The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He inherited personal property and perhaps real property in the Park Ridge area from Magdalena Perry by her will probated 1 Feb 1848.

Magdalena Perry, widow of John D. Perry, dated her will 5 Oct 1835 and it was probated 1 Feb 1848 (Bergen F:427). In her will she left to her colored servant "now living with me, the homestead farm where I now live, devised to me by my late husband, with all of the houses, outhouses, barns, hovels, grist mill and 25 acres." This was bounded on the north by a public road, south by lands of Gen. Garret Ackerson, across the Pascack Brook to land of Jacob I. Blauvelt, east by Blauvelt's land. Personal estate to Cesar and his brother Thomas Thomson and their sister Sarah Williams. Her executors were her friends John I. Blauvelt, Daniel Smith and John P. Perry.<sup>1</sup>

And all the rest to Cornelius Clopper, Jr. I make my friends, John Rosevelt, Christopher Bancker, and Evert Bancker, executors. Dated August 30, 1748. Witnesses, John Nicholls, Joseph Lester, John Porter. Codicil, September 20, 1748. Leaves to widow Sarah Sandford and Hannah Johnson, each £5. To my husband, and his son, John Thompson, each a suit of mourning. My lot No. 15, left to John Thompson, is to be sold by my executors, and the money used to pay debts and legacies. The next known owner of the property was probably William Curtis, who probably acquired the property before Jan 1811, when he signed a Bergen County Road Return. Nothing is known of the owners and occupants of the house until May 8, 1823 when a deed recorded in Bergen County shows that William Curtis conveyed the property to Abner Armstrong. On July 16, 1828 Abner Armstrong and Nancy, his wife, deeded the property (in 3

lots) to William Carr of the City and County of New York. The deed gives descriptions of the lots: (1) 82 acres, more or less, bounded by Garret A. Ackerman (formerly Peter Tebowdes?) on north side of road leading to Ramapo; James Ackerman; Wolf Swamp; Albert Zabriskie; (2) 8 acres more or less, bounded by lands formerly of heirs of Peter Tebow, dec'd; Henry Powles [Powell]; Peter Ackerman; John Van Houten; (3) 1/2 acre more or less, bounded by: Henry Powles [Powell]

A possible son, "John Thompson, Junr. (of City of New York)" was married by Chas. Board, Bergen County Justice of the Peace, on January 2, 1810, to "Mary Percey (of New Prospect).

In her will she left to her colored servant "now living with me, the homestead farm where I now live, devised to me by my late husband, with all of the houses, outhouses, barns, hovels, grist mill and 25 acres." This was bounded on the north by a public road, south by lands of Gen. Garret Ackerson, across the Pascaek Brook to land of Jacob I. Blauvelt, east by Blauvelt's land. Personal estate to Cezar and his brother Thomas Thompson and their sister Sarah Williams. Her executors were her friends John I. Blauvelt, Daniel Smith and John P. Perry.<sup>1</sup>

William Thompson was an itinerant preacher who became, by 1860, the preacher at the Methodist Church at Skunk Hollow.

On 24 May 1841 William Thompson bought two acres of land in what is today Rockleigh from Jack Earnest.<sup>1</sup> In subsequent purchases from unknown individuals, he bought, in 1844, 1850, and 1854, 32 additional acres.<sup>2</sup>
