

-- **TEBOW, TIBOUT** --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Andries Thybaut was the son of Jean Thybaut and Sarah Vander Vlecht. The family came from Bruges in Flanders, living first on the Delaware; then New York, Flatbush, Bergen, Harlem and Bushwick. Andries came to Bergen County before 1686 and married, probably in the French Church, Marie DeGrave. He purchased on May 14, 1686 from Gawen Lawrie, 261 acres at River Edge and Paramus, bounded east by the Hackensack River, west by the Sprout Brook, and partly on the south by what is now Midland Avenue. He was then of "Kindockameck" and died late in 1704 or early in 1705, at which time the land was sold to Abraham Ackerman and by him to Joost DeBaun.

Andries "Thybaut" (signing his name thus), was one of the witnesses to the unrecorded will of Samuel Demarest made January 28, 1695/96, and in 1698 was appointed one of the guardians for the minor children of Jean Durier, his neighbor. He removed to New York and joined the Dutch Church on February 28, 1700. His wife joined May 30th, following.

Andries's widow, Maria DeGrave, married (2) September 8, 1705 at Hackensack, **Albert Terhune**, widower of Weyntie Brickers; and (3) September 23, 1709 at Hackensack, **Jean Aliee**, widower of Susanna Lerou. She moved to Delaware with her third husband and died there.

I leave to my beloved wife, Mary Magdalene Tiebout, my whole estate except is herein devised otherwise. I give my Lotts of land adjoining the land I sold John Read, and James Farquerson in Hardenbergh's Patent, Ulster County, about 1200 acres to my wife, and to Cornelius Herttell, son of John Herttell, share and share alike. To my wife my Country Seat or Farm, called Roxborough, on the east side of the Bowry Lane in the outward of N. Y. City, for life; and in case my wife shall at any time have issue then I bequeath the said farm to my said wife and her heirs forever. In case my wife die without issue and in the lifetime of John Kortright, son of Lawrence Kortright, then I leave my said farm to John Kortright. I appoint my wife as Executrix. Dated February 14, 1785. Witnesses, John Ousterman (of the outward N. Y. City, farmer), John Herttell (of New London, Conn., Merchant), John McKesson, of N. Y. City, Esquire. Proved, October 11, 1785.

Jan Tiebout was an educated man and always appeared in the records with the surname Tiebout/Thibaud etc and never used a patronymic as was usual in those times.²

In 1656 Jan Tibout was at Fort Casimir on the Delaware. In the NYC Ref Ch Membership roll (Jan 1660), Jan's first wife's name is given as "Sara Van der Ulmst."

Jan Tibout is found in the Delaware Papers when he made a statement in Court on 8 January 1657 about Indians drinking beer obtained at Bortien's. On 10 January 1657 he was one of a group of men who signed a petition against unscrupulous fur traders who overpaid for furs and the last entry for "Jan Tiboet" was on 3 December 1657 when he received 2 florins for "bringing over Jan Schaggen's oxen".²

Jan Tibout moved to New Amsterdam in Jan 1660. He was school master at Flatbush.

In 1661, "Jan Tibout" was a court messenger in Bergen, New Jersey. The duties of court messenger seem to have been to read in the church on Sunday, to sing with the school, to assist in burying the dead, to attend to the tolling of the bell, and to summon parties to court. After the English takeover of New Amsterdam on 8 Sept 1664, Jan Tiebout was among a group of male inhabitants of Bergen who signed the oath of allegiance to Lord King Charles the Second.²

He was voorleser 1685-1690 at Harlem; in 1690 Guiliaem Bertholf took his place for a year; then Jan again served as voorleser for another 6 years beginning in 1691.

Jan was hired as schoolmaster of the Flatbush Dutch Reformed Ch on 18 December 1681. He was given a raise in salary from three hundred and fifty guilders in grain at sewant value to 400 guilders in the same kind of payment and value. He also received extra school tuition. The school fee in the day school shall be for a reader or speller 3 guilders for a quarter year, for a writer, 4 guilders. In the evening school a reader or speller shall give 4 guilders and a writer 6 guilders. The remaining salary shall consist of four hundred guilders in grain, at sewant value, to be delivered at Brooklyn Ferry, in addition to the use of the dwelling house and lot and pasture field and meadows belonging to the school.²

By 30 June 1682, very serious charges were brought against Jan Thibaud. Schoolmaster Jan Thibaud is brought up on charges of drunkenness and for molesting various women in Midwout and "of very aggravating and entirely indecent deeds." In his defense, he said that he did not know that he had done such a thing since he was wholly intoxicated. Justice was swift. On 30 July 1682, Jan Thibaud was censured by the church, removed from his school and church duties, told to put his affairs in order and leave his house immediately and on 1 October 1682, Jan Thibaud was replaced by Johannes van Eekkelen, a young man from Albany.²

On 16 Jan 1685, Jan Thibaud asked to be removed from censure to accept another job as Schoolmaster at "New Harlem on Manhattan Island." A written testimonial sent by Domine Selijns, minister of New York and New Harlem stated that, during the two years that Jan Thibaud had lived under the parish of New York, nothing was heard of him except what befit an honorable man. It was decided "to remove the said Jan Thibaud from censure, decreeing that by this, his honorable living, the previous rumors have been sufficiently erased, and the given scandals were removed. Wherefore we grant him an ecclesiastical witness serving the same purpose, that he may enter upon the service to which he has been called; further hoping that he may be encouraged thereby to further order his behavior in an honorable, Christian manner in keeping with his calling."²

The last record found of Jan Tibout is his second marriage [banns NYC Ref Ch] to Hester Dubois, widow of Claude Lemaistre [Claude Delamater] on 6 November 1687. "Jan Tibout, wedr Van Sara Van der Vlucht, en Hester Dubois, Wede Van Claude Lemaistre, beyde woonende tot Haerlem."

westerly along his apple trees by the east side of his house as the Road now goes to the north side of John Van Blerkum's house along the two rocks; thence on a west line to the Old Road; thence as the Road now goes to the south side of the house of Peter Tibow's; from thence as the road now goes till it comes to the King's Road from Ramapog.

R:80), Peter Tebow of the Township of Franklin, and Susannah, his wife, conveyed to Jacob Van Ripper of aforesaid place, for \$4,875., two tracts, (1) 84-1/2 acres strict measure, farm and lott of land whereon the said Peter Tebow now lives in the Township and County aforesaid, beginning westernmost corner Abraham Quackenbush's land, post on S side of Publick Road that leads from Comp Gough to Hoppers Town between the dwelling houses of the said Peter Tebow and Abraham Quackenbush; also mentioned are Brook, corner of Milldam, New Road, corner of Zabriskie's land. (2) parcel, 20 acres, lying southernmost side of that part of a lott of land now in possession of said Peter Tebow that he formerly purchased of Robert R. Livingston Esq., beginning at land of John Migheler in Township and County aforesaid. With all houses, barns, orchards, Grist Mill, Saw Mill. Signed by Peter Tebow (his mark), Susannah Tebow (her mark). Witnessed by Abraham Willis, Jacob Stor.¹

On 14 April 1803 (recorded 12 June 1804, Bergen Co. S:314) Peter Debow of the Township of Franklin, and Susan, his wife, conveyed to Sandy Mecall, for \$591.35, 46-81/100 acres strict measure, being a parcel in the Township of Franklin. Signed Peter Debow (his mark), Susanna Debow (her mark). Witnessed by Gordon Craig, Cornelius Smith.¹

On 1 July 1803 (recorded 5 Dec 1803, Bergen Co. R:182) Andrew Kirkpatrick and Robert Campbell, both of New Jersey, Trustees to execute Last Will and Testaments of Henry Cuyler the Elder and Henry Cuyler the Younger, deceased, conveyed to Peter Tebow of the County of Bergen, for \$57, 7-1/2 acres in the Township of Franklin, part of Ramapock Tract Lot no. 202. Whereas Henry Cuyler the Younger died seized of a Considerable Real Estate of which these premises were a part. Beginning at Publick Road leading from Hoppers Town to Romopock at NE corner of Peter Ackerman, purchased by him of ex-ecutors of Jacob Valentine, deceased. Mentions Mansion House formerly belonging to John Fell, Esq. but now in possession

of said Peter Tebow. Signed by Andrew Kirkpatrick, Robert Campbell. Witnessed by John Bayard, Johannah Bayard.¹

On 6 April 1803 (recorded 5 Dec 1803, Bergen Co. R186) Michael Muson [Musan? Mersan?] of the County of Bergen and Jane, his wife, conveyed to Peter Tebow of same place, for \$18, 64/100 of an acre more or less, in the Township of Franklin at a place called Petersfield, bounded on 3 sides by ditches and on the other side by Road. Signed by Macl Mersan, Jane Mersan. Witnessed by Wm. A. DePeyster, Robert Campbell.¹

On 19 January 1805 (recorded 1 June 1805, Bergen Co. U:246) Conrad Kneght of Franklin Township, conveyed to Abraham A. (2) 122-82/100 acres excepting 4 acres from west end heretofore conveyed by said Conrad Kneght unto John Van Blarcum, northerly equal 1/3 part bounded on lands of said Abraham A. Quackenbush on map marked and agreed upon by Conrad Kneght and Peter Tibow, deceased. Signed by Conrad Kneght (his mark). Witnessed by Anne Westervelt, Abm. Westervelt.¹

On 22 February 1806 (recorded 25 February 1806, Bergen Co. X:136) Cornelius Smith and Mary, his wife, and Susannah Tebow, widow of Peter Tebow, late of Franklin Township, deceased, conveyed to Abraham A. Quackenbush of the same place, for \$325, 19 acres more or less a certain lot, being part of a lot known as Boome lot in Franklin Township, beginning on E side of Road leading from House of Jacob Van Ryper to the mills of said Abraham A. Quackenbush and on line of heirs of Abraham Terhune, deceased; mentioned John Van Blarcum. Bounded N by lands of said Abraham A. Quackenbush and partly by lands of John Van Blarcum; S by Jacob Van Ryper; E by said Jacob Van Ryper and lands of heirs of Abraham Terhune, deceased. Signed by Cornelius Smith, Mary Smith, Susannah Tebow (her mark). Witnessed by Luke Westervelt, Abm. Westervelt.¹

Y:169) Albert Zabriskie of the County of Bergen, yeoman, and Mary, his wife, conveyed to Peter Allen of the same place, Carpenter, for \$175., 6-1/4 acres, 38 square rods in the Township of Franklin, beginning corner of land of William Folly; Abraham Ackerman; heirs of Peter Debow, deceased. Bounded N by William Folly; E by Abraham J. Ackerman; S by said Albert Zabriskie; E by land of heirs of Peter Debow. Signed by Albert Zabriskie, Mary Zabriskie (her mark). Witnessed by Abraham A. Quackenbush, Abm. Westervelt.¹

On 20 September 1806 (recorded 28 October 1806, Bergen Co. Z:36) Susannah Tebow of Franklin Township, widow and administratrix of Peter Tebow, late of same place, deceased, conveyed to Abraham A.
