The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

On 20 March 1804 (recorded 9 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:129) **Joseph Springer** of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to William Van Vorhaze of the same place, for \$20, 2 acres more or less, land and privileges in the Township of Franklin at Youpough, beginning W side of Ramapough River; mentioned W end of Bridge of William Van Voorhaze across Ramapough River; for privileges of cutting a Ditch to Erect Mills and Erecting Dam for purpose of said Mills; mentioned land of Samuel Bush. Signed by Joseph Springer. Witnessed by Henry Van Allen, Hendrick D. E. Verbruyck.¹

On 5 August 1810 (recorded 5 May 1812, Bergen Co. G2:324) William Van Voorhaze of the Township of Franklin, and

Ann, his wife, conveyed to Samuel P. Bush of the same place, for \$1,200., several lots: (1) 205 acres more or less in the Township of Franklin at Yopough; widow Ackerman; middle of Ramapough River; line of Peter Van Blarcom. (2) beginning at bridge of William Van Voorhazen; across Ramapough River. (3) 2 acres more or less, and equal half of right of cutting a ditch to erect mills; lands of Joseph Springer. Signed William V. Voorhase, Ann Van Voorhase (her mark). Witnessed by Mary Buggs (her mark) [Mary Boggs?].¹

On 1 November 1810 (recorded 6 February 1813, Bergen Co. H2:2??) Joseph Springer and Eve, his wife, pf Franklin Township conveyed to Peter Van Blarcom of the same place, for \$288., a lot in the County of Bergen at Jaughpaugh, on the W side of the Ramapough River, beginning at fording place of William Van Vorhase. Signed by Joseph Springer, Eve Springer. Witnessed by Peter Stormes, Henry S. Bertholf.¹

On 21 November 1810 (recorded 6 February 1813, Bergen Co. H2:284) Joseph Springer and Eve Springer of the Township of Franklin conveyed to Peter Van Blarcom of the same place, for \$69, 11-56/100 acres in the Township of Franklin. Signed by Joseph Springer, Eve Springer. Witnessed by Peter Stormes, Henry S. Bertholf.¹

He died in a hospital in Hagerstown, Maryland on March 17, 1862 of an unspecified disease.

Springer was born in Ulster Co., moved to Tompkins Co., NY with his parents, lived in Albion, NY, Williamsville, NY, Black Rock, NY, Seneca Co. OH, Erie Co., OH, Poweshiek Co., Newton Co., IA.
- **Julia Ann Springer**, b. 16 May 1818 Ulster Co., NY; d. 5 Dec 1890; buried Newton, IA; m. 10 Nov 1839 Seneca Co., OH, **George W. Kime**. He was b. 6 July 1817 VA. George W. and Julia Kime, very old settlers of Jasper County and well known there. The history of Jasper County states that Julia was born in Ulster County, New York, May 16, 1816; she moved to Ohio in 1837 and two years later was married to George W. Kime and they moved to Jasper County, Iowa, in 1852. Then, ten years afterwards, they moved to a place three miles south of West Union, Nebraska, where they remained until Mrs. Kime's death, December 5, 1890. Her remains were brought to Newton, Iowa, and interred in the cemetery here. George W. Kime, who spent the latter years of his life in retirement, died at the home of his son, Jarvis Kime, near Dunning, Nebraska, on December 22, 1898; his remains were interred beside his wife in the cemetery at Newton, Iowa. He was eighty-one and a half years of age, having been born in Virginia on July 6, 1817. He lived in his native state until seven years of age when he removed with his parents to Seneca County, Ohio, where he grew to manhood and was there married to Julia A. Springer on November 10, 1839, and their union resulted in the birth of three children, namely: Margaret E., who died in her seventeenth year; Jarvis M., who lives in Nebraska; and Mary, widow of David Finch of this sketch.
