The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Abraham Snedeker probably never married.

In his will dated 24 June 1771, probated 5 Nov 1771, "Abraham Snedeker, of the Precinct of Haverstraw, in Orange County" gives, devises and bequeaths all real estate to Abraham Thew; mentions Tunis Snedeker, son of his brother Johannes; Abraham, son of Harmanus Talman, his brother-in-law; children of Peter Van der Voort, his brother-in-law, viz. Peter and Neltie, wife of Joseph Johnson; Elizabeth, wife of John Smith "at the Hook"; Neltie, wife of Jacobus De Klerck; brother Gerritt Snedeker; children of his brother Johannes; children of his brother Theodorus, deceased; children of his sister, Elizabeth Smith; children of his sister Altye Cortie, children of Sarah Van der Voort. Provided that if Theunis Thew and Harmanus Cortie, who are now absent, do not return, then their shares are to be in the hands of Abraham Thew and his brother, John Thew. Established a piece of Burying Ground for the Snedeker family. Makes Abraham Thew, David Pye, and Theunis Snedeker, son of Johannes, executors. Witnesses were Rem Remsen, Paul Hasler, James Paul.

He lived in Rockland Co, NY. He received Lot 2, upon the division of his father's farm, having built a house on King's Highway. After brother Jabez' death, he received the homestead farm. He ran the farm until 1884. His earlier home was run as a hotel and willed to his son, Daniel.

Abraham Brower Snedeker served in the War of 1812. At one period he kept a tavern at the "1776 House" in Tappan and later built a hotel on the Haverstraw Road, which was kept by his son Daniel after 1868.

Y., being this 11th of May, 1784, in a good State of helth my mind and understanding quick and good, desirous to sett my outward house in order before my final change, do therefor make my last will and testament. I leave to my wife, Caseltna Snedker, her choice of a bed and furniture, and I will my son Boarnt to support her in a good decent and Christian manner and to bury her in the same Christian manner for considerations I have already confirmed on him. To my son John, 5 shillings; Also to my sons Jacobus, Garret and Borant. To my daughter Elenor Sneadker, œ40 and all furniture she claims "for the servises she hath don in my famely." After above "Leaguseas" are paid all my estate, real and personal, to be sold. Mention of my sons John and Jacobus of "Hententon township of Bedding Provice New Jersey." Proceeds from sale of property to be divided, one sixth to my daughter Effellanis Keshow, wife of Jehonas Keshow, for life, then to their son John; one sixth to my son Abraham; one sixth to my grandsons, sons of Joost Snedker, deceased, when of age; one sixth to my son William, one sixth to my daughter Elliner Snedker; and one sixth to my grandchildren, heirs of my son Christian, when of age. Executors, my grandson, John Keshow, and friend and neighbor, Jacob Van Wickley, Harmon Lefford, and John Wright, of Norwich, Merchant, all of the township of Oyster Bay. Witnesses, Jacob Kashow, Samuel Mott, John Wortman. Proved, Queens County, August 12, 1785. Confirmed, New York, August 15, 1785.

In his will, he wrote: ...December 19, 1750. I, Isaac Snedeker, of the New Lots, in Flatbush, in Kings County, yeoman, being sick and weak. I leave to my wife Catryntie £25 yearly, to be paid by my children and the children of my son, Gerritt Snedeker, deceased. I leave to my son Jacob all my houses, lands, and meadows in the town of Flatbush, also a wagon, plough, horses and oxen, and all implements of husbandry. All the rest of my estate I leave to all my children, Abraham, Antye, Elsie, Sarah, Isaac, Femittie, Catalyntie, and Jacob, and to the children of my son Gerritt, deceased. I leave to my grand son Isaac, son of my son, Gerritt Snedeker, deceased, £1 for his first birth right. And my son Jacob is to pay to my other children, viz., Abraham, Isaac, Antye, wife of Benjamin Emans, Elsie, wife of Roelof Van Brunt, Sarah, wife of Aert Van Pelt, Femittie, wife of Johanes Eldert, and Catalyntie, wife of Dowe Ditmas, the sum of £933 6s. 8d. in 4 payments, and also to the children of my son Gerritt. I make my three sons executors. Witnesses, Nicholas Wyckoff, Stephen Williamson, John Lott, Jr. Proved, October 31, 1758.

In the (1) marriage record, he is Jan Gerritsz from Oldenburg, soldier under Capt. Maijoor, 24 years of age, living on the Elantsgracht, having no parents (alive) and she is Grietie Michiels from Hamburg, 29 years of age, having no parents (alive).

In Amsterdam, Jan and Griet Michiels, his first wife, and Annetje Ruijs, his second wife, lived on the Elandsgracht, a canal in the center of the city.

Jan Snedeker was a shoemaker, who emigrated to this country before 1642. He located at New Amsterdam where he kept a taphouse, and later became one of the early settlers of Flatbush, where he was a magistrate from 1654-1664.

Jan Snedeker dated his will 12 Dec 1670; in it he devised his lands to his son Gerret.

"In view of his departure and up to the present time have been authorized by their son-in-law Steffan Ecker from Hamout of this land of Marde, to take over his two children in his absence, and to continue in case of his decease (in which absence may God protect him from the savages), just as though he were now deceased. They as grandfather and uncle of the deceased's children have administered his property." Signed by Jan Snedeker and Gerret Snedeker, 20 Aug 1674. (Flatbush Documents, Liber A, pp. 225-227)

On pages 291-292 of "Scandinavian Immigrants in New York" author John O. Evjen included Jan "Snedingh" in his unclassified names section. He wrote: "Jan Snedingh (Snedinck, Smedingh, Snediger) a tavernkeeper in New Amsterdam (1648), magistrate of the Midwout (1654), was possibly from the manor of Snedige, Denmark, that had been owned by families like the Grubbes and Trolles. He was married. When Nicolaes de Meyer sued him in 1658, for about 350 guilders, the wife of Snedingh appeared for her sick husband, who claimed he could not pay before the corn would be ripe. It was told in court that Mrs. Snediger, when requested to pay the plaintiff, had said, "Where there is nothing, Caesar has lost his right." In 1659 Snedigh sued Matthys Boon for "fl.10., balance of fl. 14. one pair of stockings, one pair of shoes for his son's wages." In 1660 he sued the Swede (or Finn) Moenes Pietersen. He had hired a house from the defendant for twenty-four gl. a year. After six months he moved out. He paid thirteen guilders to Pietersen, who seized eleven guilders with Jan van der Bilt, Snedingh's money; he also let a new party move into the house. The court decided that Snedingh had a right to the eleven guilders -- Snedingh sold timber and kept boarders in 1660-1661. In 1663 he was sued for taking away bricks from the strand and removing them to his house. The Schout demanded that he "shall be condemned to go to prison and there to remain on bread and water for the term of one month or to redeem the same with a sum of 100 guilders with costs." Snedingh answered, he was innocent of having so done, as the bricks were not in a heap, but lay scattered around and that he saw some boys there picking up bricks. He claimed therefore that he could not be fined. The court thought differently, and fined him twenty-five guilders."

My son Johanes is to pay all just debts and funeral charges out of that part of my estate which I have made over to him this day by deed under my hand and seal, and that of Catharine, my wife; I also leave to him all farming utensils, and all carpenter tools and weaving looms, and my gun and sword and silver cup, weighing about 8 ounces, also my bed and bedstead in the east room, and my negro "C'sar." "I leave to my wife Catharine all the goods she brought with her to me when I married unto her;" And while she remains my widow she is to have 1/4 of my orchard and 2 cows and the use of one room and the leanto and cellar, as much as she shall have occasion for. I leave to my eldest son Gerritt my Great Bible, and to my son Johanes one Book of Sermons preached by Bernardus Freeman, and printed anno 1721; Also a weaving loom. Johannes Snedecker was appointed Captain of a company of the Dutchess/Orange Co. colonial militia in 1746. He was a patriot during the Revolution and was captured with his son Garret and imprisoned in the Sugar House in New York City. Johannes caught the smallpox and died 28 Sep 1779 in prison.

They were living in Hempstead, L.I. in 1707 and removed to Tunis's tract in the Ponds Patent (near Congers, NY) as early as 1731.

On 7 Feb 1716 John Sands of Block Island, RI, gave a deed of his Quaspeck or Pond Patent land to his brother Edward Sands, of Cow's Neck in Queens Co., NY. On 5 March 1729 Edward Sands sold this property, which was approximately 1300 acres, to Theunis Snedeker of Hempstead, L.I. for £110. The property was located between the Hudson River on the north and east and the Demarest Kill, now the Hackensack River, on the west. The property extended north to Long Clove Mountain, which is the present Tilcom quarry, and East Mountain and south to what is now Congers-New City or Lake Road. On 27 March 1730 Theunis then sold his farm, of 200 acres, in Hempstead to Cornelius Polhemus for £1000. About this time Theunis moved to his Pond Patent land which was part of the precinct of Haverstraw in Orange Co., NY. This land is today located in Rockland County in the hamlets of Congers and Rockland Lake which is in the town of Clarkstown which was incorporated in 1791. There he and his sons Garret and Theodorus built the Snedeker homestead. After Theunis died, his sons gave each other quitclaim deeds on 22 May 1752.²
