The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

**Sip Family**

SIP - This old Dutch family has been continuously located in New Jersey, for two and a half centuries, and seven generations have been born in one house. This house was built in 1664, and is still occupied by a lineal descendant of the founder of the family, Adrian Hendricksen Sip. He came from Breda, Holland, in 1641, and joined the church in Bergen in 1666. The homes of the period were usually one-stop structures built of stone or stood, or both. As in the old country the gable ends generally were turned to the road. This in old country custom, was done to conserve the rain water supply for washing purposes, and also that the snow would not fall on the people passing, a consideration not so generally exercised nowadays. Adrian Sip married, first, Countess Gritje Warnants van Schoneveldt and second, Geertruje Aurians. Among the children, Antje married Simon Jacobs Van Winkle Jan Arianse, the second son, was an important and influential personage in the town of Bergen; he served in the militia, as did his son Ide. Ide's son, Garret had a son, Peter, who was a prominent jurist, serving as Judge in both Bergen and Hudson Counties. He was one of the earliest supporters of the Republican party, founded in 1856. His son, Richard, followed in his father's footsteps in position and politics, and his son, Richard Garret Sip, now occupies the old homestead. Rumor has it that when Light Horse Harry Lee came from Hackensack to Bergen he stopped at the Sip homestead stables, and, by force of arms, exchanged his worn out horse for a fresher and better one. Three spies were hung on the old willow tree in front of the house.

Adriaen Hendrickse Sip of Breda [North Brabant], Holland, came to America in 1641 and joined the church in Bergen, NJ 13 Nov 1666 (as Claes Ariaenszen Sip). He built his house at Bergen in 1664.

In the (2) marriage banns record (NYC Ref Ch), they were: "Adriaen Hendrickszen sips, Van Breda, en Grietje Warnarts Van Schonevelt."

31 Aug 1654 -- Grietie Warnars, pltf. v.s Daniel d' Sille, deft. Pltf. declares, that deft. promised to marry her, exhibiting deft's signet ring, which she received thereupon together with two different letters written by him to her dated 11th of May and first of June last and says she slept with him, requesting therefore, that he, deft., be condemned lawfully to marry her. Deft. acknowledges that he gave the promise, but says that he has no copy of the letters written to her, yet admits that they are in his own handwriting. Parties being heard, the Court order, that copy of the letters written to pltf. shall be furnished to deft. in order to answer thereto in writing at the next Court day.<sup>1</sup>

7 Sep 1654 -- Daniel De Sille and Margritta Warnars appeared in Court, the plaintiff persisting in her previous [statement]. Daniel de Sille answers briefly in writing and [demands] that she be declared inadmissible, as she passed through her minority without the knowledge of her guardian. The pltf., Margritta Warnars, further sais, that she is pregnant by him. Daniel de Sille acknowledges to have slept with her; does not know if she be pregnant by him; has no knowledge of her than that she ran along the road with a can of wine one evening. Parties having been heard, the Worshipful Court decided, that P. L. Vander Grift shall take the paper on both sides and communicate the same to the Director General and Clergy, and receive their advice thereupon.<sup>1</sup>

Monday 6 March 1656. In the City Hall. Claes Janse, pltf. vs Aryaen Sips, deft. Deft's first default. Pltf. appearing in Court sues for the arrest placed on the monies in the hands of Jan Hendrick, and requests that the same be declared valid. The Court declares (by virtue of the contumacy) the arrest valid. [contumacy means willful contempt of court.] [RNA 2:57]

Monday 13 March 1656. In the City Hall. Claes Jansen, pltf. vs Aryaen Sipsen, deft. Defts second default. Pltf. appears in Court, saying, that he worked two days last harvest with deft. and cannot, to the present time, receive any money; demands fl.2-1/2 per day besides costs of summons and loss of time etc. Requests to be allowed to take his debt out of the monies arrested with Jan Hendricsen. The Court condemns deft. in consequence of his contumacy to satisfy pltf. and permits pltf. to take, under bail, the fl.5. of wages, and to bring on next Court day specification of the costs. [RNA 2:60,61]

Monday 20 March 1656. In the City Hall. Claes Jansen exhibiting, pursuant to the order of last Court day, particulars of the expenses and time lost through the non-payment of Aryaen Sips, which being examined he was allowed for summons, losses, and extract fl.3.12. and the same is to be taken, as well as the aforesaid fl.5. [RNA 2:69]

Witnesses, William Bogert, Cornelius Boghart, Simon Johnson. Proved, December 5, 1755. Rebecca Griffith was then the surviving executor.
