The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their banns and marriage, they were: Abraham Van Duyn, j.m. Van Swol, en Geertje Martens, j.d. Van de Walebocht, d' Eerste woonende op N. Uytrecht, en twede tot N. Yorck.

He was a resident of New Utrecht at the time of his marriage. In 1698 his name appears on the census of Brooklyn. He resided at one time at Maspeth Kils in Queens Co., and then removed (about 1706) to the Raritans, N.J. In 1714 an Abraham Van Duyn, supposed to be this Abraham) lived in Cecil Co., Maryland.

His descendants lived in Morris Co., NJ and from there moved to PA, Ohio, NY state.

In their Brooklyn Ref Ch (1) marriage intentions, they were: Cornelis van Duijn, young man born in New Amersfort, and Machteltje Huyken, young woman also born in New Amersfort. They had their banns proclaimed with the consent of their parents: Gerrit Cornelissen van Duijn, father of the bridegroom; ijtje van Duijn [Jacomyntje Swart], his mother; [and] Annitje Huijke, mother of the bride.

His descendants were in Queens Co., NY and New Brunswick, Canada.

In 1687 he took the oath of allegiance in New Utrecht as a native; commissioned as justice of the peace of the county in 1689, and on ass. roll of New Utrecht of 1693. On Apl. 30, 1699, he bought of Simon Aesen De Hart and w., executors of Wm Huyken or Heocken, dec., for 262 10 sh. a farm at Gowanus 400 rods in length and 78 1/2 rods in breadth. On Dec. 30, 1699, he bought of Conrades Vanderbeek a farm in Gowanus, as per p. 210 of Lib. 2 of Con. In 1706 he was assessed in New Utrecht for 102 A.

With others, about 1710, he bought the Harlington tract in Somerset Co., N. J.

In his will, he wrote: ...March 3, 1752. I, Cornelius Van Duyn, of Brookland, in Kings County, yeoman, being at present old and weak in body. I leave to my wife Christina all my house where I now live at Gowanus, in Brookland, with the Old orchard, and one acre of land where she thinks proper on my farm, Also the cupboard in the parlor, with the bowls thereon standing, and the chest and table in the parlor, "and the bed and bedstead which stands in the kitchen," And another bed and bedstead which stands in the middle room, Also my Great Bible. I also leave her the interest of £400, and all the movable goods which my loving wife brought in my house when I first married her, Also all the linnen that is now ready made, and she is to give to my daughter Christina as much linnen as she has occasion for. I also leave to my wife two cows and pasture for the same, "and good keep in the winter," Also my little red chest and my negro man "Frank," "but if my wife cannot agree with him, my executors shall buy a negro wench or a negro man in his room, but they shall not go higher than £70." "My executors are to take especial care of my negro slave Esopus, that the poor slave shall not suffer for want of anything that may be reasonable." My son Cornelius shall provide my wife with good walnut wood, ready cut and brought to the door. I also leave her my bolting mill and bolting cloths. I leave to my son Gerritt £5 more than his equal share. "I leave to my daughter Christina £80 for a gift, as she has been very kind and helpful to me in my old age." I leave to my son Cornelius all my farming tools, also my great Canoe and carpenter tools. I leave all my clothing to my sons Gerritt, William, and Cornelius. All the rest of my movable estate I leave to my sons Gerritt and William, and to Machtel, wife of Volkert Rapalye, and child of my daughter Antye; and to the children of my daughter Jacomintie, viz., Catrintie, wife of Denys Hegeman, and Altie, wife of Cornelius Peters; And to my daughters, Cornelia, wife of Nicholas Veghte, and Macheltie, wife of Hendrick Staats. I make

my son Cornelius and my daughter Christina, and my friends, Jacobus Lefferts, Isaac Sebring, and Peter Strycker, executors. "I desire this will to be proved within six weeks after my decease." Witnesses, Jacob Bennet, Arent Heyer. Proved, October 26, 1754.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Cornelius Van Duyn, yeoman, of Brooklyn, Kings County, being in perfect health. All my just debts and funeral charges to be paid. I leave to my dearly beloved wife Phebe, my whole estate, during widowhood. At her re-marriage she may take of my household furniture whatever she may think proper to furnish one room sufficiently, and choose two of my negro wenches; likewise, whatever the law entitles her to for dowry. Unto the children of the following persons, £1,000 in equal shares, namely: my brothers, Garret and William Van Duyn, Machaltie Rapalja, Jacomanty Rynier Vaghte, Altie Peterson, Cornelia Veghte, Catharine Hegemen, Jerrhe Peterson, Gerbrant Peterson, Albert Peterson, Thomas Peterson, Machaltie Staats, and Christina Nostrand; payable to the children living when my estate is divided, at my wife's death or intermarriage. Unto my eldest brother, Garret Van Duyn's son, Cornelius, all my wearing apparel, my best saddle and bridle, holsters, pistols and gun; Also, £50; unto the said Cornelius Van Duyn's daughter, Altie, £50; unto David Sprung's daughter, Phebe, £60; unto Albert Peterson's daughter Phebe, £30, payable at the said division. The remainder of my estate, after above legacies be paid, to be divided as follows: one half to my two sisters, Machaltie Staats and Christina Nostrand, and their children, in equal shares; the other moiety to be equally divided amongst Jacobus Van Deventer, Saytie Sprung, Ida Striker, and Mary, wife of William Bennet, my wife's relatives. At my wife's death or intermarriage, my whole estate to be sold and divided as above ordered. I make my wife Phebe, Garret Nostrand, Jacobus Vandeventer and Fernandus Suydam, executors. Dated March 6, 1767. Witnesses, Christopher Codwise, Capt., now of the City of New York; Thomas Candell; Nathan Fish. Proved, February 28, 1784.

In the record of their marriage intentions, they were: Deonys Gerrets van Duijn, young man at New Utrecht, with Marytie Buycsie [sic; misreading of handwritten Huycken], young lady at Brooklyn.

His descendants were in Kings Co., NY and Somerset Co., NJ.

In his will, he wrote: ...August 19, 1729. I, Denys Van Duyn, of Flatbush, in Kings County, being very sick. All debts to be paid. I leave to my eldest son, William, £5 for his birthright. To my son Gerritt, £50, to be paid on the day of his marriage, or when he is 30 years of age. To my son Jacobus, £100, on day of marriage, or when 30 years of age. To my son David, £50, when married or 30 years old. To my daughter Maria, £50, on day of marriage, or when 30 years old. To daughters, Lydia and Keziah, each £50, when married or when 30 years old. I leave to my son William, all that tract of land or Plantation, whereon he now lives, at Raritan, in Somerset County, in Province of New Jersey, being 250 acres. And he shall pay to my executors, £400, to be divided among all my children, William, Denys, Gerrett, John, David, Jacomyntie, Anetje, Lydia, and Keziah. I leave to my son Denys, all that tract of land or Plantation where he now lives, at Raritan, aforesaid, being 200 acres. Also another piece at Raritan, of 50 acres, which is the rear part of the wood land adjoining my son William. And he is to pay to my executors, £430, to be divided among all my children. I leave to my son Gerritt, all that tract of land or Plantation whereon I now live, in Flatbush, as now in fence. Also a lot of wood land in New Utrecht, at a place called the Great Pann, being 13 acres. Also a lot of meadow in Flatbush, at a place called Kanarsey (Canarsie). And he is to pay to my executors, £640, to be divided among all my children. The place in New Utrecht, or elsewhere, not herein given, is to be sold to any person or persons, upon Long Island living, and to no other persons from elsewhere, and the money to be paid to all my children. The crop of wheat of last year and this year, is to be kept for the family. And all my children are to have lodging in my house, and not to be molested, by their brother Gerritt, or any other brother, while unmarried. I make my sons, William and Denys, and my

son-in-law, George Anderson, executors. Witnesses, Rem Martense, Adrian Martense, Adrian Hegeman. Proved, November 3, 1729.

Garret Cornelisz Van Duyn of Nieuquirken, Holland, a village in Zeeland in the Netherlands, carpenter and wheelwright, emigrated in 1649 from Zwolle in the Province of Overijssel in the Netherlands. He settled in Flatbush, on a farm adjoining the bounds of New Utrecht.

Jacomyntje stayed in the Netherlands when her father came to New Netherland, and she didn't come out to rejoin him until 1662 when she arrived in the ship, "D'Vos" ("The Fox").

In 1670 Garret Cornelisz Van Duyn returned to Zwolle, Holland, but came back to this country in 1679 and settled finally at Flatbush, L. I.

The surname is probably derived from the community of Duin or Dun, in the province of North Brabant, where he many have been born or his parents resided. On Feb. 6, 1684-5, he purchased of Jacques Corteljan, his brother-in-law, a farm in the present boundaries of Flatbush, lying south-west of Martense's lane, now (1875), owned by the heirs of George Martense, to which he removed, and which he sold, June 6, 1698, to his son Denyse.

In his will, he wrote: ...I, Garitt Van Duyn, of New Utrecht in Kings county, being in good health, do make this my last will and testament. I leave to my wife Jackominie the choice of my negroes. I leave to my son Cornelius Van Duyn, the farm where I now live at New Utrecht, with all houses and buildings, with all rights and privileges in the Commons of New Utrecht; and he is to pay the following legacies within twelve years, viz, to my son Denyse and to my daughter Ashe, and her children each, 150 pounds sterling. I leave to my children, Cornelius, Denyse, Abraham, and Ashe, all my lands in Dutchess county. The share of my daughter Ashe is to be managed by my executors for the benefit of herself and her children. I leave to my wife 25 pounds sterling, and 12 pounds yearly, for life. I leave to my son Cornelius, all my working tools for the carpenters and wheel wrights work, and I make him executor. Dated June 30, 1705. Witnesses, Henry Filkin, Peter Cortelyou, Jan Van der Beck. Proved, June 14, 1706

In his will, he wrote: ...December 31, 1768. I, William Van Duyn, of Newtown, in Queens County. All debts and funeral expenses to be paid by my executors out of what money I leave or give to my two daughters, so that the same shall be paid by them, viz., Catharine, wife of Jacob Remsen, and Maghteltie, the now wife of Abraham Remsen. I leave to my two grandsons, William and Dominicus Van Duyn, the sons of Cornelius Van Duyn, all that certain tract of land or farm, with the improvements, in Newtown, as may appear by deeds, and whereon they now live, And all my right to the lands and meadows at South, lying in the bounds of Jamaica, The said farm to be equally divided by a line running from the road that leads from Newtown to Jamaica South, about a southwesterly course through the said land, and William is to have the part on the south-west side joining the road, with the house and buildings. I also give him 4 acres of wood land, over and above his half of said farm, which 4 acres lies joining to the side of the farm which I give to him. The other half of said farm I leave to my grandson, Dominicus Van Duyn. I also give to my two grandsons all the land I have at the South side in Jamaica, with all the privileges. And when my grandson William comes of age, he shall pay to his sister, Ariantie Van Duyn, £250. And when my grandson Dominicus comes of age, he shall pay to his sister Janattie £250. All the movables on said farm to be divided between them. I leave to my grandson William my gray horse and saddle and bridle, "if I do not dispose of them myself," And they are to provide a sufficient maintenance for their two sisters until they are 18. "And they shall provide a reasonable maintenance for old John Murphy during his life, if he choose to remain in the place." My executors are to sell a piece of 8 acres of woodland lying in the Hills, and is bounded north by Dowe Van Duyn, west by John Suydam, south by heirs of Cornelius Van Duyn, And if it brings less than £600, the amount is to be made up out of the land left to William and Dominicus; And I leave the said £600 to my two daughters, Catharine Remsen and Maghteltie Remsen. I leave to my son, Dowe Van Duyn, all that certain tract of farm whereon he and I now live, as may appear by a deed from me to him, And all my land and meadows

which I lately purchased at vendue from the estate of Gabriel Furman; Also a certain piece of meadow joining the same, which I reserved for my own use. "I also give to my son Dowe my part in the large Canoe at South," Also a case of bottles and a cross cut saw. All the rest of my estate I leave to my two daughters. "I leave to my grandson, William Remsen, son of Abraham Remsen, my little Canoe at South, with all the rigging and fish car, and my carpenter's chest." "I leave to my grandson William, son of Cornelius Van Duyn, my waggons and pleasure Sleigh, and my little Canoe at home." I leave to my grandson Cornelius, son of Dowe Van Duyn, my large Dutch Bible and my fowling piece and small gun. "I leave to my grandson Aert, son of Dowe Van Duyn, a French Buckaneer [sword] now in possession of his father," Also my iron bound large chest, and my Dictionary and all other books, and my walking cane (the best), and my Holsters and pistols. I make my son Dowe, and my sons-in-law, Jacob and Abraham Remsen, and Falkert Rapalye and his son Teunis, executors. "Before signing, I give to my son Dowe the privilege of a landing called Brasses Landing." Witnesses, Abraham Remsen, Rem Remsen, Nicholas Remsen. Proved, April 5, 1769.
