

-- TERNEUR, TOURNEUR --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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**Terneur/Tourneur**

"Daniel Tourneur of Amiens in Picardy (France) fled from religious persecution and emigrated from Leyden in 1652. His son, Jacobus Tourneur, came to the present West Nyack from New Harlem on the north end of Manhattan Island after marrying Jacomina Oblinus in 1720. Jacomina's Dutch grandfather, Joost Oblinis or Van Oblenus, was a New Harlem patentee. The Tourneur name has several modern spellings and the Oblinus name is even found as O'Blenis."—Talman

The surname Turnure was originally Tourneur and is of Picard or French origin. Some etymologists hold that the name was originally Tournoire, meaning "black tower," a connection by which perhaps some well known landmark endowed the ancestral family with its name. Another possible origin is the term "tourneur," Norman French for one who took part in a tournament.

The Tourneurs or Turnures of New York were one of some thirty French families, about a third of whom were from Picardy, who made their home in Harlem in the seventeenth century. Of Picard descent were the Tourneurs, Cressons, Demarests, Casiers and Disosways, members of which all, except the last, served as magistrates. The Tourneur family has always played an influential part in the history of state and nation. Some of its members have been men of the highest repute in public, professional and commercial life. — Turnure, Joan D. (work in progress, April 1996), Descendants of Daniel Tourneur.

According to the marriage record kept by Rev. DeYoe, Aaron Tenure was 27, a blacksmith, and of Mahwah at the time of their marriage. Lizzie Garabrant was 24.

Aaron Ternure, 44, Carpenter, and his wife, Lizzie, 39, were listed in the 1900 Federal Census, living in Hohokus Township (East of the Erie RR), Bergen County, NJ in a house they owned. Listed with them were their children: Julia E., 18; Edward G., 16; Mary F., 14; Nettie, 12; Della M., 9; Emma, 6; Georgianna, 4; Allie S. (son), 3; and Sophronia S., 1.

Daniel was baptized under the name of Jean, but called himself Daniel after he fled to Holland. Daniel sailed for America, with his wife and infant son Daniel in 1651. They settled at Harlem.

Daniel Terneur was Deputy Sheriff of New Haerlem in Dec 1665.<sup>1</sup>

Daniel had land at Flatbush in 1661. He joined the NYC Ref Ch in 1672.

Jacques Tourneur served as a deacon, and also as a constable (appointed 29 Sep 1692) and overseer of the town of Harlem (appointed 29 Sep 1699, 29 Sep 1700) succeeding, in 1691, to that part of his father's lands on VanKeulen's Hook known as lots 17 & 18 (but in quantity known as three lots), and since then known as the Bussing or Storm farm. On 7 Aug 1691 he bought from Peter Van Oblenis for 60 guilders, the old Jacques Cresson residence, which became his new home. On 27 May 1698 he sold his lot number 7, of the draft of 1691, to Johannes Myer. His death is not noticed, but his farm and lots in the several divisions, in all 60 acres, were sold to Peter Bussing in 1726.

I leave to my grandchildren, Michael, Laurence, Jacobus, John, and Hendrick, all sons of my son Jacobus, all the rest of my said land and meadows. And they are to pay to their sisters, Jane, Mary, Marritje, and Sarah, £40. I leave to my son Hendrick 1/2, and to my said grandsons the other 1/2 of all my lot of salt meadow in the township of Orange. I make my son Hendrick and Jacobus Blauvelt, executors. Dated June 15, 1771. Witnesses, Jacobus Terneur, Hendrick Jacobus Terneur, John Haring. Proved, May 24, 1775. [NOTE.--The farm above described lies in Clarkstown, on the west side of Demarests Kill, or the head waters of the Hackensack river, called in the will "Maries Kill." --W. S. P.]
