

-- RUTAN --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Abraham Rutemps was an early settler at New Paltz where his children were baptized. They later moved to New Jersey.

Marie Petilions, his wife, joined the church at Bergen on 7 Apr 1679.

While living in Metz, Abraham was a minor and no records of his life there have been found. Probably about 1670, he went into Germany, as did many other Huguenots, and settled in or near Mannheim in the Palatinate where he is believed to have joined the Hasbrouck Party and journeyed with them via Rotterdam, Amsterdam, and England to America, arriving in the town of Boston in early 1675.

Abraham, so far as is known, was the first and only of this name to have emigrated from Europe to America in these times. The Hasbrouck Party sailed on to New York and travelled on, reaching Ulster County in July 1675. They moved on to Esopus, the area around Kingston in Ulster County on the west bank of the Hudson River, where, in 1677, New Paltz was founded. Abraham settled there and the first record of him in America is as a sponsor, on October 14, 1679, at the baptism of a daughter of Peter Deyo, one of the "Douzaine" (the twelve families that established New Paltz) at Kingston, New York. In 1680, the exact date not known, Abraham married Marie Petilion (or Piteljon) who is believed to have come to America in the same group as Abraham. Their children were amongst the first to be baptized in the French Church, which had been established in 1683 at New Paltz.

On September 1, 1689, Abraham took the Oath of Allegiance to the English Crown. By indenture dated October 26, 1699, Abraham bought a parcel of land and meadow in New Barbadoes in the County of Essex in the Province of East New Jersey from Thomas Noell of the City of New York, merchant, and Hannah, his wife. There he and Marie and likely some of their children lived and it seemed prospered, until he died on May 19, 1713. Marie (Mary) died later that same year. With the exception of a parcel of land that had been given to their eldest child, Daniel, and some other small bequests, her will dated February 19, 1712 (or possibly 1713?) directed that her estate be distributed in equal proportions amongst her children. While there is some disagreement among researchers, it appears that Abraham and Marie had twelve children, the first five of whom are recorded as being baptized in the French Church at New Paltz" (Ruttan, 1986 pp. 10-11).

"The first known of the Rutan family (in America) is one Abraham Rutan who came to America from Platz-Lorraine in 1677. Lorraine at that time belonged to France and it was on account of religious persecution that Rutan and a party of friends first went to Manheim, Lower Pallalinate, Germany, from there to Holland and from there to America, landing at Boston, Massachusetts, in 1677 and settling at New Platz, Ulster County, New York. Abraham Rutan married Marie Patiljon who was supposed to have come from Lorraine with the Rutan party. We have no record of her family, however, earlier than 1678 when Marie joined the Dutch Reformed Church of New York City. The date of the marriage of Abraham Rutan and Marie Patiljon is unknown. The earliest church records that we have are recorded in the Dutch Reformed Church, New York City, when in 1860 Abraham Rutan was Godfather for Racheal, the daughter of Abraham Hasbrouck, and also for Samuel, the son of Moses DeGrave." Abraham Rutemps arrived in America with the Abraham Hasbrouck family in 1675 and remained with them until 1682. He was prob. b. abt 1658 and may have been the son of Daniel Rutemps, a master draper who resided in the city of Metz, Province of Lorraine, France.

Abraham removed to Kingston for a short period and had a daughter, Hester, bap. in the Dutch Church on 6-3-1694. The record shows he removed permanently to New Barbadoes, now the present Rutherford, NJ, sometime prior to 3-31-1703 (Ecclesiastical Records of the State of New York, Vol. 3).

Abraham was a wit. at the bp. in NYC 12 May 1680 of Samuel, son of Moses deGrave and Maria LeBlanck. Abraham and Maria Rutan were wit. for Abraham, son of Paulus and Engeltje Rutan, bp. 2 Aug 1709 at Tarrytown.

In his will, dated 10 Sep 1712 New Barbadoes, NJ, Abraham Rutan mentioned wife Mary sole heiress and executrix, except plantation bought of Bath. Feurt of N. Y., merchant, on Berry's Creek and bounded S. by Abr'm Titsoort, which he leaves to eldest son Daniel. Other land; home plantation, formerly bought of Thomas Noell. Witnesses--Abraham Tietsoort, Cornelis v. Alfs, Edm'd Kingsland. Proved May 19, 1713. (Lib. 1, p. 408, and Bergen Wills) Endorsement states that administration on Abraham and Mary Rutan's wills was granted to Daniel Rutan. Inventory of Mary Rutan's estate (£35) filed May 22, 1713, by Jan Bardan and Jan Terhunen. 1717 Oct. 28. Ruttan, Abraham, son of Abraham, of Bergen Co., elects as his guardian John Brodberry, to whom letters of guardianship are issued.¹

In her will, dated 19 Feb 1712/13 New Barbadoes, Bergen Co., NJ, Mary Rutan, widow and executrix of Abraham Rutan; will of. Children--Daniel, Susana, David, Peter. Real and personal property. Witnesses--Cornelis van der Alfs, John Stage, John Berry. Proved May 19, 1713. (Lib. 1, p. 409). 1713 May 22. Inventory of the personal estate, £35.13; made by John Bardan and Jan Terhunen. Sworn to by David Raton (Ruton), the administrator of the estate.¹

An Abraham Rattan, a Sergeant in the 3rd Battalion, New Jersey Volunteers, is listed as having gone to New Brunswick, Canada, with the great Loyalist emigration from New York City in the Summer of 1783. If this applies to this Abraham, he evidently returned to the United States.

On 21 March 1780, John G. Ackerman of Harrington Precinct, conveyed to Abraham W. Rutan of Franklin Precinct, for \$60, 3 acres...line of Abraham Terhune. Signed John G. Ackerman. Witnessed by Abraham Van Boskerk, Garret J. Hopper.¹

On 6 May 1795, Cary and Hester Ludlow, gentleman, of New York City to Abraham Rattan, yeoman, of Franklin Township, for £200.4, 68.75 acres...line of Lucas cooper, James Mourison and John DeBaun. Signed by Cary Ludlow, Hester Ludlow. Witnessed by George Ludlow, Garret A. Ackerman.¹

The following transactions may possibly cite his land as a boundary: On 1 May 1804 (recorded 9 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:134) Jacob C. Haring of Franklin Township, Merchant, and Phebe, his wife, conveyed to Elijah Rosegrant of same place, M.D., for \$175., a 7-acre parcel of land in the Township of Franklin, beginning W side of the Road leading to Paramus Church, at SE corner of land of Abraham Rutan. Signed by Jacob C. Haring, Phebe Haring. Witnessed by Anne Westervelt, Abm. Westervelt.²

On 15 May 1804 (recorded 12 June 1804, Bergen Co. S:324) David G. Ackerman of Franklin Township, farmer, and Altey, his wife, conveyed to Elijah Rosegrant of same place, Doctor, for \$525, 20 acres strict measure being a lot on the paramus plains in the Township of Franklin, beginning NW corner lands of Abraham Rutan at the Road. Bounded N by the Road; W by lands of David Van Voorhees; S by said David G. Ackerman and Albert Ackerman; E by Elijah Rosegrant and Abraham Rutan. Signed by David Ackerman (his mark), Altey Ackerman (her mark). Witnessed by John D. Ackerman, Albert D. Ackerman.²

On 13 Dec 1785, William Rutan, yeoman, of Scrawlenburgh, conveyed to his son Paulus Rutan, for love and affection, 30 acres. Signed William Rutan (his mark). Witnessed by David Bye and James Canness.¹

In his will, dated 21 Apr 1812, pr 8 May 1812 (NJA 41:322), "Paul Rutan, of Harington Twsp., Bergen Co." mentions wife Genny; "Thomas Dobs, son of my sister [unnamed]"; sister Leah; brother in law John Mabey; sister Rachel; and Jacob, William, Albert and Paul (sons of Thomas Dobs). Executors were Isaac Bogert, John C. Westervelt. Witnesses—Albert Westervelt, John Zabriskie and Albert Bogert. Paul Rutan signed his will with a mark.

An inventory of the estate (valued at \$898.33) was made 7 May 1812 by Gerrit Durie and Albert Westervelt. The estate included shoemaker's tools.

Peter Ruttan joined the British army, under General Howe, in Dec 1776 and served as a Captain in the Fourth Battalion of New Jersey Volunteers in 1779, of Third Battalion in 1781, 1783 at Staten Island, NY where on Ship *Hope* Transported Loyalists from NY to Canada, nine weeks voyage, eight days of gales, arrived at Sorel and underwent severe winter, later with Van Alstine band of UEL, settled at Adolphustown, Prince Edward County, Ontario. Peter and brother William granted 1200 acres of land for loyalist services. After the Revolutionary War he sailed for Quebec and settled in Adolphustown, Ontario in August 1783.³

Peter, in 1778, accompanied Joseph Brant from New York State to Canada on a tour of observation and these two became such fast friends that Peter named his son Joseph Brant Ruttan. When the Mission was completed, Brant presented Peter with a handsome brace of pistols, which at his death came into the possession of his nephew, Sheriff Henry Ruttan, whose decendants now have them. Brant also peeled from a branch from a birch tree a piece of bark and on it recorded the services rendered by Ruttan which the latter presented to the proper authorities and was granted later that tract of land in Adolphustown that terminated on Ruttan's Point. Both Peter and William held commissions in the British Army and when the war was over both left for Canada with the Van Alstine band of Loyalists. One of them brought two black slaves, a man and a

woman, who proved a wonderful help." (G. Elmore Reaman, 1964, p. 219).

Peter Rutan, late of Franklin Twp., NJ, as a Loyalist in Montreal made claim 25 Feb 1788 for a house on Chamber St., NYC.

The name of a Peter Rattan, a Loyalist and Captain in the Jersey Volunteers, appeared on a list dated 1 Aug 1792 of reduced officers of Provincial Corps in the District of Mecklenburg, Ontario, as entitled to a land grant of 3,000 acres, of which 1,100 had been received by that date.²

Though only 17 at the outbreak of the Revolution, he was commissioned Lieutenant of the Associated Loyalists. His older brother was Captain Peter Ruttan, who had commanded a regiment during the Revolution and who was second in command of Major Van Alstine's party of Loyalists that landed at Adolphustown in March, 1784. William and his wife, Margaret, were of that party." (Stuart Adams letter, July 21, 1991)

The name of a William Rattan, a Loyalist and Lieutenant, appeared on a list dated 1 Aug 1792 of reduced officers of Provincial Corps in the District of Mecklenburg, Ontario, as entitled to a land grant of 2,000 acres, of which 800 had been received by that date.¹
