The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Land bought of executors of Joseph Wheeler, joining land of Nathaniel Crane, Executors - my three sons. Witnesses - Reiner VanGiesen, Peter Garmo, Jon'n. Sergeant. Written 16 Feb. 1748/9 Proved 7 Aug. 1749.¹

In his will of 23 Aug 1796, Egbert Sander of Saddle River left £200 to wife [massey?]; to cousin Peter Courter 25 acre farm, brother Peter remainder of lands excepting one halp [sic] piece of land brother Nicholas now lives I give to my cousin John Sanders after Nicholas's decease. Executor was Robert Gould of Caldwell. Witnesses were Sarah Gould and Joseph Gould. Probated 23 Sep 1796 (Liber 35, p. 346).^{1,2} According to Judith Ullman, this property was next to that of Henry Mead, who might have been Mary's father. She says this land is where Peter Courter was buried at the end of Courter Road if it still exists in Wayne, NJ.¹

Deed: 24 May 1796 from Henry Mead of Saddle River to Egbert and Peter Saunders of Saddle River, for £700 lawful money of NY, two lots of land situate in Saddle River, John Westervelt, Sheriff of Bergen Co., sold the said Henry Mead by virtue of an Execution to him directed out of the Common Pleas in and for the Co. of Bergen on a judgement obtained in the term of June last in favor of Peter Demarest against the Estate of the late Peter Van Blarkum dec'd. Deed bearing date of 3 Nov 1795. One of said lots of land lies between the land of William Ryerson and a lot of land now in the occupation of John Dey and adjoining Pacquanock River and running from said River eastward with the full breadth of 8.40c to the West branch of Singack Brook and then with the breadth of 11.88c to the Main Brook of Singack containing 100 acres more or less. The other lot of land being the northernmost part of an island lying between a lot land late the property of George Ryerson deceased and the Main River of Pacquanock bounded on the North and West by said Pacquanock River and on the South by a lot of land late the property of George Ryerson deceased and on the east by the branch of said Pacquanock River containing 13 acres. Witnesses David Demarest Ph. Dey. Interviewed by John Benson on the 10 Sep 1796. Recorded 17 Sep 1796.¹

In his will, he wrote: I, John Sanders, of Schenectady, merchant, being in good health, January 27, 1779. I leave to my only son, John Sanders, my Large Dutch Bible, which I have of Colonel Glen, and my house clock and one gun, and he is to have his choice of my guns, and my silver tankard, where my father and mother's name stands engraved on in a seypher, and all my wearing apparell, linnen and woolen, for his Primogeniture. I leave to my wife Debora all my real and personal estate during her widowhood. And she is to bring up, find and keep, my daughter Margrita Sanders, until she comes of age or gets married, and such an outset as my daughter, Maria, wife of John Ja. Beeckman has had, and to give her as much learning and education as possible she can. After the death or marriage of my wife Debora, I leave to my son John all my lowland and upland, meadows, pasture and arable land in the Town of Schenectady, with houses, mills and saw mill and creek dam, excepting twenty-four morgen of woodland, and eight morgen of hay land, and Indian corn land, lying on the east end of the lowland called Scotia, on both sides of the creek of the Lake. I leave to my daughters, Maria, wife of John Ja. Beeckman, and Margrieta, and to Jacob Sanders Glen, son of my daughter Sarah, wife of John Sanders Glen, and to John Sanders Ten Eyck, son of Myndert Schuyler Ten Eyck, twenty-four morgen of woodland, about one mile north from my dwelling house at Scotia. Beginning at the south side of the water of the stone flats, where my north line of woodland crosses said water, which north line is to be run from the west end of the lake, and runs from thence along the south side of the water, easterly to where the old mill road, which goes to Ball Town crosses said water, and running from said road north, and from the place of beginning north, till it makes twenty-four morgens. I leave to my daughters, Maria, wife of John Ja. Beeckman, Sarah, wife of John Sanders Glen, Elije, wife of Myndert Schuyler Ten Eyck, and Margrieta, all the rest of my lands and tenements, reserving two small Islands lying in the Mohawk river opposite Scotia, the one named Spite en Duyvel, and the other Cruysbesse island, which I give to my son John. The lands so left to my daughters, are eight morgen of lowland, hay land and Indian corn land, lying on the east end of Scotia lowland, and being the east point thereof, on both sides of the creek of the Lake, and running along the river and along the hill on the north side till it takes in just eight morgen; Also my dwelling house and lot in Schenectady, lying on the north of the house and lot of Isaac Glen, and on the south of the house and lot of Jellis Fonda; Also my pasture ground east of Schenectady, having to the south Reniers Pot, or a lane of two chains wide, to the east, John Hall's pasture, to the north Garret Abraham Lansing, and containing four morgen. And my half morgen of hay land lying on Jeffrow's land, near Schenectady. Also my bolting house and lot, and the other buildings, having to the north the house and lot of Jacobus Myndertse, east and south the streets and west the river. Also my house and lot in the eastermost end of the town of Schenectady, to the north of the street that leads direct to Canistigajoene, wherein David Rouse now lives. Also my house and lot on the north side of the street that leads direct from the Dutch church to Canistigajoene, and now in possession of James Ellis, having on the west the house of Messrs, Phin and Ellis, south the street, east the Presbyterian church; And twenty morgen of pasture land about one mile east of Schenectady, bounded north by the lane, two chains wide, east by a lane one chain wide, south by land of Jacobus Van Slyck and Adam Van Slyck. Also eleven hundred acres of woodland in Tryon County, on the south side of the Mohawks river, and on the east side of Aries creek, and within the bounds of a Patent granted to James De Lancey and Jacob Glen and others, and being lots Nos. 3, 7, 11, 15. Containing about eleven hundred acres. Also one thousand and sixty acres of woodland on the west side of Aries creek, within the bounds of another patent granted to James De Lancey and Jacob Glen, of four thousand acres, being Lots Nos. 6, 14, 20 and 22, as by map and Release of the Patentees. Also six hundred acres of woodland in Tryon County on the south side of Mohawks river in a Patent granted to Philip Livingston, Walter De Boys, and others, being the north half of Lot No. 37, in the first tract, and half of Lot number one in the second tract, and the south half of Lot No. 38, each half lot is two hundred acres, and was conveyed to me by

Coenrat Matyes; And five hundred acres of woodland in Tryon County on the north side of Mohawks river in the Patent granted to Jurrie or George Klock, William Nellis and others, being Lots Nos. 29, 41, 84, 142, and the north half of Lot No. 123, sold to me by Johannes Deygert; And the northeast half of No. 122, sold to me by Robert Nellis; Also three hundred and sixty acres of woodland in Tryon County on the north side of Mohawks river, above the little falls in Glens Purchase, sold to me by Abraham Glen, being the south end of Lot No. 11; Also a tract of land on the north side of Hudson river, on both sides of a creek called White creek, about forty-five miles northeast from Albany. Granted by Patent to Lieut. Henry Farrant, excepting four hundred and ten acres, conveyed to Isaac Vrooman, Esq., and John Todd; Also a house and lot in Albany near the Church of England, in the third ward, bounded north by the street, east by Abraham E. Wendell, west by Mr. Sharp, north by street, as by deed from the Corporation of Albany. I leave to my daughter all my wife's wearing apparell. To my son John a negro man and woman and her children, and the cattle and all farming utensils belonging to my farm called Scotia. My daughter, Margrieta, is to be carefully brought up till of age or married. All the rest of my estate to my five children. I make my wife Deborah, and my son John executors." Witnesses "in the room where he then was," Alexander Vedder, Peter Van Benthuysen, hatter, Abraham Oothout, Esq. Proved, February 7, 1783.

Deed: 24 May 1796 from Henry Mead of Saddle River to Egbert and Peter Saunders of Saddle River, for £700 lawful money of NY, two lots of land situate in Saddle River, John Westervelt, Sheriff of Bergen Co., sold the said Henry Mead by virtue of an Execution to him directed out of the Common Pleas in an for the Co. of Bergen on a judgement obtained in the term of June last in favor of Peter Demarest against the Estate of the late Peter Van Blarkum dec'd. Deed bearing date of 3 Nov 1795. One of said lots of land lies between the land of William Ryerson and a lot of land now in the occupation of John Dey and adjoining Pacquanock River and running from said River eastward with the full breadth of 8.40c to the West branch of Singack Brook and then with the breadth of 11.88c to the Main Brook of Singack containing 100 acres more or less. The other lot of land being the northernmost part of an island lying between a lot land late the property of George Ryerson deceased and the Main River of Pacquanock bounded on the North and West by said Pacquanock River and on the South by a lot of land late the property of George Ryerson deceased and on the east by the branch of said Pacquanock River containing 13 acres. Witnesses David Demarest Ph. Dey. Interviewed by John Benson on the 10m Sep 1796. Recorded 17 Sep 1796.¹

The following transaction may concern *this* Peter Saunders: Peter Saunders to Peter Courter both of Saddle River on 17 Apr 1797 for 175 Pounds. Property was quit claimed. It contained 25 acres. It was a legacy to Peter Courter from Egbert Saunders, dcd. The land is to be layed out on the north side of the farm wheron the parties to these presents now liveth in the followin manner viz. Twenty acres to lay joining the land of William Ryerson by a line running parallel to the said Ryersons line from the road to Henry Meads land in the Singack Swamp and the other five acres to lay on the south side of the said Henry Meads lot by a line parallel to the said meads line from the upper end to the Brook. Witness Justers Burnet and Robt. Gould. John Benson on 5 Apr 1797 interviewed Saunders. Recorded 29 Jul 1797.¹

Peter Saunders of Bergen Co., NJ made a will on 4 Sep 1797 in which he left to nephew William Jenkins, son of sister Anne, 30 acres off south side of farm. Nephew Peter Courter son of Peggy remaining part of farm and residue. He to maintain my father during his life. He also refers to: nephew John Saunders son of brother John dec'd farm on which brother Nicholas Saunders now lives in Essex Co.; sister in law Massey (widow of brother Egbert Saunders, dec'd, brother Saunders, Moses Lyon owes me money, Polly Meeker and Anne Meeker daughter of sister Lidia, sister, sister Sarah a bond given by Joseph Gould, nephew Abraham Courter. Executors were Peter Courter and Henry Mead of Pasquanack. Witnesses William Drummon, Mary Mead and John Dey. The will was probated 4 Oct 1797 (Liber 36, p. 426; File 2718B).¹

On 17 September 1801 (recorded 22 May 1806, Bergen Co. W:411) William Jenkins and Rachel, his wife, of the City of New York, conveyed to Robert Van Ness of the Township of Caldwell in the County of Essex, for \$325, 31 acres in the Township of Saddle River, a parcel devised by last will of Peter Saunders, deceased, to said William Jenkins. Bounded S by Abraham Ryerson; E by Singack Brook; N by Peter Courter; W by Pequannack River. Signed by William Jenkins, Rachel Jenkins. Witnessed by Abraham Ryerson, Hessel [?] Lyon, Aaron Reuch [?].²
