The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Stillwell

The original name said to have been Cooke, it being said that in Charles I's time Nicholas, Jasper and John Cooke, brothers, were forced to leave England on account of persecution, and fled in disguise to Holland (about 1630) where they assumed the surname of Stillwell (their mother being a Still and Wells the family residence). Nicholas seems to have tendered his services to the Queen of Bohemia and served under her. About 1638 all three brothers came to America. John returned to England and served and was executed as one of Charles I's regicides. Jasper settled in Connecticut and d. at Gilford.

Nicholas purchased a farm in 1639. The location is said to be near present 34th street, New York City. He was a tobacco planter. At one time he commanded a Dutch troop against the Indians. Later he became a magistrate at Gravesend, L. I., and, about 1664, settled on Staten Island. His English wife was Abigail Hopton (daughter of Robert Hopton), who perhaps, d. abroad. His second wife was Ann Van Dyke. He d. Dec. 28, 1671, at Dover, S. I. His sons were Richard, Nicholas, William, Thomas, Daniel and Jeremiah. Jeremiah's son Richard had sons Nicholas and Thomas. This Thomas had a son Nicholas, b. 1705, who settled at White House, N. J., and was the ancestor of the Hunterdon co. Stillwell family, some of whom settled in Somerset. -- Honeyman, A. In his will, he wrote: February 14, 1760. I, Daniel Stillwell, of Richmond County, being sick. I leave to my wife Catharine the use of all my estate until my son Abraham is of age, if she remains my widow. Also £100. I leave to my son and heir, Richard Stillwell, that part of my farm or Plantation which lyes below the road that leads from the Smoking Point to the Fresh Kill lands and meadow (except 3 acres of salt meadow, which I purchased of John Brown), and 5 acres of woodland lying next to the land of Tunis Van Pelt, and he is to pay to his brother Daniel £170. I leave to my son, Nicholas Stillwell, all that part of my farm that lies above or at the south side of the above-mentioned road (except 5 acres given to his brother Richard), and 3 acres of salt meadow which I purchased of John Brown, and he is to pay to his brother Abraham £170. I leave to my daughter Catharine £100 and a negro girl. To my daughter Hester £100 and a negro girl, and the same to my daughter Mary. The rest of my estate I leave to all my children. If my wife should marry before my son Abraham is 21 she shall have her legacy of £100, and remove off from my estate. My executors may sell land to pay legacies. I make my wife and father-in-law, Nicholas Larzelear, and my son Richard executors.

In his will, he wrote: Elias Stillwell, New York, cooper. To my wife Elizabeth, all my estate, real and personal, during her widowhood, until my children arrive at age of twenty-one years; in case my wife should marry during the minority of my children, I empower my executors to sell and dispose of all my estate, the money so arising therefrom to be equally divided between my wife, my son Elias, and my daughter, Anna Stillwell; if either of my children die during their minority, that the share of the one so dying shall be divided between the survivors. I appoint Burger Vandewater, Philip Ebert, and my wife Elizabeth, executors. Dated December 14, 1796. Witnesses, James Harper, grocer, Thos Hazard, tanner & currier, Gilbt. V. Mater. Proved, May 25, 1797.

John received a patent for 160 acres of land on Staten Island which was previously taken up by his grandfather, Nicholas Stillwell, and settled there in 1693. In 1693 was High Sheriff of Richmond County. In 1702 was a delegate to the General Assembly and continued so until his death.

In his will, he wrote: 16 day, 1724. "I, John Stillwell, being in perfect memory and senses, Blessed be God." I leave to my wife my dwelling house in which I now live, and the lot on which it stands, during her life, and then to my two sons Richard and Thomas, and I leave to them all my land in the County of Richmond. I leave to my son John all my Plantation called Garratts Hill in the township of Middletown in New Jersey, and all my lands lying near the said Plantation, with the Poplar Lots, and 1/2 of my meadows in said township. I leave to my sons Joseph and Daniel all my land lying at a place called Parrassye in said township, and one house lot and orchard in Middletown, and the other 1/2 of my meadows in said township, and my son Joseph is to have his choice in the division. And I give my rights in all other lands in New Jersey to my sons John, Joseph, and Daniel. I give to my granddaughter, Rebecca Salter, £5. To my daughter, Alice Stillwell, £80. To my daughter, Mary Stillwell, £80. I leave to my wife Rebecca, 1/3 of all the rest of my movable estate, and the other 2/3 to my 8 children above named. I appoint my wife and my brother Richard Stillwell, and my two sons, John and Richard, executors, and Trustees for my three youngest children. Witnesses, Thomas Walton, Martha Rue, Richard Walton. Proved, January 17, 1725/6.

Lt. Nicholas Stillwell came from an old English family. He emigrated from County Surrey in England to Virginia before 1639, when he was made a tobacco viewer of a district on the Charles River. He came with his brothers John and Jasper, and his two young sons, Richard and Nicholas to America about 1638. Having engaged in a land controversy between Virginia and Maryland, he fled northwards in 1645 and settled at Deutil Bay [Turtle Bay] in New Amsterdam, calling his tobacco plantation there "Hopton." In 1648 he bought a house, lot and farm in Gravesend on Long Island, where he lived and became a magistrate. In 1660 all were ordered to live within the village for greater safety from the Indians, but he obtained permission to remain on his bouwry between Gravesend and New Utrecht, as he had so many sons he could defend it. At the time of the English conquest of 1664, he upheld the Dutch. At odds with his English neighbors, he sold his plantation and removed to New Amsterdam, but by 1670 had settled at Old Dorp on Staten Island, where he died 28 Dec 1671.

Nicholas Stillwell is recorded (as Nicolas Stillewel) on 25 Nov. 1646, as deeding a house and lot to Jan Jansen Schepmoes. This house and lot was "on the north side of the Graft, on the island of Manhattan."⁴

On 6 June 1668 Nicolaes Stilleweil and Annetie, wit. bp. at NYC Ref Ch, of Pieter, son of Pieter Belou & Francyn de Bou.

In his will, Nicholas Stillwell, Staten Island, "Husbandman," "being weak and sicke," leaves to youngest son Jeremiah an iron gray mare. Leaves to "well beloved and affectionate wife Anne" all lands, houses, and estate, and makes her executor.

Dated December 22, 1671. Witnesses, Nicholas De Meyer, Richard Charlton. Letters of Administration granted to wife Anne, June 17, 1672.

On 29 December 1672 Anne Van Dyke married (2) **William Wilkens**: "William Wilking to Ann Stillwell, widow of Gravesend."³ William Wilkins died 1676, and Anne m. (3) License dated 13 Jan 1679, **William Foster**.

In his will, dated 18 Dec 1687, probated 2nd Tues. in March 1687, William Foster, of Jamaica, mentioned to wife Hannah, life use of home and a third of the personal estate, with remainder to dau. Deborah, who is to live with Mrs. Rebecca Woolsey till aged 18. Bequest to John, son of Nicholas Stillwell. Residue to daus. Mary & Deborah. Mr. William Nichols, exr. Wits; Benjamin Thurston & Richard Jones.⁶

He came with his father to American in 1638. In 1664 he was appointed one of the Justices of the West riding of Yorkshire, under the Duke of York. In 1688 he was commissioned one of the Justices of the Quorum, under James II., and in 1680 received a similar commission under William and Mary. In 1691 was a member of the first colonial Assembly, as a Delegate from Kings County.

Signed his name Nicolaes Stillwell in 1662.

The will of John Bayles, 1682, leaves 7 pounds to Elyas Stilwell, sonne of Nicholas Stilwell and my daughter Rebecca, his wife, deceased.² In the will, he wrote: I, John Bayles, Jamaica, October 18, 1682. Makes wife Rebecca executor. Leaves to son John 5s. Leaves to son Elias the meadow at furthest east neck, with the orchard, and 3 acres at the lower end of Great meadow. To sons Thomas and Jonathan all the rest of houses, lands and meadows. To daughter Elizabeth Hubbard £10. Legacies to daughter Mary Hewlett, Damoris Lyns, Abigail Smith, Ruth and Rebecca. Leaves to Elias, son of Nicholas Stilwell and my daughter Rebecca, £10. Leaves to his wife Rebecca household goods. Mentions grand child, John Bayles. Not witnessed. Proved December 13, 1682.³

In his will, Nicholas Stillwell wrote: 19th of January, 1715. I, Nicholas Stillwell, of Gravesend, in Kings County, being weak in body. I leave to my wife Elizabeth £40, and a negro woman, and she is to remain in possession of all tenements and lands, and to have two horses, and use of a waggon and "Slay" and furniture, until the 1st day of August, 1717. I leave to my son Nicholas £100, and a negro boy. To the children of my son Elias, £25. All the rest of my estate to my sons Nicholas, John, Richard, and Thomas, and to my daughters, Anne Christopher, and Mary Johnson, and the children of my son Elias, and my grand children, John Emans, Nicholas Emans, Abraham Emans, Isaac Emans, and Catharine Emans. I make my sons Nicholas and Richard executors. Witnesses, Samuel Hubbard, Thomas Craen, Elias Hubbard. Proved March 5, 1715/16.

In their marriage record they were: Thomas Stillwell of Gravesend to Martha Balein [Billeau] of Staten Island.

They lived on Staten Island at New Lots of the Old Town (later Garretsons and now Dongan Hills).

Thomas Stillwell was an important man on Staten Island: constable, sheriff, magistrate, captain of the militia, and member of the Colonial Assembly. His only son predeceased him.

In his will, he wrote: In the name of God, Amen. I, Thomas Stillwell, of Staten Island, Esq., being sick and weak. I leave to Nicholas Stillwell, son of my son, Thomas Stillwell, deceased, all that Plantation or farm, commonly called Wallbours' farm, lying on the east side of the Old Town, and also one half of the meadow belonging to it; that is to say, that part of the meadow that lies next to the ditch. And the said Nicholas is to pay to his two sisters, Mary and Anne Stillwell, £50 each, when they come to the age of eighteen. And he is to pay to Martha Brittan, daughter of Benjamin Brittan, £--. If he die under age, then the land is to go to his sisters Mary and Anne, and they are to pay to Martha Brittan £100. I leave to my daughter Frances, wife of Nicholas Brittan, 60 acres of land joining to the land I now live on, as it is now in his possession, during her life, and then to her son Nicholas Brittan, and he is to pay to his sister, Mary Brittan, £25. I leave to my daughters, Anne and Rachel Stillwell, the message and tenement with all the housing and buildings and all the lot, and three quarters of a lot of land, with a lot of salt meadow at the Great Kill, marked No. 2, which is the land I now live upon, after my wife's decease, and they are to pay to my daughter, Frances Brittan, £50. I leave to my wife Martha, the use of all the estate I now live upon, for life, or during her widowhood, and make her sole executor, and my loving friends, John Stillwell and Abraham Taylor, Esq., and Richard Stillwell, Sr., overseers. Dated May 21, 1704. Witnesses, Nathaniel Whitman, Ellis Dusebury, Alex. Stuart. Proved before Thomas Wenham, Esq., being duly authorized by Lord Cornbury, May 9, 1705.¹

All the rest of my estate to my children Francis Brittain, Annie Billve, Rachel Brittain, and to Thomas Stillwell's three children, Nicholas, Jane, Musho (?), and to Mary Hoffer's two eldest daughters, Mary Jurne and Elizabeth Jurne. I make John Le Count and Richard Stillwell executors. March 3, 173 4/5. Witnesses, William Richman, Sarah Ramah, Ebenezer Salter. Proved, October 23, 1736.
