

-- **STRYCKER, STRIKER** --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Gerrit Strycker was listed on the 25 Sep 1683 Rate List of Amesfort (Flatlands), NY, with 2 men & one negro; 3 horses, 7 cows, 1 of 2 yrs., 1 of 1 yr., 2 oxen, 8 cows, 3 of 3 yrs., 6 of 2 yrs., 6 of 1 yr. [sic]; 2 morgens of land; valued at £.11.-.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Gerritt Strycker, of the town of Flatlands, in Kings County, being weak in body, my will is that my wife, Weyntie Strycker, shall remain in full possession of all estate, houses, and lands, but if she re-marry, then she shall deliver up one half before the solemnization of her marriage. And after her decease, all the estate is to go to my children, Eyda, Jacobus, Geesie, Maria, Catharine, Jannettie and Cornelius. My eldest son, Jacobus Strycker, is to have £12 10s as a free gift. Dated at the house of the testator, May 24, 1693, "and signed, sealed and published in the presence of the underwriters, the testator being in his full witt and understanding, for so much as we could see." Jacob Strycker, Coert Stenvense, Jacobus Vandewater.

Jacobus Gerritszen Strycker was a tailor in Amsterdam.

Jacobus Gerritszen Strycker was an artist. He was also a farmer, trader, magistrate, and "limner". His wife was Ytie Huybrechts, possibly related to the lady of the same surname, whose daughter at about the same time married Titus van Rijn, the son of a greater "limner," Rembrandt. Strycker came to New Netherland in 1651, a gentleman of considerable means and decided culture, and after a successful career died in 1687. He was Burgher in 1653 and afterwards Alderman of New Amsterdam, and also Attorney General Sheriff of the Dutch towns on Long Island up to August 1673. Very little of his work as an artist is known. Three of his portraits have been identified. He left a son, Gerrit, who became Sheriff of Kings' County in 1688, and a brother, Jan, who also left descendants.<sup>1</sup>

On 14 May 1644 appeared "Jacob Gerritsz from Dwinglo, journeyman tailor on Nieuwestraet [Amsterdam], 26 years old, assisted by his uncle Heyndrick Lucassz from Meppel, a tailor in St. Jacobsstraat, and Ytie Huyberts living on the Oude Heregracht, assisted by her mother, Janneke Harmes." The marriage took place on 29 Jul 1644.<sup>2</sup>

Ytie's father, Huibert died before the baptism of his son -- Huibert -- on 17 Nov 1619. On 17 Apr 1621 Jannetje Harmes married (2) Jan Heyndricksz, a laborer in the Two Crowns soap factory in Amsterdam. Jannetje Harms and her second husband had a son -- Hendrick Jans -- who would have been the half-brother to little Ytie Huyberts and her brother, Huybert Huybertsz. Jan Hendricksz d. before 30 Jan 1652.<sup>2</sup> Jacob Strycker in Netherlands on 30 Jan 1652 made a contract with Jannetje Hermans, "last widow of Jan Hendricks" workman in the soap factory "The Two Crown", at Amsterdam. Jannetje declared she had very little means and was now an old woman, 60 years old. She transferred all of her possessions to her son in law, Jacob Strycker, who was to take her free of charge to New Netherland and to support her there.<sup>3</sup>

Jan Strycker, from Ruinen, Province of Drenthe, Holland, b. 1614, came to New Amsterdam in 1652 with wife and four children; was one of the founders of Flatbush in 1654, and chief magistrate there.

His probable brother was Jacobus Gerritse Strycker, some of whose descendants also settled in Somerset Co., NJ.

Soon after his arrival in 1654, he took the lead in founding a Dutch colony at Midwout (Flatbush), where the same year he was selected as Chief Magistrate of the settlement.<sup>1</sup>

His son Gerrit settled in Somerset Co., NJ, as did children of son Pieter.

In the Flatbush Ref Ch record of their (3) banns and marriage, they were: Jan Strijcker, widower of Lambertje Seubering, residing in Midwood, with Swaantje Jans, widow of Cornelis De Potter, living under Brooklyn, at the ferry.

In the Flatbush Ref Ch record of their (4) marriage they were: Jan Strijcker, last widower of Swaentje Jans, and Tuentie



Tuenes, last widow of Jacob Hellaken.

With his wife Lambertje Seubering, two sons and four daughters, Jan Strijcker (who came in 1652) hailed from Ruinen, in the province of Drenthe.

He helped found the Dutch colony at Midwout (Flatbush), where he was Chief Magistrate of the settlement, and served in various civil and military capacities.

In his will, he wrote: ...October 24, 1768. I, John Stryker, of Flatbush, in Kings County, being weak in body. After all debts are paid, I leave to my son Peter my silver-hilted sword for his Birth right before any division. I leave to my youngest son Michel my Great Dutch Bible, "which heretofore belonged to his grandfather, Michel Hanse Bergen." Also all my farming tools and all my real estate, wherever situated, "except 7 acres in Flatbush, being the place where my grandfather, Jan Stryker, deceased, lived, bounded west by the street, south by Dominicus Vanderveer, north by the School Pasture, and east to be bounded by a line drawn from the School Pasture to said Dominicus Vanderveer's orchard, the same course with the most easterly line of said School Pasture." And he shall pay to my executors œ400 for my 10 children, viz.: Peter, Johanes, Antye, Magdalena, Abraham, Sammetye, Jacobus, Margaritie, Michel, and Femitie "each one just tenth," and to be paid in three years. And 3 years later he shall pay £400 to said children. I also leave to my son Michel all my right in the Flatbush Patent in the undivided lands conveyed to me by my father Peter Stryker, November 16, 1738. Also 1/2 of cattle and horses and my weaving loom. The lot reserved above I leave to my children, also all the rest of my real estate. And whereas my slaves have faithfully served me they shall have the choice of which of my children they will live with. I make my son Michel, and my brother, Peter Stryker, and Cornelius Vanderveer, executors. Witnesses, Peter Stryker, Jr., Geritt Stryker, Petrus Van Steenberg, schoolmaster. Proved, September 15, 1770.

In the Flatbush Ref Ch record of their marriage and banns, they were: Pieter Strijcker, young man from Midwood, residing there, with Annatje Barends, young lady from N. York, residing at N. Utrecht.

Peter Strycker was a patentee of Flatbush and was High Sheriff of Kings County in 1683. He was Captain of the Militia in 1689 and Judge of the Court from 1720-1722.<sup>1</sup>

Pieter Strycker, in 1710, bought a tract of 4,000 acres in Somerset Co., NJ, on which two of his sons and four of his grandchildren later settled.

Peter Strycker of Flatbush wrote his will on 23 April 1729, and it was proved on 27 March 1742. In his will he wrote: ...April 23, 1729. I, Peter Strycher, of Flatbush, in Kings County, being in health. I leave to my 7 children, John, Jacob, Barent, Peter, Hendrick, Zytie, wife of Aris Vanderbilt, and Lumitie, wife of Johannes Lott, all my personal estate, except that my son John shall have my silver hilted sword. I leave to my wife Aertie the use of the "Great southern room in my dwelling house in Flatbush, with liberty to pass through the house to the well to fetch water, or any other business, and she is to be maintained with all necessaries." I make my sons John and Peter executors. Witnesses, Martin Schenck, Adrian Hegeman, S. Gerritson. Proved, March 27, 1742.
