The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Personal estate, incl. a large Bible. Executors--brothers Simon and Jacobus van Arsdalen and John Stryker. Witnesses--Gerrit van Aersdalen, Johnnis van Aersdalen, John van Dike. Proved May 7, 1753. (Lib. F, p. 119.) 1753, Apr. 18. Inventory, £174.9, incl. a negro woman and negro boy, £60; books, £2; a silver cup, £1.10; made by Sachyos van Vooryes, Petris Quick, Simon van Aersdalen, Johannes Stryker and Jacobus van Aersdalen.

Cornelis Symonsz Van Arsdale had a farm at Flatlands, and one at Gravesend purchased of his father in 1700.

In his will (dated April 25, 1738, probated Apr. 19, 1745 NYC) Cornelis made his wife "Maritie," sole executor, and gave to her all his estate, real and personal, for life; to his eldest son, Dirck, a silver tankard as his birthright; then, after his wife's death, the estate to his ten children. As to "Jannetje," whom he stated was by a "former wife," as she had had her mother's inheritance, she was not to share in anything further coming from her father's last wife.

Dirck was living in the Six Mile Run area of Somerset County, NJ around 1720. He was a deacon there in 1723 when "The Rebellion at Raritan" over Domine Frelinghuysen flared up. The baptismal records for Six Mile Run prior to 1743 are lost

and so we are missing a very important piece of the puzzle. However, he was also very involved with the New Brunswick DRC. In Clayton's "History of Union and Middlesex Counties, NJ", a "List of Families in the Congregation, 1732-1735" shows two Van Arsdalens: Dirck and an "Aris". Situated next to Aris Van Arsdalen's name are those of Jeremiah and Hendrick "Van Derbilt" and a little further down the list "Aris Van Derbilt".

Gerret's second wife was called "widow" on a note dated 1 May 1782. Gerrit was a contributor to the new church at Neshanic in 1761. He lived in Straban Twp, York Co, PA and is on the tax list there 1780. In 1783, he was one of the Petitioners for the settlement in Kentucky.

Jan Cornelisz Van Arsdale settled on the Harlingen tract in Somerset Co., NJ. On May 4, 1741, he and Hendrick Vanderveer jointly purchased Lot No. 21 of Cornelius Van Duyn, of Brooklyn. (Trenton Deeds, Book G 2, p. 494).

In his will, dated 30 Nov 1749 Somerset Co., NJ, John (Jan) Vanarsdalen directed that wife [to have] estate during widowhood for maintenance of children, viz., Cornelis (eldest), Garret, Johannis, Isack, Maritie (wife of John Vannuise), Johanna and Sara. An expected child. After remarriage or death of wife estate to be divided equally among them. Executors--brothers, Philip Vanarsdalen and Nicholas Wyckoff. I order that children by my first wife shall first have out of my estate £57, etc. Witnesses--Abraham Vanarsdalen, Josound (Johannis) Sait (Hait), Nicholas Wyckoff. Proved 26 March, 1750.

In his will, he wrote: "...I, John Van Arsedale, of Jamaica, in Queens County, "being, by the abundant, gracious mercy of God, in perfect health of body." All debts and funeral charges are to be paid out of my personal property. My beloved wife Lainte shall have the use and profit of all my dwelling house, lands, tenements, and meadows which I now possess during the time she continues my widow. "But if she had rather, I order that she shall have paid her £15 a year during her life. If she accepts the same, then all my real and personal estate is to be divided among my three children, as follows: To my son Simon £10. To my son Nicholas £150. To my son Uriah £150, and the rest to all my children, viz., Simon, Nicholas, Uriah, Christophel, Cornelius, Ida, Peternella, Maria, Heletie, and Sarah. My executors are to sell real estate unless my children can agree to divide the same. I leave to my sons my wearing apparell, and I make them executors. Dated -- day of (???), 1736. Witnesses, George Youngs, Benjamin Coe, Benjamin Hinchman. Proved, March 8, 1756, before Samuel Clowes, Esq. Confirmed by Sir Charles Hardy, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor, April 29, 1756.

- **John Van Arsdale**, b. 5 Jan 1756. John served in the Continental Army during the entire Revolution. He was wounded and taken prisoner at the battle of Fort Montgomery, 16 October 1777, and endured captivity at the Old Sugar House in New York City. After nine months he was released as part of a prisoner exchange. The following year he was with General Clinton's expedition against the Indians in Western New York, and served in every campaign until 1782. He was a Sergeant under Captain Hardenburg, of Wessenfelt's Regiment. It was this John who distinguished himself by a well known act of heroism at the Battery of New York, 25 November 1783. When the English troops were preparing to evacuate, wishing to leave their own flag flying, they nailed it to the flag staff and greased the pole to prevent its removal. John volunteered to remove it and put our own flag where it had a right to be. He succeeded in climbing the pole holding the flag he had fought for between his teeth. Tearing down the English flag, he triumphantly placed the Stars and Stripes there before the enemy had sailed. The Army officers and citizens cheered the act enthusiastically, and presented him with

a handsome memorial. The government appointed him custodian of the flag with orders to raise it there every Evacuation Day as long as he lived, and his sons after him. At his death, he was buried with military honors by the Veteran's Corps, of which he was the first Captain. The flag was cherished, and was last used at the laying of the cornerstone of the Washington Monument in New York. It was subsequently destroyed in a fire at the Barnum Museum.

Philip must have settled in 1728, soon after his first marriage, within the bounds of the Readington congregation in or near Somerset County, NJ. On May 20, 1728, he received a deed from his father-in-law, Hendrick Van Dyke, for 230 acres of land, adjoining "the brook," Robert Burnett and (???) Dumont. While the exact location is uncertain it is to be judged it was in present Branchburg, possibly in present Hillsborough township, as a Philip Van Arsdale was among the inhabitants of Hillsborough in 1751. This land came afterward into the ownership of John, Philip's son, as in 1793 a sheriff's deed sold it away from John to Philip, Jr., the deed being recorded at Somerville and reciting the earlier deed from Hendrick Van Dyke. (Somerset Deeds, Book A, p. 296). As on Jan. 16, 1783, Philip (presumed to be Philip, Sr.) sold 240 acres of land near Pluckemin to his son Hendrick, it may be Philip spent his later days on this Pluckemin farm. In fact a deed to Johannes Powelson, of near Pluckemin, May 1, 1767, stated it was along the line of Philip Van Arsdalen. The fact that Philip's wife, Jane, joined the Readington church in 1733, and he in 1741, makes it certain, we think, that he originally lived nearer Readington than to either Pluckemin or Somerville, but it is also probable that, before 1767, he had gone to near Pluckemin.

Philip's will of Oct. 23, 1787, was probated Aug. 10, 1796 (Trenton Wills, Book 35, p. 405), but only mentions his four living sons, Hendrick, Philip, John, and Jacob.

Symon Janse Van Aersdal lived at Amsterdam, at the Pottebakkerspad (Street of potters) about 1650. He came to New Netherland in 1653, leaving behind his first wife. After his arrival in New Netherlands, he may have been a potter for a time. Later in 1653, he was a farmer at Midwoud (Flatbush).

He was among those taking the oath of allegiance at Flatlands between Sept. 26 and 30, 1687, on which he was noted as "Simon Janse Van Aerts Daalen 34 Jeare," meaning that he had been 34 years in this country.

He was a magistrate in 1661 and again in 1686. He was on the census list in 1698.

4 Sep 1663 -- Symon Janzen Asdalen, pltf. v/s Jan Teunizen, carpenter, deft. Pursuant to the order dated 28th August last, the pltf. produces a declaration of two persons, whereby he proves, that he absolutely purchased the house in question from the deft. The declaration being read to the deft., he persists in his answer. Pltf. replying says, to tender deft. the oath or to swear himself, that the sale was not optional. Whereupon the deft. says, he will not take any oath, and will not convey the house to the pltf., unless he confirm his statement by oath. Pltf. undertakes to confirm it on oath and did so accordingly at the hands of the Officer. Burgomasters and Schepens therefore decree, that the pltf. shall enter into the property and possession of the aforesaid house and lot, as his own.¹

The will of Rev. Simeon Van Artsdalen of Hunterdon Co., NJ (NJW 1363J), written March 3, 1786, lists among his executors "cousin John Simonson of Somerset County". Simeon (1753-1786), whose first wife was Maria Hogeland, was one of the sons of Jan Van Artsdalen (1718-1776) and Elizabeth Kroesen of Bucks County, PA and one of the grandsons of Simon Jansz van Artsdalen (1697-1770) and Jannetje Romeyn of Bucks County. Simon van Artsdalen's brother, Jan Jansz van Aersdalen (c.1705-?), appears to be the one whose children all adopted the Simonson surname.¹
