The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Ambroise Sicard left La Rochelle, France with his family in 1681 for reason of religious persecution. He went to England, then to New York before 1688.

In 1692 he purchased 95 acres in New Rochelle, NY. Letters of denization (naturalization) were issued to him and his three sons in 1695.¹

He lived in New Rochelle, NY, where he was living in 1698 when a census taken that year lists him (age 67), son Daniel & wife and child, and son Jeam (James).

Ambroise Sicard's will is recorded New Rochelle, N.Y., 21 May 1701. The 1701 will was not written in anticipation of near death, but was a family agreement and on that account was signed by most of those concerned¹.

Will -- (written in French) 28 March 1701 -- I, Ambroise Sicard...[wishing] to keep good peace and family harmony between Ambroise Sicard, my oldest son; Daniel Sicard, Jacques Sicard, Guillaume Landrin and Marie Sicard, Francois Coquiller and Silvie Sicard, all my children and daughters. Signed Ambroise Sicard (mark), father Ambroise Sicard, Daniel Sicard (mark), Jacques Sicard, Guillaume Landrin, Jaune Sicard (mark), Marie Landrin (mark) Anne Sicard (mark). Witnesses: J. B. deTuffeau, Robert Blomer, To Nesson²

He was still living (with son Daniel) in 1710. Daniel received his father's house.

They were listed in the 1698 census of New Rochelle, Westchester Co., NY: brocar secar [Ambroise Sycard, Jr.], ag 32; Jean secar [his wife], ag 30; Madlan secar, ag 10; nan secar, ag 6; Jean secar, ag. 01.

Ambroise Sycard was an elder in the church, and in 1710 signed the license to erect a new building, yet is omitted from the census of that year. In the 28 baptismal entries which he signed he spelled his name in 16 different ways. The variants include Si Cart, Saycord, Secart, Sycar, Cycor; [Sycard and Sycart] are the only ones that occur as many as four times.²

In his will, he wrote: August 27, 1733. I, Ambrose Sicard, Sr., of New Rochelle, in Westchester County, being very sick. I leave to my son Ambrose, 7 shillings. To my daughter, Magdalen Williams, 6s., and to my daughter, Judith Dubois, 6s., they having already received their portions. To my wife Jane, all the rest of my movables, and the use of house, lands, and or-

chards during life. After her decease, to my sons Daniel and Paul. I appoint my loving nephew, Peter Sicard, and my friend, John Badaux, executors. Witnesses, Daniel Girane, Daniel Angevine, John Coutant. Proved, December 4, 1735.¹

New York Times, Feb. 8, 1889 -- Three Years for Embezzlement. Philadelphia, Feb. 7. -- Ambrose T. Secor, formerly book-keeper and cashier of the American District Telegraph Company, pleaded guilty to-day to the embezzlement of funds of the company and was sentenced to three years' imprisonment. The amount involved is said to be about \$17,000. The money, it is alleged, was taken in sums of \$100 or so, and false entries were made to cover the amounts. When no longer able to cover his misdoings Secor disappeared from the city. He was subsequently found living in Jersey City and was brought back on a requisition. In explanation of the matter the prisoner's counsel to-day stated to the court that Secor got into the trouble through requests of the then President of the company to loan him money. That officer, he said, would write to Secor asking him to borrow for him, say, \$100, and would inclose in the letter a due bill for the amount asked for. In order to accommodate him Secor, having no other means, used the money of the company, and in this way became involved. It became necessary for him in order to cover up his transactions to falsify his books, and when he got so deep in the mire that there was no escape without discovery he fled the city.

About 1744, he moved across the Hudson River [from Westchester Co., NY] to the Haverstraw/Southfields/Monroe area. He signed The Articles of Association, Haverstraw Precinct, May 1775. These Articles were a resolution to "do in the most solemn manner resolve never to become Slaves, and do associate under all the ties of Religion, Honour and Love to our

Country, to adopt....whatever measures may be recommended by the Continental Congress...for the purpose of preserving our Constitution and opposing the execution of the several arbitrary and oppressive acts of the British Parliament etc, etc....." signers were David Seacor, David Seacor Jr, Ellis Seacor (Jonas?), Isaac Seacor, Isaac J. Seacor, Jacob Seacor, James Seacor, John Seacor, Isaac Seacor, and Samuel Seacor. A Benjamin Secore refused to sign this document, but did sign one which disallowed and never consented to taxation (sic) without representation. This document provided no hand in the revolution, but stood for the King, Country and Liberty. This Benjamin had his estates confiscated later. This Committee, also listed those who have "Neglected or Refuses" to sign the Association. This list included John Secore, Jnr, John Secore, Samuel Seacor and Isaac J. Seacor, not seen. This "not seen" may connote that Isaac was a prisoner of the British and not to be considered a Tory. However, on August 15, 1775, an Isaac Seacor of Capt. John Bedle's Company (Dutchess County) refused to sign the Association.

James Fitz Gibbon testified: "I do hereby certify that Mrs. Secord, wife of James Secord, of Chippewa, did in the month of June 1813, walk from her house, near the village of St. David's to De Cou's house in Thorold by a circuitous route of about twenty miles, partly through the woods to acquaint me that the enemy intended to attempt, by surprise, to capture a detachment of the 49th Regiment, then under my command, she having obtained such knowledge from good authority, as the event proved. Mrs. Secord was a person of slight and delicate frame and made the effort in weather excessively warm, and I dreaded at the time she must suffer in health in consequence of fatigue and anxiety, she having been exposed to danger from the enemy through whose lines of communication she had to pass. The attempt was made on my detachment by the enemy and his detachment, consisting of upwards of 500 men and a field piece and fifty dragoons, were captured in consequence. I write this certificate in a moment of much hurry and from memory, and it is therefore thus brief. (Sgd.) James Fitz Gibbon, Formerly Lieutenant 49th Regiment."
