The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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Sandford/Sanford

SANFORD--William Sanford, of the Island of Barbados in West Indies, bought from the East Jersey Proprietors, July 4, 1668, a tract of land lying between the Hackensack and the Passaic rivers, extending from their junction about seven miles northerly to Sanford's Spring (now Rutherford); the purchase was made partly in trust for Major Nathaniel Kingsland, also of Barbados, and the latter took two-thirds of the tract Sanford reserving the other third. They gave the name New Barbadoes to their purchase. William located at East Newark (now Harrison), the settlement being known as Stantfort. He was an influential member of the new settlement; he was captain of the militia, and a member of the Governor's Council, 1683-86. He was appointed March 24, 1682-83, one of the justices of the peace of the quorum throughout East Jersey, also attorney-general; was one of the judges of the court of common right in 1683-85, and made a major Dec. 3, 1683. Major Sanford was undoubtedly of English descent and birth. There are, however, many families in and about Paterson bearing this name who are of Dutch descent, their name being originally Zandvoort, the meaning being the same. His will was proved Sept. 1, 1692; he devised his estate to his wife, Sarah Whartman, and states that they had been married on board the pink *Hannah* in the river of Surinam, March 27, 1667. Children: Nehemiah, married (first) Richard Berry, (second) Thomas Davis; Katherine, married Dr. Johannes Van Inburgh (Van Emburgh); William; Grace, married Parent Cosens; Elizabeth, married Captain James Davis.

William, only son of William and Sarah (Whartman) Sanford, married, Feb. 1, 1696, Mary, daughter of Lieut. Michael Smith. His will was proved April 16, 1733. Children: 1. William, baptized Nov., 1696 married (first) Rachel Davids, (second) Catharine -?-. His will proved April 7, 1750, named the following children: William, to whom his father devised his whole plantation of 30 acres, and 150 acres of meadow; Mary, married Samuel Pennington; Sarah; Elizabeth; Frances; Rachel, and Catherine. 2. Michael, married Maritie Dey and had issue: Maria, Anna, and Johannes, baptized May 13, 1733. This Johannes

was undoubtedly the John Sanford who served as a private in the Revolutionary War, afterwards volunteered in the War of 1812, and lived at Bloomingdale, Passaic county, and was father of Peregrine Sandford, of Paterson, for forty years justice of the peace, common pleas judge, etc. 3. John, married Martije Van Inburgh and had one child, Catryna, baptized June 7, 1724. 4. Peregrine, married Fytie Vreeland; their children were: Enoch, William, Jane, Aphie (or Aghie), and Elizabeth. 5. Robert. 6. Richard. 7. Frankie. 8. Jenne. 9. Anne. 10. Mary, married Hendrick Dey.

He was a mariner. Capt of sloop, *Sea Flower*, engaged in trade with West Indies. Later, a merchant in NYC.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their (1) banns and marriage they were: Abraham Santvoort, j.m. Van N. Yorke, en Vrouwkje Van Hoorn, j.d., Van N. Yorke.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Abraham Santford, of New York, merchant, being of sound mind, I order that my executors punctually observe and keep and cause to be performed all the covenants and agreement, I am bound unto in certain articles or ante nuptial contract, made between myself and my present wife Lydia Sandford; I also leave her a decent suit of mourning, and a negro girl; I also leave to my wife the use of all the house and tenement wherein we dwell, during her life. My executors, immediately after my decease, are to enter upon and take possession of all my houses and lands, and all my estate (except as above), and sell the same to the best advantage. Of the proceeds, they are to pay 1/3 to my granddaughter Helena, wife of Theodorus Van Dyke, and daughter of my son Cornelius Sandford, and 1/3 to my son-in-law William Bradford, Jr., and Sytie, his wife, my daughter, and 1/3 to my daughter Anne Maria, wife of Dirck Schuyler. I make my sons-in-law, William Bradford, Jr., and Dirck Schuyler, executors. Dated August 3, 1742. Witnesses, James Buvelet, William Goodday, Daniel Shatford. Proved, May 19, 1747. The executors having resigned, Letters of administration are granted to the widow, Lydia Sandford.

In his will, he wrote: I Cornelius Santford, of New York, merchant, being in good health. I leave to my wife Gertie my negro boy and girl. To my daughter Helena, by my former wife, £50, and all my plate marked with the letters C. S. H., and all my former wife's wearing apparell, also a negro man, and my Large Dutch Bible. I leave to my brother, Abraham Santford, all my wearing apparell. I leave to my wife Gertie, 1/3 of all the rest of my estate, and the rest to my daughter Helena, "and to such child or children as I may happen to beget by my said wife." Contingent legacies are left to Catharine, wife of Mr. Abraham Van Wyck, and sister to my former wife, and to "my sister Leitie, wife of William Bradford, Jr.," and "my sister Ann Mary, wife of Dirck Schuyler." I make my father-in-law, Syme De Hart, and my friends, Garrett Van Horne, Cornelius Van Horne, and Abraham Van Wyck, executors. Dated December 21, 1732. Witnesses, Richard Perrow, John Chambers, Thomas Elde. Proved, February 3, 1741. Gerritt Van Horne was then dead.

At a Court of Record, held August 4, 1679, before Thomas Delavall, mayor. Mary Stevenson, wife of Caspar Stevenson, of Jamaica, Plaintiff, against Dirck Smith, alias Dirck Jansen Vandeventer. She demands 3/4 of the Sloop "New York," which defendant mortgaged to her for £10, and by default the said sloop became forfeited to her, and she was obliged to hire a new master to carry the plaintiff and the concerns put on board to New York, at a cost of £3. 10s. a month, and other charges to the amount of £30.

December 10, 1686. Mary Stevenson, wife of Caspar Stevenson of Jamaica, Plaintiff, against Dirck Smith, alias Dirck Jansen Sandvoort, defendant. The plaintiff demands that, without delay, he render unto said plaintiff 3/4 of the sloop called the "New York," which defendant sold to her for £10, New England money; also 3/4 of her sails and tackling, etc., and 3/4 of all things to said sloop belonging, which the defendant sold to plaintiff for £10, on condition that, if he paid to plaintiff £10 within four days, the sale to be void, but he has not paid the same.

Aprill the 30th Ao: 1673: Did Jan Smedes of this Citty, Transport and make over unto Coenraet Ten Eyck, Jacob Abramse, Carsten Leursen and Jan herberding of the Citty aforesaid, a Certai[ne] peece of Land Lying and being on this Island manhatans, on this syde of the ifresh water, beginning at the Corner of the Lane Called 't maegde paetie, and Running ifrom thence allong the said Lane; uppon a southeast Lyne, to the Corner of Mr: olof Stevense Cortlants pasture, and further allongst the sd: Pasture to the orchard of the said Smedes, (:w :ch orcherd, together w :th the slip of ground thereunto annex is excluded out of this Sale:) and from thence, alongst the fence of the sd: orcherd uppon a Straight Lyne, to the Land of Mr: William Beeckman, uppon a post marked fr~ and from the said marked post, alongst the Land of ye said Beekman uppon a westerly Lyne to the Corner of the highway, before the house, where dirck Sieken now Lives in, and further from the said Corner alongst the said highway to ye Corner of 't maegde Paetie aforementioned; Itt being part of the Land w :ch was heretofore by the Curat :rs and heirs of Rachell van Thienhoven Transported unto the sd: Smedes; Contain[ing] in Lenght & breath as the same now is Limited & Encompassed in itt's fences; and the said John Smedes Likewise aknowledged to have received full satisfaction: for the same prmises w :ch said Transport was Signed by the sd: Jan Smedes; In the prsence of Johannis d' Pyster alderm: & Nicolaes Bayard, Secretary.²

Jacob Santvoort had a tannery and prospered. He was one of those who contributed to the forced loan ordered by Governor Colve in 1674. He and his wife were both listed as members of the Dutch Reformed Church, living on High Street. The name was later often written Santfort, Santford, etc.

On 20 May 1673 [Deed] Carsten Leurse of this Citty Shoemaker (for a valluable Concoideration, to him In hand paid by

Coenraet Ten Eyck, Jacob Abramse Sandford & Jan Herberding;) Transport & make over unto the said Coenraet Ten Eyck Jacob Abramsz & Jan Herberding their heirs & assigns, and unto each of them; one Equall quarter part of a Certain Lot, of ground wch was on the 20th of Septemb 1672; Transported unto ye sd Carsten Leursz by Adriaen Van Laer, Lying wthin this City; together wth a house, Barkemill and other ye buildings thereuppon, or in any wyse thereunto belonging or appurtaing, wch sd; Transport was signed by the sd Carsten Leursz in the presence of Nicholas Bayard Secretary & Ephraim Herman.¹

The whole Lott Containing as appears by the former Transport of John Snediker, on the Southsyde Eight Rod six foote, on the eastsyde fourteene Rod Ten foote and on ye westsyde seven Rod and nine foote, wich said Transport was signed by the said Egbert Wouterse, In the presence of Aldermn; Olof Stevense & Secretary Nicholas Bayard.¹

Capt. William Sandford from the Parish of St. Mary's, Island of Barbadoes, was the first settler in West Hudson [Co.]. In 1668 he purchased from the Indians over 15,000 acres of land, running about seven miles northward between the Hackensack and Passaic rivers, for himself and Nathaniel Kingsland. Capt. Sandford settled on his portion, which he called New Barbadoes, and lived there until his death Jan.-Mar. 1690/91. Presumably he was buried on his own land as was his wife Sarah who died in 1719, which plot continued in use as a family burying ground for several generations.

Captain William Sanford, of Barbadoes was granted by Governor Carteret a patent for the land between the Hackensack and Passaic Rivers, which he named New Barbadoes. He lived in east Newark (now Harrison) in 1675.

He was a captain of the militia and a member of the Governor's Council 1683-86. He was a justice of the peace, attorney-general, was a judge of the court of common right 1683-85, and was made a major in 1683.

In his will, dated 2 Jan 1690/91 and probated 12 Sep 1694 William Sandford mentioned wife Sarah ("formerly known by the name of Sarah Whartman," marriage concealed). Children--Katherine, Peregrine, William, Grace, Elizabeth, Nidemia, wife of Richard Berry. Real and personal estate. Wife sole executrix with request to Col. Andrew Hamilton and James Emot of East Jersey, Gabriel Meenviell and Wm. Niccols of N. Y. to assist a "poor ignorant widow & five innocent children." Witnesses--Patrick ffalconar and John Browne. Proved September 12, 1694. 1690-1 March 23. Inventory of the estate (£493.15.3), incl. 4 slaves, taken on his plantation at New Barbados, by Thomas Yansen and Patrick ffalconar.²
