The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolvement of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

VAN BUSKIRK - The common ancestor of the Van Buskirk family in this country was Laurens Andriessen, who came over in 1655. His name appears as an owner of a lot on Broad Street, New Amsterdam, June 29, 1656. Shortly after he purchased land in Minkakwa, later Greenville. In 1668, he was appointed "Recorder and Marker" for Minkakwa, and in 1676 was appointed "Marker General" for the Town of Bergen. He was commissioned a member of the Court of Bergen in 1677 and was made president of the same in 1681. He married Jannetje Jans, widow of Christian Barentsen in 1658. He died in 1694. His son, Pieter, born in 1666, married Trintje Harmanse of Constable Hook, and went there to live in the house which was torn down only last year. He was the ancestor of the Van Buskirks of Bergen, later Hudson County.

Abraham bought about 1724 from his father, Thomas, the homestead lot (including the family cemetery) in the Wierimus Tract (now Saddle River Borough).

On 17 April 1772, Lawrence Van Boskerk and Abraham Van Boskerk, both of Werimus, in New Barbadoes Precinct, conveyed to Cornelius J. Bogert of Paramis, in New Barbadoes Precinct, for £512, 128 acres, corner to Albert Terhune. Signed by Laurins Van Boskerk, Abraham Van Boskerk. Witnessed by Cornelius Van Boskerk, Hendrick Hopper (his mark).² This property, in the Weirimus Tract, had apparently been held in common by several Van Buskirk brothers. This lot had as its southern boundary what is today Mill Road in Saddle River.

In his will dated 28 Nov 1788, probated 6 March 1794, Abraham Van Buskirk of Paramus, Bergen Co., NJ, yeoman, mentioned: eldest son, Thomas, Dutch Bible and £10 for his birthright, also farm whereon he now lives and £50 drawn with me in a lottery; son Cornelius, homestead plantation, brew house and my part of 1/3 of certain meadow called Buskirk's, near place called Wearimus; daughter Helen Bogert, wife of Cornelius Bogert, £100 and £50 drawn in a lottery. Grandchildren: Margaret, Rachel and Henry Fredericks, Jr. (issue of daughter Margaret, dec'd, formerly wife of Henry Fredericks) £100 divided between them. Daughter Jannetje (wife of Lawrence Van Buskirk) £100. Daughter Elizabeth (wife of Peter Van Buskirk) £100. Grandchildren, i.e. Rachel (wife of Isaac Hopper) and Catherine Cooper (children of daughter Rachel, dec'd, formerly wife of Thunis Cooper) £100 between them. Daughter Catherine (wife of Thomas Boggs) £100. Executors, sons Thomas and Cornelius Van Buskirk, and son-in-law Cornelius Bogert. Wit: Jacobus Rutan, George Achenbach, Antye Achenbach.¹

Abraham Van Buskirk lived along River Road in the New Bridge area of Bergen County, NJ. He was a medical doctor by the late 1760s or early 1770s and was a member of the New Jersey Medical Society. He was elected a member of the Bergen County Board of Chosen Freeholders several times, beginning in 1766, and in 1775 was appointed County Loan Officer, a position of great trust and prestige.¹

When a local Committee of Correspondence was formed to help keep all of the colonies informed about events, Abraham Van Buskirk was elected to it, in 1775. Ten days later he was sent as a deputy to represent Bergen County at the new Provincial Congress, the popularly-elected body that was taking over control of the state government from the royally-sanctioned Provincial Assembly.¹

Abraham Van Buskirk and his family removed to Nova Scotia on the *Esther* on 15 Sep 1783.^{1,2}

In 1791 Col. Abraham Van Buskirk was elected a Vestryman of Christ's Church, Shelburne, Nova Scotia.²

"Abraham Buskirk, Captain in the British Service, Richmond Co." died intestate and letters of administration were granted 19 Jan 1785 to his widow, Ann of Richmond Co.

Abraham Van Buskirk, a Loyalist, embarked at New York for Nova Scotia in 1783, and perished at sea, at about the age of 33. His wife was Ann Corsen, or Corson, who subsequently married Jacob Remsen, and a second time a widow, Lewis Ryas [probably Ryerss]. She inherited a large and valuable estate near Port Richmond, which was partially wasted by her second husband.¹

On 8 January 1795 (recorded 4 October 1805, Bergen Co. V:411) Thomas Van Buskirk and Abraham T. Van Buskirk of Harrington, conveyed to Peter T. Van Buskirk of the same place, for £125, 1 acre strict measure, Tenement House Barn and parcell in the Township of Harrington whereon said Peter now dwells, bounded E, S, and W by said Thomas Van Buskirk; N by road. Abraham Van Buskirk, 53, Miller, was listed in the 1850 Federal Census, living in New Barbadoes Township. Listed with him were: Abraham A. Van Buskirk, 18, carpenter; Cornelius A. Van Buskirk, 26, farmer; Christina Van Buskirk, 23; Abraham Van Buskirk, 5; Richard Van Buskirk, 2. Also living with him was Elizabeth Bogert, [77?].

Abraham Van Buskirk, 62, farmer, was listed in the 1860 Federal Census, living in New Barbadoes Township (Hackensack P.O.), Bergen County, NJ. Listed living with him were: Abraham A. Van Buskirk, 27, carpenter, and his wife, Mary A., 23. Also living with them were: Simon Swiss, 21, laborer; Rosewell Van Buskirk, 3; and Peter S. Van Buskirk, 1. All were b. in Bergen County, NJ except Simon Swiss (b. Switzerland).

At the time of his death he was an Elder in the Lutheran congregation in New York City.

In his will dated 1 Apr 1733, Andries Van Boskerk of Bergen County, New Jersey, mentioned his wife Anna; son Lawrence Van Boskerk; dau. Fitie, wife of Jacob De Groot; sons John and Joost; daughter Anna as wife of Gerardus Johannes Schutt; and dau. Helena as wife of David Thomas. Made son Lawrence executor. Wit: John Baldwin, Joseph Day, Josiah Beek.¹ In his will, he wrote: I, Andries Van Boskerk, of Bergen County, New Jersey, being in perfect health. I leave to my wife Anna, all the linnen, woolen, silk, gold, and silver, belonging to her body, "and to that end my said wife may have a reasonable consideration out of my estate in lieu of a suit of mourning." And she shall continue in possession of such parts of my dwelling-house where I now live as she shall see cause to make choice of, for one year. And I have, with the consent of my said wife, caused my son, Lawrence Van Boskerk, to give a bond for £40 in lieu of dower. "And being desirous not to depart this life without performing the promise I made to my said wife before marriage, provided she perform her promise made to me." I therefore leave to her a negro woman, aged about 15 years; Also the rents of my two tenements and lots lying in Pearl street, in the city of New York, and the rents of the least of my housen, in John street, and also all the goods and movables that were properly belonging to my wife at the time of our marriage. And she is to pay to my executors £145. I leave to my daughter Fitie, the least of my houses in John street, after the death of my wife. Whereas I have taken sufficient care during my life to provide for all my children by distributing among them all my real estate, my sons, John and Joost, are to pay to my daughter Helena, £3, 15s, yearly during my wife's life. And my son Lawrence and my daughter Fitie shall pay to my daughter Anna, £3, 15s, during my wife's life. All the rest of my personal estate I leave to my son, Lawrence Van Boskerk. The amount which my wife is to pay I leave 1/2 to my three daughters, Fitie, wife of Jacob De Groot, Anna, wife of Gerardus Johannes Schutt, and Helena, wife of David Thomas, and 1/2 to my son Lawrence, and I make him executor. Dated April 1, 1732. Witnesses, John Baldwin, Joseph Day, Josiah Beek. Proved, April 17, 1732.¹

In 1724 Thomas Van Buskirk sold two lots in the Wearimus Tract to his sons, Lourence Thomas Van Buskirk and Andries Thomas Van Buskirk. Andries bought the northern lot in the Weirimus Tract from his father, Thomas, on 15 Apr 1724, and his brother Lourence bought the parcel of land just to the south. At about the same time, three other sons of Thomas (Abraham Thomas Van Buskirk, Peter Thomas Van Buskirk, and Isaac Thomas Van Buskirk) bought land to the south of Lourence.

Andrew Van Buskirk, brother of Col. Abraham Van Buskirk, and also a Tory, in the 1760s ran a tavern on the south side of New Bridge Road [Bergen Co., NJ], across the road from the New Bridge Inn owned by Peter P. Demarest. From this tavern, he instituted a stagecoach route to Paulus Hook in 1766. In 1775, he switched his stagecoach route from Paulus Hook to Hoboken, to service a ferry owned by William Bayard, a wealthy landowner who was also a Tory (after the war broke out, William Bayard became a Colonel in command of a Tory military corps).¹

He was a Loyalist. The State of New Jersey ordered his arrest and in early July 1777, 150 militia under Major Samuel Hayes of Newark were dispatched to apprehend him. In a letter from Hayes to Livingston reporting on the raid, he confirms his taking Andrew Van Buskirk on Barbadoes Neck. He mentions that Van Buskirk had taken the oath of allegiance to the State of NJ about 3 weeks prior and since that time sold provisions to the British, and he was arrested for having "committed high treason." His property was confiscated two years later.¹

Laurens Andriessen Van Boskerk was a native of Holstein in Denmark (now part of Germany), and emigrated to New Netherland about 1654 or summer of 1655. He purchased 29 June 1656 a lot on Broad Street in New Amsterdam. He was then unmarried and a turner by trade ("draijer" in Dutch; from "drawer" or one who draws the knife). He lived in New Amsterdam until 1662, when he purchased 170 acres at Mingackwa (later Greenville, now part of Jersey City) and built a house there. He soon became one of the most important members of colonial New Jersey—justice of the peace, judge of the Bergen Co. court and later its president, and a member of the Council under several governors.

He purchased, with others, a large tract of land at "New Hackensack."

“Lawrence van Buskirk, Esq. of Minachquay, Bergen Co.” dated his will 7 Nov 1750 (proved 12 Apr 1753). In it he mentions (wife) Fytie. Lawrence T. Van Buskirk bought a lot in the Weirimus Tract in 1724 from his father, Thomas. His homestead was on the East side of East Saddle River Road. They lived at Wieremis by January 1740, when a NYC Luth Ch. baptism was held at his house.

On 17 April 1772, Lawrence Van Boskerk and Abraham Van Boskerk, both of Werimus, in New Barbadoes Precinct, conveyed to Cornelius J. Bogert of Paramis, in New Barbadoes Precinct, for £512, 128 acres, corner to Albert Terhune. Signed by Laurins Van Boskerk, Abraham Van Boskerk. Witnessed by Cornelius Van Boskerk, Hendrick Hopper (his mark).² This property, in the Weirimus Tract, had apparently been held in common by several Van Buskirk brothers. This lot had as its southern boundary what is today Mill Road in Saddle River.

In his will dated 20 Nov 1773, probated 22 Feb 1774, Lawrence Van Buskirk of Bergen County, yeoman, mentioned wife Eva; eldest son, Thomas; youngest son, John La. Vanbuskerk; dau. Allyte Vanbuskerk; son John, not yet 21; dau. Antye; dau. Jannitye; dau. Mary; daughter Margret. Executors names were Thomas A. Van Buskerk and Peter Dedricks Wanemaker. Witnesses were Isaac Stagg, Cornelis Van Boskerck.^{1,3}

Signed by Thomas Van Buskirk, Abraham Van Buskirk (his mark). Witnessed by Andrew A. Hopper, John D. Ackerman.²

On 31 July 1861 (in testimony in Rev. War Pension file for Peter Van Buskirk) William Ramsey, resident of Hohokus . aged 88 swore that he had lived in Hohokus all his life and was acquainted with Peter van Buskirk and his family when they lived at New Port and kept a tavern. The deponent then kept a turning mill within one-half mile of Peter van Buskirk.¹

On 19 Nov 1861 Abraham Van Buskirk of Washington, D.C., aged 63, son of Peter van Buskirk, a Revolutionary pensioner, stated that in 1812 his father had sold his farm in Harrington Township to Garrett A. Ackerman, and moved to NYC. That he and his father both served in War of 1812. In 1816 they moved to Hopewell, Ontario County, NY and lived there some 23 years.¹

Thomas Van Buskirk is thought by some to have been the earliest settler in the Saddle River Valley, having built a log house in 1708 near the present Lutheran Church in Saddle River. Others, including Reginald McMahon, believed he never actually lived on this land, but did have a homestead in Hackensack Township in an area previously known as New Hackensack. In 1708 Thomas Van Buskirk bought half of the Wierimus Tract from Albert Zabriskie, who had received a deed for it from the Indians 1 June 1702. On 3 June 1718 Thomas Van Buskirk completed legal title to the land by purchasing it from Dr. John Johnston, a middleman for the East Jersey Proprietors (Deed Book D:254, Trenton).

In 1724, in deeds dated April 15, Thomas sold two lots to two of his sons, Lourance Thomas Van Buskirk and Andries Thomas Van Buskirk.

Thomas Van Buskirk was Justice of the peace at Hackensack in 1727, when his wife, Volkje was godparent to Catharine Hoeyer, bp. early 1727 NYC Luth Ch., dau. of Erick Christian Hoeyer and his wife, Catharina.

Thomas Van Buskirk lived in Hunterdon County the latter part of his life.

Thomas Van Buskirk's will was undated, but probated 20 Oct 1748 (NJ Wills 2:493). In his undated will, Thomas Van Boskerck, of Reading Township, Hunterdon County, NJ, mentioned Wife, but not named. Son, John. Daughters--Janetie, wife of Pieter Van Norden; Gertruy, wife of Wiert Banta. Residue to children, viz., Laurens, Andries, Abraham, Pieter, Isack, Machiel, John, Margret, the wife of John Church, and Titie, wife of Andries Amack. Executors--sons Laurens, Abraham and Machiel. Witnesses--Jacobus Swart, Joost Schamp, Nicholas Wyckoff. Proved Oct. 20, 1748. 1747-8, March 1. Inventory, £136.3.10; made by John Stoll, Jr., and Isaac Krom (or Crom).

On 15 May 1804 (recorded 14 November 1805, Bergen Co. V:354) Thomas Van Buskirk of Harington conveyed to Leshan Derest of the same place, for \$33.12, 1-1/4 acre, 16 rods, in Harington beginning near land of said Thomas Van Buskirk, bounded N and E by road; S and W by land of said Thomas Van Buskirk. Signed Thomas Van Buskirk. Witnessed by John Davd. Haring, Abraham Van Buskirk.¹

In his will, dated 3 Mar 1809, pr 26 Mar 1811, "Thomas Van Buskirk, of Harington, Bergen Co., yeoman" mentions home-stead farm to be disposed as per included rough map to grandson Thomas A., son of eldest son Abraham T. Van Buskirk, dec'd; to 2nd and youngest son Peter. Two daus. Rachel (wife of David Baldwin); Leah (wife of John D. Ackerman); Margaret (wife of Garret Hopper); and Mary (widow of Andrew Hopper). Also mentions "late wife" (unnamed). Thomas signed his will with a mark.

Executors were son Peter and nephews Abraham Bogert and Henry I. Zabriskie. Witnesses were Cornelius Ackerson, Albert G. Hopper and Abraham Westervelt.

An inventory of the estate (valued at \$442.96) was made 23 Mar 1811 by John Hopper and John D. Ackerman.

On 26 March 1804 (recorded 24 July 1804, Bergen Co. S:422) Andrew G. Hopper of New Barbadoes Township, Taylor, conveyed to David Baldwin of the Township of Harrington, Carpenter, for \$1,875, 75 acres more or less in the Township of Harrington, beginning N corner of lands of Thomas L. Van Buskirk. Bounded NW by Saddle River; NE by lands of Thomas Van Buskirk; SE by lands of Cornelius Demarest and Caspares Westervelt; SW by said Thomas L. Van Buskirk. Signed by Andrew G. Hopper. Witnessed by Garret Hopper, Abrm. Westervelt.²

Osburn, 19, farmer; John Osburn, 18, farmer; Maria J. Osburn, 15; Rachel C. Osburn, 13; Elizabeth D. Osburn, 8; Henrietta Osburn, 5; and Thomas B. Osburn, 2.

Rachel Van Buskirk, 81, widow, keeping house, was listed in the 1880 Federal Census, living in Washington Township. Living with her were Gustavus Tompson, 14, black, a servant; and Hester E. Wanamaker, 63, widow, her daughter.
