The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

Henry Z. Jones, writing in The Palatine Families of New York, 1985, Vol. II, p. 1027-8 discusses the family of Johann Philipp Theis, and then goes on:

Another emigrant family of this surname settled in New Jersey. They probably descend from the Johan Deis, his wife, and 2 children noted next to Marcus Deis, his wife, and 3 children, and other NJ settlers such as Koenraat Meinsinger, Kristiaan Worms, and Peter Wannemager on Capt. Leonard Allan's ship in the 5th party in Holland (Rotterdam Lists). This New Jersey Theis/Tyson family seem to have no listing on the Hunter Subsistence Rolls. Johannes Tysse was noted in the Ramapo Accounts in 1714. Johannes Deuss and his wife with 2 children were recorded next to the Wannemacher and Meusinger families at Hackensack ca. 1716/17 (Simmindinger Register). Johannes Theuson/Thysson/Tays m. Anna Catharina Wannemacher. . . It is easy to confuse this New Jersey family with that of Johann Philipp Theis; I would not be surprised if they were related in Germany. The name is sometimes spelled Tays.

David Tice kept a grocery store at Saddle River, Bergen Co., NJ in the 1860s.

Abraham Debaun, 80, and Sarah Debaun, 76, were listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in Washington Township, Bergen County, NJ (probably in or near Saddle River). Living in the same dwelling, but a separate family were David Tice, 31, farmer; Maria Tice, 29; and John J. Tice, 5. David was listed in the 1860 Federal Census, Washington Township, Hohokus P.O., as a merchant, and his son John J. was listed as a clerk.

David Tice, retail dealer, was listed in Washington Township, Bergen Co., in the May 1863 NJ Tax Assessment List, taxed on one one-horse carriage, valued at \$100.

In May 1879 David J. and Maria were living in Paterson.

Johannes Deuss and his wife with 2 children were recorded next to the Wannemacher and Meusinger families at Hackensack ca 1716/17 (Simmendinger Register).³ Jno. Phill Theis, of the Palatine settlement of Annsberg, volunteered to serve in the Palatine Expedition Against Canada, 1711.⁴

Johannes Teyse in 1714 paid 3-15 pounds for drawing engrossing and duplicats of papers and again 17-6 for surveying and laying out land. Johannes Teyse about 1714 bought 210 acres in the Ramapo tract.³

Land of "Johannes Tyse" was mentioned in a Bergen County Road Return dated 22 Nov 1733 and again June 1737. The line of Johannis Tyse was mentioned in a Bergen County Road Return dated 29 June 1737 concerning a road altered at the request of Jacobus Van Gelder, Johannis Tyse, and Johannis Pillesfelt. Also mentioned in the Return were the house of Isaac Boogaert, the line of Peter Fauconnier, the line of Gerrit Van Blerkum, house of Peter Tibou, and the Kings Road from Ramapog.²

This Johannes Tice may be descended from the Johan Deis who (with other NJ settlers Koenraat Meinsinger and Peter Wannemager) appears on Rotterdam Lists for Capt. Leonard Allan's ship in the 5th party in Holland (emigrated 1709/10).

Jones warns not to confuse this family with that of Johann Philipp Theis (#759 on Hunter List), although he says he "would not be surprised if they were related in Germany."

The surveyors do alter a two rod road which was laid in the year 1733, Nov. 22nd, as follows: Beginning from the house of Johannis Pillesfelt as the road now goes to the house of Isaac Boogart; from thence as the road now goes to the line of Peter Fauconnier and Johannes Tysse's land; thence along said line till it comes to a small meadow; thence north with a small turn as the trees are markt till it comes to the said line again and so along the line to the end of the lott of Johannes Tysse; thence as the road now goes to the line of Gerrit van Blerkum to a black oak tree to the corner of his fence; thence from said tree to a black oask stump standing in his clear land; thence on a straight to where he has planted apple trees; thence south-westerly along his apple trees by the east side of his house as the Road now goes to the north side of John Van Blerkum's house along the two rocks; thence on a west line to the Old Road; thence as the Road now goes to the south side of the house of Peter Tibow's; from thence as the road now goes till it comes to the King's Road from Ramapog.
