The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

He was the Simpkins immigrant ancestor, who settled at Boston by 1636. In 1636, April 14th, Nicholas Simpkins was brought before Gov. Winthrop for "braving Lt. Morris and telling him in public that he lied. He confessed but refused to acknowledge it as a fault or to ask pardon." He was committed and on the 16th, upon his submission and acknowledgment that he had done ill, "we took his bond of twenty pounds to appear at the next court and left him at liberty. Besides he was ill and we feared he would grow distracted."

Nicholas Simpkins on March 5th, 1640, ordered by the Court at Yarmouth with Philip Tabor, to be added to the Commission to make an equal division of planting land.

Nicholas Simpkins, tailor, when in Boston, 1634, was made First Captain at Castle in the harbor. Aug. 28, 1636, Sebastian Paulina was brought over by Mr. Simpkins to be bound out to Mr. Robert Keayne for ten years, but because he was a nephew of Mr. Simpkins it was decided he had no power to apprentice him. Nicholas moved in 1638 to Yarmouth, back to Boston in 1649, and was of The Ancient and Honorable Artillery in 1650.

Feb. 5, 1645, Nicholas and wife Isabel living in "Bastable," probably meant for Barnstable, sells to Thomas Boardman of Yarmouth their plantation of fifty-five acres. March 1, 1648, Nicholas Simpkins of Scituate, New Plymouth, sells to John Williams, Jr., all houses, barns, thirty acres of upland and thirty of meadows. April 4, 1649, Esbell (?) Simpkins, the wife of Mr. Nicholas Simpkins, releases her third in same.

Among the historical collections in Plymouth, Mass., may be seen an ancient deed given by Nicholas Simpkins to Andrew Hallet of Yarmouth, bearing date 1644.

Prior to 1658, Nicholas appears on the town records of Oyster Bay, L. L., where he sells to Gideon Wright seven acres near Sagamore Hill. 1658, he buys house and lot of Eleazer Leverich. 1668 he testifies to the ownership of a lot belonging to Anthony Wright. 1678, he buys of the Indians "the westernmost little Island," now Dosoris. He gives this island to his daughters, Sarah and Mary, and their husbands, Wm. Wilson and Samuel Tiller, and with them in 1687 assigns the title to Thomas Wall in exchange for land at Great Neck. 1668, he was one of the proprietors under the Musketa Cove Patent.

Nicholas Simkins made a declaration at Oyster Bay, dated 20 Dec 1683, in which he stated that he was aged 56 or thereabouts, now an inhabitant of Musketo Cove, and was one of the first settlers of Oyster Bay, in 1653, along with Peter Wright, William Leverich, and Samuel Mayo.¹

In her will dated 22 Apr 1685, probated 13 Oct 1685, Alice Crabb, of Oyster Bay, widow, mentions that her dau. Lydia Horner is to have "two shares of meadowings adj. Nicholas Simpkins, which shares I had from my brother-in-law Anthony Wright.

Jerwin Rootes, in his will dated 6 July 1696, probated 23 May 1697, mentions life estate to wife Willmet, including house & lands I bought of Nicholas Simpkins of Muscoto Cove; mentions son Peter Rootes, when of age to have my clothes, silver hat band, etc.; daus Dorathy Snethen and Phebe Rootes; wife's dau. Elizabeth Coles; wife's three sons Derrick, William & Garrett; two son-in-law Samuel Coles & Nicholas Snethen.

"Pieter Simkam, tailor, from Nimwegen" came to America on the Spotted Cow, 15 April 1660. He was engaged to work for Peter Stuyvesant. The record in the New Netherland Account Book reads: [for the Spotted Cow, April 15, 1660]: "Pieter Simkam, tailor, from Nimwegen. (On Cr.) [on the credit side]: On April 15, 1661, placed to credit of Gen. Stuyvesant, to whom Simkam is engaged." A foot note indicates that van Laer had transcribed his name as Timkam, and O'Callaghan as Hinkam.²

In the marriage record, they were: Pieter Suncam, j. m. Van Oÿe, en Debora Jans, j. d. Van Batavia.

He was probably from Ooij near Nijmegen. Ooij is both a village and polder east of Nijmegen in The Netherlands (and Nimwegen is another spelling of Nijmegen and Ooij has many variations on historical maps, like Ooi, Ooy, Oy, Oey). The village and polder Ooij is part of the Rijk van Nijmegen. The word 'ooij' stands for 'meadow near a river'. Here it is the river Waal.

For which said lot the grantors, before signing and delivering the present acknowledged to have been well and thankfully satisfied and paid; therefore they, grantors, in their aforesaid quality declared to desist from and renounce all claims and pretensions they the grantors or any of their successors could or might advance against the said lot, further promising to keep, perform and carry out this conveyance firmly and irrevocably and to secure said widow against all ulterior claims; pledging as per law. In testimony of the truth this present has been subscribed with their own hand by the grantors. In New Orange, July 2, 1674. O, Stevens V. Cortlant, Johannes Vanbrugh, Adolf Pietersz, Wilh Beeckman, Jacob Kip, Ephraim Herman, Clerk.¹
