The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Albert left Flatbush and settled in Bergen County. Albert Romeyn and Jannetie Westervelt, his wife, were accepted upon confession into the Hackensack Ref Ch 5 Jan 1712.

He ran an inn at one time known as the Brown Stone Tavern, which stood on the west side of Kinderkamack Road, south of Continental Avenue, in River Edge, NJ on the eastern part of his farm. A stone in the front wall was lettered "Ano 1719 AR x JR" for the date of the building and the initials of Albert and his wife, Jane. It ceased to be a tavern when the property, called his Steenraupie farm, was acquired by William Williams prior to 1800. The building stood until 1896. Stones from the walls were used in the construction of the nearby Congregational Church in 1899.

In it, he wrote: In the name of God amen I Benjamin Romine of the ponds in the township of franklin in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey farmer being at present in a good State of health and of a Sound Despoising mind memory and Understanding. thanks be to god for the Same and as to my worldly and temporeal Estate where with it hath pleased god far above my deserts to bestow upon me do upon this Eight day of February in the year of Our Lord One thousand Eight Hundred and twenty three make publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to Say. I recommend my Soul to god who gave it and my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken. I appoint my friends Garit P. Hopper and Henry C. Hopper the Executors of this my last will and testament. it is my will that my Executors Shall after a reasonable time Sell my personal property and So much of my Real Estate to pay all my Just debts and funeral Expenses. "At the commencement of the Revolutionary War, he was a mere lad at school, preparing for admission to King's (now Columbia) College, but upon the occupation of the city by the British army, his father's family retired to the neighborhood of Hackensack, in New Jersey. His studies being this interrupted by "war's rude alarms," he enlisted in the American army, and served several terms of six months each, finally attaining the rank of sergeant, and was engaged in several hotly-contested skirmishes. He was finally taken prisoner, and immured in two of the prisons in New York; from which, after a confinement of seven weeks, he was released, by exchange, in October 1781. After the close of the war, his family having suffered considerably in the loss of their property, young Romaine opened a school for both sexes in New York, where he soon established a very good reputation as a teacher--numbering among his pupils Washington Irving, Professor John Anthon, the late Judge J.T. Irving, and others since distinguished in the literary professional, and social circles of the city.³

Signed Casparus Westervelt, Jane Westervelt. Witnessed by Elias Folly, Garret Smith (his mark).¹

Benjamin Romeyn was appointed Dutch chorister of the Ponds Church in April 1787 and continued in this office until 1824.

Civil War Pension Records: On 3-18-1908 Henry [Romaine] made the following deposition in Rochelle Park, Bergen Co., NJ: I was 62 years of age Aug 24, 1907. I am not now engaged in any business. PO address is Rochelle Park, NJ. I was born here in this house Aug 24, 1845. My father was born here, too, and this has always been my residence. I now show you the Bible record of my birth. The date of the publication of this Bible is not stated anywhere within its covers that I can find. To the best of my recollection this Bible came into my father's possession when I was a boy in my teens and he obtained it in a trade whereby he gave Harper Brothers a Bible printed in Dutch. As you will see the Bible before described contains family record of births. My name as therein recorded and date of birth was written by my father, Daniel Romaine. The entries as recorded are as follows: Births — Daniel Romaine, Sep 8 1816; William Berdan, Dec 28 1817; Martin Richard Romaine,

Apr 8 1836; John B Romaine, Jun 25 1841; Henry Romaine, Aug 24 1845; Daniel Romaine (Martin's son), Aug 25 1862; John R Berdan, Jun 22 1790; Mary Van Houten, Jun 14 1791; Maggie Oldis, Oct 15 1842; Annie Romaine, May 9 1864; Mary Romaine, Mar 10 1868; Lillie Romaine (Martin's dau), Dec 12 1871.¹

John B. Romaine, Henry's older brother, made deposition stating "I know the entries were all written by my father, who died May 29, 1892." Henry died 11-16-1914. A Special Examiner in letter to Commissioner of Pensions 3-19-1908 wrote "Five generations of the Romaine family have occupied the homestead where claimant and his brother now reside. James Van Campen Romeyn attended the Schenectady Academy, 1784. He studied theology under his uncle, Rev. Theodorick Romeyn. He was a Trustee of Rutgers College. He was pastor of the Reformed Churches of Schraalenburh and Hackendack from 1799 to 1833.³

He was educated in 1774 at King's [later Columbia] College, Medical School, New York, NY. He was educated in 1780 at Edinburgh; he wrote a thesis on the formation of pus to secure a M.D. degree. He was elected Professor of the practice of physic at the Medical School of Columbia College between 1783 and 1787 at New York, NY. He was a member of the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York between 1784 and 1787. He was a member of the first Board of Trustees of Columbia College between 1787 and 1793 at New York, NY. He was granted a charter for the "College of Physicians and Surgeons" as part of Columbia University [sic], but the charter was suspended due to protests from Columbia College's trustees, who saw a conflict with their medical school circa 1791 at New York, NY. He was a lecturer in chemistry, anatomy and the practice of physic at Columbia College, but worked mostly in private classes so that eventually he "had a medical school of his own" between 1791 and 1792 at New York, NY. He was approached by "Queen's (now Rutgers) College at New Brunswick, N.J. for a degree conferring arrangement," but remained teaching in New York circa 1792.

He was a controversial member of the New York medical profession, yet he taught some notable students such as Dr. David Hosack. Romayne, who is considered today one of the founders of Columbia's College of Physicians and Surgeons. The whereabouts of his papers are unknown. They are thought not to have survived.

Nicholas appeared on the census listed in 1790 at New York, NY, on p. 134 as "Nicholas Romain" with one male over 16 and two females (Ages : 01-00-02-00-00). (Another "Nicholas Romaine" [thus] is listed on p. 126 (Ages : 02-00-05-00-00).)¹

He was graduated from Columbia college in 1795; was licensed to preach in 1798, and was pastor of the Reformed Dutch church at Rhinebeck, N.Y., 1799–1803; of the Presbyterian church in Schenectady, N.Y., in 1803; of the First Presbyterian church in Albany, 1804–08, and of the Cedar Street Church, New York city, 1808–25. He declined the presidency of Transylvania university and of Dickinson college; was one of the founders and a director of the Princeton Theological seminary, 1812–25; a trustee of the College of New Jersey, 1809–25; and was moderator of the general assembly of the Presbyterian church in 1810. The honorary degree of A.M. was conferred on him by Union college in 1797, and that of D.D. by the College of New Jersey in 1809. Civil War Pension Records: On 3-18-1908 Henry [Romaine] made the following deposition in Rochelle Park, Bergen Co., NJ: I was 62 years of age Aug 24, 1907. I am not now engaged in any business. PO address is Rochelle Park, NJ. I was born here in this house Aug 24, 1845. My father was born here, too, and this has always been my residence. I now show you the Bible record of my birth. The date of the publication of this Bible is not stated anywhere within its covers that I can find. To the best of my recollection this Bible came into my father's possession when I was a boy in my teens and he obtained it in a trade whereby he gave Harper Brothers a Bible printed in Dutch. As you will see the Bible before described contains family record of births. My name as therein recorded and date of birth was written by my father, Daniel Romaine. The entries as recorded are as follows: Births — Daniel Romaine, Sep 8 1816; William Berdan, Dec 28 1817; Martin Richard Romaine, Apr 8 1836; John B Romaine, Jun 25 1841; Henry Romaine, Aug 24 1845; Daniel Romaine (Martin's son), Aug 25 1862; John R Berdan, Jun 22 1790; Mary Van Houten, Jun 14 1791; Maggie Oldis, Oct 15 1842; Annie Romaine, May 9 1864; Mary Romaine, Mar 10 1868; Lillie Romaine (Martin's dau), Dec 12 1871.¹

John B. Romaine, Henry's older brother, made deposition stating "I know the entries were all written by my father, who died May 29, 1892." Henry died 11-16-1914. A Special Examiner in letter to Commissioner of Pensions 3-19-1908 wrote "Five generations of the Romaine family have occupied the homestead where claimant and his brother now reside. They are of good repute." Romaine, Henry, Art. 3 Art Engr. US Navy pension #55261, 39941. Born Lodi Burrough, Bergen Co., NJ 8-24-1845. 5'9", 145#, dark hair, dark eyes, dark complexion. Enrolled on 4 Aug 1864 and discharged 19 Jul 1865. Commissioned as Officer - Acting 3d Asst. Engineer and ordered to USS Chippewa 4th rate. On 9-30-1907 Henry stated not married and no children.¹

David Riker shows a Claes Janszen and a Stoffel Janszen Romeyn that he says are brothers of Symon Janszen. He shows them all arriving in 1653.

Claes Jansen Romeyn came to New Netherland about 1653. He bought from William Comton a plantation (lot no. 23) 3 Mar 1679 at Gravesend, L.I. where he lived for several years.

In 1696 he bought a 300-acre tract between the Hackensack and Saddle Rivers, and he added 600 more acres in 1697. His "Romine Patent" was located just south of Thomas Van Buskirk's Wierimus tract (which was in today's Saddle River). The Romine Patent is dated 30 Nov 1697, East Jersey Deeds, F:545, Trenton.

He was a cooper and was sometimes referred to as Klaes Jansen Cooper. He lived near Hackensack for about 10 years, and then moved to Shappekenike (now Greenwich) in NYC, where he died. His children all settled in Bergen County.

On 23 April 1715, Clase and Carhina Romine, yeoman, of Bergen Co., conveyed to John Romine of same, for £400, west side of Hackensack River and next to Saddle River...line of Isaac van Giesen and Jurion Westervelt...paid to heirs of John Berry and Clase Romine, father to the said John Romine. Signed Clase Romine and Carhina Romine (her mark). Witnessed by David Ackerman, John Bardan, Thomas van Boskerk and George Ryerson.²

He used the name Theodorick. He graduated from Princeton in 1765, and then studied theology under Rev. J. M. Goetschius. He was ordained May 1766 and served Dutch churches in Marbletown, Rochester, and Wawarsing in Ulster Co., NY He became pastor of the churches at Hackensack and Schraalenburgh in May 1776. When the British pursued Washington through Hackensack in Nov. 1776, they plundered Dominie Romeyn's house and destroyed furniture, books, and papers. He then moved his family to New Paltz, and then to his mother-in-law's at Marbletown, where they remained for 2 years. He then accepted a call to Schenectady, where he was instrumental in establishing an academy, which developed into Union College. One of their children was the Rev. John Brodhead Romeyn.

Nicholas Romayne, son of a silversmith, obtained his elementary education at Hackensack, NJ under the instruction of Dr. Peter Wilson, the late Professor of Languages in Columbia College.

Nicholas changed the spelling of his name from Romeyn to Romayne when he was a young man to facilitate pronunciation, probably circa 1770. He was educated in 1774 at King's [later Columbia] College, Medical School, New York, NY. He was educated in 1780 at Edinburgh; he wrote a thesis on the formation of pus to secure a M.D. degree. He was elected Professor of the practice of physic at the Medical School of Columbia College between 1783 and 1787 at New

York, NY. He was a member of the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York between 1784 and 1787. He was a member of the first Board of Trustees of Columbia College between 1787 and 1793 at New York, NY. He was granted a charter for the "College of Physicians and Surgeons" as part of Columbia University [sic], but the charter was suspended due to protests from Columbia College's trustees, who saw a conflict with their medical school circa 1791 at New York, NY. He was a lecturer in chemistry, anatomy and the practice of physic at Columbia College, but worked mostly in private classes so that eventually he "had a medical school of his own" between 1791 and 1792 at New York, NY. He was approached by "Queen's (now Rutgers) College at New Brunswick, N.J. for a degree conferring arrangement," but remained teaching in New York circa 1792.

He was a controversial member of the New York medical profession, yet he taught some notable students such as Dr. David Hosack. Romayne, who is considered today one of the founders of Columbia's College of Physicians and Surgeons. The whereabouts of his papers are unknown. They are thought not to have survived.

Nicholas appeared on the census listed in 1790 at New York, NY, on p. 134 as "Nicholas Romain" with one male over 16 and two females (Ages : 01-00-02-00-00). (Another "Nicholas Romaine" [thus] is listed on p. 126 (Ages : 02-00-05-00-00).)

Nicholas Romayne was a New York City physician and professor of medicine who had attended King's College when Alexander Hamilton was there, and received the M.D. degree at Edinburgh in 1780.²

Dr. Nicholas Romayne, working to establish his own medical college in New York City, had delivered private lectures to medical students since 1787, but his school, lacking a charter from the state, had wanted authority to award degrees. In 1790 the regents still hoped to see a medical school established in the state, and Romayne petitioned them to recognize his school officially, a measure that would have endangered Columbia's educational leadership in the city....By late spring 1791, the trustees had persuaded Romayne to initiate a medical course at the college with the assistance of Bard.¹

By the mid-nineties, Romayne was disgusted with the practice of medicine in the United States, and he decided that he could make his fortune in western land speculation. In this venture he became associated with Robert Troup, who was investing heavily in lands in western New York and was an attorney for the Pulteney Associates.²

In her will dated 4 March 1791, proved 1 Dec 1792, Sarah Van Dam, of New York, mentioned her neice, "Susannah, wife of Nicholas Romayne, Esq., Professor in the practice of Physic of Columbia University, New York" as well as their daughter, Susan.³

In 1835 the "Homestead" lot of Garrett Myers, located northwest of the intersection of the Fort Lee and Hackensack Turnpike and English Neighborhood Road, was conveyed from Garrett Myers to David Christie. The house in which David Christie lived, however, was located on the northeast of the intersection. The building located on the southwest side of the intersection is probably the same building indicated on the 1865 Chapman map as the "D. Carlock Hotel." The parcels of land which David Christie owned were subdivided among family members when he died in 1848. The parcel located southeast of the intersection of the Fort Lee and Hackensack Turnpike and English Neighborhood Road was conveyed to Mary Christie Romaine, who built the "Romaine House" which is extant today and located at 107 Romaine Place.³

David Riker shows a Claes Janszen and a Stoffel Janszen Romeyn that he says are brothers of Symon Janszen. He shows them all arriving in 1653.

On April 22, 1662; Symon Janzen Romein & Gerrit Van Tright vs. Albert Albertzen (Ribbon Weaver) [Terhune], def't. Symon & Gerrit state that Albert is bound to deliver them tobacco according to the contract on the purchase of land.

In their marriage record they were: Simon Janszen Romeyn, j. m. Van Amsterdam, en Sophia Jans, j. d. Van's Gravenhage. On 16 April 1667, Simon Jansz Romeyn of City of New York, conveyed to Maria Tayne, widow and relict of Philip Cassier, deceased, house and lot of land within this City, on southside of the markevelt street; adjoining property of Jan Evertse Bout, Jacob Teunisz, and Jacob Leenderts.¹

On the 25th day of Jann[ry] 1672/3 - Did Geertie Hoppen Late widdow of Andries Hoppen deceased, Simon Jansz Romeyn and Lammert huybertse moll, Tutors and Gardians of the Children of the said Andries hoppen deceased; For and in Consideration of Certaine sume of monney to them in hand paid by Giourt olphertse of the City of New Yorke meason. Transport and make over unto the said Giourt olphertse his heirs and assignes, a Certaine house or Tenement with: a Lott of Ground, scituatue Lying & being wth: in this City in the broadway betwene the Lott of David Provoost and that of Gerrit Vulleever, Containing in breadth before towards the Street twoo Rod seven foot, and behinde twoo Rod three foot. In Lenght on the south side fourtheene Rod and twoo foot, and on the northside thirteene Rod nine foot; as more at Large doth appeare by the sd: deed of sale Signed & Sealed by the sd: Widdow & Guardians in the presence of the aldermenn olof Stevensz Cortlant & Nicolaes Bayard Secretary. ("Original Book of New York Deeds January 1st 1672/3 to October 19th 1675" as published in Collections of The New-York Historical Society for the Year 1913 pp. 5-6)

At a meeting of the Common Council held December 8th, 1683. The City and Corporation of New York was divided into six wardson of which was the South Ward, described: To begin att ye Corner house of James Mathews by ye Watter Side and so North ward along the heere Graft to ye house of Simon Jonson Romain and ffrom thence West ward up ye Beaver graft to ye Corner House of Barent Coursen and ffrom thence south ward by ye fforte to ye watter syde including ye Pearle street & so to ye house of James Mathews againe. According to W.S. Pelletreau, The House of Symon Jansen Romaine was the West corner of Beaver and Broad Street. Southside of Beaver Street. (Mentioned in deed 1658).

In 1692 Isaac DeForest made Simon Jansen Romeyn tutor & overseer of his children.

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Symon Jansen Romeyn, of the city of New York, Gentleman, being in good health do make this, my last will and testament. I leave to the Dutch Reformed Church, £5. All the rest of my estate I leave to my wife, Sophia Romeyn, "And if it should happen that God did take my said wife out of this vain World before me," then I leave it to my wife's nearest relations. Makes his wife executor. Dated October 3, 1702. Witnesses, Johanes Viell, Johanes Van Vorst, Jan Jansen. Proved, November 21, 1702.

In her will, she wrote: I, Sophia Romeyn, of New York, widow. I leave to my brother, Jacob van Westerhout, of Westchester, shoemaker, 20 shillings. I leave to my brother, Jacob Westerhout, and my sister, Christian wife of Frederick Scuneman [corrected to Frederick Scureman], of New Rochelle, the house and lot of ground whereon I now live in New York, and I make them executors. I remit to Cornelia Low [corrected to Cornelia Law], wife of Andries Low [corrected to Andrew Law], of New York, merchant [corrected to mariner], a debt of £20. Dated October 7, 1715. Witnesses, Catharine Ker byl, Tunis Quick, Henry Wileman. Codicil confirms the above and leaves to Elizabeth, wife of Casparus Maybee, of New Rochelle, £40, and to Anne, wife of Hendrick Van Pelt, £40; to Christian, daughter of Dennis Dorthegan [corrected to Dennis Dothagen], a bed, "my gold rings and golden ear pendants called in Dutch, Stricken." To Affie, daughter of Casparus Maybee, my large looking-glass. To Christian, Sophia and Catharine, daughters of Casparus Maybee, household goods, silver tankard, 2 large silver porringers, 24 silver spoons, and silver mustard pot. To Hannah Van Swanenburgh, "one of two silver cups, with two handles which are much of a size" and a mourning suit of shalloon, and a silk scarf. Dated December 29, 1715 [corrected to 6 Dec]. Witnesses, Susanah Parmyter, Tunis Quick [correction: add to witnesses, H. Wileman]. Proved, December 29, 1715.

He was pastor of the Hackensack Reformed Church and Schraalenburgh Ref Ch from 1775-c. 1785, during which time he spent two years in New Paltz, NY with his wife's family, to escape the British.

He used the name Theodorick. He graduated from Princeton in 1765, and then studied theology under Rev. J. M. Goetschius. He was ordained May 1766 and served Dutch churches in Marbletown, Rochester, and Wawarsing in Ulster Co., NY. He became pastor of the churches at Hackensack and Schraalenburgh in May 1776. When the British pursued Washington through Hackensack in Nov. 1776, they plundered Dominie Romeyn's house and destroyed furniture, books, and papers. He then moved his family to New Paltz, and then to his mother-in-law's at Marbletown, where they remained for 2 years. He then accepted a call to Schenectady, where he was instrumental in establishing an academy, which developed into Union College.

The honorary degree of A.M. was conferred on him by Union college in 1797, and that of D.D. by the College of New Jersey in 1809. He [was] the author of occasional discourses which were collected and published (2 vols., 1816).¹

William H. Romaine appeared on the census listed either on p. 171 (14 W[ard] Div. 1) or p. 658 (16 W[ard] District 3) in 1860 at 14 W. Nyc Div. 1 OR 16 W. Nyc District 3, New York, NY.

He began military service on 20 October 1862 at New York, NY, ranked as a Captain, serving New York, E Co. 7th Inf Reg. NY and D Co. 174th Inf Reg. NY. The New York 174th Infantry Regiment was organized 1 November 1862, and mustered 17 February 1864. The regiment's morality rate was low and it saw several battles in 1863 at Port Hudson, LA, Ascension, LA, Donaldson, LA, and Baton Rouge, LA.

Captain Romaine fell ill from drinking bad water at Port Hudson, received a medical discharge and a disability pension from ca. 1864. He and Caroline M. Ewing lived circa 1864-1908 at 109 Fairview Avenue, Jersey City, Hudson County, NJ. He appeared on the census listed on p. 524 in 1870 at 14 W., Jersey City, Hudson County, NJ. He died on 15 May 1908 at New Jersey State Hospital, Morris Plains, NJ; cause of death listed as "Exhaustion, Chr[onic] Nephritis [?] and Senile Dementia." He was buried at Jersey City, Hudson County, NJ.
