The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

The immigrant ancestor of this family in America appears to have been William, who appeared in Amsterdam in 1647 using the patronymic Jansen rather than Traphagen and was a baker by trade. He married there and emigrated to New Netherlands about 1657. He left a deposition at Kingston, New York in 1671 naming many of his family members and the areas his family had connections in Lippe, Germany.

Hendrick Traphage & Claartje Hoppe (as husband and wife) witnessed the baptism of Claertje (b. 7 Sep 1760), dau. of Gerret Van Houten & Jannetje Kip at a date between 7 Sep 1760 and before 12 Oct 1760 at Acquackanonk RDCh.(bap. #722). He was the son of Jonathan (Johannes) Traphagen and Margritie Laroe b. ca.1735 probably in the area of Ramapo (now Mahwah), NJ.¹

They apparently moved from Bergen Co., NJ to neighboring Rockland Co. NY area ca. 1776. In 1790, Henry Traphagen was in Haverstraw, Rockland Co. with 3 males over 16, 5 males under 16 and 4 females. The next line showed Jonathan Traphagen with 1 male over 16 one male under 16 and 2 females. They later moved to New Hurley, NY, where two Jonathans, a Garret, Henry, and Jacobus Triphagen, were enumerated in Ulster Co. in 1800. "Hendrick Traphagen from the congregation of Romerpock" became a member of the New Hurley RDCh. [probably the father, but possibly the son.] ca. 1808. (History of Twp. of Shawangunk p.54). Other members of the family admitted to the church there were: Jacobus Traphagen and wife Maria Westervelt (3 Dec 1808), James Traphagen (2 June 1810), Hendrick Traphagen and wife (2 Jun 1811) and Rachel Traphagen wife of John Packer (3 Oct 1812)(ibid p.55). Hendrick d. there on 5 Sep 1810 aged 75 and is bur. in the Hurley RDChyd.(bur. #1004).¹

Hendrick Traphagen may have been the Henry Traphager, inn-keeper, who witnessed the will of Benjamin Waldron, of Harlem, NY, cordwainer, dated 18 June 1781.

Henry and Jamima were Loyalists who left NY on the ship "Commerce" to St. John, New Brunswick, Canada.¹

Probate: Traphager, Henry, City of St John, St John Co., Will dated April 26, 1817, proved 9 July 1818, registered 20 May 1820. Old and infirm. Daughter Jane, wife of Thomas Sancton, Esq., entire estate with the exception of bed and bedding to son Cornelius, and 5 pounds each to son Henry, daughter Martha and daughter Mary. Johannes Traphagen was listed on the New Jersey Tax List 1737 as Traphagen, Joannes, Bergen County NJ.⁴

When Jonathan Traphagen (Johanne’s brother) died in 1743 (before November 29, 1743) there was already contention about the Ramapo Tract land and Jonathan’s father-in-law, Hendrick Leroux made bond on the land to protect the interests of his grandsons. Evidently Johannes had sold the land to Matthew Estle and David Ransford and moved to New York City where he worked as a cordwainer (shoemaker) and died in 1750 when his wife was given administration of his estate. Jonathan’s eldest son Hendrick tried to recover his share of the property in 1759 from the possessor, Elizabeth Lane, and this process dragged on for a couple of years.⁴

William appeared in Amsterdam in 1647 using the patronymic Jansen rather than Traphagen and was a baker by trade. He married there and emigrated to New Netherlands about 1657. He left a deposition at Kingston, New York in 1671 naming many of his family members and the areas his family had connections in Lippe.²

In (2nd) marriage record, they were: Willem Janszen Traphagen, Van Lemgo, Wedr. Van Jutge Claes Groenvis, en Aeltje Dirx, Van Steenwyck.³

He was said to be a physician, who settled in Brooklyn and Kingston.

In the Brooklyn Ref. Church record of the (3rd) marriage, the record reads "1661, Feb. 6. Willem Janszen Traphagel, to Joosje Willems, with certificate from the Manhatans." In the (2) record of their marriage, they were: Willem Trephagen, widower of Tryntje Peele, and Gepje Pier, widow of Hendrick Ariaanse, both resid. in Kingstown.

William Traphagen, Jr. purchased land in 1705 in Dutchess County, New York, from Henry Beekman, part of the west side of current Rhinebeck village. He is credited with building a house that became Traphager Tavern, the forerunner of the Beekman Arms hotel in Rhinebeck which styles itself as the oldest hotel in the United States. I have since found a map of this 1705 patent which shows that the land where the current Beekman Arms now stands was not within the original 1705 purchase. However in 1746, Arent Traphagen, a son of Willem Jr. excahnged some land with Henry Beekman which may be the ground the hotel now stands on. Arent is credited with building the hotel in 1769 but he died in 1747, per the date his will was probated.¹

In 1719, Willem Traphagen Jr, purchased 280 acres additional from Henry Beekman, but this land was about 3 miles far-

ther eastward, south of Landtsmans Kill near the land of Laurens Duyts.¹
