The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

John Baptist Van Rensselaer, in his will dated 25 April 1763, probated 9 May 1763: John Baptist Van Rensselaer, of the Manor of Rensselaerwyck, in Albany County, NY mentioned (leaving real estate in Albany and other places) children (not named) of Adonijah Schuyler, late of New York, deceased; children (not named) of John Schuyler, of Second River, in New Jersey.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Adonijah Schuyler, of New York, being of perfect mind. I leave to my wife Gertruy the use of all household goods and 3 negro slaves, which she shall choose, while she remains my widow. My executors are to sell all the rest of my estate in New York and New Jersey, and the rest of my personal estate and the property left to my wife when her right ceases. From the proceeds, all debts and burial charges to be paid, and the remainder of the money to be paid to my wife and my children, Rensselaer, Mary, Swan (?), John, Peter, Adonijah, and Philip, when they are of age. The interest is to be used for the education and support of my children. I make my wife and my brothers, John Schuyler and Peter Schuyler, and Mr. David Johnson, of New York, merchant, executors. Dated May 20, 1761. Witnesses, James Melrose, James Still, David Ogden. Proved, May 28, 1762. [NOTE.--The house of Adonijah Schuyler is now No. 118 Pearl street. He also owned a large lot on the south side of Beaver street near William street. South William street, or that portion of it which was the continuation of the old mill street, was cut through the south part of his lot. His wife was sister of Jacobus Van Rensselaer.--W. S. P.]

Arent Schuyler was a merchant at Beverwyck. He moved to New York City in 1694. He was also a surveyor and an Indian agent for the British government.

Schuyler associated with Major Anthony Brockholst to settle in 1697 the area later known as Wayne Township, Passaic County, NJ. He probably removed to Pompton in the spring of 1702. Arent was a trader and in 1710 removed to a tract at New Barbadoes Neck on which copper was discovered and mined, making him very wealthy.

Book No. 2 of Conveyances, Brooklyn, Kings Co., NY, p. 249-50:30 Dec 1702, John Vandyckhuys died intestate and left three daughters, Auke, Swaentie and Alliday as heirs. The daughter Auke, deceased, and her husband John Lucasse on behalf of their son Johannes, and Swaentie with the consent of her husband Aaron Skeyler, and Alliday Vandyckhuys, agree to sell Aaron and Swaentie Skeyler land in Gravesend bounded by that of William Williamsen, Derick Amertman also another parcel bounded by property of John Lake and widow of Martin Petersz. Signed by John Lucasse as tutor and guardian of his son Johannes, and by Alliday vandyckhuys.

Excavation of the Schuyler copper mine in what is today North Arlington began in 1710, after the land was acquired by Arent Schuyler, a surveyor and Indian agent for the British government. Folklore has it that the discovery of copper on the site was made by a slave while cultivating a field. Schuyler's son John took over the mine and, with the aid of Benjamin Franklin, bought a British-made steam engine to pump water from the mine so more ore could be extracted. In 1776 the son sold out to Josiah Hornblower, the man who transported the steam engine to America. After the Revolution, the mine had a spotty operating history. Its longest period of ore extraction was from 1833 to 1841, when a British concern opened a new tunnel, named "the Victoria Shaft" after England's future queen, who was then Princess Victoria. The mining operation was last reopened in 1901, but that attempt resulted in failure a year later. In 1956 the mine's remaining openings were sealed to prevent injuries.

Arent Schuyler built a dock at the foot of what is now Stewart Avenue in Arlington (Kearny), to facilitate the shipment of copper ore from the mine at the north end of what is now Porete Avenue. The road over which ore was moved from the mine to the dock at the Passaic River is the route now followed by the Belleville Pike.

Arent Schuyler built a mansion near the Belleville Pike at the Passaic River; it was torn down in the 1920s to make room for the present Fairlawn Manor Tract, in Arlington, a section of Kearny, Hudson County.

Arent's 3rd wife, Maria Walter, was a granddaughter of Jacob Leisler. Maria survived Arent, and she m. Dec 1736 Archibald Kennedy.

In his will, he wrote: I, Arent Schuyler, of New Barbadoes, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, Gent. "Being in good health, and being penitent and sorry from the bottom of my heart for my sins." I leave to my eldest son Philip all that my 1/3 part of 1,260 acres of land between Pompton and Peckquaneck which are in common between me and Samuel Bayard, and the heirs or assigns of Anthony Brockholst, Esq. I having already provided for my son Casparus, by giving him a tract of land of 500 acres of upland and meadow, "at a place formerly called Lessa point, but now Wingworth's point, within the bounds of Burlington, by deed dated September 28, 1724. I therefore give him 5 shillings in full of all claim to my estate. I give and devise all that dwelling-house and tract of land where I now live in New Barbadoes, and which was sold to me by Edward Kingsland and wife Mary, April 20, 1710, with all the buildings, to my son, John Schuyler, reserving all mines and minerals. To him and his heirs male, and in default of heirs, then to my son Adonijah, and his male heirs, and in default of heirs then to my daughters Eva and Cornelia. I leave and devise, all that the large house, and grounds thereto belonging, in Elizabethtown, and all that tract of 760 acres near Rahway river and the meadows upon the sound, esteemed 27 acres, as the same was conveyed to me by Effingham Townley, December 20, 1720, together with all improvements, to my son, Peter Schuyler, and to his heirs, and in default of heirs, then to my son John and his heirs, and in default, then to my son Adonijah and his heirs, and in default, then to my daughters Eva and Cornelia. I give and devise all those tracts and pieces of land at Elizabethtown point, as described in a deed to me from Effingham Townley and wife Sarah, December 20, 1721, with the large house thereon since built, and also that small piece of land at the point, purchased from William Dugdale and John Searle, January 21, 1722, with the house and improvements, to my son, Adonijah Schuyler, and his heirs (same reversions as above). I leave to my two daughters, Eva and Cornelia, all the dwelling-house and two lots in the Broadway in New York, now in possession of Mrs. Swift, and to the survivor of them. I leave to my eldest son, Philip, £25, in full of all claims as heir at law. I leave to my

daughters Eva and Cornelia, to each an Indian slave and £1,000, "current money, at 8 shillings by the ounce," when they are of age or married. As to the children I may hereafter have, I leave to them the same as my other children. I leave to each of the four children of my late daughter Oliver, £250 each, when of age or married. Notwithstanding the instrument executed by my beloved wife, that she would not claim any right in my estate, other than the provision made for her before marriage, I direct that she shall have and enjoy the use of my chariot, and two of the best horses I shall have, and the choice of my female slaves. And if she think proper she shall remain and live in my house where I now live, and be maintained out of my estate so long as she remains a widow. I leave all the slaves and household goods on the farm where I now live, to my son John, and the rest to my sons John, Peter, and Adonijah. My executors are to have full power to operate all mines on my estate, and the profits to be for my sons. I make my son John, and John Walter, merchant, of New York, executors. Dated December 17, 1724. Witnesses, William Beekman, Jacob Goelet, Joseph Murray.

Codicil confirms the above will, and leaves to his son Casparus £50 annually, and to his wife Mary £2,500 in addition to £1,500, formerly agreed to be given. To daughters Eva and Cornelia, £3,000, and also a house in the Smith's Vly, in New York, with the land. To my grand-son, Arent Schuyler, son of my son Philip, £1,000. The testator states that he then had far more money than he had when his will was made. Dated October 30, 1730. Witnesses, John Cooper, J. Rowzet, John Cooke. Proved, February 2, 1730/1.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Colonel John Schuyler, of Albany, being in perfect health. I leave to my son, Philip Schuyler, my grist mill at Saratoga, for his right of primogeniture, reserving to the children of my son, John Schuyler, deceased, the right to grind free of toll; Also my farm at Saratoga, with 1/2 the saw mill, with all the negroes; Also my dwelling house in Albany, with the ground, except 5 feet wide on the south side next to the house of my son John. I also leave to my son Philip, 1/2 of my undivided 1/7 of my lands in the Patent of Saratoga, which with the farm and saw mill I value at £890, and he is to pay to my daughters, Margaret Schuyler and Catalentie Cuyler, each £50. In his will, he wrote: March 27, 1739. I, Myndert Schuyler, of the city of Albany, "considering the frailty of my body." I leave to my wife Rachel the use and income of all my estate during her life time. After her death, all the monies and bonds which I have at interest are to be continued, and my daughter, Anna De Peyster, is to have the interest during her life. After the death of my said daughter, I leave all my estate to her children, to wit, Anne and Rachel De Peyster, "and such other children as it may please God to give to my said daughter," And they are to have my silver plate, bedding, and household stuff when of age. "All my goods, rights, and credits are to be inventoried and entered in the Publick Records." I make my wife Rachel, and my daughter Anne, and her husband, John De Peyster, and Rutger Bleecker, Hendrick Cuyler, Jr., and Philip Schuyler, executors. Witnesses, Abraham Cuyler, Nicholas Bleecker, John R. Bleecker. Codicil, July 28, 1741.--Whereas my daughter Anne, wife of John De Peyster, hath since the making of my will procreated a son named Myndert Schuyler De Peyster, I give to him £30 after the death of my daughter, and one good silver tankard, to be made for him, And all my clothing, and my gun or fusee, and my sword with silver handle, for his prerogative as being my only grand son, And after the death of my daughter I leave to him and his sisters, Anne and Rachel, all my estate. After my wife's decease, all my shop goods and merchandize are to be sold at auction, and my executors are to be assisting and giving the best advice and council to my grand children. Proved in Albany, before Goldsbrow Banyer, July 24, 1756. Confirmed by Sir Charles Hardy, Governor, August 16, 1756, and Letters of administration granted to John De Peyster and Anne Dow, formerly Anne De Peyster, and now wife of Volkert Peterse Dow. [NOTE.--Myndert Schuyler, a member of a famous family, was for many years Surrogate for Albany County, and his son in law, John De Peyster, held the same office.--W. S. P.]

Philip Pieterston Schuyler of Amsterdam immigrated to New Netherland in 1650. He settled in Beverwyck. His bouwery embraced the southrly portion of the present (1871) village of West Troy, besides which he owned various house lots in Albany. He was a merchant, trader and dealer in land. On Mar 16, 1656, he was deeded one large and one small, decayed old house, on two lots (Lot 12) on the E side of the Great Highway (Broadway), by Claes Hendricksen. Confirmed by Gov Nicholls, Apr 23, 1667.

In 1664, he and Van Schaick were given permission to purchase the "Halve Maen" (Half Moon Patent) of the Indians (N of Cohoes, NY), included an island in the Hudson, at the mouth of the Mohawk (Van Schaick Island). Well connected with the Indians. Commissary at Fort Orange, 1655. Magistrate, many terms. In 1664, he bought a lot, at State and South Pearl Sts, from Abram Staats, where he built a house. A second house was built next to it in 1667. The first house remained in the family until 1777, when Stephen J Schuyler sold it to Henry Staats, and it stood until 1887, when it was torn down. The second house (residence of Capt Johannes (1668-1747, then his dau Margaretta, wife of Col Philip, of the Flatts, who l there, as her town house, until her death, 1783. It was then briefly, the Lewis Tavern). The second house stood until 1798, when it was torn down to permit the widening of Pearl St. Delegate to the Mohawks, 1655. Commissaris, or Magistrate, Albany. Officer of the Dutch Church. He gave a stained glass window, containing his family crest, which was one of the few to survive, when the church was demolished in 1806. Vice Director under Stuyvesant and Nicholls. First Commission of Capt in Albany, 1667. Commissioner of Albany, 1678. 1669, Capt of Schenectady. He laid out the "New Village" at Esopus, with others, in 1662. Owned houses in Albany, on Broadway, and on State, Beaver, and North Pearl Sts, where he lived at different times. He built the family home known as the Flatts, on a bouwery, 4 miles north of Albany, about 1690 (?), on land purchased in 1672, from the Van Rensselaers, whose property adjoined him to the North. It is now the Village of West Troy. The original house was the home of Arent van Curler. After van Curler's death, it became the home of Richard Van Rensselaer, who sold it (to Philip



for 700 beavers and 1200 florins Holland and 1600 florins seawan) on his return to Holland. A fire in 1763 destroyed much of the original house. It was re-built under the direction of Margareta Schuyler, known as Madame Schuyler, the American Lady. She managed the family estate, as a widow, for 28 years. The last family members moved out of the house in 1910 and it was sold in 1929, and burned in 1962. He was a supporter of Dom Nicholas van Rensselaer, his son-in-law, in the disputes the Domine had with Jacob Leisler and Jacob Milbourne.

Margaret's father, Brant Van Slichtenhorst, was the director of Rensselaerswyck.

Margaret's will was probated 27 June 1711. In it, she wrote: ...I, Margaret Schuyler, widow of Phillip Schuyler, sometime of Albany, merchant, being of sound mind, and considering that there having been some unhappy differences among my children; the youngest of them being apprehensive that by the strict rules of the common law, the will made by my said husband and myself on May 1st, 1683, might not be authentick enough to make such equal division among our eight children. But that Peter Schuyler, eldest son of my deceased husband, Peter Schuyler, might be entitled to all of the real estate. Yet, not thinking that my son, Peter Schuyler, would himself endeavor to take any such advantage, he being present at the making of said will. I give to each of our 8 children an equal part of all real and personal estate. And I being further willing to dispose of the real and personal estate, which, by the extraordinary blessing of God, I have acquired and purchased since the death of my husband. And my son Peter, at my request, being agreed with the seven other children, by deed, dated August 16, 1707, by which all further differences among them are prevented, I do give to my eight children, Gertruy, Alida, Peter, Arent, Phillip, Johanes, and Margaret, and to the three children of my son Brant Schuyler, namely: Phillip, Oliver, and Johanes, all my estate, real and personal. Provided always, that my son Phillip shall have the farm called the Flatts, with the utensils, he paying therefor, the sum of £600, to the rest. And they are all to pay an equal part of 9 bushels of good merchantable wheat yearly, to the Patroon or Lord of the Manor of Rensselaerwyck. Mentions "Cornelia Schuyler, widow of my son Brant Schuyler." I make my sons, Peter and Johanes, and my son in law, Robert Livingston, husband of my daughter Allida, executors. Signed and sealed in Albany in my dwelling house. Witnesses, Iona Rumney, Anthony Caster, John Dunbar. Proved in Albany, June 27, 1711, before William Van Rensselaer, Esq., and of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas.

They lived at the Schuyler-Colfax House in Pompton.

He was deeded the property of his father, but deed was lost, later sought by his brothers, John, Peter and Adonijah (NY Gazette-Mercury 12/9/1771. Father's will was also lost.) He divided his father's lands at Pompton, with Henry Brockholst, and the sons of Samuel Bayard, in 1755. He occupied the Pompton Homestead, and represented it in the Colonial Legislature.

The following transaction probably refers to their children: On 13 July 1790, John and Mary Van Houten, of Saddle River Precinct, conveyed to Martin Ryerson of the same place, for £100, 48 acres in Franklin Township...one half of tract patented by the heirs of Anthony Sharp, the other half by Phillip Schuyler, Isaac Schuyler, Peter Schuyler, Casparous Schuyler and Arent Schuyler to Peter Van Houten and John Van Houten on 20 Oct 1780. Signed John Van Houten, Mary Van Houten. Witnessed by Isaac Hawlenbeck, Garret Hawlenbeck.<sup>1</sup>
