The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

David Valentine bought in 1719-20 of his father-in-law, land at Oyster Bay, NY, since occupied by his descendants.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, David Valentine, of Moskete Cove, in Queens County, yeoman, this 26 of October, 1743, being sick. I leave to my daughter Sarah Valentine, all my tract of land which I have lying on the north side of the highway which leads from Moskete Cove to Matinecock, lying on the east end of Dirck Albertson's land, being 30 acres. She is to have 1/2 when she is of age, and the other half upon the second marriage or death of my wife Charity; Also a bed and furniture and a sorell horse colt. I leave to my grand daughter, Phebe Coles, 10 acres of land lying on the south side of said highway, leading from Moskete Cove to Matinecock, and to be taken off the east end of my land; Also two bonds for £19, 19s, 3d, and all the household goods which did belong to her mother, Charity Coles, deceased. I leave to my wife Charity all personal estate, except as above, and the use of the east part of my dwelling house and kitchen, and my lands during widowhood. And so long as my daughter Sarah, and my grand daughter Phebe are unmarried they are to have the privilege of living in the house. I leave to my son Jacob all the rest of my estate after the death of my wife, with all farming utensils. I make my wife and my son Jacob executors of this will, "which is written upon one side of one sheet of paper." Witnesses, Dirck Albertson, Michael Mudge, William Lawrence. Proved, January 11, 1743/4.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Ephraim Valentine, of Hempstead, in Queens County, being this 11 day of April, 1759, not well in health, and well knowing that in a short time I must yield unto Death, but before my Change should come I would set my House in order." All debts are to be paid out of the money that shall arise by the sale of my land lying at the place called the Kills. I leave to my wife Charity 1/3 of all movable estate, and my negro man "Jesse," and my horse and riding chair, and the use of 1/3 of the rest of my real estate during her widowhood. I leave to my son Joseph and my daughter Anne all the rest of my estate, houses, lands, and meadows, both divided and undivided, that is to say, to my son Joseph 2/3 and to my daughter Anne 1/3, and they are to pay to my grand son, John Carle, £25, and he shall have all the Patent right that I bought of my son in law, Jacob Carle. If my son Joseph dies without issue, his share is to go to my daughter Anne and to my grand sons, John Carle and Sylvester Cornell. I make my wife Charity, my son Joseph, and my son in law, Obadiah Valentine, and my trusty friend, Richard Ellison, Jr., of Hempstead, executors, and they are to sell my lands at the Kills and give good title. Witnesses, Richard Townsend, Richard Titus, Hannah Wilson. Proved, July 30, 1760.

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Charity Valentine, of Hempsted, in Queens County, widow, being this 21 day of October, 1769, weak in body." I direct all debts and funeral expenses to be paid. I leave to my daughter, Charity Cornwell, all my apparell, except one gown which I give to my daughter, Anne Valentine. All my land at the Hills and all my movable estate are to be sold in some reasonable time, and when the money is collected, one-half is to be put at interest for my daughter, Charity Cornwell, during her life, and then to her children, Elizabeth and Jane Cornwell. The other half I leave to my grandson, John Carle. I make my friends, Richard Ellison and Jacobus Lyster, executors, and they are to be paid for their trouble. Witnesses, Elizabeth Willis, Jacob Willis, Richard Ellison. Proved, December 8, 1769. Jacob Willis and Richard Ellison were Quakers.

I leave to my wife Huldah 3 cows, to be purchased and maintained on her thirds of my farm; Also 10 bushels of wheat, 10 of corn, and 10 of Rye yearly, and firewood brought home to the door, and a horse and a riding chair, and a negro man, and all household furniture. I leave to my son Philip 10 acres of land fronting on the south side of 10 acres that my son Richard holds by deed on the north side of my farm. I leave to my sons, Richard and Philip, all the rest of my lands and all my rights in the Common lands, except the Brushy Plains. To each of my sons I leave a negro boy. I leave to my two sons "my Desk and two Books, one titled the Present State of England, the other named Conductor Generalis, and my book stand." I leave to my wife my Great Bible during her life, and then to my son Philip, and I leave o my two sons all my lands and Money. I leave to my grandson, Jonathan Valentine, 8 acres of timber land, to be laid out on the west side of my land joining to Francis Davenport, also the privilege of cutting 5 loads of hay on my meadow at South, yearly. And my sons shall furnish my grandson Jonathan apparell, meat, drink, washing, and lodging, and pay for his Schooling until he is 14 years old, and then put him to learn a trade. I leave to my son James a bond of Daniel Tarbush; To my daughter Anne a looking glass that hangs in the west room, and the bed and furniture, and œ40 and a negro boy; To my granddaughter, Margaret Valentine, £18, and all the movables that did belong to her father, Jonathan Valentine, deceased. I leave to my son Jonas 1/2 of my right in the Brushy Plain, and to my son David the other half. I leave to my daughters, Martha Foster and Phebe Hendrickson, 10s. each. I leave to my daughter, Sarah Crooker, 10s., and to my daughter, Ruth Crooker, three cows, "when she thinks fit to call for them." I make my wife and my sons, Richard and Philip, and my friend, Samuel Clowes, Esq., executors. Witnesses, John Williams, Benjamin Downing, Luke Cummins. Proved, January 14, 1769.

Huldah/Haldah left a will dated 10 November 1781, proved 25 March 1782. In her will, she wrote: ...I, Huldah Valentine, of the Township of Hempstead, on Nassau Island, being this 10th day of November, 1781, weak in health of body, but understanding sound, altho ancient in years. I leave unto my two sons, Richard and Phillip, three cows, paying all my charges of sickness and funeral charges. Unto Phebe Crooker, daughter of my daughter Ruth, my best cupboard and stand and two brass candlesticks, one small trunk, a half a dozen silver tablespoons, silver tea tongs and milk pot. The rest of my estate that was given to me by my husband, to Phebe Hendricks, Sarah Crooker, Anna Smith, wife of James Smith, and Phebe Crooker, and Martha Forster's children as much as either of my above-mentioned daughters, and Black Sarah and the rest of my money and clothes to be equally divided between Phebe Hendrickson, Sarah Crook, and Anna Smith, wife of James Smith, my three daughters, and Phebe Crook and Martha Forster's children equal with either of my three daughters. Unto David Valentine's, deceased, two sons, George and Phillip, £50, to be in their uncles' (Richard Valentine and Phillip Valentine) hands till the boys come of age. Unto Abigail Valentine, daughter of David, £10; to James Valentine's four daughters, £20. I make James Smith, Hendrick Onderdonck, John Williams, executors. Witnesses, John Williams, Samuel Searing, Richard Smith, yeoman. Proved, March 25, 1782.

In his will dated 4 April 1768, probated 18 June 1768, he wrote: I, Richard Valentine, of Hempsted Harbor, in Queens County, being this 4 day of the 4 month, called April, 1768, much indisposed in body and very far advanced in years, and well knowing that I shall not subsist long in this outer Tabernacle." I leave to my sister, Ann Pearsall, the use of my west dwelling house, and the two leantos on the north side, and the cellar and the Chamber, and 1/2 of my meadow ground below my house, and firewood for her use to support one fire, and the privilege to gather apples, and a cow and my black horse, and pasture for both, until her death or marriage. In his will, he wrote: I, Richard Valentine, Jr., of Hempstead Harbor, Queens County, on Nassau Island, yeoman, being this 28 day of 3d month, called March, in the year 1763, well in health, do make this present writing to contain my last will." I direct my executors to make a division of my lands, with my father, Richard Valentine. My executors are to sell so much of my lands as will pay all debts. "Only I would not have my house, where my father now lives, sold, and I would have my executors set apart so much of my movable estate as will be sufficient for my wife and children to keep house and carry on farming." The rest to be put at interest. My wife is to dwell in my dwelling-house until my son is of age or until she marries. "My children are to be supported, educated, and schooled." If my wife marries before my children are of age, my executors are to have the oversight of them. I leave to my wife Phebe two beds and furniture that my executors shall judge worth £20; also 6 sitting chairs, worth œ1 10s., and so much pewter as will be worth œ2. And one high Bilstede chest, valued at œ1 8s., and a riding chaise and horse worth £25 2s. 6d. All the rest of my estate to my children, my son Richard to have a double share, and my daughters Abigail, Sarah, Mary, Phebe, and Martha to each a share. After the death of my wife and father, my executors are to sell lands. I make my wife, and my brother-in-law, Benjamin Robbins, and my loving friend and kinsman, William Seaman, executors.
