The family groups represented in this collection may not be complete, because information was entered bit by bit as I found it or happened upon it; I have not done any systematic research on these families. Because they do not compose whole family genealogies, these listings are arranged differently from most genealogical records or histories. Each listing is a family group, and is arranged and filed alphabetically under the name of the head of the family.

Names are generally in alphabetical order (disregarding spelling variations and middle names), then in approx. chronological order. The first sorting is by surname (mixing together any and all spelling variations), then by given name, then by approximate birthdate (when known) in approximate chronological order. For easier reference, surnames in headings are grouped together under the most common spelling usage that evolved in this geographical location, regardless of individualistic spellings in the records themselves. Cross references are used in most cases where surname spellings substantially vary.

Within the quoted records, the individual spellings have been (mostly) retained because they sometimes provide clues (although in general—but with exceptions—they seem to largely reflect the record keeper's particular orthography and not always, at this early period, any special family preference). Those interested can see the variety and evolution of a particular name's spelling and the interesting and sometimes amusing attempts at phonetic reproduction. Keep in mind that before names and spellings were standardized, records reflected the individualistic whim of the particular recorder (often two different spellings of the same name within the same document). In addition, all records were handwritten, and sometimes deciphering a handwritten name in early records can be quite challenging! So expect to search under all possibilities of spelling (for both surnames and given names).

Given names are grouped together without regard for middle initials or middle names. Because middle names and/or initials are sometimes used, sometimes not used in various records, it seemed simplest to arrange entries as if the middle names or initials did not exist. Usually all variations of a given name are grouped together as though spelled one way: Jan, Johannes, John, etc. are all grouped as one (but also look under the other forms).

Sources and references are included with each "family" grouping, but may or may not include sources that are cited (or are obvious, such as baptismal records, etc.) within the narrative or listing itself.

As with any compiled genealogical record, researchers should regard this information as leads and clues, and should verify all data with independent research.

I welcome, and would be grateful for, any additions or corrections, especially with source citations.

Kings County, NY, Deeds, Book I, p. 344: Ante-Nuptial agreement between Agias Van Dyck and Magdalena Hendrix, widow of Minne Johannes dec'd, dated 22 Dec 1693, signed Agias Van Dyck in presence of Henry Filkin & Jacobus Vanderwater. Acknowledged before Henry Filkin, Justice, Recorded 23 Dec 1693. Henry Filkin, Regr.

In her will, she wrote: 3d day of February, 1693, I, Magdalena Van Dycke, widow, of the city of New York, being sick, do make this my last will." I leave to Ellinor Cavalier, the now wife of John Cavalier the elder, that parcel of ground which the said John Cavalier's house stands on, the breadth of the whole lot, as broad as the house stands but no further. If she die before her husband, then it is to go to my heirs, but if she outlive her husband then to her absolutely. The rest of estate is left to Peter, Katharine, John, Magdalena, Mary, and Elizabeth Cavalier, and to Kathrina Arnouts Van der Weyde. Makes Peter Cavalier and his mother, Ellinor Cavalier, executors. Witnesses, Evert Van Hook, Olphert Shwartz, Wm. Huddleston. Proved, before Colonel Stephen Van Cortlandt, February 3, 1696, by oath of witnesses, and Peter Cavalier takes the oath as executor.

John VanDike of St. George's Hundred in Co. of New Castle, [DE], Executor of the Last Will & Testament of Andrew VanDike of sd place, dec'd., for the sum of 40 pounds, sold unto Abraham Gooding of sd place, yeoman (as high bidder), a seventh part of a plantation & tract of land, late the share of David VanDyke. This is property that sd Andrew in his lifetime was seized of. In sd Andrew's Last Will, dated 20-May-1730, he bequeathed his land to be equally divided amongst all his sons & daughters, excepting his son Stanley. Division made insufficient for bringing up the youngest child of sd Andrew, afsd son David. Orphans Court on 16-May-1738 before John Richardson, Charles Springer, Jehu Curtis, John Finney, Thomas James and Thomas Noxon ordered selling 1/7 if said plantation belonging to sd. David. The nearest relations of sd david, namely Thomas Hyatt and Isaac Cannon certified the desired sale; condition was when sd David reaches 21, the amount of forty pounds (amt. paid to each of his brothers and sisters for like share) be accountable to him. In the meantime, sd David to be put out as an apprentice when he becomes 14 years. He shall be taught to read English and write and arithmetic to Rule of three without bringing further charge against sd Court. Signed: Jo VanDike. Wit: Jno Robinson, Thos Noxon. Recorded 14-Nov-1738. (M1:102)<sup>1</sup>

His occupation was given as a pilot. On 18 April 1657 Frans Claesen van Dyck had the Burger right. He was one of New Amsterdam's earliest schoolteachers. He was also a shoemaker.<sup>1</sup>

In 1738 he purchased a 1000-acre tract of land bordering upon Crum Elbow Creek, bought jointly with Aert Williams. They lived first in NYC, then moved to near Tarrytown, NY. About 1737 they moved to Great Nine Partners, near Crum Elbow.

In His will, he wrote: "...I, Francis Van Dyck, of Crom Elbow Precinct, in Dutchess County, yeoman, being in health. I leave to my son Francis, 200 acres of land, being a 200 acre lot, lying in the Great Nine Pastures, in Dutchess County, bounded west by the Fish Creek, north by lot 6 of Aert Williams, and south by lot 4 of Aert Williams, during his life and then to his children. If he dies without issue, then to my sons Peter and Cornelius. I leave to my sons Peter and Cornelius, 300 acres of land in Crom Elbow Precinct, bounded west by Fish Kill, north by Aert Williams, south by Aert Williams, and east by the lot called Caele Bergh Lot. My son Peter is to have the north half, and my son Cornelius the south half. I leave to my grand-son Jacobus, son of my son Jacobus, deceased, 100 acres of land, beginning at the north-west corner of 253 acres, which came to my share of the land I purchased with Dolf Banker and Jost Garrison, and to run south along the west bounds till a line parallel to the north bounds will contain 100 acres, being the land improved by his father. I leave to my sons Peter and Cornelius the remainder of said tract, being 153 acres, and all the rest of my real estate. The said lands are charged with the payment of £5 yearly to my brother, Richard Van Dyck, during his life. I leave to my daughters Magdalena, Margaret, and Catalinta, all my personal estate. I make Jose Garrison, and Magdalena his wife, my daughter, and Richbald Williams and my daughter Margaret his wife, and my daughter Catalinta, executors. Dated July 19, 1751. Witnesses, Edward Man, Benjamin Payne, Abraham De Forest. Proved, November 19, 1753.

Hendrick came from Utrecht in 1639 as Ensign (1639-40); returned to Netherlands. He came back in 1643 with Stuyvesant with commission as "Schout-Fiscal" (dated June 28, 1645) from the States General of the Netherlands. Member of Council, New Netherlands, 1642, 1644.

Hendrick Van Dyck was an ensign in command of the Dutch forces in their early wars with the Indians. He was the first Schout Fiscal -- a sort of judge and sheriff-in New Amsterdam, and held his office until 1652. He was one of the original grantees, from the West India Company, of plots of land at New Amsterdam, his lot being on the west side of what is now Broadway, below Trinity Church, and running to the North River.

In 1655 he shot and killed an Indian who was stealing fruit from his orchard. This hasty action led to much trouble with the Indians and many settlers were killed.<sup>3</sup>

29 June 1656 -- Hendrick van Dyck as Att'y for his son in law Nicolaes Meyer, appeared in Court in New Amsterdam.<sup>2</sup>

In his will, he stated: In the Name of God, Amen. Know all men that on the 13 day of August, 1655, about 8 o'clock in the morning, did appear before me, Dirck Van Schelluyne, Publique Notary, Mr. Henry Van Dyke and Mrs. Divertie Cornelisen, his wife. The said Henry Van Dyke being sound in body, and the said Divertie being sickly in bed, but both having their

minds and memories sound. They declare that they have dowered their two daughters at the time of their marriage according to their ability, viz.: Sada, married to Nicholas Meyer, and Ryche, married to John Deveritt [Dareth]. They desire that their two under aged children, namely, Cornelius Van Dyke, aged 13, and Janeke, aged 9, shall each have the sum of 400 guilders. The survivor of the two testators is to have all the rest of the estate. "Done at Amsterdam, in New Netherland, at the house of the testators, in presence of John Jacobsen, cooper, and Peter Jansen De Witt, farmer, as witnesses." Proved at Court of Record in New York, March 20, 1687/8. (Note: This is the oldest will on record in New York. The house of Hendrick Van Dyke was on the west side of Broadway, the third lot south of Oyster Pasty Lane.)

I leave to my son, John Van Dyck, all my farm or plantation where I now live in Kings County, with all buildings, and he shall pay to my executors £600. I leave to my daughter Gertruy, the now wife of James Robinson, £200, and I leave to her daughter Janettie a gold ring. I leave to the children of Philip Van Arstate and his wife, my late daughter Jannettie, deceased, £200 (names not given). I leave to the child (not named) of my daughter Tryntie, deceased, late the wife of Tunis Denise, £150. I leave to my daughter Maria, wife of Gerrit Boerum, £200. I leave to my son John my best wagon and my Great Dutch Bible. I leave to my grand son Hendrick, son of my son John, my gun. I leave to my son John a negro woman and negro man, and he is to pay œ100. My executors are to sell all the rest of personal estate, and after paying legacies the rest to be divided among my children, Hendrick, John, Gertruy, and Maria. Jacobus Franszen Van Dyck had three brothers, Claas Franszen, b. about 1643; Dirck Franszen, b. about 1647; and Tymen Franszen, b. 1657. Jacobus and his brother Dirck were cadets in Capt. Cornelius Steenwyck's Company of New Orange Militia in 1673.

In the record of their marriage intentions at NYC Ref Ch, they were: "Jacobus Franszen, young man from Amsterdam, and Magdaleentje Cornelis, young woman from New Albany, both living in New York."

In 1683 he was the owner of an open boat, indicating he had probably followed the shipping business to some extent, as his father had done before him. In 1686 he was living on King Street, and on 23 June 1688 he and his three brothers were awarded a patent for their land in Smith's Street.

Jan Thomasse Van Dyck, the first of the name in America, was the son of Thomas Van Dyck and his wife, Sytie Dirks, of Amsterdam. There were two other sons, Nicholas Thomasse and Hendrick, but there is no evidence that any of the Holland family came to America except Jan Thomasse, who emigrated in 1652 and settled at New Utrecht, Kings county, now part of the city of Brooklyn. His wife, who came with him, was Tryntie Achias Haegen.



Tryntje Agges Haegen was b. about 1615 Knipphausen. Until 1855, Knipphausen was in Germany (*Inn- und Knipphausen*), a tiny territory. One part of it is today part of Wilhelmshaven, the other was in the area of Varel, in the south of Friesland County [*Kreis Friesland*].<sup>2</sup>

Jan Thomasse Van Dyck, of probable Friesian origins, emigrated 1652, possibly on "De Bonte Coe" (The Spotted Cow) and settled in New Utrecht. (One source SCHQIV #4, Oct 1915, says he was the son of Thomas Van Dyck and Sytje Dirks- however, H. Macy does not corroborate this, and says parents are unknown) His original patronymic was Guecke/ Glecken etc. Jan's children were baptized in the Old and New Dutch Reformed Churches of Amsterdam.<sup>3</sup>

In 1657 he was granted 25 morgens (50 acres) of land. In May, 1659, he appears in a drawing for lots of meadow land at New Utrecht. Feb. 23, 1660, he is referred to as "Overseer over all" and as "Sergeant." On June 12, 1660, he accompanied Lord General Peter Stuyvesant to Canarsie, where a piece of meadow was given the town of New Utrecht. He is here referred to as Assistant Secretary of that town, Custodian of its Records, etc. On January 26, 1660 he joined with four others in a letter to the Fiscal, complaining of the damage done daily by the hogs in consequence of the insufficiency of the fences, "so that they also had a mind to be neglectful if nothing was done to abate the evil."

He was appointed Magistrate of New Utrecht in 1659, and also, subsequently, on Feb. 23, 1660, Dec. 22, 1661, and Aug. 18, 1673. On Aug. 24, 1662, he is mentioned as one of three Commissioners of the village of New Utrecht. Later he is spoken of as having been selected by the Council of War as one of four Schepens of the village.

In the NYC Ref Ch record of their banns, they were: Jan Janszen Van dyck, j.m. Van Amsterd., en Theuntje Thys, j.d. Van Buuren en Gelder't.

On Sept. 29, 1676, he was assessed for one poll, 2 horses, 2 cows of 3 years, 1 cow of 2 years, 16 morgens (32 acres) of land; all of a total valuation of £84.10. ("Documentary History of N. Y.," Vol. 2, p. 282). On Dec. 27, 1689, he was commissioned by Lieutenant-Governor Leisler as Lieutenant. (Ibid, p. 198). On page 809, Vol. 4 of "Documents Relating to Colonial History of New York," his name is given as "Captain of Foot Company of the Town of New Utrecht;" date 1700. In 1726 he sold all his real estate, consisting of a dwelling house and 60 acres of land, also ten other parcels of land, to his son-in-law, Rutgers Van Brunt, for £1,676. This deed is dated September 14, 1726, and was recorded July 31, 1729. As his wife was dead, his son, Matthys, well settled at Red Hook, and his son Jan an extensive land owner in Middlesex and Somerset counties, New Jersey, his daughters all married and he an old man, he probably disposed of his real estate in order that a division could more easily be made among his children at the time of his death.

In his will, dated 16 May 1735, probated 9 Nov 1736, Jan Van Dyck of New Utrecht in Kings County, mentioned his two sons John and Matthys, and his three daughters: Catharine, widow of Daniel Hendricksen, Jannettie wife of Capt.

Rutgers Van Brunt, and Angentye wife of Simon De Hart. Also mentioned grandson John Stephens and granddaughter Teuntie, widow of John Fleigh. Mentions children of deceased dau., Catalyntje, late wife of Garret Keteltas (3 sons and 3 daus, not named). Great-grandson John Van Beuren, a son of his granddaughter Teuntie Ricpon, deceased, who was the wife of Doctor John Van Buren, Jr. Appointed two sons, John and Matthys Van Dyck, and two sons-in-law, Rutgers Van Brunt and Simon DeHart, executors. Witnesses: Cornelius and Joost Van Brunt, Theophilus Ellsworth, and Christopher Codwise.

He left New Utrecht in 1720 and settled at Fresh Ponds, Middlesex county, N. J., about three miles from Spotswood. In a list of the militia under command of Col. Thomas Harmer in 1715, recorded in "Colonial Records," Vol. LX, p. 72, in Fifth Company, "John Van Dike" is listed as a private. His will, dated "Corporation of New Brunswick," April 12, 1757, is recorded on page 484, Liber H, Trenton. The family Bible of Jan Van Dyck and his wife Annetje (Anna) Ver Kerk, was, in 1890, in possession of Rev. J. Addison Henry, D. D., of Philadelphia, and the records were photographed by William H. Rue, of that city. Jan Van Dyck and his wife are buried in the old Ten-Mile Run burying-ground, two or three miles above Rocky Hill near the New Brunswick pike. He died in 1764, over 80 years old.

Anne, wife of Zacheus Van Dyke, was mentioned in her father's will, dated 6 Oct 1761.

In his will, he wrote: ...The twenty-fourth April, 1780. I, Zacheus Van Dyke, of the County of Richmond, being weak in body. All my just debts and charges to be paid and satisfied out of my moveable estate. I leave to my beloved son John all the lands and meadows that I now possess, together with two horses and one waggon, plows, harrows, and tackling belonging thereto; and two negro boys named Jack and Bob; he to have full possession at the age of twenty-one. If he die without lawful heir, then his portion is to be equally divided to my two daughters, Elizabeth and Catharine. Unto the said daughters, all my moveable estate (except the above mentioned) to be equally divided when my son John is twenty-one; my daughters to have their option to make their home with my son John on the homestead farm during his non-age. My two daughters' portions shall not be sold immediately after my decease, but shall remain on the farm until my son John is of age, and then be delivered to them in equal shares agreeable to the inventory that shall be taken at my decease. My daughters shall so share with my son John in all the increase of my stock and every other emolument that may arise from the place during the same period. Should either of my daughters marry, then the executors to pay unto her one equal half of what money there may be at my decease. If ever my beloved brother, Cornelius Van Dyke, should return, my son John shall maintain him during his life with victuals and Cloath upon the homestead farm. In case the lands should be confiscated, my son John shall share equally with my beloved daughters Elizabeth and Catharine to the contrary notwithstanding. I make Cornelius Cole, Isaack Praul, and my son John, executors. Witnesses, Jacob Cole, John Marshall (farmer), Obadiah Browne. Proved, May 31, 1782.
