The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: Barnardus Swartwout, of New York, merchant, in order to prevent unnecessary disputes between my heirs and executors, as well as to do strict justice to my partner-in-trade and son, Barnardus Swartwout, Jr., I ratify and confirm an acquittal or transfer which I signed, October 21, 1794, made to my son Barnardus, by which I transferred to him and his heirs all the stock-in-trade, which comprehends all lumber, merchandise, cash obligations of all kinds, debts due to our partnership, with all account papers and every kind of transaction relative to the partnership between my son and myself which is known by the firm of Barnardus Swartwout and Son. I do therefore for myself, my heirs and executors, relinquish from all benefits, proceeds, or profits that have or may arise from Partnership; before any sale or division of my real property is made, I give to my wife Elizabeth, during her life or widowhood only, the house and lot of ground in which I now reside, with the furniture therein, and my negro woman, Flora; at her death or remarriage the aforesaid house, ground, and wench be sold by my executors, and the net proceeds thereof shall be equally divided among my children; within two years after my death, all my houses, stores, and lots of ground on which they stand, vacant lots, water lots, the farm in the County of West Chester, and the land at Wappings Creek, Dutchess County, and all and any real property I shall own, shall be sold by my executors, and the proceeds, after deducting my just debts and funeral charges, and depositing with my son Barnardus, £800, the interest only of which is to be applied for the use of my wife, and which I charge him to pay her annually during her life or widowhood only, and at the expiration of either, the principal shall be equally divided among my surviving children or their heirs--the residue of the sales of my real property be equally divided among my children, Barnardus, Hannah Van Steenberg, Catharine Chrystie, Mary McIntyre, and Hester Montross, or their respective lawful heirs; if any of my children die before the division of my real property, such share shall be divided among the surviving children or their heirs; whereas, my sons-in-law owe me money on various accounts, I direct that the amount of my said demands against them be considered as so much money advanced to their respective wives (my daughters), and which debts must be deducted from their several shares or portions; my daughter, Catharine Chrystie, to have the use as her own the lower front room and front room on the second floor, with a privilege in the kitchen, garret, and yard in the house which I left to my wife during her widowhood, and for which time my daughter Catharine is to have the above-mentioned privilege. I appoint my son Barnardus and my son-in-law, Nathaniel Montross, executors. Dated November 3, 1794. Witnesses, Thomas Hook, Joseph Newton, Thos Gilbert. Proved,

I leave to my wife during widowhood the use of all my real estate, but in case she marries she shall have the income of 1/2 my lands and one negro wench, and a bed and furniture. I leave to my son Thomas, £60, or the choice of one of my negroes, for his birthright. All the rest of my estate I leave to my sons, Thomas, Cornelius, Adolphus, Samuel, and Jacobus. I leave to my daughters, Jacomintie and Catharine, £25. Also legacies to my daughters Elizabeth and Janetie. I make my sons, Thomas and Cornelius, and Theodorus Van Wyck and John Brinckerhoff, executors. Witnesses, John Rail, Stephen Ladow, Jacob Graer. Proved, June 19, 1749.

He lived at Swartwoutville in Dutchess County, NY. He was an important officer in the state militia in the Revolution; later becoming a General. He was for many years an assemblyman and senator. He purchased 384 acres at Rockland Lake in what

is today Rockland County, which his son, Derrick, occupied and later inherited.

He lived on a Farm on Sprout Creek. Later known as Swartwoutville, Dutchess County, NY. Baron Von Steuben stayed in his house. Old house, sold ca. 1789 to the DRC at Fishkill, Hopewell and New Hackensack, as a parsonage. He bought it back, and left it to his son Jacobus. New house up the road, left to his dau Aeltje. He began his military career, in 1759, as the Captain of a company under Lord Jeffrey Amherst at Ticonderoga and Crown Point, during the French and Indian War. He served in the American Revolution, rising to the rank of Col and commanding a Dutchess County Rgt of Minutemen (1776-80), serving at the Highlands and in the NYC area. Brig Gen, NY Militia, Mar 1780 to 1794. He was also an Assemblyman (1777-83) and State Senator (1784-95). Delegate from Dutchess Co to the state Constitutional Convention. Delegate, US Constitutional Convention, voted against ratification. He purchased land (384 acres) of the Quashpeake or Pond Patent, in what is today Congers, NY (Aug 18, 1782), reaching East to Rockland Lake, which was confiscated from Theodorus Snedeker, who was labeled a Tory for trading with the British.<sup>1</sup>

I leave to my wife Anake all whole estate; that is to say, 2 1/2 lots of plow land and 2 1/2 lots of meadow ground, and 2 lots called the Great Pasture, being Lots 6-7, which said lots may be sold by my executors. If my wife dies, or is married, then I leave the same to my grandson, Julius Swartwood, son of Philip Swartwood. And in 7 years after he comes in possession he shall pay to my daughter Yanatie, wife of Johanes Osterloet, ≈100, and to my grandson, son of my eldest daughter, Esther, wife of Abraham Cuddleback, ≈100, a good horse saddle and bridle, and two cows. I leave to my oldest son, Gerardus, a cow

and 2 steers. I make my wife and my son Philip and my friend, Jonathan Westbrook, executors. Witnesses, Samuel Green, Jonathan Pettit, Joseph Willett. Proved, November 12, 1761. Joseph Willett, of Minisink, New Jersey, being a Quaker.
