

-- TEN EYCK --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In his will, he wrote: I, Abraham Ten Eyck, of New York, cordwainer, of sound mind. I leave to my wife Jozintie, so long as she remains my widow, the use of all my estate, real and personal. If she marries, she shall have 1/3. I leave to my son Richard £3, over and above what I shall give him, in full bar to his claim as heir at law. Of all the remainder of my estate, I leave 5/6 to my 5 children, Richard, Daniel, Abraham, Effie, wife of John Lewis, and Mary, wife of Frederick Fine, and 1/6 to the children of my daughter Elizabeth, late wife of Erasmus Williams, of New York, merchant (names of children not given). After the death of my wife, my executors are to sell all estate. I make my wife and my sons and my son-in-law, John Lewis,

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Anthony Ten Eyck, of the Manor of Rensselaerwyck, in Albany County, being weak in body. I leave to my son Coenraed 1/2 of a certain lot in Coeyman's Patent, known by the name of the Cruple Bush, which lot contains 140 acres. And also so much of the land laid out by John R. Bleecker into two lots sometime in September, 1767, and adjoining to said Cruple Bush, as with the said half lot will make 200 acres. I also leave him "my watch, buttons and apparell, arms, sword, ammuniton, buckles and my Large Dutch Bible." Whereas I received £700 from my wife at our marriage, for which I gave a bond to Theodorus Van Wyck and Dirck Brinckerhoff, of New York, of which I have paid £200, my executors are to pay the rest. And whereas I also gave them a bond to pay to my wife £60 yearly for life, in lieu of dower, my executors shall pay the same. I leave to my daughters, Catharine and Susan, a "small lot on the north side of Coeyman's Creek, near the bridge"; Also a lot called the Bogertie (Little Orchard), and a lot called the Plantation. My executors are to sell enough to pay all debts. My two daughters are to be maintained until my daughter Susan is 21, and the children (not named) of my late daughter Sarah are to be maintained until of age. I leave all the rest to my son Coenrad, and to my daughters, Gertie, Catharine, and Susan, and to the children of my daughter Sarah, deceased. What I have advanced to my children is to go towards their shares. I make my son Coenrad and my daughters, Catharine and Susan, executors. Dated April 24, 1775. Witnesses, James Waldron, blacksmith, Wilhelmus Rouw, David McCarty, merchant. Proved, June 20, 1775.

In their (1) marriage record in Amsterdam register of Marriages, they were: Coenraet ten Eyk from Meurs [Moers near Bielefeld in Germany], shoemaker's mate, age 27 years (residing 11 years at the N.Z. Voorburgwal; having no parents living) with Maria Boel from Ceulen [Cologne], age 23 years (residing at the Conixgracht; having no parents living; assisted by her sister Jannetien Boel). His signature to this document was "Koenradt ten Eijck." His family was from Antwerp; they fled to Cologne during the Counter-Revolution; then went to Amsterdam.

Coenraedt Ten Eyck came from Amsterdam, Holland, with two or three children, and settled in New Amsterdam about 1650.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of the (2) marriage banns, they were: Coenraedt ten Eyck, Wedr. Van Maria Boelen, en Annetje Daniels, Wede. Van Herman Smeeman, beyde woonende tot N. Yorke.

He was a tanner and shoemaker. His sons Dirck, Tobias and Coenraedt succeeded him in business.

In 1660 Coenraedt Ten Eyck was assessed on two rods, two and one-half feet (Rineland measure), the width of his lot on the west side of what is now Broad Street, NYC, being the 10th lot and about 25 rods from the East River. The amount of the assessment was forty guilders per foot for the building of the "Graff," or canal, which extended from the river through the entire center of Broad Street to Beaver Street. This canal was made by widening, deepening, straightening and planking the sides of a natural rivulet that led from the swamp back of Wall Street to the river. It was, however, soon ordered to be filled up, paved and made into a street. A sewer was laid through the street in 1703, from Exchange Place to Water Street. In 1674

Mr. Ten Eyck was estimated to be worth \$5,000 -- a fortune in those days. His sons Dirck, Tobias, and Coenraedt succeeded him in business.

In his will, made at New York, he wrote: I, Coenradt Ten Eyck, considering my present weakness, "I confirm that matrimonial condition made with my present wife, whereby she was to have 2,000 guilders, of which I have paid to her creditors the sum of 1650 guilders, by which there remains the sum of 350 guilders. I leave to my son Matthias 2,000 guilders, wampum value, to be paid out of the sum which shall come from the sale of my houses, and to make his profit therewith without paying any interest for the term of four years, and then he is to bring it into the common estate. My son Tobias is to have one year's rent of my two houses, because my other children have a long time had the benefit of my money and have made their profit therewith. And touching the tannery, my three sons, Dirck, Tobias and Coenradt, shall have the preference thereof before others, on condition they pay for the same a reasonable and civill price upon the estimates of indifferent persons. I appoint and make my sole and universal heirs my children, Morice, wife of Wessel Ten Broeck, Jacob, Dirck, Tobias, Coenradt, Hendrick, and Matthias, gotten by my deceased wife Maria Boise, "head for head, and each in equal proportion." I leave to my eldest son for his privilege 100 guilders or 12 pieces of eight. Makes his sons Dirck, Tobias, Coenradt and Hendrick executors. Dated September 4, 1686. Witnesses, Wm. Bogardus, Peter Stoutenburg, Hendrick Jansen Van Virden. Entered in the Record for John West, Clerk. Probated, and his sons Dirck, Tobias, Coenradt, and Henry Ten Eyck were confirmed as executors, April 26, 1687. [NOTE.--The houses of Coenradt Ten Eyck were on the north side of Pearl street, next west of Staat Huys lane, which ran between it and the old City Hall. He also owned the water lots opposite, on the south side of Pearl street, and on the east side of Coenties slip.]

On 24 Nov 1675 he took the Oath of Allegiance to the King of Great Britain. He appears to have lived for a time in Ulster Co., where he was appointed Gauger at Kingston, 10 Dec 1682. He was, in 1689, an Assistant Alderman, NYC, for the North Ward under Gov. Leisler.

Hendrick Ten Eyck began a conjugal relationship at Christmastime in 1700 with **Catherine Springsteen**, dau. of Melchior Springsteen & Gertruyd Barthels. She bore him two illegitimate sons (Hendrick and Johannes/John) and a poss. dau.²

It is likely these transgressions that prompted Pieterella's mother to specifically disinherit her son-in-law, Hendrick Ten Eyck. The will of her mother, Johanna de Bruyn, widow of John Hendrick de Bruyn, dated 1 Oct 1702, leaves a certain share of her estate to her daughter, "but her husband, Hendrick, is to have no part of it...I desire that my daughter Petronella be not dissatisfied, for my gift is not through any disrespect to her, but because her husband, who deserves so little at her hands, should reap no benefit."

Hendrick Ten Eyck died intestate and, on 1 July 1721, Letters of Administration were issued to his "son and heir" Johannes. [Corrections, Vol. 16, p. 83.] In the original abstract "Johannes" was misread as "Jacobus." William Burnet, Governor, etc. Whereas Hendrick Ten Eyck, of New York, died intestate, Letters of administration are granted to his son and heir, Jacobus Ten Eyck, July 1, 1721.
