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The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He first appeared in New Netherland in 1637: called variously Aert Pietersz, Jongen, Ariaen Pietersz, Solder - "apparently stationed at Ft. Orange for about 6 years beginning in 1637." He "may have returned to the Netherlands following his term as a soldier for West India Company." On 4 Mar 1649: defaulted on a court appearance at Renssealerswyck. On 8 Jul 1649: summoned again to court "at instance of Dom. Megapolensis" & "Aert Pietersz promises to wed [Blanche Ael] at the first opportunity." On 13 Jun 1659: Court Minutes of Ft. Orange, Vol II: Aert Pietersen, plaintiff, Jochim Kettelheym, defendant More on the above case in minutes of 8 Sep, 14 Sep & 28 Sep 1660.

In May 1661 he made his return from trip to Netherlands aboard 'the Beaver' with wife & child, recorded as "Aert Pietersen Buys van Beest and wife and son" --- cited: DHSNY, vol III:p33 (states that the child was Cornelius bp at Wiltwyck on 14 Aug 1661). In 1661: Aert Pietersen Buys appears on a list of 30 settlers in Harlem (Riker's History of Harlem).

On 23 Oct 1660, from The Early Records of Albany, Notarial Papers: he paid part of an inheritance from his grandfather, Teunis Crynen, to Jan Henddrix van Bael, at the same time empowering that man to collect the inheritance for him from his brother, Cornelis Pietersz Tack, dwelling in Etten. Aert then residing in Rensselaerswyck & made his mark for signature.

On 24 Oct 1661: Aert Pietersen Tack appeared on the excise list as a property owner in Wiltwyck, Esopus (NYHD, vol XIII, p 230). "He is also frequently mentioned in records of the building of the curtains & palisades [at Wiltwyck], his house bieng situated on a corner lot at the edge of town against the barricade." "The court records for the next three years include the name of Aert Pietersen Tack far too many times to detail all the cases involved"... "invariably concern debts, first to him, and increasingly, owed by him to others.." On 28 Feb 1662: plaintiff in court at Albany. On 21 Dec 1662: "cons the village rich man, Dr. van Imbrock, into loaning him a large sum with his next season's crop as security, then disappears, abandoning his wife and family to reap this bitter and many-times-over-mortgaged harvest."

Arie/Aert Pieterszen Tack emigrated about 1660; he disappeared and returned to the Netherlands around 1663, deserting his wife and children. In a 21 Aug 1664 court record [NY Col Ms vol 10, part 3, pp291-3], Anneken Adriaens, "having married one Aert Pietersen Tack, who has not hesitated to marry another woman at Amsterdam in Holland," petitions for divorce from Tack. Ms. Stowell states that Aert was then living in New Harlem; his name, as Aert Pieterszen Buys, continues to appear in the Court Minutes of NA in 1665, 1671 and that in 1671 he was leasing a farm at Fordham.

William L. Tait was the first Mayor of Rockleigh Borough, Bergen Co., NJ (1923-1925), which was named after the Tait family estate near Norfolk, VA.^{1,2} They lived in the Haring-Corning House, in Rockleigh, Bergen Co., NJ from 1913 to 1930. The house was built of dressed sandstone and brick in 1741 by Abraham D. Haring.²

Rev. David M. Talmage was graduated from Rutgers College, New Brunswick, NJ in 1874, and from the Theological Seminary of the Reformed Church at New Brunswick 8n 1877. My will is if it please God to take me away (yf I doe not otherwise alter) that my son John Tanner, living in Tolspidle in Dorsetshire, England, shall have £30. But if my son cannot be procured to come over, or not heard of, the town where I live shall have the use of the same for their general good, provided they put in security to send it to my son, or if he shall come over to fetch it. Legacies to Thomas Ireland, "Richard Everard's children," "Roger Tiner's boy," and "John Rode's youngest boy," "Bethiah Mills shall have a cow and a calf, and she and her mother shall have £10 to buy them clothes. Henry Pearsall's children shall have 5 shillings. [The rest is torn and lost.] Endorsed "Quietus, June 23, 1669." (Not recorded.)

In the 1880 census, John Teachman, 68, mason, and Anna Teachman, 58, were living in Nyack, NY with Samuel, 30, RR fireman, his wife Catherine (Kelly) and their 7 mo. old dau, Anna B. (Annabelle).

Samuel died in Jersey City 9 Mar 1883 from a fall from a trestle while working as a blacksmith for the RR. He was 32. His newborn twins, Samuel and Katie b. 18 Feb 1883 (calculated) both died within 3 weeks of their father, on 24 Mar 1883 and 15 Mar 1883. They share a gravestone with Sam in Pearl River.

Annabelle was raised by the elder Teachmans, presumably in Nyack while widowed Catherine went to NYC by 1891 to cater foods for Invalids. She appears in Trow's NYC Directory from 1891-92 through 1915. Her mother-in-law Anna Teachman came to NYC by 1895-96 and is listed in directory as widow of John and living in two addresses on W. 42nd St where both the Port Authority and the New Amsterdam Theatre stand today.

On 19 December 1687 Andre Thauvet and Isaac Mercier and others, petitioned, and on 27 September 1687 were granted British Naturalization in New York City. By 1689 Andre was acting as Justice of the Peace in New York.¹

Cornelis settled about 1683 on the Raritan in the vicinity of Somerville, N.J. His children adopted "**Tunisen**" as their surname, which was continued by numerous descendants in Somerset County, N.J. Cornelis was in 1703 a member of the Assembly of New Jersey.

In his will, dated 24 Aug 1727 Raritan River, Somerset Co., NJ, Cornelius Teunissen mentioned Wife, Neelye, the home plantation on Raritan River, during widowhood. Oldest son, Cornelius, one-half of same at her remarriage or death, and to pay to my eldest daughter, Fenneye, widow of George Fairly £300. Second son, Tunis, to have the other half and weaving looms. Peter DuMont, John Tunissen, Junior, Derk Van Veghten, to proportion said plantation equally between these sons. Tunis to pay my youngest daughter, Sarah, £300. Third son, John, the plantation on which he now lives, at the "bound brook," which was purchased of Jonathan Douty. The youngest son, Dinis, that plantation between the first and second mountains, bought of Jacob Sebring, on which my son Cornelius now lives. Residue of estate. consisting of bonds, plate, jewels, cattle, horses, slaves, etc., to be divided equally among the six children. Executors--sons Cornelius and Tunis. Witnesses--Peter Sonmans, Manuel Correll, Noah Butterton. Proved 3 Oct. and 3 Nov., 1731.

Aryaentje Waelensz, living in the village of Bergen on the West side of the North River, well known to me the Notary, through the grace of the Lord robust and healthy in body, going and standing, in the full possession and perfect enjoyment of their memory and understanding, as was outwardly apparent and fully evident to everybody. Who acknowledging that nothing is more certain than death, and nothing more uncertain than the hour of the same, therefore not desiring to depart from this world without having previously disposed of their temporal estate, first of all they commend their immortal soul, when the same shall have left their mortal body, to the boundless mercy of God, and their dead body to the earth through a Christian burial. Next arriving at the disposal of their estate to leave behind, declared that out of singular love and affection shown each other in the married state, and if it please God still to be shown, they Testators have willed and do order by these presents, if he Testator should die before his wife, Aryaentje Walensz, then the same shall remain in possession of the entire estate, and as usufructuary during her life enjoy the usufruct or proceeds of the Testator's estate, real and personal, bonds or credits, linnen, wool, copper, tin, and all kinds of Furniture, besides the cattle, none excepted, as he Testator at his death shall vacate and leave, with power, in case of need or poverty, even to be permitted to consume a portion of the same. On the other hand, she, Testatrix, desires, in case of her dying first, that her husband shall keep possession of one half the entire estate, and the other half shall succeed to her, Testatrix's, children lawfully begotten with her deceased husbands, Frans Pieterszen Sloosz and Cornelisz Janszen Slubber, by whom no property has been vacated or left. Notwithstanding this they, Testator and Testatrix, desire that after their, the Testators', death the children shall receive each one half, and they are named heirs, except of the part of the estate which shall remain to the Testator in case she should die first, assigning to the children as a legacy in place of the satisfaction of the lawful share, to each child six(*) guilders in sewant. Further, they, the Testators, leave to Jan Godderusz, son of Joost Goddersz, to be enjoyed in advance after the demise of the Testator, one quarter of the entire estate to be left by the survivor, and further, as a confirmation of this their testament, fifty guilders to the poor. Done at Bergen, October 9, 1662, in the presence of the worthy Harmen Smeman and Laurensz Andrieszen, invited and requested for the purpose as creditable witnesses, who have subscribed to the original minute of the present with my (???) besides the aforesaid Testators and me, Notary. Harmen Smeman, Lourensz Andriesz. this is X the mark of Dirck Toeniss, Ariaentje Walingsz. This above Copy agrees with the original. To which testifies, Tilman Van Vlecq, Notary Public.(*). This probably is a mistake and should be either sixty or six hundred guilders (Written in the Dutch language.)"

22 Jan 1664 --Elias Janzen appearing declares, that there was a pound of candles in the mill, which was missed, and that Jan de Witt would have it that he took them; whereupon he gave him for answer, that it was not true and that perhaps a dog had been in the mill and eaten them; saying he must not lay them to his charge, for perhaps he was as honest as he. After which the abovenamed de Witt came behind, where he sat on this mill stone and struck him, so that the blood followed; and that this was seen by no other person than by Jan Teunisen.¹

Jan Teunisen, pltf. v/s Jan de Witt, miller, deft. Pltf. says, that he had contracted to make a vault in the bay, for which he had been paid and was hard pressed to finish it--that deft. would not allow him his journeyman, though he offered him a man in his place. Deft says, he could not agree to that as he did not want another in the mill. And whereas parties cannot agree herein with each other, it was therefore proposed, if it were not better, that Jan de Witt should keep the mill alone a month more or less, on condition of paying his partner a certain sum for his share for the time he keeps it to himself, which they both agree to; And whereas they cannot agree with each other on what the abovenamed de Witt should give for the time he alone had the mill, Burgomasters and Schepens decree, that each shall choose a man to reconcile them therein, to which they have no objection and Jan de Witt on his side therefore chose as referee Burgomaster Paulus Leendersen van der Grift, and Jan Teunisen Schepen Jacob Backer, who have accepted it.¹

Jan Teunisen returning, the declaration of Elias Jansen hereinbefore written, was read to him and he is asked if it were true? Answers, Yes and that he should not like to get such a blow and he made his nose bleed with the blow.¹

Footnote: Jan de Witt and Jan Teunisen from Leerdam were partners and owned the windmill, which was situated in the present City Hall Park "on the line of the Great Highway," now Broadway. They dissolved partnership, De Witt retiring the following May. --O'C.¹

Walter Thong by 1699 was a householder in NYC, living in the South Ward. His brother, Benjamin, accompanied or followed him to NYC. Walter Thong, merchant, was admitted freeman of NYC 13 Jan 1702; his brother Benjamin Thong, leather dresser, became freeman of NYC 30 May 1702 (Benjamin had been bp. 10 Aug 1681 Hartford, Huntingdonshire, England, so his becoming freeman probably coincided with his coming of age).⁷

Walter Thong was described as a merchant of New York in a 30 Dec 1713 mortgage granted by him to Jaques Fonteyn of New York, vintner, price £400; mortgage £200; due 1 May 1714.³

Richard Walters Thongh, Anna Van Deurse witnessed the baptism 11 Aug 1700 NYC Ref Ch, of Richard, son of Rip Van Dam & Sara Van der Spiegel.

On 1 June 1687, a deed from the City of New York conveyed to White Timmer, "...all that certaine peece of Ground Scituate Lyeing and being in the Smiths Street within the sd. Citty next to ye houses and Grounds of Lowrence Hendrix & the Houses & Grounds Gertie Dye being in Length to ye East side fifty eight ffoot English measure and the west side towards the Street ye Like quantity and in breadth to ye north side fifteen & one half fott [sic] and to ye south side fferty one foot English measure together with all and singular ye houses and buildings thereuppon ways passages Comodidities heriditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to ye same belonging or appertaining by any ways or means whatsoever..." (New York Deeds, NY and Long Island Documents and the Melyn Papers, pp 85-86)¹

In 1688 he contributed ironwork worth f 50 toward the building of a new Dutch Church.²

On 19 May 1690, he was one of three men ordered to appraise guns on board the sloop *Resolution*.³

The land owned by Whyt Timmer was eventually sold to James Livingston (as per a lengthy footnote by Wm Pelletreau to the will of James Livingston dated 3 Sep 1763 and proved 31 Aug 1764; Abstracts of Unrecorded Wills, Vol XI, Prior to 1790 pp 183-184).¹

Tennet - the 1797 Tax Rolls show the same property taxed under the name of Peter Dintle and on March 8, 1826 the same tract of land was deeded from Peter Tintle and Elizabeth, his wife to their eldest son, George Tintle.

He came from (poss. Bristol) England to Flushing, L.I. by way of Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Westchester Co., NY. He was in Flushing by 12 Aug 1667, at which time "George Tippetts" was enrolled as a volunteer in a militia company organized by the Governor for the King's service.

On 6 July 1668, George Tippett and his father-in-law, William Betts jointly purchased a 2000 acre parcel from Elias Doughty. This land bordered on the Hudson and Bronx Rivers. They divided the property, William Betts taking the northern half (which had formerly been Youncker Van der Dunck's planting field), and George Tippett receiving the southern half. In 1669, his friend, Elias Doughty gifted to George Tippett by deed, an island called Papiriniman, near Fordham and Spuyten Duyvil.

George Tippett lived on the eastern side of Spuyten Duyvil Neck (formerly called Yonckers Neck, Tippett's Neck, and Berrian's Neck).

By 1765 Robert Towt was on the Freeman list as a "cordwainer." In 1776, prior to the British occupation, his name appears on a list of those who had window lead taken from their houses to make ammunition for the American army. He appears to have been a supporter of the Revolution.

By December 1777 he had removed his family from the city to Morristown, NJ, where his daughter Cornelia Hardecker Towt (the future wife of Samuel Rudd) was born. Prior to March 1784 he had returned to New York City, and on 18 January 1785 he was appointed "Inspector of Sole Leather in this City," along with James Tylee.

From 1790 to 1793 he was living at 26 George Street, and moved in 1794 to 18 George Street, listed as a leather inspector. In the 1796 NYC directory he is listed as "Senior Inspector of Leather" living at 18 George Street, where his widow continued to live until she died in 1809.

He signed his will on 18 March 1799 and it was admitted to probate 23 July 1799. In it he mentions his house and lot on [75] Mulberry Street (subsequently owned by his spinster daughter Ann Towt and mentioned in her will of 1846), his wife Sarah, and "My eldest son John Towt...My youngest daughter Joanna [unmarried and not 21]...My daughter Mary by a former wife...My other children by my said wife Sarah, to wit—Elizabeth, John, Robert, Sarah, Ann, Cornelia, Margaret, and Joanna...Children of Judith, daughter of my wife Sarah by a former husband,...who was the wife of Samuel Brant, but is now deceased."²

Robert Towt and Moses Taylor, Sr. were brothers-in-law. Robert's first wife and Moses Taylor's wife were sisters.

Robert Towt's second wife, Sarah Van Vurst, had m. (1) 14 April 1759 NY French Church, **Samuel Bourdett**, son of Samuel Bourdett and Judith Blagg, and grandson of Samuel Bourdett and Judith Piaud. Diary Account of Cataline Trico by Jasper Dankaerts - 1680. From "New Netherland Connections" Vol. 1, No. 3: On Thursday, the 30th of May in 1680, Jasper Danckaerts, a Labadist missionary, wrote in his diary: M. de la Grange came with his wife to invite me to accompany them in their boat to the Wale Bocht, a place situated on Long Island, almost an hour's distance below the city, directly opposite Correlaers Hoeck... He had an old aunt and other friends living there... This aunt of de La Grange is an old Walloon woman from Valenciennes, seventyfour years old. She is worldly-minded, with mere bonte, living with her whole heart, as well as body, among her progeny, which now number 145, and soon will reach 150. Nevertheless she lives alone by herself, a little apart from the others, having her little garden, and other conveniences, with which she helped herself ...

Deposition by Catalina Trico 1684/5. From "New Netherland Connections" Vol. 1, No. 4 -- Deposition made by Catalina Trico on 14 February 1684/5 before Governor Thomas Dongan himself. According to George O. Zabriskie's Founding Families of New Netherland, the Governor took this deposition "to assist William Penn in his dispute with the Calverts over the boundary separating Pennsylvania and Maryland, later known as the Mason-Dixon line."

The Deposition of Catalina Trico aged four score yeares or thereabouts taken before the right honorable. COLLO. Thomas Dongan Leut. and Governour under his Royall. highss James Duke of Yorke and Albany etc. of N York and its Dependencies in America, who saith and Declares in the p'sens of God as followeth T'hat she Came to this Province either in the year one thousand six hundred and twenty three or twenty fouer to the best of her remembrance, and that fouer Women Came along with her in the same Shipp, in which ship the Governour Arian jorissen Came also over, which fouer Women were married at Sea and that they and their husbands stayed about three Weekes at this place and then they with eight seamen more went in a vessell by ordr. of the Dutch Governour. to Dellaware River and there settled. This I Certifie under my hand and ye seale of this province.

Deposition By Cataline Trico - 1688, From "new Netherland Connections" Vol. 1, No. 3 -- On the 17th of October, 1688, William Morris, Justice of the Peace, signed the following deposition given by Catalina Trico in the year before her death. The abbreviations have been expanded the to make for easier reading. Catelyn Trico aged about 83 years bom in Paris cloth Testify and Declare that in the year 1623 she came into this Country with a ship called the Unity whereof was Commander Arien Jorise belonging to the West India Company being the first ship that came here for the said Company; as soon as they came to Mannatans now called New York they sent Two families and six men to harford River and Two families and 8 men to Delaware River and 8 men they left at New York to take Possession and the Rest of the Passengers went with the Ship up as farr as Albany which they then Called fort Orange. When as the Ship came as farr as Sopus which is 1/2 way to Albanie; they lightened the Ship with some boats that were left there by the Dutch that had been there the year before a tradeing with the Indians upon there oune accompts and gone back again to Holland and so brought the vessel up; there were about 18 families aboard who settled themselves att Albany and made a small fort; and as soon as they had built themselves some hutts of Bark: the Mahikanders or River Indians, the Maquase: Oneydes: Onnondages Cayougas and Sinnekes, with the Mahawawa or Ot-tawawaes Indians came and made Covenants of friendship with the said Arien jorise there Commander Bringing him great Presents of Bever or other Peltry and desyred that they might come and have a Constant free Trade with them which was concluded upon and the said nations came daily with great multitus of Bever and traded them with the Christians. There said Commander Arien Joris staid with them all winter and sent his sonne home with the ship; the said Deponent lived in Albany three years all which time the said Indians were all as quiet as lambs and came and Traded with all the Freedom imaginable. In the year 1626 the Deponent came from Albany and settled at New York where she lived afterwards for many years and then came to Long Island where she now lives. The said Catelyn Trico made oath of the said Deposition before me at her house on Long Island in the Wale Bought this 17th day of October 1688. William Morris, justice of the Peace.

Richard Truman is mentioned in a Bergen County Road Return dated 3 June 1743, recorded at the request of Richard Truman to alter (nullify) a road formerly laid out over the lands of Jacobus Blinkerhof, Isaac Stegg, Joris Blinkerhof, Abraham Stegg, Jacob Stegg, and Allebert Westervelt and lay out a new road. Landmarks mentioned in the Return include: beginning at a Road that comes from the Taenne Vley and runs to Clooster, lands of Jacobus Blinkerhof, land of Isaac Stagg, Joris Blinkerhof, land of Abraham & Jacob Stegg, line of Albert Westervelt, house of Richard Trueman, land of Barent Cool.¹

Manuel Trumpeter was a free negro at the time of Kieft's land grant to him of 18 acres (surveyor's certificate dated 12 Dec 1643). The land was adjacent to that of Anthony Portugies and Groot Manuel. The grant was confirmed by Gov. Nicolls on 19 Oct 1667, but the confirmation went to Manuel and Anthonya Trumpeter's orphaned children, Bernard and Christina.

On 6 Dec 1663 Domingo Angola and his wife Mayke petitioned for manumission of Christina Trumpeter, the baptized orphan daughter of Manuel Trumpeter and Anthonya, his wife, both deceased negroes. The petition was granted.

Governor Richard Nicolls in 1667 confirmed all the house-and-garden patents (previously granted) to the (black) freedmen. Manuel Trompeter's (1643) was confirmed to his children Bernard and Christina.¹
