The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In the Brooklyn Ref Ch record of their marriage banns, they were: Cornelis Rutsen van Brunt, "young man, norn in Nieuw Uijtrecht [and] living there" to Trijntjen Adriaensen Bennet, "maiden born in Nieuw Uijtrecht, living in Gowanes" witness: Arie [.....], father of the bride.

In his will, he wrote: July 25, 1748. I, Cornelius Van Brunt, of New Utrecht, in Kings County, Gentleman, being weak in body. All debts are to be paid out of movable estate. I leave to my son, Rutger Van Brunt, all that house and home lot in the Town of New Utrecht, bounded north west by Hendrick Janse, south east by the lot formerly belonging to Joost Van Brunt and Cornelius Van Brunt, myself, Also the half part of the said lot, bounded east and south by the road that leads from New Utrecht to Flatbush. I also give to my son, Rutger Van Brunt, the now dwelling house and tract of land joining thereto, beginning by the road aforesaid, at the northwest corner of a home lot lately belonging to Hendrick Smak, and sold to the said Rutger Van Brunt, and running south along the division fence of the said home lot between my son Rutger and myself, and so along with a straight line to the land of Jaques Cortelyou, and so along the said Cortelyou to the bay, being all my land between the said line and the land of Coert Voorhees, Also all my land in the Town of Gravesend, as now in possession of my son Rutger. I give to my son, Nicholas Van Brunt, all my now dwelling house and tract of land joining thereto, beginning at the northwest corner of the home lot late of Hendrick Smak, and sold to Rutger Van Brunt, and running south along the fence to the land of Jaques Cortelyou, and so along the land of said Cortelyou west to the road, and so along the road to the place where it begun. Also all my land in said town between the land of Jan Van Brunt and the Hills, as now in possession of my son Nicholas, Also all my right in the undivided lands of said town by the Great Pond, formerly belonging to Joost Van Brunt and myself. I leave to my sons, Rutger Van Brunt and Nicholas Van Brunt, all my woodlands and meadows in Kings County. My son Rutger shall pay to my daughters, and to the children of my daughter Angentie, deceased, £200 in 5 years after my decease, viz., to my daughters, Tryntie, Marytie, Margaret, and Neeltie, each £40; and to the children of my daughter Angentie £40, And my son Nicholas shall also pay £200. All the rest of my movables to my sons and daughters, and the children of my daughter Angentie. I make my sons Rutger and Nicholas executors. Witnesses, Jan Janse, Cornelius Groenendyck, Peter Lefferts. Proved, May 13, 1754.

Rutger Joosten Van Brunt had arrived in New Amsterdam in 1653. He was probably from the village of Brunt in the Gelderland province of the Netherlands.

Rutger Joosten received a grant on 18 Jan 1662 of a double lot in the village of New Utrecht, bordered by lands of Tomas Jansen, Jan Gerrits, Cornelis Beeckman, and Nicasius De Sille; and further two lots in the valley, Nos. 17 and 20.¹

William Burnet, Governor, etc. Whereas Rutgers Van Brunt, of New Utrecht, died intestate, Letters of administration are granted to Joost Van Brunt, December 19, 1722.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Rutgert Van Brunt, of Kings County, yeoman, being well in body. I direct all debts and charges to be paid. I leave to my grand son, Rutgert Van Brunt, one of the sons of my son, John Van Brunt, lately deceased, £800 when he is 21, in 4 annual payments, but if he dies under age without issue, then to my other grand son, Jacob Van Brunt, and if he dies under age, then to my 4 daughters, Altie, wife of Nicholas Stillwell, Maria, wife of Joris Lott, Trintie, wife of John Rapalye, and Tuentie, wife of Denys Denys. I leave to my grand son, Jacob Van Brunt, one of the sons of my son, John Van Brunt, £800 when of age, but if he dies under age, then to my grand son, Rutgert Van Brunt. I leave to my wife Jannetie the use of all the rest of my real and personal estate while she remains my widow, and also the use of the money left to my two grand sons until they are of age. If she marries or desires to live elsewhere than on my farm, then my executors shall pay her £600 and

her choice of my negro men or women, also 2 horses, a mahogany cupboard, a chest of drawers, my best bed and furniture, a silver tankard containing a quart, a silver tea pot, a silver bowl, silver sugar cup and cover, and a whole set of Tea table furniture and 6 chairs. All the rest of my estate I leave to my 4 daughters, and I make them and my wife executors. Dated July 14, 1752. Witnesses, George Barnet, Francis Wessells, John Burnet, Esq. Codicil.--Confirms the above will, and leaves to his grand son, Rutger Van Brunt, a silver hilted sword and "my officer's silver pike now in possession of my son in law, Nicholas Stillwell." Dated July 10, 1755. Proved, July 29, 1758.

In her will, she wrote: ...I, Janettie Van Brunt, widow of Rutger Van Brunt, of Kings County, being ancient and infirm. I direct all debts to be paid. I leave to my grandsons, Rutger Van Brunt and Jacob Van Brunt, each œ10. I leave all the rest of my estate, real and personal, to my daughters, Altie, wife of Nicholas Stillwell; Maria, wife of Joris Lott; Tryntie, wife of John Rapalye, and Teuntie, wife of Denys Denyse, and I make them executors. Dated March 24, 1761. Witnesses, Engelbert Lott, Geritt Cowenhoven, Adrian Van Brunt. Proved, February 1, 1764.

In his will, he wrote: ...April 4, 1760. I, Rutger Van Brunt, of New Utrecht, in Kings County, farmer, being sick. I direct all debts and funeral charges to be paid. I leave to my son Wilhelmus all that home lot of land, with house and barn, where my brother, Cornelius Van Brunt, used to live in New Utrecht, "which said home lot begins from the main road, along the lane running to the strand, till you come to the corner of the Sheep Pasture, so called, from thence south east with a straight line till you come right over the south west corner of the Town's plain, and so with a straight line to the said main road, or Kings Highway, Also a certain piece of clear land, some lying on the south west side of the road that leads from New Utrecht town to Deneyses ferry, and some on the east side of said road as it now lies in fence, being about 90 acres, Also 1/3 of all my wood land lying in New Utrecht wood lands (except 2 pieces which I give to my sons Albert and Joost), Also 1/2 of all my meadow ground which lies in the township of Flatlands, Also 1/2 of a certain piece of salt and fresh meadow in the town of Gravesend adjoining the land of Daniel Lake, And my said son Wilhelmus shall pay to my executors £700 within four years after my decease. I leave to my son Rutger, Jr., all that certain piece of land with the improvements in the town of Gravesend, some lying on the south west side of the road that leads from Gravesend town to New Utrecht town, and some on the north east side of said road, with all the meadow and swamp adjoining the same, Also 1/3 of all my wood lands in New Utrecht (except 2 pieces), and he shall pay £500 to my executors. I leave to my son Adrian all that certain piece of land with improvements where I now live in New Utrecht, bounded south east by land of Volkert Voorhees, north east and south east by Petrus Van Pelt, north east by the road that leads through New Utrecht town, north west partly by Wilhelmus Van Brunt and partly by the said lane which leads to the strands, and south west by Jacques Cortelyou and the River, being 120 acres, Also a piece of clear and wood land at a place called the Great Pond in New Utrecht, Also 1/3 of all my wood land in New Utrecht (except 2 pieces), Also 1/2 of my meadow in Flatlands, and 1/2 of a piece of salt and fresh meadow in Gravesend, joining the land of Daniel Lake, And he shall pay to my executors £700. I leave to my son Albert œ300. To my son Joost £600. To my daughter Saertie, wife of Jeremias Vanderbilt, £400. To my daughter Cataryntie, wife of Daniel Hendrickson, £400. To my grand daughter Elizabeth, wife of Hendrick Johnson, Jr., £100. To my grand daughter Nelly £100. I leave to my son Albert a certain piece of wood land and a piece of salt and fresh meadow in the town of Brookland, Bounded south east by Browers creek, so called, north west by the upland of John Rapalye. I leave to my son Joost a certain piece of wood land, partly in New Utrecht and partly in Brookland, Bounded north west by the cleared land of widow Van Brunt, south east by Garrett Van Duyn, north east by Tunis Van Pelt. All the rest of my estate I leave to all my children. I make my sons Albert and Joost, and my son in law, Jeremias Vanderbilt, executors. Witnesses, John Johnson, farmer, Nicholas Groenendyck, cordwainer, Simon Boerum, Gent. Proved, May 19, 1760.
