

-- ROLL, RALL --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Isaac Roll served in the Revolutionary War in the Quartermaster's Department of the army as a teamster.²

In his will, he wrote: Roll, Isaac, of Springfield Twp, Essex Co; will of -- Wife, Sarah, use of 1/3 of real and personal estate and \$125, while my widow son, John \$1 in addition to land I have given him by deed. Son James, \$, in addition to lands that I have given him by deed. Daughter, Caty Woodruff (wife of Abher Woodruff) \$75. Grandsons, James Ayres and Isaac Ayres (sons of daughter, Betsy Ayres, decd, late wife of Daniel Ayres), each \$75, when of age; should they die before becoming of age the said \$150 to be divided between my 2 sons, Abraham Roll and Jacob Roll. Grandchildren, Jacob Thompson and Betsy Thompson (children of daughter Sally Thompson, decd, late wife of Smith Thompson), \$75 to be divided between them, when of age, should they die before coming of age, said \$75 to my sons Abraham and Jacob. Sons, Abraham and Jacob, residue of real and personal estate after my wife ceases to be my widow; should said sons die unmarried, their shares to be divided between the remainder of my sons and daughters and grandchildren. Executor-son, Jacob C. Roll. Witnesses - Benjamin Meeker, Samuel Ross, Nehemiah Bedford. Proved Nov 9, 1809.^{3,4}

He was of Turtle Bay in the Out Ward of NY, a mariner. Like his father, he owned land in Westchester Co., NY and Greenwich, CT.

He wrote his will 7 May 1744; it was probated 13 July 1744. In it, he wrote: ...I, John Roll, of Turtle Bay, in the out ward of New York, mariner, being sick. I leave to my son, Mangle Roll, £5 in full of all demands as eldest son and heir. I leave to my wife Allida, and to my children, Mangle Roll and John Roll, all my estate when they are of age. My executors are to have full power to sell lands. My will is that my vessell be kept going for the better maintainance of my children if my wife thinks proper, and it is not to be sold. I make my wife and Isaac Bragaw, Sr., of Newtown, and John Carhart, of Rye, executors. Witnesses, Isaac Brackow, John Dyckman, Jacobus Kip. Proved, July 13, 1744.

The will of Mangle Janse Roll was written 16 Aug 1732, probated 19 April 1744. In it he described himself as "of Turtle Bay in the Outward of the City and County of New York, Yeoman, being Sick in Body." He left his estate to his wife Anne and children John, Catharine, and Johannah, and Catharine's daughter Susanah Forber. "Executors are to sell all real estate. If my son John shall have a mind to purchase my house and lot of ground in New York, fronting the French church, he shall have the preference [now No. 23-25 Pine street.--W. S. P.]. I make my wife Anne, and my son John, and my son-in-law Philip Minthorne, and Samuel Beekman, executors. Witnesses, John Ten Broeck, H. De Myer, Jacob Janeway. Proved, April 19, 1744. The wife Anne was then dead.

Peter Manglesone purchased an 80-acre tract on the northwest side of Staten Island on 16 May 1696 from Thopmas Parker of Woodbridge, NJ. He registered his cattle mark 11 Feb 1696/97 on Staten Island and on 6 April 1698 was referred to as constable there when he witnessed the inventory of John LeCounte. On 23 March 1697 Peter Mangelsen and Jeneke his wife sold the 80-acre Staten Island parcel to his uncle, John Woglum, probably intending to settle in Niskayuna (near Schenectady) on the Indian land which his parents deeded to him two years later. However, Peter and his family remained in the north for only a few years. He is recorded on a list of members of the Schenectady Reformed Church in 1700, but beginning in 1702 had children baptized in NYC.

She was mentioned, as "Janette Mangles" in the 3 April 1711 will of her father.

Jannetje Du Chesne m. (2) about 1714 **Theunis Egberts.**, son of Egbert Sanderszen & Hermentje Harmens of Flatbush and Bergen. Teunis was bp. 9 July 1662 NYC and was a widower, probably of Susanne Letelier, aty the time of his marriage to Jannetje.
