The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He immigrated from England to Oyster Bay, NY in 1678.

On 9 Dec 1676, the town of Oyster Bay granted to "John Robinson Jonyer [joiner?] a half acre of land joining on one side to John whittecars land and fronting to ye highways yt goes to the waterside with ffree commonage ffor two cows and one hors and timbar suffitient ffor his youse on his trace." This lot was on what is now South Street, near where the railroad ends.¹

John Robinson subsequently acquired land in Madnans Neck (Great Neck, Hempstead), Cold Spring, in Oyster Bay (this land was on the boundary with Huntington, and on 23 Oct 1680 the town of Huntington granted "John Robyson Juynor of Oysterbay our right of the streme at Cold Spring to put up a corn mill and a saw mill."¹).

In his will, he wrote: ...I Joseph Robinson, of New York, merchant, being sick in body. I leave to my great grand son, Joseph Robinson, son of Barns and Margaret Robinson, £300, to be put at interest till he is 21. If he dies under age, then to Margaret Robinson, his sister. I leave to each of my executors £30, over and above their expenses. All the rest of my estate, real and personal, I leave to my grand children, Barns, Joseph, and Peter Robinson. My executors are to sell all my estate except my wearing apparell, which I give to my three sons, and my books, which I give to my grand son, Joseph Robinson. Whereas my grand sons, Barns and Joseph Robinson, are indebted to me for considerable sums of money, it is to be deducted from their shares. I make Andries Abramse and Leonard Lisenard executors. Dated May 13, 1757. Witnesses, John Burnet, Andrew Hamersly, Joris Remsen. Proved, March 23, 1759.

[NOTE.--Joseph Robinson was a prominent merchant in New York. "Robinson street" (now Park Place) was named in his honor.--W. S. P.]

The "New York Mercury" contained the following notice: "On Friday, March 16 (1759), departed this life, in the 76 year of his age, Colonel Joseph Robinson, of this city, merchant. A Gentleman of unblemished Reputation, whose memory will allways be honored by all that had the Pleasure of being acquainted with him, and particularly by the members of Trinity Church, to whom he was a most faithful and industrious Steward in receiving and disbursing the Alms of the Congregation. He was chosen Church Warden in Easter week in the year 1724, and was annually elected till 1756, when he insisted on being excused on account of his Age and Infirmities. His Remains were decently deposited in his own vault in Trinity Church yard on Monday evening last (March 19)."

The residence of Joseph Robinson appears to have been what is now known as "Fraunce's Tavern," on the corner of Pearl and Broad streets. The following advertisement appeared in the "New York Mercury," January 22, 1759: "To be sold at Public Vendue at the Merchants Coffee House on Tuesday the 30, in the Forenoon, The corner house near the Long Bridge, wherein Colonel Robinson now lives." On May 28, 1759, appears the following: "De Lancey, Robinson and Company have removed their Store to the House where the late Colonel Joseph Robinson lived, being the corner House next the Royal Exchange." On January 15, 1762, Oliver De Lancey, Beverly Robinson, and James Parker sold the house and lot to Samuel Francis.--W. S. P.

Hannah received land from her brother Benjamin in 1699. She was then the widow of Thomas Robinson. In 1730, her son, Joseph Robinson, as the oldest son and heir to be, of his mother, then Hannah Oakley, sold this land to his stepfather, Miles Oakley of Westchester. Joseph Robinson's uncle, Benjamin Horton, was at this time reported by him as being "late deceased." (Westchester Co. Land Records, Liber G, p. 81)¹

Hannah Horton was sister to Capt. John Horton; in 1714 when the iron work of the Eastchester saw mill was cited as belonging to his estate, in a deed from Roger Barton to Jeremiah Fowler, father to Jonathan, Esq.⁴
