The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In the Kingston Ref Ch record of their marriage and banns they were: Anthony Slegt, j.m., born in Kingstown, and Neeltjen Bood-gaard, j.d., born in Mormel [Marbletown].

In his will, he wrote: ...February 20, 1756. I, Anthony Sleght, of Kingston, in Ulster County. I leave to my wife Neeltie the use of my present dwelling house where I now dwell, with cellar and yard room, as I have a lease for the same from my son in law, Abraham Turck, with the privileges granted by said lease, so long as she remains my widow. Also a bed, with the coverings and hangings, and so much of my household goods as she thinks she may need to keep house with, and after her death or marriage they are to go to my daughter and grand daughter, Also £11 yearly, "All of which I leave her in lieu of dower, hoping she will be satisfied." I leave to my daughter Catharine, wife of Abraham Turck, all the rest of my real and personal estate, and she shall pay to my grand daughter Lydia, daughter of Johanes Schepmoes by my daughter Maria Magdalena, deceased, £200, and £200 to my grand daughter Catharine, daughter of Johanes Stofell Thomas by my daughter Janettie, deceased, when she is 16 years of age. I leave to my grand son Anthony, son of Abraham Turck by my daughter Catharine, all my wearing apparell and my Fowling piece and cane, and to my daughter and grand daughters all the rest of my household goods. I make my daughter Catharine, and my sons in law, Abraham Turck and Johanes Stofell Thomas, and my cousin, Abraham Hasbrouck, executors. Witnesses, Abraham Van Keuren, Cornelius Elmendorph, Jr., Joseph Gosherie. Proved before Jan Eltinge, Surrogate, July 16, 1760.

Barent Sleaght took the oath of allegiance in 1687 in Brooklyn as a native, and was a church deacon there in 1693. He was a wheelwright

In his will, he wrote: 18 August, 1710. I, Barent Sleaght, of Staten Island, yeoman, being very sick. I leave to my wife Hellitie all estate during life, "but when it doth please God to call my wife out of this world," then my whole estate to my children, Henry, Barent, John, Cornelius and Christina. And my eldest son Henry shall have £5 above the rest. Witnesses, Isaac Corbet, Rebecca Cole, Abraham Cole. Proved, September 28, 1712, and Letters of administration, with will annexed, granted to wife Hillitie.

In his will, he wrote: ...27th day of November, 1781. I, Barnt Sleight, of the County of Richmond, yeoman, being at this time very weak and low in body, but of sound mind. All my just debts and funeral charges to be paid. I leave to Elizabeth, my beloved wife, all my lands and all my stock of horses and cattle that is on my farm and my farmer's utensils and everything that belongs to me, so long as she remains my widow. If my wife marry then my three sons, Henry, Jacob and Barnt, should divide my estate equally between them, excepting Henry to have £5 more, and they to pay unto my wife £40 instead of her Right of Dower. My three sons each to have a negro boy; but not to be in their possession while my wife remains my widow. I make Elizabeth, my wife, and my son Henry, and my brother-in-law, James Seguine, all of the County of Richmond, executors. Witnesses, Joshua Wright, yeoman, John Cole, Daniel Peatman, yeoman. Proved, February 21, 1782.

Cornelis Barentszoon Slecht, recorded in Woerden 1640-1653, distiller and brandy wine maker, left to New Netherlands where he was named as the brewer in Esopus (Kingston, NY).

1684 Testamentary (Copy in Ulster County New York Probate Records) prepared by Cornelis & Tryntje as Follows: "Cornelis Barentsen, her husband, co-testator" and herself "desire that the whole estate "shall be inherited by the survivor" and at their deaths by "the children: Jacomyntje, Hendrick, Annetje, Mattys and Petronella" "If any of the Testors shal remarry, one half of the property is to divided immediately among the children". " A linen chest made by Jan Jansen, which Petronella has, is above her portion (Een Kasse gamaakt door Jan Jansen" "voor linen kasse date Petronella voor uyt heeft boven haar portie") Signed Cornelis Barntse Slecht, Trynte Tysen Bosch.²

In his will, he wrote: May 26, 1757. I, Hendrick Sleght, of Richmond County, being weak in body. I order all debts and funeral charges to be paid. I leave to my wife Catharine the use of all estate so long as she remains my widow, If she marries, she is to have £60, and bed and furniture, and a negro girl, and she is to remove off from my estate. I leave to my son and heir, Barent Sleght, the lot of land and the meadow thereto belonging where I now live, and he is to pay to his three sisters £200. I leave to my son John the lot of land he now lives upon, and 9 1/2 acres of salt meadow, with the apurtenances, and he is to pay to his sisters £100. I leave to my 3 daughters, Mary, wife of Abraham Portier, Heletye, widow of Peter Poillon, and Catharine, wife of James Luequeer, each £100, to be paid by their brothers. All the rest of my estate I leave 1/2 to my sons and 1/2 to my daughters. I make my son Barent, and my two trusty friends, John Bedell and Benjamin Seaman, both of Richmond County, executors. Witnesses, John Grandain, Joseph Bontill, John Sequin. Proved, May 10, 1758, in New York, before John Godby, Esq.

In his will, he wrote: I, Henricus Slegt, Jr., of Rhinebeck Precinct, in Dutchess County. I leave to my wife Rachel, during her widowhood, the use and profit of all my estate, and "she is to furnish maintainance and Christian like education for my children." If she marries before my son Matthew is of age, my executors are to manage the estate for the best interests of my children. When my son Matthew is 20 years old, all my estate, real and personal, is to be divided among my four children, Matthew, Catalyntie, Anatjie, and Mayke. It is my will that my son Matthew keep the Plantation and messuage where I now live, and he is to pay to each of his sisters 1/4 of the value, and he is to have all the live stock of horses, etc. I leave to my son Matthew for his birthright my gun, my silver shoe buckles, and gold ring, marked H. S., And my silver clasp and silver sleeve buttons. I make my brother, Matthew Slegt, and my brother-in-law, Henricus Johnson, and my brother-in-law, Moses Cantyn, and my good neighbor, Guystert Van Waganer, executors. Dated November 4, 1755. Capt. Mattys Slecht/Sleight was a Freeholder in Kingston, N. Y. Jan. 20, 1714/5. He removed to Rhy-bech, (Rhinebeck) Dutchess county, N. Y. about 1716 and was among the Tax Payers on the first List on record, dated Jan. 1717/18. He was a Freeholder of the County in 1714 when the population was only 447 individuals, consisting of 66 families. He was elected and served as one of the six Assessors in 1717/18, 1718/19 and again in 1728/29.¹

A Deed dated April 16, 1719, from Hendrick Kip and Jacomynte his wife, assigns to Mattys Sleight Jr., his brother-in-law, "The one just half of two-thirds of the lands of Hendrick Kip, late of Dutchess County, father of the same Hendrick, which land was conveyed to said Hendrick and Catholynte his sister, by their eldest brother, John Kip, eldest son of Hendrick Kip, deceased." Thus he came into possession of property which was originally a part of the Patent granted by Gov. Dongan and the Indians to Gerrit Aertsen, Arie Rosa, Jan Elting, Jacob & Hendrick Kip.¹

Mattys Slecht was a commissioned Lieutenant, in the 4th Foot Company of the "Regiment of Militia in ye Counties of Ulster and Dutchess," New York April 21, 1693. He was later commissioned a Captain. He was a Freeholder in Kingston, N. Y. Jan. 20, 1714/15 and a Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of "ye Old Dutchess," in 1727 and 1728.¹

In his will (Liber 19. Written in Dutch) he wrote: In den Name des Heeren, Amen, May 10, 1752. I, Mathys Sleight, of Rhinebeck Precinct, in Dutchess county, "land man" being sick in body. I leave to my wife Catalyntie one half of the income of my estate until my children are of age. I leave to my sons, Mattewis and Hendricus, each £15, and to my eldest son Mattewis 10 shillings for his birth right. All the rest of my estate to my children, Mattewis, Hendricus, Antye, Marytie, and Tryntie. I also leave to them all my right in the Paltz Patent. I make my sons, Martinus and Hendricus, and my son in law, Moses Cantyne, executors. Witnesses Isaac Kip, Jr., Christian Schultz, Isaac Kip. Proved in Court of common Pleas, February 24, 1756, before Laurence Van Kleek, Judge, and Leonard Van Kleek and Henry de Burgh, Justices.

Samuel Pell, of New York, shopkeeper, in his will dated 14 March 1760 mentioned his daughter Elizabeth, wife of Matthew Slegt.

Matthew Slegt, in his will, proved 28 June 1762, wrote: ...I, Matthew Slegt, of New York, merchant, being weak in body. I leave to my son Matthew £10 in bar of his claim as eldest son, To my daughter Catharine £1,000. I leave to my executors £100 as a reward and compensation for their trouble and service. My executors are to sell all the rest of my estate, real and personal, and put the money on good security till my son Matthew is of age, 1/3 of the income to be paid to my wife, 1/3 to my daughter Catharine, and 1/3 to be used for the education of my son Matthew till he is of age, and then the whole to be paid to my wife and two children. If both my children should die, then their part to go to the children of my brothers and sisters (not named). I make my wife Elizabeth and my daughter Catharine executors. Witnesses, John Vanderspiegel, merchant, Peter Marschalck, baker, Wendell Ham, baker. Proved, June 28, 1762.

A legal notice appeared in *The New-York Mercury*, 27 Sep 1762, Issue: 530, p. 3: "All persons that have any demands on the estate of Matthew Slegt, deceased, are desired to bring in their accounts, that they may be adjusted; and those that are indebted on note or book debt, are desired to make speedy payment to Elizabeth Slegt, Executrix, Francis Marschalk, Evert Bancker, [and] Isaac Marschalk, Executors. N.B. The widow of the said Matthew Slegt continues the same shop where her customers may be supplied as formerly."¹

In her will, dated 24 June 1765, proved 8 Oct 1781, Elizabeth Sleight, widow, and relect of Matthew Sleight, late of the City of New York, merchant, being in good health of body. I leave to my beloved son, Mathew Sleight, my whole estate, both real and personal. My executors are to sell the whole of my real and personal estate (except such part of my furniture as they

shall think proper to keep for the use of my said son), the proceeds to be put at interest for the use of my son. My son Matthew to live with my father and mother, Samuel Pell and Mary Pell, and my sister, Hester Pell, during his minority, and they to be his guardians. My executors to pay to my said guardians, the interest on the money left to my son by his father, Mathew Sleight, for his support, maintenance, and education, so long as he shall live with them. If he dies without lawful issue then my whole estate to go to my father and mother, Samuel and Mary Pell, and one-third part thereof to my sister, Hester Pell. I make my sister, Hester Pell, my friends, Evert Banker, and Henry Van Vleck, executors. Witnesses, Cary Ludlow, Surrogate, Barnard De Forest, Abraham Ferdon.
