The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Signed by Richd. Dyckman, Libah Dyckman. Witnessed by Henry Van Dalsem, Garret A. Lydecker.¹

On 6 July 1806 (recorded 1 Aug 1806 Bergen Co. Y:195) Garret Dykman of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to Abraham Stevens of the same place, for \$360., 16 acres strict measure in the Township of Franklin, beginning north west line of Ramapough Patent, being corner of lot of Lodiwick Bush, formerly Thomas Ackerson's, and line of lot now belonging to Conradt Fisher; line of James L. Ackerman; middle of road; near school house; public highway. Signed by Garret Dikeman. Witnessed by Abrm. Post; Abrm. Willis; John Van Houten.¹

Leaves to his eldest son Peter, £3, when of age, in honor of his birth right. Dated May 11, 1688. (No witnesses named.) New York, on the 25 of June, 1698, the will of Isaac Stevenson, annexed, was proved, and his wife Margaret is confirmed as executor.

In her will, she wrote: I, Margaret Stevens, of New York, widow, being sick. I leave to my daughter, Elizabeth Mauritz, widow, £50. To my daughter Margaret King, widow, my biggest China dish. To Elizabeth Noxon (late Elizabeth Pascoe), wife of Bartholomew Noxon, one of my lots of ground in the Commons of New York, which is marked in a certain map of a certain parcel of land formerly belonging to my deceased brother Jacob Leisler, as Lot No. 131. To my daughter, Elizabeth Mauritz, all my apparell, and to my two daughters, all the rest of my estate, and make them executors. Dated February 3, 1731. In his will, he wrote: February 9, 1727, in the First year of King George II. I, John Stevenson, of the Borrough Town of Westchester, Gentleman, being sick. My executors are to pay all debts. I leave to my wife Abigail, the use of 1/2 of all estate, during such time as she shall remain my widow and no longer. Also the south half of my dwelling house, and 1/2 of all other buildings. Also the use of 1/2 the ferry from Westchester to Long Island, for which I have a lease. I leave to my son Edward, on condition that he pay legacies, 1/2 of all lands and meadows in Westchester, and 1/2 of all my privileges in the Common lands, and of my dwelling house and buildings, and of the ferry. And the whole after the death of my wife. And he is to pay these legacies. To my sons, James, John, and Benjamin, £80 each, when of age. If he neglects or refuses, my executors are to sell lands. I leave to each son, a mare colt of the pacing breed. My executors are to sell all my lands, meadows, and privileges in Newtown and Jamaica, on the Island of Nassau, commonly called Long Island. And from the money they are to pay to my three daughters, Mary Jones, Charity, and Abigail, £100 each. The rest to be put at interest to bring up my sons, James, John, and Benjamin, till of age, and then the principal to be divided among them. I leave all my wearing apparell to my four sons. I leave to my nephew, Cornelius Verdine, when of age, 100 acres of land, out of the first tract of land that shall be taken up in the Western Division of New Jersey, by virtue of a warrant, dated November 4, 1724, to take up the quantity of 1875 acres in said Western Division. If he dies under age, then to my sons, James, John, and Benjamin. All the rest of my lands in the Western and Eastern Divisions of New Jersey, are to be divided among my sons, James, John, and Benjamin. I leave to my wife, 1/4 of personal estate, except money due to me. Whereas I have given to my daughter Mary, wife of Evan Jones, £200 in cash, and a mare and saddle of the Value of £15, and my mother-in-law, Mary Perkins, late deceased, has given her considerable value, my daughters, Charity and Abigail, shall have £215 each as an equivalent, and the rest of my personal estate to my three daughters. The share of Abigail to be paid when she is 18. I make my wife, and my son Edward, and my uncles, Robert Field and Jonathan Whitehead, and Col. William Willett, and my brothers, Elnathan and William Stevenson, executors. Witnesses, Thomas Baxter, James Baxter, William Forster. Proved, May 10, 1728. Abigail Stevenson, Edward Stevenson, Robert Field, Elnathan Stevenson, and William Stevenson, were all "of the People called Quakers."

He graduated from King's College (now Columbia) in 1768, and shortly afterwards was admitted to the bar. He practiced law very little, spending his life in engineering experiments.¹

Anna Stuyvesant Bayard (the sister of Gov. Peter Stuyvesant), owned 564 acres at Hoboken. Her great grandson William Bayard had inherited the property, but became a Loyalist and it was confiscated. It was purchased by Col John Stevens (a steamboat inventor), who was Treasurer on Horseback, of the New State of NJ, during the American Revolution. Stevens Institute was founded on the grounds in 1870, by Edwin Augustus Stevens, his son, who was married to Martha Bayard Dod, a collateral descendant of William Bayard.

In his will, he wrote: Newtown in Queens County, on Nassau Island. I, Thomas Stevensen, because of the uncertainty of this life and the certainty of Death. I leave to my wife, Jean Stevensen, 1/2 of the Plantation on which I now dwell, with the now house I live in, and 1/2 of the orchard and meadow, and a piece of land lying in the Town Plot of Newtown and bounded on the north by Pullis (?) and Joseph Ketcham's meadow and upland, west by Job Vonglit's upland and meadow, south and east by Coe's mill creek. And another piece lying in Frayes (?) neck meadow, so called, during her natural life. Also 1/2 of my personal estate, except a negro man. I leave to my son, Steven Stevensen, the other half of my said lands and meadows, and a negro man. I leave to my two sons-in-law, Thomas Betts and Samuel Thorne, a piece of salt meadow, lying on the east side of Newtown, being my share of salt meadow, except an Island of meadow lying next to the upland, which I give to my son Steven. I leave to my grandsons, Thomas Stevensen, son of John Stevensen, of New Jersey, and Thomas Stevensen, son of Daniel Stevensen, of Newtown, all that my 1000 acres of land lying in West New Jersey, which I bought of my son, John Stevensen; To be divided equally. I leave to my daughter, Sarah Stevensen, the remainder of my movables, plate excepted, and my best bed with its furniture, and my best riding horse. I leave to my grandson, Jennings Stevensen, son of my eldest son, William Stevensen, of West New Jersey, £10. I make my wife and my son Daniel, and my nephew, John Stevensen, executors.
