The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Hendrick Van Alen owned a grist mill in what is today Oakland, Bergen County, NJ; it was later owned by Cornelius Vanderhoof. This mill was located near the old jail and court house [a log building erected in what is now Oakland during the Revolution after the Hackensack Court House was burned down by the British in 1780].²

On 2 August 1740, Garret Van Ale, of Saddle River, conveyed to Roelief Cor Van Houten, miller, of the same place, for £65, land purchased by Gisbert Van Blerkum, John Bogart and John Bardan, all of Bergen County, from Andrew Johnston and William Skinner, both of Perth Amboy...said John Bogart being introduced by his two brothers Steven and Isaac Bogart...said Isaac Bogart exchanged with Peter Van Ale who sold to Henry Van Ale and the said Garret Van Ale. Signed Garret Van Ale (his mark). Witnessed by Isaac Vander Beck, Paulus Vander Beck, William Provost.¹

On 2 Aug 1783, John H. van Allen, Garret van Allen, and Hesel Van Allen (heirs of Doctor Andrias van Allen), all of Bergen Co., NJ, [sold] to Cornelius Vander Hoof, of same, [for] £860, 221 acres, Hendrick van Allen, deceased, in his will, gave his land to John van Allen, Garret van Allen, Hesel van Allen, Cornelius & Elizabeth vander Hoof, and Doctor Andreas Van Allen. Signed John Van Allen, Garret van Allen, and Hesel (x) van Allen.¹

Hendrick Van Ale of Japog, Franklin Township, Bergen County, New Jersey, Yeoman, wrote his will December 1778, and it was probated 5 July 1783 (Trenton 25:314). In it, he mentioned his wife Thomesina; eldest son Peter Vanale; other sons William, Hessel, Garret, John; heirs of deceased son, Dr. Andrew Van Alen; and granddaughter Bethshe Mead. Executors were brother John Van Ale, Hessel Doremus and Cobes S. Bogert. An inventory of the estate was made in 1783 by Jacob Ackerman and A. Abiah-?.²

His estate was sold at public vendue for £860. The property was 220 acres including "All that messuage Tennent and House, Barn, Mill." (D:221 of Deeds, Bergen County).²

On 20 March 1804 (recorded 9 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:129) Joseph Springer of the Township of Franklin, conveyed to William Van Vorhaze of the same place, for \$20, 2 acres more or less, land and privileges int he Township of Franklin at Youpough, beginning W side of Ramapough River; mentioned W end of Bridge of William Van Voorhaze across Ramapough River; for privileges of cutting a Ditch to Erect Mills and Erecting Dam for purpose of said Mills; mentioned land of Samuel Bush. Signed by Joseph Springer. Witnessed by Henry Van Allen, Hendrick D. E. Verbyryck.³

On 9 May 1804 (recorded 9 May 1804, Bergen Co. S:131) Henry Van Allen of the Township of Franklin conveyed to Peter Van Blarcom, Samuel Bush, Ryer Van Blarcom, and James Van Blarcom of the same place, for \$155.75, 89 acres strict measure in the Township of Franklin, beginning corner of tract of 64-42/100 acres returned to Lemuel Cobb on 15 Jan 1800 and recorded Book G12, p. 335, said tract recorded Surveyor General's Office, Perth Amboy, Book S14, p. 215. He died intestate and an inventory of his estate (valued at \$1,479.48) was made 5 June 1807 by Martin Van Houten and John P. Post. The inventory lists surveying instruments, sundries from the Vendue Book. The inv. was sworn to by Abigail Van Allen, administratrix, 28 Oct 1807 (she signed with a mark).³

An inventory of Abigail's estate (value not totalled) was made 27 Mar 1810 by Hendrick V. D. L. Verbyryck and Frederick Storms. It was sworn to by Laurence I. Ackerman and Martin Van Houten, admins. (de bonis non) 17 Aug 1810.

In 1769 John Vanalen of Ramapo purchased 139 acres along the Ramapo River in the area of what is today Mahwah, and on 13 Sep 1779 he sold this acreage to Andrew W. Hopper.¹

On 12 December 1769, Isaac Bogert, of Campgaw, conveyed to John Van Allen, for £350, 139 acres minus 19 acres...in Saddle River Precinct, bounded by William Hopper and Hendrick Laroe, deceased...purchased from William Kingsland, sheriff of Bergen County, who sold the lands of Johannes Laroe to satisfy a judgement of Abraham Gouverneur. Signed by Isaac Bogert. Witnessed by Hessel Doremus, Guilliam Bertholf.²

On 13 September 1779 (recorded 16 May 1805, Bergen Co. U:180) John Van Alen of Ramapough, yeoman, conveyed to Andrew W. Hopper of the same place, for £3800, 139 acres excepting 18 acres formerly sold by Johannes Laroe to Isaac Bogert 12 Dec 1769, being a house and tract at Ramapough in the Township of Franklin, the same being 1/4 part of land lately belonging to Hendrick Laroe, deceased. Bounded N by Jacobus G. Bogert; S by said Andrew Hopper; E & W by land belonging to the Proprietors of New Jersey. Signed by John Van Allen (his mark). Witnessed by Jacobus Bogert, Crynes Bartolf.³

On 5 November 1779, John Van Allen bought two tracts of the confiscated estate of the loyalist John F. Ryerson. One tract was for 262 acres bounded north by the Ramapo Patent. Another was for 49 acres bounded south by the Passaic River.¹

The Van Alen-Hopper-Van Horn House on Ramapo Valley Road in Mahwah is labeled "John Vanalen" on an Erskine Revolutionary map.

John Van Ale was an executor of his brother Hendrick Van Ale's will, dated Dec 1778; probated 5 July 1783.¹

In 1797, when they were living in New York, Van Allen and his wife sold property and in the same year bought lands at Cedar Swamp in Franklin Township. In his will, dated 1 June 1807, probated 4 May 1808, he mentioned a farm of 175 acres to son Peter, who was then living upon it; and his homestead lot in Franklin Township to the heirs of his son Henry.⁴

Lourens Van Alen owned property in Albany in 1667-8, and was assistant alderman when Albany was chartered in 1664. He bought land in S. Kinderhook in 1703.⁴

In his will, he wrote: 4 March, 1712. I, Lawrence Van Alen, of Kinderhook, in the County of Albany. I leave to my eldest son John Van Alen, £30, for his right of primogeniture, I leave to my son Luycas, £30, in consideration of the services he hath done this several years past; I will that my sons Luycas and Jacobus shall receive the sum of £18 yearly for their services, during the time they remain bachelors. After all debts are paid all the rest of my estate, to wit, the remainder of that certain tract of land lately bought of Jan Hendricks De Bruyn, and that parcel of land in company with the heirs of Geritt Lansing, situate at Wappense (Woppingers) hill, near Poughkeepsinck, and the house and lot in Albany between the house of Christopher Yeates on the south, and Johanes Luycas on the north, and all my negroes, and other goods, shall be divided among my nine children, Johanes, Evert, Peter, Stephen, Luycas, Jacobus, Catharine, wife of Melgert Melgerts Van Der Poel; Jannettie, wife of Leendet Phillipe Cozine; and Christine, wife of Johanes Van Dusen. Witnesses, Robert Livingston, Jr., David Schuyler. Proved, October 27, 1714.

In the Amsterdam register, dated 23 April 1654, is the following entry: Pieter Van Haelen from Utrecht, schoenmakersgesel [shoemakers apprentice], aged 28 years, the father living at Utrecht; living in the Dijkstraat, and Weyntje More from Campen, aged 30, parents dead, living on the Geldersche Kay, accompanied by her cousin Gijsbertje van Hoorn. Father's consent is shown. These persons were married at Buyscksloot (near Amsterdam) May 17, 1654.¹

Pieter van Halen, with wife and two children 3 and 1 years old, sailed for New Netherland in the *Gilded Beaver* in 1658. He lived first at New Amsterdam and by about 1661 settled at Wiltwyck (Kingston).

Pieter Van Alen of Beverwyck /Albany, came to America by 1658 when he is first entered into Beverwyck Court Records. He was a trader of Albany. By 1667, he had married Maria Teller, daughter of Willem Teller and Margariet Donckensen -- and he had died by January 1674. With his brother Lourens Van Alen and some other men, he purchased extensive lands at Kinderhook. His widow however sold his share of it. So far as is known he lived more in Albany (where he was identified as a merchant) and likely hardly at all in Kinderhook. His brother Lourens was settler and resident at Kinderhook.

In a will made by Maritje Teller and her [third] husband Gerrit Van Ness, dated 6 Dec 1707, they refer to a contract made 14 Feb 1676-7, before they were married, according to which William Van Alex [Van Alen], mariner, was to have property belonging to his mother, wife of Garret Van Nes, at her decease, provided Jannetje, the wife of Lourens Van Schaick, a daughter of Jan Jans Oothout (niece of Garret Van Ness) and Mayeke (another dau. of Jan Jans Oothout) the wife of Thomas Harmans Hun, have an amount of equal value in clothing.

Pieter's family originally came from Haelen or Haalen, a town in Belgian Limbourg. Pieter Gerretse Van Allen came to America in 1706 and settled along the Saddle River in New Jersey; later moving to the Ponds (Oakland).

In the m. record they are "Pieter Gerritse Van Halem, y.m. b. Rotterdam, and Trintie Hendrikse Hoppe, y.d. b. Ackinsack, both living here."

On 8 Apr 1710, "Trintie Hendrikse Hoppe, wife of Pieter Van Alen" joined the Hackensack Ref Ch.; "Pieter Gerritse Van Aalem" joined on 6 Apr 1717.

On 17 Aug 1711, Hendrick Hoppe of New Barbadoes, deeded land in New Barbadoes to Pieter Gerritse Van Aelle ... "for and in consideration of the Love, Goodwill and Affection, which I Have and do beare towards my Loving Son an Law Pieter Van Aelle."

Peter Fauconnier in 1728 deeded 210 acres to Peter Van Halle at Kamgwah [Campgaw, Bergen Co., NJ].

"Peter Van Allen, of Saddle River Precinct, Bergen Co., yeoman" dated his will 30 Mar 1757 (proved 6 Oct 1759). In it he mentioned son Hendrick to receive 20 shillings for birthright. He mentions wife Tryntie, to have real and personal estate while my widow. Son Anderis, the farm where I live, reserving a portion for my son Jacob. Executors named were sons Anderis and Jacob. Witnesses were George Ryerse, Pieter Post, Hassel Garritse.

He served in the American militia before joining the British in Nov 1776. He had purchased from John Earle in 1775, a lot containing 3/4 of an acre with a house and other buildings on it in Hackensack, and this property was confiscated in 1778 and sold by the Commissioners for Forfeited Estates to Cornelius Hogeland.²

William Van Allen was a United Empire Loyalist. They moved to Burton, Sunbury Co., New Brunswick, Canada, and later to Woodhouse Twp., Norfolk Co., Ontario, Canada.¹
