The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

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Valleau

The Valleau Family originated in Geneva, Switzerland, with Anthony Valleau. Isaac, the next known member, was born in 1608 on the Isle of Re on the west coast of France and became the Sieur de la Pree. His son, Isaac, born in 1638, became a merchant at St. Martin's and married Susanna Descard. In 1685 they escaped to New York and settled in New Rochelle where the old home is still said to be standing, built in 1700 and known as the Drake homestead. In succeeding generations there was an Isaac until 1751 when Peter was born in Bergen County, New Jersey, who was loyal to the British Crown and who established the family in the Bay of Quinte district. He married Jannetie Lazier, widow of Andrew Labriskie [Zabriskie], and with his two sons, Hildebrand and Cornelius, left New Jersey and coming to Quebec by boat went up the St. Lawrence River until they reached Adolphustown where they took up land and remained eleven years. Then they moved to Sophiasburg where five generations of Valleaus have lived.

Esaie Valleau was the Sieur de la Pree (Lord of la Pree, a portion of the Isle de Re), and, in his time, his family and connections were seated in the Isle de Re and vicinity. Tracing his family is difficult because the records of the Isle de Re were lost by an incendiary fire 19-20 Jan 1891.

In their marriage record, he was a cooper, from Kingston; she a widow of NYC.

He was living in the East Ward of NYC in 1703, where, according to the census of that year, his family consisted of himself, two females, one male child, and three female children.

In the Tappan Ref Ch record of their marriage, they were a j.m. and j.d. both of Hackensack, with license.

He lived, after his marriage, in New York City where he was made a freeman 17 Oct 1766. He was a saddler. In 1767 he was Constable of the West Ward of NYC. At one time he had a factory for the manufacture of chocolate, in NYC.²

Fauconnier Valleau was a Loyalist and removed to Nova Scotia after the Revolution, where on 14 Aug 1784 he bought a house on Swan Creek in Maugerville, Sunbury Co., Nova Scotia from John Valleau, his son.

The Valleau family came from "L'Isle De Re, France. Isaiah (Esaie) was born there and was a merchant of St. Martin, St. Thomas and West Indies. In 1710 census he is found at age 72 living in New Rochelle, NY and resided there as early as 1690.²

In his will, Esiah Valleau of New Rochelle mentions eldest son;s son; son Peter Valleau; and daughter Borim's [Bonnin] children. Left £5 to French church in New Rochelle. Named son Peter executor. Witnesses: John Pell, Jean Tiese, Daniel Lambert. Dated 22 Dec 1712; probated 13 May 1713 (Westchester Co., Liber 8, p. 285).

In 1838 he was appointed one of the Lay Judges of Bergen Co.. About 1844 he moved to Parkersburg, WV.²
- **Ming Valleau**, b. 1798; d. 7 July 1822 of injuries from a premature explosion on July 4th at Vauxhill Gardens, NYC.; m. 1 June 1821 **Julia Blanchard**.¹ Julia Blanchard m. (2) -?- Prior. She d. 1852. Ming Valleau was a cadet at the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, NY 10 Aug 1814 to 8 Nov 1817. He was 2nd Lieut. of the 3rd Infantry in Aug 1819 and was honorably discharged 1 June 1821.²
