The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He fought in the Revolution under Captains Abraham Onderdonk, Terwilliger and John Cooley; all under Colonel Hay. He was of Clarkstown, Orange Co., NY at the time of his enlistment. At the time of his second enlistment he lived in Bergen County, NJ and then in the winter of 1778 moved to Hempstead, Orange County, . In 1810 or 1816 he moved to Camillus in Onondaga County, NY; seven years later he moved to Junius in Seneca County, NY; two years later he moved to Phelps in Ontario County, NY; then three years later he moved to Seneca in Ontario County, NY; and three years later from there to Benton in Yates County, NY.

Barak was a Loyalist during the Revolutionary War. He removed from Danbury, Connecticut to Long Island with the British in 1777 after the burning of the town. The Americans captured him at St. George's Manor, 25 November 1780. He was brought to Fairfield, Connecticut and eventually to Fishkill, New York. After his release he removed to Weston, Connecticut, in what later became the Town of Easton. Barak set up and operated a gristmill there. He was married in the Trinity Church, Huntington, Connecticut.

Ephraim Taylor was a Staten Island vestryman 1 April 1703 and Justice of the Peace in 1695 and 1704.

In his will, he wrote: I, Ephraim Taylor, of Staten Island, leave to my son Abraham, all that land that I have leased of the Earl of Limerick, until the lease has expired, he paying the rent yearly. I leave to my son John £12, and all my clothing and my loom and tackling. I leave to my daughters, Margaret, Sarah, and Martha, each a cow when of age. I leave to my wife so long as she continues unmarried, all my farm and buildings, with all improvements, and after her decease to my sons and daughters. I appoint my wife and my son John executors. [No date in this online version; but prob. c. 1711]

Garrett Taylor moved his family to Steuben County, NY in 1836 and on to Illinois in 1844. In 1844 when he came here, there was no railroad and the I and M Canal had not been built. Garrett would have been 53 years of age at the time they made this trip, his wife 52, unmarried children of 16, 14, 11 and 8 plus two married daughters and thier families. All of Garrett's sons owned farms in Woodstock Township at the time of their death, all having bought, or inherited from their father, farms quite close to the original homestead.

From the Rushville Times in 1906 comes the following story about their trip to Illinois: Sixty-two years ago this fall, Garrett Taylor, a farmer of Bourbon [Bergen] County, New Jersey, decided to go west with his children and grandchildren including Mr. Walters and Mr. McMurty, his sons-in-law, (19 in all). They loaded their wagons and drove to Buffalo, New York, and came by the lake to Chicago, where they again loaded the wagons and drove to LaSalle, Illinois. Here they took to the water again and came by river steamer to Frederick, Illinois. They then drove to the wilderness south of Rushville, which they helped clear and transform into pleasant homes. Only three of the above are now living.

[Obituary] Died on Monday last at his residence 4 miles southwest of Rushville of general debility, Mr. Garrett Taylor in the 86th year of age. Mr. Taylor was born in New Jersey, removed to the state of New York, where he resided about 9 years, emigrated to this county in 1844 and has continued to reside on the same farm 31 years. Up to a year ago, Mr. Taylor had a great deal of vitality and energy for one of his years, frequently walking to town. He has been an exemplary member of the Presbyterian church for upwards of 60 years and was held in high esteem by all who knew him. His aged wife still survives him and 8 children mourn his departure. (The Rushville Times, November 12, 1875)

On 11 Nov 1805 Moses Taylor Jr. "Merchant of New York City," purchased the Abraham A. Haring house in Rockleigh, Bergen Co., NJ. According to his granddaughter, Emma Winner Rogers, he had "lived the city life of his day, and had been drawn to make a summer home in this quiet valley by his childhood memories of it when his parents had fled there from New York during the Revolutionary War and made it a temporary home." He also built the Methodist Church, over the state line, in Palisades, Rockland Co., NY.

On 11 November 1805 (recorded 28 November 1805, Bergen Co. W:19) Abraham D. Haring of Harington, cordwainer,

conveyed to Moses Taylor, Junior, of the City of New York, merchant, for \$1625., three lots in Harington, messuage, dwelling or mansion house, part of tract formerly belonging to David Haring (the father of said party of the first part), now deceased. (1) 8 acres, the home lot, beginning middle of public road, bounded N and W by lands of Jacob D. Haring; S by lands of John A. Haring; E by middle of the road. (2) 4 acres mountain wood lot beginning NE corner of land of Jacob D. Haring by land of Peter Riker; bounded N by lands of Samuel D. Haring; S by lands of Jacob D. Haring; W by lands of David D. Haring; E by lands of Peter Riker. (3) 3 acres, 32 rods of swamp wood lot bounded N by said Jacob and Samuel D. Haring; E by Jacob D. Haring. Signed by Abraham D. Haring. Witnessed by Benj. Blackledge, Henry Blackledge.<sup>2</sup>

He was a Methodist and the first Methodist services in the area were held in his home in 1820. Moses Taylor was instrumental in building the Methodist Church (1832) across the line in Palisades, NY. In 1858 the Taylors were among the dozen local inhabitants requesting an easier wagon route to the steamboat landings at Piermont. His will, written in 1851, was not probated until 1870, the year after he died at age 98. He devised to his daughter Margaret Elizabeth, wife of Pierson Shay, the homestead, valued at \$2200. In a 1862 codicil, he stipulated that "since the making of the will, her husband had left her" and was not entitled to any say in the estate. He further mentioned that as she was incompetent, she was to be in the care of his three executors, his other married daughters. Moses J. Taylor was unsuccessful in breaking the will.<sup>1</sup>
