The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Geesje Jans, widow, and her two (step?) sons, Joost Casparse Springsteen and Johannes Casperse Springsteen, arrived at New Amsterdam in 1652 from Groningen and in 1660 they joined the settlement at Bushwick.

Andrew Provost believed that the three sons of Caspar Springsteen (Johannes, Joost, Melchior) were probably step-children of Geesje Jans and that only Barbara and possibly a Jannetje Caspars who was a baptismal sponsor for some of the Springsteen children in Oct, 1695 were children of Geesje. The Springsteen family immigrated from Groeningen sometime before 1652. Caspar Springsteen's widow came to New Netherland with her three sons -- Joost, Johannes, and Melchior -- and her daughter -- Barbara. Caspar Springsteen the father must have died either shortly before they left, shortly after arriving or on the voyage.^{1,3}

Casper Springsteen, of Newtown, made his will 8 Nov 1723, some five years before his death. In it, he named wife Mary; sons Joris [Joost], Derrick, Abraham, and David; also a daughter Geertruy Miller. He named as executors "my brother Pieter Praa, my wife and my son Joris." In his will, he wrote: ...November 8, 1723. I, Caspar Springsteen, of Newtown, Queens County, being sick. I leave to my wife Mary, all household goods, and movables, and the best room in my house, and she shall keep what goods and movables she may think convenient for her use, and she is to have the use of all the estate, for her maintainance. I leave to my son Joris, my home farm and orchard and land adjoining. And 1/3 of the salt meadows, that part which I used to mow myself. And he is to pay what remains due on two bonds to Gertry Lott and Johannis Lott. And he is to pay to his brother Derrick, £50. I leave to my son Abraham, the house, barn, orchard, and land adjoining, bounded west by Jonathan Moore, east by Mr. Pumry (Pomeroy?), north and south by highways. And a piece of woodland lying near his, between the land of William Creed and the land of Jonathan Coe. Also 1/3 of a piece of salt meadow joining the meadow of Jonathan Coe and David Coe. I leave to my son David, the house and lot he now lives on, bounded east by George Remsen, north and west by Robert Field, south by highway. And a piece of wood land and cleared land, bounded north and west by land of David Coe, south by Richard Betts, north by highway. Also 1/3 of the salt meadow, that part which he commonly mows. My son David is to pay to my daughter, Gertry Miler, £50. After death of my wife, all the rest of movables to my 5 children. I make my wife, and my son Joris, and my brother [in-law], Peter Praw, executors. Witnesses, Robert Field, Samuel Wright, Josiah Herman. Proved, August 7, 1729.

On 1 March 1694/5, Machiell Palmentier of Bushwick deeded to Casper Jansen Smith and Mattyse Demaree a certain mill in the place and land there near Jacques ffontyne.

On 26 Jan 1695/6 Casper Jansen and Mattyse Demaree of Kings County, deeded to John Covert and John Meserole, Jr. the above mentioned mill.

On 19 Oct 1696, John Meserole, Jr. of Bushwick deeded to John Marsh of Kings Co., one-half of Grist Mill, commonly called Bushwick Mill, between meadow of Tunis Gysberts and Charles ffountaine, formerly in the possession of Casper Jansen Smith.

At about the time of the sale of his mill, Casper Janse settled at or near Tappan, Rockland County, NY.

Johannes Casperszen Sprinsteen emigrated in 1652 with his mother (or poss. stepmother), Geertje Jans and his brother, Joost Caspersze, another brother (Melchior?), and a sister or step-sister.¹

Johannes was one of the twenty-two men selected in 1660 by Director-General Stuyvesant to establish the new settlement on Long Island as Mespat, later known as Boswyck, within the area purchased by the West India Co., from the Indians in 1638, where prior attempted colonization had been destroyed by the savages in 1643 and 1655. As a participant Johannes was allotted his prorata share of land, about 35 acres, as well as a residence and a garden within the palisaded Boswyck village. In 1663, he and his brothers were members of the militia, assembled and trained for community defence. When the threat of attack had become greatly reduced, he leased on November 18, 1666, for four years, from Claertie Vernier the Bushwick farm inherited from her husband, Capt. Ryck Lydecker, who died that year.¹

Thereafter, Johannes resided at Boswyck for only a brief period. His removal to Cripplebush is considered to have taken place at about the time of or shortly after, the expiration of his leasehold, and quite certainly before 1675, since his name does not appear on the Bushwick rate list of that year. As Johannes Caspars, Feb 17, 1677/78, he bought from Minne Johannes, who immigrated in 1663, Wood Lot No.8 in the New Lots of Flatbush, which property he sold Oct 20, 1684 to Jan Dircksen Van Vliet, who immigrated in 1664. As Johannes Kaspars, he was listed in 1683 as a Brooklyn property owner, and in 1687, at Brooklyn, he took the oath of allegiance, and stated he had been in this land for 35 years.¹

At Brooklyn Dutch Church, April 6, 1684, Johannes Casperse with wife Maria Teunisse, and son Caspar Jansen, was baptismal sponsor for two children of his brother Joost Casparse.

As Johannes Casparse living at "Crupebos" in Kings County, he made his Will April 4, 1693, probated May 14, 1694, naming wife Maria Johannes, and daughters Jannetje, Barbara, Mettie and Anna. The Will having as witnesses Matthys Cornelissen, Jacobus Vandewater and Jaques Cousseau, his then prospective son-in-law. This Will, published merely in abstract form, cannot be construed as definite evidence that Johannes (3) Casparse did not have surviving son, or sons, whose patrimonial claims he may have felt had theretofore been satisfied. He did have a son Theunis of baptismal record, May 6, 1674, who may, or may not have survived his father.¹

He also unquestionably, had a son Caspar, born about 1660 but not found of baptismal record, whose recorded church appearances with Johannes Caspars and Maria Teunis, as well as his like appearances with Joost (2) and Mechior (2) Casperse brothers of Johannes Casperse, and with Barbara (Springsteen) DeGroot sister of Johannes (2) Caspers, establish Caspar, beyond reasonable doubt, as such son. This Caspar (3) is again found of record, 1693, and thereafter, at Tappan, Rockland County, N.Y. where in the Dutch Church some of his issue including three sons, are of baptismal record, and in which area Barbara DeGroot, his aunt, and Casper Melchior, his cousin, had become settlers.
