The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

The family moved between 1628 and 1635 from the region near Calais in Northern France to the Netherlands and settled in the region of Groede and on the island of Walcheren (Middelburg). The name of the father is not known, the mother (or step-mother) was Isabeau Rohart. From that marriage 4 children are known, among whom two sons, Isaac (birth estimated around 1616) and Thomas (born around 1623). Thomas died in 1667 in Groede and probably had no children. Isaac Seloivre (1616), after his marriage in 1641 settled in Breskens, situated in the Western part of Zeeuws Vlaanderen in the Netherlands, near the river Schelde, opposite Vlissingen (Flushing) where he became a cartwright.¹

Isabeau Rohart was present at the marriage contract of Isaac Seloivre with Susanna Sohier, together with Samuel du Rietz [du Rije] and Dominique Favereau, his brothers in law.

- **Jeanne Seloivre**, m. before 1636 **Dominique Favereau**, schoolmaster first in Arnemuiden, later in Middelburg. Favereau originated from Calais. Jeanne and Dominique were still alive in 1656 when their child Jeanne was born.
- **Marij Seloivre**, m. **Samuel du Rijets** (or du Rije), farmer in Groede/Breskens.
- **Isaac Selover**, b. about 1616
- **Thomas Seloivre** b. Marcq (near Guines, Calais) around 1623, buried Groede 16 Mar. 1667. He was a cartwright in Groede. He was married to Maria Boussemaer, but no date is known. Also unknown if there were any children from this

marriage.

The family moved between 1628 and 1635 from the region near Calais in Northern France to the Netherlands and settled in the region of Groede and on the island of Walcheren (Middelburg). The name of the father is not known, the mother (or step-mother) was Isabeau Rohart. From that marriage 4 children are known, among whom two sons, Isaac (birth estimated around 1616) and Thomas (born around 1623). Thomas died in 1667 in Groede and probably had no children.²

Isaac Seloivre (1616), after his marriage in 1641 settled in Breskens, where he became a cartwright. Breskens is situated in the Western part of Zeeuws Vlaanderen in the Netherlands, near the river Schelde, opposite Vlissingen (Flushing). In 1673 he sold his business and moved to Middelburg, together with his wife Susanne Sohier. He died between 15 May 1681 and 25 April 1682 in Schoondijke or in Middelburg. His wife Susanne Sohier, daughter of Francois Sohier and Sara Saye, came from the same region near Calais. She died, probably in Middelburg shortly before 15 Nov. 1694.²

In May 1681 he made, lying sick in bed in Schoondijke (thus in the house of his son) a codicil (addition to his will). In this codicil he arranges that the share of his daughters Sara and Elisabeth will go to their children and not to theirs husbands. Further he gifts a black coat to his son Isaac and another one to his grandson Isaac. Soon afterwards he dies (still in Schoondijke? or in Middelburg?), as his wife is called a widow in April 1682.²

She remarried (2) (betrothal Middelburg 16 Aug. 1674) with **Jan Dermout**. Both were still living in 1682. There was a child Isaac.
- **Sara Selovire**, did confession in Breskens 1668. She married (1) (betrothal Breskens 6 Sept. 1670) with **Hendrick Antheunissen Fijoen**, smith, first in Koudekerke, later in Groede. She remarried 27 July 1681, **Michiel Jansen Faro**, and after his death (betrothal Groede 12 Apr. 1698) **Jannis Hage**, both smiths. Sara Sloovers was buried in Groede 27 Nov 1739. There were several children from the first and second marriage.
- **Elizabeth Selover**, did confession in Breskens 1672. Was married to **Andries de Jonge**. Both were living in Middelburg in 1682, but nothing else is known.
- (poss) **Abraham Selover**. He lived in Middelburg. There is an Abraham who married in Middelburg 11 Jan. 1674 to a Jacquemijntje Kerlijn(?). He died in 1717. Abraham and his wife appear as witnesses at baptisms of children of Isaac (1642), but that's the only clue for a relationship.²

Isaac in 1683 went to [New Netherland]. I now think, that he went on a kind of contract base as schoolteacher for a period of five years, because in 1689 he is back in Middelburg, where he signs for the Dutch East Indies Company (VOC) to serve as a junior merchant in Batavia. These contracts were generally also for a period of 5 years. Isaac (1642) probably died on his way to Batavia, as over 80% of the people on board this particular ship died during the voyage.³

My hypothesis is that Isaac (1642) took with him on this voyage to America his eldest son Isaac (1665) and his next eldest daughter Susanna (1668). His eldest daughter Janneken (1666) and his other children stayed behind, and I guess they went to live with their grandmother in Middelburg, who was by then a widow. When Isaac (1642) was about to return to Middelburg, his two children had probably already married and must have decided to stay in America. So Isaac returned alone.³

Isaac Selover (b. 1642) is the one, who is found on the tax rolls of Newcastle, Delaware, from 1683.³

She probably went with her father and brother to Nieuw Nederland.²
- **Jakemijntje Selover**, bp. 12 Oct. 1670 Schoondijke (witnesses: Heindrick Antheunissen Fioen, Jacob Steenaart, Janneken Schovaarts) She lived in Oosterland in 1706. Was married two times, to resp. **Cornelis Leenderts van de Eerst** and **Anthonij Anthonisse Laan**. She died before 1727 as her son Anthonij Laan was in 1727 heir of his aunt Adriana Selovire.
- **Adriana Selovire**, bp. 25 oct. 1671 Breskens (witnesses: Abraham Selovire, Joris Caeu, Jacoba Houterijve). She did not marry and eventually was buried in Groede 15 Jan. 1727. Her heirs ab intestato were Janneken Selovire, living in Rotterdam, and Anthonij Laan, son of Jaquemijntje Selovire. Actually there is a small problem here, as also the "American" should have been heirs. But maybe there was no contact anymore between them.
- **Elisabeth Selovire**, bp. 12 Nov. 1673 Schoondijke (witnesses: Reijnier de Clerq, Elisabeth Selover). Nothing else of her is known. Probably died young.
- **Adriaan Selovire**, bp. 1 Jan. 1676 Schoondijke (witnesses: ds van der Burcht, Jan Meeusen, Sara Selover). Nothing else of him is known. Probably died young.

Cathalina Alstyne (Catharine) was the twin sister of Elizabeth Alstyne, who m. 1760 Moses Taylor. Another sister, Maria Alstyne, m. 1759 Robert Towt.

Catharine's will, dated 7 Oct 1795, probated 21 Nov 1799 (rec. NYC), "Catharine Slover, New York, widow" mentioned daughter Catharine Laurence, wife of William Laurence of New Bern, North Carolina; property inherited from her father, Abraham Alstyne, and her mother Elizabeth Alstyne, widow of Abraham Alstyne; son James Slover, now residing with William Lawrence, aforeaid, in New Bern, North Carolina; son Thomas Smith now residing with me in New York (not yet 21). Makes sons James Slover, Abraham Slover, and also John Taylor, New York, grocer, executors. Witnesses were Robert Towt, Alex. Grant, John Towt. A codicil dated 5 May 1798 mentions her four children and she makes her executors, instead of John Taylor named in her will, Jacob Vredenburgh, New York, Barber and John Brower, New York, iron monger. Witnesses to the codicil were John Brower, jr., Leonard Kip, jr., Robert Sickles, jr.
