The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Dirk Wesselse Ten Broeck, as commissary, justice, recorder, mayor of Albany (1696-1698), member of Assembly, ambassador, wrote his name Dirk Wesselse. To land contracts, deeds, and to his will, he wrote his name in full, Dirk Wesselse ten Broeck, the ten always with a small t.

In 1663 Dirk Wesselsen [Ten Broeck] purchased of the heirs of the renowned Anneke Jans Bogardus her home in Albany, from which she had been buried earlier in the same year.<sup>1</sup>

In his will, written by himself in the Dutch language, dated February 4, 1715, and proved on February 6, 1718, he wrote: "In the Name of the Lord On the fourth day of February, in the first year of our Sovereign King George of Great Britain, &c., and in the year of our Lord 1714/5, I, Dirck Wesselsen ten Broeck, formerly of Albany, now of the Manor of Livingston, being sound in body and mind, having and using my memory, but considering the shortness and frailty of human life, the certainty of death, and uncertain hour thereof, have advisedly, without inducement, persuasion, or misleading by anybody, made, ordained, and concluded, this my last Will and Testament, revoking and annulling hereby all and each Testament formerly by me made and executed. This to be taken as my last Will and Testament, as follows: First. -- I commend my immortal soul, whenever it shall leave my body, to the gracious and charitable hands of God, my Creator and Saviour; my body to a Christian burial in the earth, whence it came, and there to remain until the day when my soul and my body shall be re-united, on the day of resurrection, to share in the ineffable joy of eternal bliss, which God in his grace has prepared and promised, through the death of Jesus Christ, for and to all who faithfully believe in Him. I. Concerning such worldly goods as the Lord has been pleased to bestow on me, far above my deserts, I give and dispose of them as follows: II. I give to my eldest son, Wessel ten Broeck, as his privilege of first-born son, the sum of three pounds current money of New York; and I desire that he shall make no further claim upon my estate than an equal share, as given hereafter to his Sisters and Brothers. III. It is further my will and desire that after my death my honest debts shall be paid by my heirs, in due time. IV. I appoint my well-beloved wife, Christyňa Wesselsen ten Broeck, executrix and administratrix of my whole estate, real and personal; lands, houses, lots, bonds, notes, rents, gold and silver, coined and uncoined; jewels, clothing, linen, woollen, horses, cattle, negro slaves, and whatever else, nothing in the world excepted nor reserved from my whole estate, here, in England, Holland or elsewhere, wherever it may be; to administer thereon, without interference or contradiction by my children or anybody else, or that she should be held to give an accounting or inventory during the time of her widowhood; but with this express condition, that she shall not be allowed to sell, alienate, or exchange any of my real estate, wherever it may be, such as lands, houses, lots and mortgages, but only use thereof the fruit, and yearly income of which she may dispose during her widowhood. But, if she should again marry, she shall be held, before entering anew into the state of matrimony, to surrender the whole estate, according to a sworn inventory, to my sons, to wit: Wessel ten Broeck, Samuel ten Broeck, Johannes ten Broeck and Tobias ten Broeck, whom I then appoint executors of my whole estate, real and personal, to administer thereon. They shall be held to give to my said wife one-third of the yearly revenue, during her life, and the other two-thirds, after deducting all expenses, I desire shall by them be equally divided between my eleven children, or their heirs, namely: Wessel ten Broeck, Elsję ten Broeck, wife of Johannes Cuyler; Catalyntje ten Broeck, wife of John Lissger; Cornelia ten Broeck, wife of Johannes Wynkoop; Geertruy ten Broeck, wife of Abraham Schuyler; Christyňa ten Broeck, wife of Johannes Van Alen; Elisabeth ten Broeck, wife of Antony Costar; Lidia ten Broeck, wife of Volkert Van Vechten; Samuel ten Broeck, Johannes ten Broeck, Tobias ten Broeck, each to have one just eleventh share. V. After the death of my wife, I give to my eldest son Wessel Ten Broeck two-thirds of all my lands at Saratoga, in the County of Albany; and the other third I give to my daughter Geertruy, wife of Abraham Schuyler. Said lands being the just seventh part of the whole Saratoga patent, granted to me, Col. Peter Schuyler, and others. I give this to my said eldest son, and to my daughter Geertruy as above said, to wit: two-thirds to the said Wessel ten Broeck and his heirs forever, provided that these stretches of pasture-land shall be counted as £125, New York currency, in the share of my said son Wessel ten Broeck, in the estate which I shall have. And likewise the third part given to my said daughter Geertruy shall be counted as £75 New York currency; which said third part, I give to her, and her heirs, as equivalent to the mentioned sum, forever, after the death of my wife. VI. Further, I give to my sons, Samuel ten Broeck and Tobias ten Broeck, all my lands in the said Manor of Livingston, according to the conveyance to me from Mr. Robert Livingston, to be divided into two equal parts, of which my son Tobias shall first choose his half, and the other half shall go to my son Samuel, and to their respective heirs forever. I also give to my two sons, Samuel and Tobias aforesaid, four horses, four cows, four sheep, four pigs; one of my negroes, to be selected by them; all farming utensils which then shall be found on my bouwery, for which I will that my said sons shall each pay to my said executors the sum of £190, New York currency, or together £380; provided that each of them may retain the full share of his inheritance from said sum. If their share should not amount to as much, then they add and pay to the administrators the difference. If their share amounts to more, then it shall be paid to them out of the estate; but they shall not be allowed to make a claim on the land here given to them, until after the death of my said wife; then they shall receive as their own the land with houses, barns, brewery, and other privileges. VII. After my wife's death, I give to my son Johannes ten Broeck, my two houses and lots in the City of Albany; on the north

side of Yonkers (State) street, on the west side of Yaugh (now James) street, on the east side of the house and lot of Antony Costar, and on the south side of said Costar, according to conveyance, to him and his heirs forever. I also give to the said Johannes all my right and title in and to land on the east side of Hudson's River, on a Kil called Kinderhoek Kil, which is not sold yet; according to the patents from Sir Edmond Andros and Colonel Thomas Dongan, -- to him, his heirs and assigns forever: which houses and lots, and right and title to land on Kinderhoek Kil I value at £200, New York currency, and I will that so much shall be refunded to the estate, after deducting as much as one-eleventh part of the whole shall amount to, and the residue shall be paid to my executors for the behoof of my other heirs; and if his share is larger, then it shall be paid to him by the administrators. VIII. It is my wish and will, and I give all my other lands, houses, and lots, excepting what as above I have given to my said sons and daughter Geertruy, and all my negro slaves, cattle, and other property of whatsoever nature it may be, after my own and my wife's death, to my said eleven children, to be sold to each, and the proceeds accumulated, which, with the sums to be paid by my sons and daughter, shall then be equally divided among my said eleven children, it being well understood that my said sons and Geertruy, shall not pay more for their land, as appraised by me, than so much as it amounts to, more than their eleventh part of my whole estate. IX. It is further my wish and will, that none of my real estate shall be sold to strangers, but it shall always remain in my family. X. It is my wish and will, that Christina Legget, when she comes to marriageable age, shall have a good outfit. All the above I declare to be my last Will, requesting that it may have full effect in every way. Thus done and concluded, at my Bouwery, in the Manor of Livingston, and signed and sealed by my own hand this Fourth of February, 1714/5. Dirck Wesselse ten Broeck Signed and sealed in the presence of Jan Vosburgh, William Scott, Pieter Vosburgh. This will was proved on the sixth of February, 1718. A few months later, on September the first, the wife of Major Ten Broeck took steps to have assistance from those she trusted in executing the expressed wishes and will of her husband. She appointed her -- Loving sons, Wessel Ten Broeck, Johannes Ten Broeck, and my son-in-law, Johannes Cuyler, all of the City of Albany, to be my true and lawful and irrevocable Attorneys, rendering account to me, when thereunto required; and after my decease, unto the heirs of the said Dirck Wesselse Ten Broeck. (Signed) Cristyna Ten Broeck

They lived at Albany, NY, where he was Mayor 1746-48.

In his will, he wrote: ...July 1, 1748. I, Dirck Ten Broeck, of Albany, merchant. I leave to my eldest son Abraham £15, "In right of Primogeniture." Also my house and lot in Albany, in the 3d Ward, where I now live, bounded east and south by the street that leads to Waterfleet, west by the house and lot where Adam Deats lives. Also my store house and lot in Albany, bounded south by Foxes creek, north by the lot in possession of Adam Deats, east by the street that leads to Waterfleet. I leave to my children, Catharine, wife of Johannes Livingston, Christina, wife of Philip Livingston, Jr., Maria, wife of Gerardus Graesbeck, Sara, wife of Johannes Ten Eyck, Margareta, and Dirck, each 1/7 of the value of the said two houses and lots, "which I do hereby appraise at the sum of £600." I leave to my son Dirck my houses and lots in Albany, in the 3d Ward, bounded west by street, "east by another street, formerly called de Waggon Way," south by the house and lot of Johannes Pruin, north by the house and lot of Cornelius Ten Broeck. And each of my other children is to have 1/7 of the value, which I appraise at £225. I leave to my sons, Abraham and Dirck, all my lot of land lying at Serigtoge, in Albany County, on the west side of Hudson river, being Lot No. 3, as divided by the Patentees of Serigtoge. Also 1/7 part of the undivided woodland in

said Patent, as granted to me by a certain indenture of lease and release. Each of my other children is to have 1/7 of its value, which I value at £400. I leave to my daughters, Maria, Sara, and Margarita, and to my sons, Abraham and Dirck, each £300, as my other daughters have had, and my daughter Margarita, when of age, is to have an outset, as my other four daughters have had. I leave to my wife Margarita the use of all estate, negroes, and goods, during her life, to bring up and educate and maintain my two sons and my daughter Margarita. If my wife marries, she is to give a perfect inventory, and then the use of estate is to go to my seven children, and my wife is to have the use of my house and lot where I now live, and 1/2 of my lot of ground or garden "by the city stone wall," and a negro woman and £300. I leave to all my children my house and lot in Albany, in the 3d Ward, bounded south by ground of Theunis Eghbertie, north by the house and lot of William Rogers, west by the street, and east by another street. Also 2 lots in said city, in the 3d ward, bounded north by the house and lot of Wilhelmus Vanderbergh, south by the street, west by the pasture ground of Elbert Gerritson, east by the ground of the heirs of Cornelius Van Scherluynen and others, in Company. Also a lot or garden in said Ward, bounded north by the gang way by the city stone wall, south by the house and lot of Tesen De Freest, west by a small lot of Luycas Johannes Wyngaert, east by the river. Also a house and lot of pasture ground, lying in the Manor of Rensselaerwyck, at Waterfleet, bounded east by the house and lot or garden of the Lord of the Manor, west by the Pasture ground of Anthony Van Schaick. Also a lot in the town of Schenectady, bounded east by the ground and brewhouse of Barent and Jan Vroman, west by the ground of Philip Livingston, south by the street, north by the ground of Jan Vroman. Also a tract of land in Albany County, on the north side of the Mohawks river, westward from the fall kill, being part of a large Tract of land purchased of the Natives by James Henderson, Philip Livingston, John Lindsay, and 5 other persons, and known as Lots 10-11, according to the deed I have for the same in Company with Cornelius Cuyler. He acquired the Manor of Foxhall through his wife, who inherited from her stepfather, Major Thomas Chambers. Col. Wessel Ten Broeck, Jr. lived in the stone mansion known as the "Senate House" in Kingston, NY. He was a Justice of the Peace for many years, and in 1738 was Lieutenant-Colonel of the Ulster County Militia, under the command of Col. Abraham Gaasbeek Chambers.

In his will, he wrote: I, Wessel Ten Broeck, of the manor of Fox Hall, in Ulster County, yeoman, "being at present surprized with sickness." I leave to my daughter Sarah, and Lawransie, wife of Mr. David De Lamater, two lots of land lying to the southwest of Kingston, called the Division of the heirs of Wessel Ten Broeck, No. 1 and No. 4. I leave to my daughter Sarah a house and lot at Kingston, adjoining southwardly of the lot where Mr. Livingston's barn stands; Also 3 house lots which I bought of the Trustees of Kingston March 6, 1731; Also 1/5 of 1/2 of the house and lot which was my father's dwelling house in Kingston; Also a negro woman. And she is to have the same out set when married as my daughters Lawransie and Rachel had when they were married. I leave to my daughter Lawransie 1/5 of the above named dwelling house and a negro woman. I leave to my daughter Rachel 1/5 of said house. I leave to my eldest son, Wessel Ten Broeck, all my dwelling house buildings and land conveyed to me by Abraham Gaasbeek Chambers on June 26, 1701, in lieu of 2 acres near the place of the old Corn mill; Also 1/5 of 1/2 of my father's dwelling house in Kingston; Also 1/2 of all my lands and tenements in the County of Ulster, except as I have herein given; Also one negro woman and part of my stock of cattle, and 1 waggon and a plough and harrow, and a pair of pistols and holsters, and a gun and a musket and my Bible and cane. And "my son Wessel shall pay 1/2 of the cost of building a house for my son Coenradt, of two rooms and a kitchen," and a barn 60 feet long. And he is to pay to my three daughters £375, in 6 annual payments. I leave to my son Coenradt 1/5 of the house and lot in Kingston which was my father's, and 1/2 of all my lands and estate except as above; Also a negro man, waggon and plough, and my Great Holland gun, and a Bible such as I gave to my daughters, and my sword and part of my cattle, and he is to pay to my 3 daughters £375. All the rest of my estate to the children. My old negro woman Mary may live with such of my children as she will choose. I make my sons executors. Dated April 27, 1743. Witnesses, Abraham Gaasbeek Chambers, Teunis Van Gaasbeek, Gilbert Livingston. Proved before Edward Whitaker, Esq., March 2, 1744/5.

Wessel Ten Broeck and his brother John visited Somerset Co., NJ and so liked it that their father, Jacob Ten Broeck, agreed to buy land there. Mr. Hasell, of Philadelphia, was the selling agent for Henry Neal, who lived at Cape Fear in the province of North Carolina, and who in his will described himself as a "gentleman." He seems to have owned many slaves, both male and female. Fourteen hundred and twelve pounds and twelve shillings was the price paid for eight hundred and fifty-four 7/10 acres, consisting of one tract of 513 4/10 acres and a second tract of 341 3/10 acres. The first tract was conveyed to Henry Neal by Francis Elvington of Somerset County, by lease and release dated 18th and 19th of December, 1721; consideration £500. The second tract containing 341 3/10 acres was conveyed to Henry Neal by deed from Daniel Hollingshead of Somerset county. This tract joined the 513 4/10 tract conveyed by Elvington, and the deed from Hollingshead to Henry Neal was dated December 20, 1721. Samuel Hasell acknowledges receipt above his own signature of £1412.12 on May 1st, 1735. J. Stevens and two other men witnessed Hasell's signature to the deed and the receipt. Thomas Farmer, one of the Council of New Jersey, certifies that on October 14, 1736, John Stevens, one of said witnesses, on oath stated he saw Samuel Hasell sign, seal and deliver said deed, and Lawrence Smyth certified that he recorded said deed in Liber C., No. 3, Folio 312-316 in Secretary's office at Perth Arboy. With all this care, the deed was worthless in law, for Henry Neal died a few days prior to execution of the deed at Cape Fear in North Carolina, leaving a will which empowered any two of the three executors named in his will to convey his real estate. When the Ten Broeck family learned that Samuel Hasell could not alone execute a lawful deed, they thought their £1412 gone. "A trick of the rascally English." But John Stevens, of Rocky Hill, soon learned that it was only a blunder on Hasell's part. Henry Neal in his lifetime did authorize his cousin Samuel Hasell to sell his Somerset County

land as appeared in the advertisement for the property. He died, however, before any sale was made, which ended Hasell's power. The will required two of the three executors named therein to make a legal deed. The two executors in North Carolina sent a written power of attorney to John Stevens of Rocky Hill to execute a new deed to Jacob Ten Broeck. This was done, and the deed was recorded Oct. 14, 1736, in Liber C. No. 3, folio 316-319.

Jacob Ten Broeck deeded to his son, Wessel, 427 3/10 acres, or exactly one-half of the tract. Wessel took possession of his half and resided on it until 1747, when he died from some kind of a fever which generally prevailed in Somerset County that year. He left surviving two sons, Tjerck and Jacob, and two daughters, Anne and Elizabeth.

Wessel Ten Broeck left a will in which he named his brother Cornelius Ten Broeck as guardian of his four minor children, all of whom were under twelve years of age at that time. In his will, dated 14 Aug 1747 Somerset Co, NJ, Wessel Tenbrook mentioned Wife, Neeltje, the home-plantation (400 acres) with the negroes and stock, during widowhood. In case of marriage, executors to have same for use of the children: Jacob (the oldest), Tyerk, Johannes, Anatje and Elizabeth (all under 21). Wife, Neeltje, executrix. Executors--brother, Cornelius, Jacob Tenbrook, brother-in-law, Henry and Andreas Dewitt, Peter Nevius and John Berrien. Witnesses--Abraham Stryker, Hendrick Tader, Thomas McBryde. Proved 1st March, 1747-8.
