The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Cornelius lived at, and operated the ferry in Brooklyn; he moved about 1678 to Bergen, N.J. He was a merchant.

Sarah Roelofse was proficient in the Indian tongues and often acted as an interpreter for Peter Stuyvesant. For her services to Stuyvesant, she was confirmed in a patent granted to Cornelis Van Borsum, on Oct 14, ?, for a lot on Manhattan Island, north of the windmill, on the west side of the road to Klatchhook.

In his will dated 16 June 1680, probated 25 Sep 1682, Cornelius van Bursam of New York, wrote: to daughter Anna "the proper portion of a child." Rest of estate to his wife Sarah, "and she is to maintain my daughter Anna decently, and cause her being taught reading and writing, and a trade, by which she may live." "My negro girl Elizabeth is not to be sold, but to remain in the service of my daughter Anna." Mentions "my wife's daughter Rachel Kierstede." If his daughter Anna dies, then his brother, Timon Van Borsum, is to have "50 whole Beavers, at 8 guilders apiece or their value." Makes wife Sarah, executrix. Dated June 16, 1680. Proved, September 25, 1682.

Egbert Van Borsum emigrated to American in 1639 and settled at New Amsterdam. He was a skipper and sailor, captain of the Prince William in 1644, trading between New Haven and New Amsterdam. Egbert had a brother, Cornelius Van Borsum, living in Amsterdam, to whom, in Oct 1644 he gave a power of attorney to collect money due him from the West India Company. No records have been found to indicate that this brother ever came to New Netherland.

Egbert Van Borsum purchased a house and lot from Govert Loockermans on 26 March 1642, described as being "by Wolphert's Valley, now (1653) called the Ferry." He later bought, on 29 July 1647, another house and lot on Manhattan Island from Jan Petersen.

Van Borsum obtained a patent for two lots at the ferry in Brooklyn on 15 July 1654 and leased from the city the exclusive rights to the Brooklyn ferry, which he operated between New York and Brooklyn beginning 1 June 1654. The city enacted an odinance detailing the conditions under which the ferry was to operate, and various charges to be paid for the conveyance of people, wagons, livestock, and various goods and farm products. Because one of the requirements called for the ferryman to provide a lodge on both sides of the river, Egbert Van Borsum acquired, on 28 Aug 1654, a lot of land at Long Island, at the ferry landing, adjoining the lot formerly belonging to Cornelis Dircksen Hooghlandt and William Jansen Thomassen, who had in turn been the previous ferry-masters here. It was about this time that Van Borsum was also referred to as a tavern-

In 1670 he appears to have resided at Flatbush.

After the death of old Egbert Van Borsum, which occurred shortly prior to the taking of the county by the English, his widow, Annetje, continued the business of tavern keeper and mistress of the ferry for several years, the latter department of business being performed by her son, Hermanus.

I leave to my wife Elizabeth, and to my son Hendrick, full power to sell my estate to pay debts and for the support of my mother. My wife shall have the use of my estate during widowhood. Whereas my son Hendrick, and my daughter Catharine are already of age, and have had considerable out of my estate, I therefore order that my son Cornelius shall be brought up and educated as his mother shall think proper till he is of age, and then he is to have œ100. After the decease of my wife all the remainder to my three children. I make my wife and my son Hendrick, executors. Dated August 12, 1736.
