The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

"That Aert's first wife was "Anna" as shown in the census [of 1706, 1708/9], is confirmed by both of them acting as sponsors at the baptism of Ane Catryn and Barent, children of Barent Christopher, on 13 Aug 1716.' [Aert Symesen and wife Aentje]. The name "Antie" is also coupled with Aert Simonson, sponsors at the baptisms of Antie Prall, on 21 Oct 1707, and the baptism of Maria Christoffelzen in 1710. That Antie, the wife of Aert, was the daughter of Han Christopher and Tryntje Barents, is further indicated by the fact that members of that family acted as sponsors at the baptism of Aert's children in 1708, 1710, 1711, 1713, and 1717. Hance Christopher (Jr) in his will of 30 Dec 1718, gave to Hans Simoson (probably his name-sake), "son of Aert Simonson", two young cattle. This would indicate that Aert's wife was the sister of the testator (WNYHS 2:187)."²

He moved to Staten Island about 1701, (as Aert Blanck), where he was ancestor of a large family. He was probably the owner of property on Staten Island, east side of Richmond Avenue, immediately below the crossing of the Springville Creek, in an area known as Karle's Neck. His old stone house was torn down in 1895, replaced by a brick house by David Simonson.

He signed a petition to King William, 1701, as Aert Blanck. Apr 1, 1703, Surveyor of Highways. Members DRC, 1751.

In his will, he wrote: May 6, 1747, I, Aert Simonson, of Staten Island, husbandman, being very sick. I leave to my wife Margaret the use of all lands, houses, and tenements in Richmond County, until my son Isaac is 21. Then I leave all my said lands to my sons, Simon, Hans, Arthur, Christophel, Daniel, Barent, Cornelius, and Isaac. I leave to my son Simon 20shillings before any division. I leave to my daughters, Catharine, wife of Johannes Huisman, and Anna, wife of Henry Cocheron, £120. I leave to my wife my Dutch Bible and brass kettle. All therest to my wife and sons. I make my sons Christophel and Daniel, executors. Witnesses, Peter Doler, John Crocheron, Daniel Corson. Proved, March 5, 1753.

He inherited half of his father's land and built a house on what later was Richmond Ave., New Springville, Staten Island. Administration on the estate of Barent Simonson was granted to his widow Abigail on 27 Jan 1797.

Abigail bought a portion of her property from son, Isaac. He and his brother, Isaac, purchased, May 1, 1756, from their siblings, 80 acres of land at at Northfield (Earle's Neck), which had come from their father. He also had a grant of land at Castleton. The properties were sold Mar 1, 1797 to Esik Simonson. Captain.¹

Abigail left a will dated 16 Mar 1801, proved 14 Aug 1807, mentioning her daughter Abigail, wife of Walter Dongan, sons Barent, Rheuben, and Jacob, and the home she had purchased from her son, Eseck [Records in the Surrogate's Office, St. George, S.I.]

I leave to my nephew, Isaac Simonson, the son of my brother Isaac, deceased, all my land and meadows with houses and all the improvements thereon which was "separated and divided" to me in the division between me and my brother Frederick, deceased, with my waggon, two horses, a plow, two harrows, all the "geers" and all my farming utensils, he paying and discharging all my just debts which I do owe on my own account, and exclusive of any debts of my aforesaid brother, and my funeral charges. Whereas my brother Frederick by his last will and testament duly executed, bearing date, the 25 April, 1777, did give and devise to me all his plantation lands, meadows, mesuages and ferry, subjecting the same to the payment of his just debts, funeral charges and certain legacies specified in said will, as by said will may more fully appear. My will is that all that part of my estate willed to me by my brother, as aforesaid, shall be sold by my executors and the monies arising therefrom, and all my other moveable estate not before disposed of, I give and dispose of in the following manner, if any there be after paying the debts and legacies as aforesaid, to wit: One fourth part thereof to the children of my brother Simon, deceased; one fourth part to my nephew, Gozen Simonson; one fourth part to the children of my brother Jehonas, deceased; the remaining fourth part to the children of my brother Ram, deceased. I make my friend, Haremonas Garrison, my nephew, Gozen Simonson, and my nephew, Jehonas Simonson, the son of my brother Simon, executors. Witnesses, Benjamin Seaman, Surrogate, Cornelius Corson, yeoman, Joseph Lake, yeoman. Proved, April 16, 1781.

"Lintie" Simonson (deceased) was named in the 1773 will of Henry Stevens of Bridgewater Twp, Somerset County as one of his granddaughters. Henry Stevens & wife Catalyntje (Hoff) baptized daughter Catlyntje at Readington in 1742, and the latter must have been the (second?) wife of John Simonson. Stevens' will also mentions granddaughter Catlintie Simonson; Catlintie and Lintie must be the Catlyna and Lena baptized to John Symonsen & Catlyna in 1766 and 1768.¹

John Simonson of Bridgewater Township, Somerset County" wrote his will on 12 Jan 1804, and it was proved on 19 Jul 1804. In it he left his wife, Elizabeth, use of his real estate for the maintenance of his children. His daughters (unnamed) who are not married are each to have 50 Pounds for an outset. He gives each of his youngest sons -- Simon and Dennis -- 400 Pounds. His son Adam is to be charged 90 Pounds against his share. His daughter "Linety", wife of Cornelius Williamson, is to be charged for book accounts [debts] against her. Residue is to be divided "between all my sons and daughters" (unnamed). Executors: Friends, Cornelius Van Horn and Peter Quick (near Readingtown Meetinghouse) Witnesses: John Cox, Christopher Strycker, Albert Cox.

Symon Barentsen was the only known child of the union between Barent Symonson and Tryntje (i.e. Catherine) Claes (Klaessen). Barent Symonson died before 1642, when his widow married, 2nd, Juriaen Blanck, and they made their joint will on 21 Aug 1662, by which the survivor was to have everything. Tryntje wrote her own will as Catherine Blanck on 1 Sep 1698, in which she names her son Symon Barentsen.

Simon was thought by Elmer Van Name to have m. (1) 10 Sep 1729 Churchville, Bucks Co., PA, **Blandina Van Woglum**, dau. of John Van Woglum & Blandina Viele. This seems unlikely, however, because Blandina Van Woglum appears to have m. (2) Abraham Stevens.

Simon Simonson was listed on a 1784 Bergen County Tax List as a mill owner. The mill was sold by his heirs to Casparus Westervelt.

In his will, dated 20 June 1782, probated 19 March 1792, he described himself as "of Hackensack Precinct." In the will he mentions his son Symon to receive double share of the estate. Eldest son, Van Pelt; other sons, John, Aert; daughters Johanna, Elizabeth, wife of Henry Marsh; Marya, wife of James Huyler; Aeltie, wife of Thunis Cooper [Bogaert?].¹

His heirs sold his mill on the Hackensack River and lot of land to Casparus Westervelt.

The stone was "saved" from the jaws(?) of a giant caterpillar tractor that was clearing off the area before constructing dormitory buildings by two young girls back in about 1950. Other sources claim the graves in this cemetery were removed to the New York Cemetery (aka Maple Grove Cemetery) in Hackensack. Wouldn't you think the grave stones would have been moved as well?? Obviously, they missed one. Regrettably, the stone is broken in half, but otherwise it is in remarkably good condition. The stone reads as follows: Here lies the Body of Simon Simonson [the last "s" is a florin, i.e., shaped like an "f"] who departed this life on May Ye 31st [another florin] A.D. 1785 in Ye 84th Year of his Age [the last "e" is finished off with a curlicue of 3 circles and a central dot.] On the top of the stone is a winged angel's head with wig surmounted by a cloud. The side designs are each headed by 1 1/4" chrysanthemum with 3 leaf clovers snaking in a vine down each side. The overall dimensions of the stone are approximately 17 3/4" by 46 3/4" There is no visible "signature" or sign of the stone cutter, but the stone is of such quality that it was surely done by a known cutter.;

In his will, he wrote: ...sixth day of August, 1776, I, Simon Simonson, of the County of Richmond, farmer, being weak and in a low state of health. All my just debts and funeral charges to be paid. I leave to my eldest son, Isaac, four acres of land and houses and barns beginning at the south-east corner of my land; Also, two acres of woodland at the south end of my land. Unto my three sons, namely: Isaac, John, and Jeremiah, the remainder of my lands and salt meadows in equal shares; they paying to my daughter Ann, £150; each to pay £50. Should Isaac die without issue, then the land devised to him is to go to my two other sons and daughter equally. My moveable estate to be equally divided amongst my four children. My son Isaac's part to be at the south-east of my lot adjoining to the four acre lot to him before given; my son Jeremiah's part to be at the north-west side of my lot fronting on the water; my son John's part at the south-west end of my land at the Reer, and running across from fence to fence; Isaac's part to have four acres of swamp and fresh meadow at the south side of the ditch. If the swamp or meadow shall fall in Jeremiah's division, Isaac must give up his land for meadow. I make my son Isaac, my brother, Jeremiah Simonson, and Goyen Simonson, executors. Witnesses, John Tysen, farmer, Thomas Miller, Thomas Kingsly. Proved, February 25, 1783.

In the records of his application for a Revolutionary War Pension, Simon Simonson testified that he was born in Staten Island about the 24th of January 1750 "as my recollection serves me. I have no record of my age -- the record in my family Boble being lost and my memory much impaired by old age." He lived on Staten Island about eight years, then moved to Hackensack, NJ where he lived for about four years, then moved to Elizabethtown, NJ where he lived for about 12 years. After that he again moved to Hackensack, where he remained until the end of the War "and where I now live," 27 June 1833.¹

About May 1776 he enlisted at Elizabethtown for five months; during the period of this enlistment he took part in the battle of Long Island and the subsequent retreat to White Plains. During the battle at the latter place he was with a picket guard about five miles from the main army. After the battle he joined in the retreat of the main army under General Washington to New Jersey, where, at Wood Bridge, he was discharged in October, his enlistment having expired. He served later as a militiaman for periods of one month each in April or May 1777; June or July the same year; April or May 1778; June or July 1778; fall of 1778; early spring 1779; summer of 1779; and fall of 1779. All of this service was in the regiment of Col. Van Cortland of Elizabethtown. In the winter 1779-80 during one month's service under Capt. Nichols he took part in the battle of Staten Island. In the spring of 1780 he moved to Hackensack, where he served one month in the spring and again in the fall. In the summer of 1781 he was stationed at the Liberty Pole for one month. In the spring and summer of 1782 he served two periods of one month each. His commanding officers in Bergen County were Capts. John Outwater, Elias Romaine and Peter Ward; and Col. Teunis Dey.¹

On 1 May 1806 (recorded 6 May 1806, Bergen Co. X:394) Jane Wade of the County of Bergen, conveyed to Simon Simonson of the same place, for \$47, 5 acres, 30 perches of woodland in the precinct of New Barbadoes, Munaghia patten on the W side of Quacksack opposite John Earl's Point, beginning at corner of woodland of Isaac Berdan; Vanderbeeks. Signed by Jane Wade. Witnessed by Jane Smith Wade, Wm. A. Depeyster.
