

-- STEINMETS, STYNMETS --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

**Steinmets, Stynmets, etc.**

Casparus Steinmets arrived in New Amsterdam in 1631 and became a trader with the Indians at Albany. He lived at Ahasimus until driven out by Indians in 1655. He went to New Amsterdam, where on 22 Feb 1656 he was licensed to tap beer and wine. He later removed to Bergen where he was admitted to the rights of a small burgher 11 Apr 1657. He was a lieutenant of the Bergen militia and was later made captain (4 Sep 1673). He was a representative from Bergen in the 1st and 2nd General Assembly in New Jersey.

CASPAR STEYNMETS was born in Holland; it is said at Schiedam, but the exact time or place has not been authenticated. He arrived in New Amsterdam in 1631 and with his brother sailed up the river to Albany, and there became prominent in trading with the Indians. His oldest child, named after him, was baptized in 1650; his wife being Dorothea Arentsen (Van Wagenen). At her death he married again Jenneetje Gerritsen (Van Wagenen) of Ahasimus. He therefore became connected by marriage with both of the distinct branches of the Van Wagenen family, that of Esopus and that of Bergen. Steynmets purchase a plot of land on Winkle Street, near Fort Amsterdam. In 1652, he removed to New Jersey and purchased a "Bouwery" in Ahasimus. Here he combined the two businesses of farming and trading and became well-to-do. The Indian troubles forced him back to New Amsterdam but he returned in 1658 and lived within the Bergen Township limits until his death in 1702. All of his children were baptized in the old church at the fort. He was organizer of a company of militia and was commissioned lieutenant and later became captain. He was well educated and his knowledge of the Indian language made him valuable as an interpreter in their dealings with the whites. After the English occupation in 1664, he was continued in office

by Governor Philip Carteret, having previously been made a judge by Governor Stuyvesant. In 1671, he was married, for the third time, to the widow of Michael Tades, and moved to her farm in Ahasimus. At her death he gave the home farm to his sons John and Gerrit, but continued to live in the homestead until his death. He was buried in the old Bergen cemetery. John Steynmets willed his portion of the farm to his sister, Joanna Prior, and she in turn gave it to her son, Jacob Prior.

In his will, he wrote: ...May 8, 1750. I, Benjamin Steymets, of Gravesend, in Kings County, being very sick. I leave to my wife Sarah the use of all my real and personal estate during her life or widowhood, to maintain and bring up my children. After her death or marriage, all my estate to my 8 children, Christopher, John, Peter, Benjamin, Thomas, Geritt, George, and Neeltie. To be divided when my youngest child is 15 years of age. I leave to my son Christopher my smith tools "for his better support." I leave to my daughters Hannah and Sarah each £15. My negro woman "Cate" and my 2 negro children are to be sold by my executors to pay debts. If any of my children shall be able to buy my real estate they shall have the preference before any stranger. I make Samuel Garretson and James Hubbard executors. Witnesses, John Buys, Cornelius Emmans, Jacobus Rider. Proved, April 25, 1762.

Marriage intention for his (2) marriage filed in NYC Ref Ch on 31 March 1652: "Caspar Steynwits (sic!), widower of Dorothea Aestens (sic!), and Jannetje Gerrits, young woman from Zutphen."

Caspar's third marriage was recorded in the DRC at Bergen, NJ: "Casper Steynmets (widower) and Treyntje Jacobs (widow) were married on 15 March 1671 before the court at Bergen."

A footnote on page 78 of Charles H. Winfield's "History of the Land Titles of Hudson County, NJ." Winfield says (in part): "At what time Steinmets came to this country does not appear. In the spring of 1652, having lost his first wife, he married Jannekin Gerrits, of Zutphen, probably living at Harsimus at that time. For his third wife he married Tryntje, the widow of Jacob Stoffelson. He resided at Harsimus and was driven out by the Indians in 1655. He went to New Amsterdam, where, on 22 February 1656, he was licensed to tap beer and wine...After his marriage with Stoffelsen's widow, he took possession of the West India Company's farm at Harsimus..."

Gasper Stenmets of Bergen County, took the Oath of Allegiance to the King, 22 Nov 1665.<sup>3</sup>

On 20 May 1673: "Gasper Steenmits and wife Trenica Wallens, formerly wife of Jacob Stoffelsen, forbidden to fence land at Horsemes, leased to them by Gov. Nichols of New York on 1 March 1667" According to one document, A committee had examined the petition of Caspar Steenmets in behalf of Trenica Wallens his wife to the second farm at Harsimus, granted 5 March 1665 to Jacob Stoffelsen, then husband of Tryntje Wallings.<sup>2</sup>
