The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Elbert Elbertsen came from Nykerck in the province of Gelderland. He was a weaver by trade and sailed from Texel in Dec 1637 on the "Calmer Sleutel" ["Key of Kalmar"] at the age of 18.

According to Van Laer's Van Rensselaer Bowier Manuscripts (p. 395) Kiliaen van Rensselaer wrote to Peter Minuit on 29 December 1637 mentioning Jacob Planck and that "with him go the following young men engaged for my colony, to wit: Arent van Corler, assistant, 18 years old; Elbert Albertsen, 18 years old; Claes Jansen, 17 years old; Gerrit Hend[ricksen], 15 years old; Gijsb[ert] Arentsen, 22 years old." It appears to have been van Laer who added the information that Gysbert Arentsz was from Bunnick, near Utrecht, and the four other young men were all from Nykerck in Gelderland.

After his initial service at Rensselaerswyck, Elbert Elbertse evidently came to New Amsterdam. In their marriage intentions at the NYC Ref Ch, they were: Elbert Elbertsen, young man from Nieuwerkerken, and Aeltje Cornelis, widow of Gerrit Wolfertzen.

They settled at Flatlands, L. I. He was long a justice of the peace and held other important offices. His first known use of the surname "Stoothof" may have occurred when one Elbert Stoothof was the witness at a baptism on 5 Sep 1684. If this is Elbert the younger, it may well be that the immigrant did not use the Stoothoff surname in earlier times when there were fewer people in New Netherland and surnames were not as necessary to distinguish one individual from another.

In an 'Answer to the Representation of New Netherland' by Cornelis van Tienhoven, 1650,[in his list of] some descriptions of the persons who have signed the remonstrance, he included...Elbert Elbertsen came to the country as a farmer's boy at about ten or eleven years of age, in the service of Wouter Van Twyler, and has never had any property in the country. About three years ago he married the widow of Gerret Wolphertsen (brother of Jacob Van Couwenhoven) and from that time to this has been indebted to the Company, and would be very glad to get rid of paying.¹

In her will, she wrote (translated from Dutch): ...I, Sarah Roeloffse, late widow of Elbert Elbertse Stouthoff, considering the frailty and shortness of Human life, Do make my last will in manner following. 1st. I commit my immortal Soul into the merciful hands of God Almighty, and my body to a decent burial. 2nd. I revoke all other wills. Now I will before anything else to my daughter Blandina, of this city, a negro boy, Hans. To my son Luycas Kierstede, my Indian, named Ande. To my daughter Catharine Kierstede, a negress, named Susannah. To my son in-law, Jacobus Kip, husband of my said daughter Catharine, my negro, Sarah, in consideration of great trouble in settling the accounts of my late husband, Cornelius Van Borsum, in Esopus and elsewhere. To my son Jochem Kierstede, a little negro, called Maria, during his life, and then to Sarah, the eldest daughter of my daughter Rachel Kierstede by her husband, Ytie Kierstede. To my son Johannes Kierstede, a negro boy, Peter. I leave to my daughter Anna Van Borsum, by my former husband, Cornelius Van Borsum, on account of her simplicity, my small house and kitchen, and lot situate in this city, between the land of Jacob Marits and my bake house, with this express condition, that she shall not be permitted to dispose of the same by will or otherwise, but to be hers for life and then to the heirs mentioned in this will. "It is my will that my son Luycas Kiersted shall have the privilege of buying the house where he now lives and the bake house and lot belonging to the same and to pay the money for the same to the other heirs, he to retain his share. I have fully satisfied my sons Hans Kierstede and Roeloff Kiersted for their share in their father's estate, being 40 Beavers, as by account for the same, the rest of my estate I leave to the seven children of me and my deceased husband, Hans Kierstede, viz, Roeloff, Blandina, Johannes, Luycas, Catharine, Jacobus, Rachel, and the children of my deceased son Hans Kierstede by his wife Janike equally. Only Hans Kierstede the eldest son of my deceased son Hans Kierstede shall have £1 for his birth right. I appoint as guardians of my daughter Anna Von Borsum, and managers of her house and lot my son-in-law Jacobus Kip, and my son Kierstede, and my son-in-law Wm. Teller, giving them full power as executors." Dated July 29, 1692. Witnesses, Wm. Bogardus, Jacob Maurits, (???) Hoaglandt. Codicil, August 7, 1693, confirms the above will and leaves all her clothing to her daughters Blandina, Catharine and Rachel, "and to each of the wives of my 5 sons a silver spoon." Witness Peter Schuyler, Justice of the Peace. Proved, October 21, 1693. Certificate of Wm. Bogardus and Dirck Hoaglandt that they did see the testatrix seal and publish and declare the above instrument as her last will. New York, October 21, 1693. New York, October 21, 1693, Johannes Kip, Wm. Teller, Lucas Kierstede take the oath as executors of the will of Sara Roeloffs, before David Jamieson, clerk. The will of Sara Roeloffs proved before Governor Benjamin Fletcher and the same confirmed on October 21, 1693.

[NOTE.--Sara Roeloffse was the daughter of the famous Aneke Jans, by her first husband, Roeloff Jansen. Sara Roeloffse married first Hans Kiersted, "chirurgeon," after his death she married Cornelius Van Borsum, and her third and last husband was Elbert Elbertse Stouthoff. Her house was on the north corner of Pearl street and Whitehall. The small house left to her daughter Anna Van Borsum was next north of this. She was well acquainted with the Indian language and acted as interpreter for Peter Stuyvesant. It was at her first wedding that Governor Kieft, taking advantage of the condition of the guests "after the fourth or fifth drink," induced them to subscribe very liberally toward building a new church in the fort.--W.S.P.]

Grandchildren--Margaret, Johanna and Sarah (daughters of eldest son Garret, dec'd.), Albert Stotehoff and his sister, Anatje. Homefarm of 330 acres; 61 acres in Middlesex Co., on the road from New Brunswick to Rocky hill, bought of John Parker. Executor of John Harrison; 150 ac. on the South branch of Raritan River in Somerset Co., conveyed to testator by Harmanus Hoogland, May 12, 1739. Personal estate. Executors--sons William and John, and son-in-law, Abraham Hoogland. Witnesses--Cornelius Stoothoff, Henry Cortelyou and Petrus Nevius. Proved Nov. 18, 1756. (Lib. F, p. 388.) 1756, Nov. 20. Inventory, £778.13.11, incl. bonds and cash, £265.1.6; a silver cup and 3 spoons, £10; 4 negroes, £220; made by Cornelius Stoothoff and Henry Cortelyou.
