. Regiment. Also, Lieut. in Capt. Seely's Co., Col. Joseph Benedict's Third Westchester Regiment, all of N. Y. Troops." (Reynolds Family Assn. Annual, 1916, p. 105.)

In the N. Y. Census of 1790 Titus was of North Salem: 1 son over 16, 2 under; wife and 2 daughters.

His will signed Nov. 8, 1808, was probated at White Plains Jany. 17, 1809. In the will, Titus Reynolds, of North Salem, mentioned wife Sarah, and ordered that after her death his property be equally divided between "all my children;" mentioned dau. Sarah; dau. Mary otherwise called Polly; devised to son Benjamin, a stable with land around it, land on top of the hill, and a piece west of a line to be drawn from near the highway to the river meadow; to son Samuel the half north of sd. line, and residue of estate; to son David a deed to land adjoining that of Abraham Van Scoy, bearing date of 12 May 1808, from me Titus Reynolds. Executors, sons Benjamin Reynolds and Samuel Reynolds. Wit., Samuel Townsend, George B. Purdy, Eben' Purdy, Junr.<sup>1</sup>

Deborah Husted, sister to Sarah, above, m. Nathaniel Reynolds, Jr., who was the grandson of Ebenezer. Another Sarah Husted m. Daniel Reynolds, Jr., grandson of Joshua.

Titus and Sarah were Quakers and warm patriots. They always lived as farmers in North Salem, and are buried in the No. Salem St. James' Cemetery. The farm of Titus was of about 600 acres--almost a square mile in area--and it was mostly in the area now flooded by the big Titicus Reservoir (New York City water supply), between Purdys Station and Salem Centre. At his death the big farm was divided up among his three sons who always remained there on the land.
