

-- VAN BOMMEL --

The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

He was probably from near Bommel, Gelderland. He immigrated to New Netherland about 1658, settling in New Amsterdam.

In the (2) NYC Ref Ch record of their marriage banns, they were: Jan Hendrickszen Van Bommel, Wedr. Van Lysbeth Jans, en Annetje Abrahams, j.d. Van Amsterdam.

He later built a mill in Harlem and also later owned land in New Amsterdam (by 1663) [Stoke's Iconography vol 2, p. 301.]

In his will, he wrote: [21 Sep 1689] I, John Hendricks Van Bomell, inhabitant within this city of New York, "Leaves to his wife, Armitie Jans, the full use of all estate. If she remarry, then two-thirds are to go to the children, Cornelius and Aeltie, "procured by my former wife Elizabeth Jans, and ~~Petrestie and Lyndert~~ [Corrected to Abraham, Pietertie and Lyntie Van Bomell], procured by my present wife, Armitie Jans." "I leave to my son Cornelius, of whom I have not heard any news these 16 years, if ever he shall happen to return, he is to have 100 guilders wampum for his birthright. And whereas my daughter Aeltie, at the time of her marriage has received 400 guilders, the other daughters to have the same." Makes John Harberdingh and Jacob Boelen executors. "And whereas it has pleased God to afflict me with blindness, whereby I am obstructed duly to

sign and seal this my will, I have therefore sent for my neighbors, and desired them to witness this will." Witnesses, Martin Clock, Albert Clock, John Harberdingh, Wm. Bogardus. Proved, by oath of the above witnesses, that this is the last will of said testator, and that this is a true translation from the Dutch original read to him, being blind. August 16, 1693. The will of John Hendricks Van Bomell, proved August 16, 1693, and Letters of administration granted to John Harperding and Jacob Baelen.

Inventory of estate of Amittie Van Bommell, widow of Jan Hendrickse Van Bommell. Taken by the executors, Jan Harpendingh and Jacob Boelen, and appraised by order of the Worshipfull Mayor, by Gerardus Duyckinck and Gabriel Thompson, February 27, 1693/4. House and lot in Princess street, next to the house and lot of Jan Harpendingh, £200. House and lot next to Richard Elliott, £60. Total, £301. [NOTE.--The "house and lot next to Richard Elliott" is probably now No. 14 South William street, which was the Mill street of early days, and the "Slyck Stedje," or muddy street of Dutch times. The house of Richard Elliott (or Ellett) which is next east was in after times owned by Rev. Lewis Rou the minister of the French Church.--W. S. P.]

Marcelis Janse Van Bommel was farmer of the burger and tapster's excise of liquors in Beverwyck many years. Some of his children took Marcelis as their surname, others Van Iveren.<sup>1</sup>

Marceles Jansen Van Bommel sold a house (which he had purchased 1653 of Goosen Gerritse Van Schaick) in Beverwyck to Cornelkis Wyncoop 29 Jan 1657.<sup>3</sup>

In his will, dated 11 June 1690 New Albany, NY, probated 22 May 1722, Marcelis Janse, of New Albany, mentioned wife Annetie, sole and universal heir; mentioned their children: Gysbercht, Huybertje, Sytje, Judith & Aasuerus. Witnessed by Cornelis Swart, Johannes Becker, Junr.<sup>4</sup>
