

## -- SLOAT, SLOT --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Cornelius Slott served in the Revolution as a Sergeant in the NY State Militia. Cornelius Slott was an orderly Sergeant in the New Windsor Regiment or the 2nd Ulster Co. Regiment, Col. James McClaughrey, from 6 Oct 1777 to 20 July 1778. He was taken prisoner 7 Oct 1777 at the taking of Fort Montgomery by the British and confined in the old Sugar House Prison until 20 July 1778, where he suffered great privation.<sup>1</sup>

Cornelius Slot's father-in-law, Arthur Kinney (1711-1802) served in the Revolution in the 2nd Regt., Ulster County, NY Militia.<sup>1</sup>

Henry Eltinge Sloat had charge of construction of the Erie tracks from Suffern to the pier in Piermont, NY.

Henry Elting Sloat was in the business of building docks along the waterfront of New York Harbor in New York and New Jersey. By early 1826 Henry and Margaret had moved to Port Richmond, Staten Island, NY, where they began a family. By 1838 they had moved to Tappan Landing (Sparkill, NY). Henry and Margaret appear to have died in son, Jenkins, home in Rockland, NJ, what is now Rockleigh, NJ.

They lived in Sloatsburgh, Rockland Co., NY in the Ramapo River clove, on land inherited from his father. He was a farmer and a tanner, establishing a tannery in 1792.

Isaac Sloat probably built the main house in 1814. It served as a public house on the old post road and was the meeting place of the supervisors and judges of Orange and Rockland Counties for 25 years. At his death, the property was inherited jointly by his two sons Steohen and Jacob, the former receiving the old farm and place, the latter the northern end of the property.<sup>3</sup>

On 20 February 1790, Jacob Zabriskie of New Hamburg, conveyed to Leah Slott of New York, for £100, 5 acres...corner to Albert Van Voorhees, Stephen Terhune and Samuel Provoost. Signed by Jacob Zabriskie. Witnessed by Benjamin Bertholf, Samuel Provoost.<sup>1</sup>

On 13 April 1805 (recorded 4 July 1805, Bergen Co. U:331) Albert R. Westervelt of the Township of Franklin, and Margaret, his wife, conveyed to Henry Bervoort [Brevoort elsewhere in deed], of the Township of Saddle River, for \$1000, 6 acres more or less being a dwelling house and lot in the Township of Saddle River near the mills of Isaac Sloat, beginning at W bank of the Saddle River on the S side of the bridge; mentioned line of George Doremus. Bounded N by road west; NW by Garret Garretse; S by said George Doremus; E by the Saddle River. Signed by Albert R. Westervelt, Margret Westervelt. Witnessed by Caty Westervelt, Abrm. Westervelt.<sup>2</sup>

On 10 May 1805 (recorded 8 July 1805, Bergen Co. U:354) Samuel Brevoort of the Township of New Barbadoes, Inn Keeper, conveyed to John Bervoort and Jane of the same place, for \$2000, 75 acres more or less at New Hamburg, beginning NE corner of land of Leah Slott and the land of Stephen Terhune; mentioned Sprout Brook; land of Albert Voorhis and Nicausie Kipp; Road that leads from Paramus to Hackensack. Bounded N by Albert Terhune; E by Sprout and Albert Voorhis; S by Nicausie Kipp and Albert Voorhis; SW by Road; N by Albert Voorhis; W by Leah Slott. Signed by Samuel Bervoort. Witnessed by Henry Bervoort, Albert Cough (his mark).<sup>2</sup>

Isaac Sloat, and wife Leah, of Rockland County, NY, in March 1813 conveyed her deceased father's property at Arcola (including the Red Mills), as "all that certain messuage, Gristmill, Saw Mill, tract or parcel of land and land covered with water lying and being...at a place known by the name of New Hamburg," containing 38 acres, to Garret Oldis, Francis Oldis and Benjamin G. Oldis for \$7,000.

Isaac Sloat of Hampstead, in his will dated Jan. 30, 1821, probated Jan. 4, 1823. Mentioned Wife, Leah; Sons, Stephen and Jacob; Mentions the pond, dam, bark-mill, saw-mill, tale-race, log-way, etc. Executors: Wife and two sons.

Jacob Sloat was a mechanical genius and may be said to have been the founder of the manufacturing operations at Sloatsburg. The first mill was built in 1815. It was a frame building about 20 x 60 feet with three stories and two wings, one being a machine and smith shop where heavy mill screws and vises were made. This mill marked the exact site of the wigwam of one of the old Indian proprietors of the land... Under his supervision, and in partnership with his brother Stephen, additions were made to the mill, and machinery was purchased in order to meet the demand for cotton cloth and cotton twine.<sup>1</sup>

Jacob Sloat, 59, manufacturer of cotton twine, and Sarah, 48, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in the Town of Ramapo, Rockland County, NY. Listed living with them were: Martha Sloat, 20; Mary Sloat, 16; Henry Sloat, 12; Louisa Hollenbeck, 77; and Catherine Logen?, 21.

Jacob Sloat, 62, farmer, and Sarah B., 52, b. MA, were listed in the 1855 New York State Census, living in Ramapo Township, Rockland County, NY. Listed living with them were: Mary W., 21, child; Henry R., 17, child; Harmeh Gorman, 40, servant; Ellen Gorman, 38, servant; and Mary Gorman, 8, servant.

Stephen Sloat was a prominent farmer and widely known manufacturer. In his youth he conducted a woolen mill at Paramus and later a cotton twine factory at Sloatsburg.

Stephen Sloat, 60, farmer, and Catherine, 59, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in the Town of Ramapo, Rockland County, NY. Listed living with them were: John Jacob Sloat, 27, manufacturer of cotton twine; William Sloat, 26, farmer; Spencer Sloat, 21, physician; and Mary Sloat, 20.
